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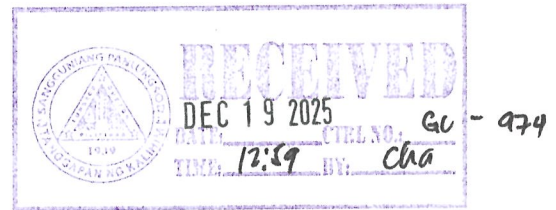



IMPLEMENTING RULES AND REGULATIONS
Pursuant to City Ordinance No. SP-3457, S-2025

“AN ORDINANCE GRANTING LENGTH OF SERVICE AWARD TO BARANGAY ELECTED OFFICIALS IN QUEZON CITY WHO HAVE COMPLETED THREE (3) CONSECUTIVE TERMS OF OFFICE, PROVIDING FOR THE QUALIFICATIONS AND MECHANISM FOR THE GRANT THEREOF, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES”

RULE 1
GENERAL PROVISIONS

ARTICLE 1. TITLE. These Rules shall be known and cited as the Implementing Rules and Regulations of Ordinance No. SP-3457, S-2025, *“AN ORDINANCE GRANTING LENGTH OF SERVICE AWARD TO BARANGAY ELECTED OFFICIALS IN QUEZON CITY WHO HAVE COMPLETED THREE (3) CONSECUTIVE TERMS OF OFFICE, PROVIDING FOR THE QUALIFICATIONS AND MECHANISM FOR THE GRANT THEREOF, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES”*

ARTICLE 2. PURPOSE. These Rules are promulgated to prescribe the procedures and guidelines for the implementation of Ordinance No. SP-3457, S-2025 in order to facilitate compliance therewith and achieve the objective thereof in granting Service Award to elected barangay officials.

ARTICLE 3. DECLARATION OF POLICY. It is thereby the policy of the Quezon City Government to recognize and reward the valuable service of its elected barangay officials through the granting of award to those who have completed three (3) consecutive full terms in the same elective position.

ARTICLE 4. DEFINITION OF TERMS.

- A. THE ORDINANCE:** Refers to Quezon City Ordinance No. SP-3457, S-2025, and any subsequent amendments thereto.
- B. ELECTED BARANGAY OFFICIALS:** Refers exclusively to the Punong Barangay (Barangay Chairman) and the Sangguniang Barangay (Barangay Kagawad) who were elected to office.
- C. THREE (3) CONSECUTIVE TERMS:** Refers to the full completion of three (3) successive terms of office as an Elected Barangay Official in the same position (Punong Barangay or Kagawad), without any interruptions or

breaks, whether due to resignation, recall or any other reason, between the periods of service.

D. SERVICE AWARD: Shall collectively mean the Financial Reward granted under the Ordinance.

E. ABSENT AWARDEE: For the purpose of this Implementing Rules and Regulations shall refer to an individual who has been recognized to receive the service award but is not physically present or unavailable at the time the service award is to be presented or received, due to various reasons such as, but not limited to the following: The awardee is out of the country or ill.

F. PRIMARY ID: A government – issued document that is difficult to forge, contains key details (photo, signature, full name, birth date), and is accepted as sufficient proof of identity on its own such as but not limited to:

H. BCRD: Refers to the **Barangay and Community Relations Department** of the Quezon City Government, the primary implementing agency.

RULE II ***QUALIFICATIONS AND COVERAGE***

ARTICLE 5. SCOPE OF APPLICATION. The Service Award shall be conferred upon all Elected Barangay Officials who have served and completed three (3) **Consecutive Terms** in the same elected position in any barangay within Quezon City.

ARTICLE 6. QUALIFICATIONS FOR THE SERVICE AWARD. An Elected Barangay Official shall be qualified for the Service Award, provided he/she meets all the following criteria:

- 1. Term Requirement:** Must have commenced their service starting in the year 1994 and successfully completed Three (3) Consecutive Terms in the same position (Punong Barangay or Kagawad). The Service Award shall be granted to each qualified individual for **EVERY THREE (3) CONSECUTIVE FULL TERMS COMPLETED.**
- 2. No Interruption:** The terms must be successive and without any break or interruptions in service except:
 - 2.1. When the Elected Barangay Official dies during his/ her third (3rd) term in the same position or his/her term was extended by law,

the three (3) consecutive terms shall be considered as *“deemed completed”* and shall be eligible for the Service Award.

2.2. A Barangay Official who was elected to a different post during his or her third (3rd) term is considered to have completed the full three – year duration of that term even if the term was legally extended. Provided, that he or she finished the full three years of service before assuming the new position.

2.3. For periods when the Elected Barangay Official was compelled to cease from holding office due to suspension or similar legal processes that were eventually lifted, provided the official completed the rest of the term.

3. Clean Record: Must not have been dismissed, removed or disqualified from Public Office due to administrative or criminal conviction by a final and executory judgement by any government agency, quasi – judicial bodies or courts of justice during their entire tenure.

4. Succession Rule: An Elected Barangay Kagawad who, during their third (3rd) consecutive term, succeeds and finishes the term as Punong Barangay, by virtue of operation of law under Title Two, Chapter 2 of the Local Government Code of 1991 on Vacancies and Succession, shall still be entitled to the Service Award for the position of Barangay Kagawad, provided the official completed the aggregate service period.

ARTICLE 7. POSTHUMOUS GRANT. In case of death, absence or physical inability of the qualified barangay official who completed or was in the process of completing their third (3rd) consecutive term, the Service Award shall be granted posthumously to their legal heirs, subject to the appropriate submission of legal documents provided under Article 11, Rule III of this Implementing Rules and Regulations.

***RULE III
MECHANISM FOR THE GRANT OF THE SERVICE AWARD***

ARTICLE 8. COMPONENTS OF THE SERVICE AWARD. The Service Award shall consist of Financial Reward granted to qualified barangay Officials who have completed their three (3) consecutive full terms in the following amounts:

- a. **Punong Barangay** – Ninety Thousand Pesos (Php 90,000.00)
- b. **Barangay Kagawad** – Fifty Thousand Pesos (Php 50,000.00)

ARTICLE 9. IMPLEMENTING COMMITTEE (IC). The Barangay and Community Relations Department (BCRD), in coordination with the Office of the

City Mayor, City Treasurer's Office, and Liga ng mga Barangay, shall be responsible for the processing, validation, and facilitation of the release of the Service Award granted under the Ordinance.

ARTICLE 10. DOCUMENTARY REQUIREMENTS. Qualified Elected Barangay Official shall be required to submit the following documents:

- a. Service Record Certification issued by the BCRD or BCRD Head Certification for payroll;
- b. Certificate of No Pending Case issued by the Special Investigative Committee on Administrative Cases Against Elective Barangay Officials and City Legal Department; and
- c. Affidavit of No Pending Administrative or Criminal Case in connection with the discharge of the barangay official's functions during his or her tenure by the Qualified Barangay Official.

ARTICLE 11. DISPOSITION OF THE SERVICE AWARD IN CASE OF DECEASED OR ABSENT AWARDEE. In case the Qualified Barangay Official is deceased or is outside the Philippines for any justifiable reason or ill, the disposition of the Service Award shall be granted posthumously to their legal heirs in the following manner:

1. **LEGAL SPOUSE:** In addition to the submission of documentary requirements provided under Article 10 of this Rule, the legal spouse shall be required to submit:
 - a. Death Certificate of the Barangay Official issued by the Philippine Statistics Office (PSA) or the Local Civil Registry (LCR) of the place where the barangay official died;
 - b. Marriage Contract of the Barangay Official and the surviving spouse issued by the Philippine Statistics Office (PSA);
 - c. Photocopy of valid government issued ID of the surviving spouse with three (3) specimen signatures. In the absence of a valid ID, the latter shall provide two (2) secondary identifications.
2. **LEGITIMATE CHILD/ CHILDREN:** In the absence of the legal spouse due to death or is likewise outside the Philippines for any justifiable reason or ill, the legitimate child of the awardee shall be entitled to receive the Service Award provided that documentary requirements under Article 10 of this Rule are submitted and proof of legitimacy and filiation is duly presented such as but not limited to:
 - a. Death Certificate of the Barangay Official issued by the Philippine Statistics Office (PSA) or the Local Civil Registry (LCR) of the place where the barangay official died;
 - b. Death Certificate of the legal spouse issued by the Philippine Statistics Office (PSA) or the Local Civil Registry (LCR) of the place where the barangay official died;

- c. Marriage Contract of their parents issued by the Philippine Statistics Office (PSA);
- d. Birth Certificate of the legitimate child issued by the Philippine Statistics Office (PSA) or the Local Civil Registry (LCR) of the place where he or she was born;
- e. Marriage Contract issued by the Philippine Statistics Office (PSA). (*In case the claimant is the legitimate daughter of the Barangay Official, and is married.*)
- f. Photocopy of valid government issued ID of the legitimate child with three specimen signatures. In the absence of a valid ID, the latter shall provide two (2) secondary identifications.

Should there be two or more legitimate children, they shall, by virtue of a Notarized Special Power of Attorney (SPA), designate one among them to claim the Service Award.

In case where the awardee was not legally married, a Certificate of No Marriage (CENOMAR) shall be submitted in lieu of a Marriage Certificate.

3. ILLEGITIMATE CHILD OR CHILDREN: In the absence of legitimate child/ children, the illegitimate child or children shall be entitled to receive the Service Award provided that documentary requirements under Article 10 of this Rule are submitted and proof of filiation is duly presented such as but not limited to:

- a. Death Certificate of the Barangay Official issued by the Philippine Statistics Office (PSA) or the Local Civil Registry (LCR) of the place where the barangay official died;
- b. Death Certificate of the legal spouse issued by the Philippine Statistics Office (PSA) or the Local Civil Registry (LCR) of the place where the barangay official died;
- c. Birth Certificate of the Illegitimate child with Acknowledgement of the Father (*if the father is the awardee*) issued by the Philippine Statistics Office (PSA) or the Local Civil Registry (LCR) of the place where he or she was born;
- d. Marriage Contract issued by the Philippine Statistics Office (PSA). (*In case the claimant is the legitimate daughter of the Barangay Official, and is married.*)
- e. Photocopy of valid government issued ID of the legitimate child with three specimen signatures. In the absence of a valid ID, the latter shall provide two (2) secondary identifications.

Should there be two or more illegitimate children, they shall, by virtue of a Notarized Special Power of Attorney (SPA), designate one among them to claim the Service Award.

4. COLLATERAL RELATIVES: In the absence of legal spouse and children, only the direct ascendant relatives (*parents*) of the elected barangay official may receive the Service Award provided that documentary requirements under Article 10 of this Rule are submitted and proof of blood relationship is duly presented such as but the not limited to:

- a. Death Certificate of the Barangay Official issued by the Philippine Statistics Office (PSA) or the Local Civil Registry (LCR) of the place where the barangay official died;
- b. Birth Certificate of the Elected Barangay Official issued by the Philippine Statistics Office (PSA) or the Local Civil Registry (LCR) of the place where he or she was born;
- c. Notarized Affidavit of Next of Kin declaring familial relationship.
- d. Notarized Affidavit of two (2) Disinterested Persons.
- e. Photocopy of valid government issued ID of the collateral relative with three specimen signatures. In the absence of a valid ID, the latter shall provide two (2) secondary identifications.

In the event that a Qualified Elected Barangay Official is considered an absent awardee, the Service Award may be received by the person duly designated by the awardee through a Notarized Special Power of Attorney (SPA). The SPA shall be submitted in lieu of the Death Certificate and in addition to the other applicable requirements under this article.

ARTICLE 12. DIPOSITION OF THE SERVICE AWARD IN CASE BOTH THE AWARDEE AND THE LEGAL SPOUSE ARE OUTSIDE THE PHILIPPINES. In cases the Qualified Elected Barangay Official and his or her legal spouse are both residing abroad or is outside the Philippines for a justifiable reason, the Service Award shall be received by the person designated in the Notarized Special Power of Attorney (SPA) executed by the awardee and the legal spouse.

ARTICLE 13. PROCESS AND FLOW FOR GRANTING THE SERVICE AWARD.

1. **Application and Submission:** The Qualified Elected Barangay Official or his or her legal heirs shall submit the complete documentary requirements provided under Article 10 and 11 of this Rule to the BCRD.
2. **Review, Verification and Evaluation:** The BCRD shall review the application for completeness and shall verify the authenticity of the submitted documents.
3. **Recommendation:** Upon successful verification, the BCRD shall approve the list of qualified officials and recommends the grant of the Service Award to the Office of the City Mayor.
4. **Final Approval and Funding:** The City Mayor grants final approval, and the City Budget Office is mandated to release the corresponding Service Award through the City Treasurer's Office.
5. **Disbursement of the Service Award:** The BCRD shall disbursed the Service Award to the awardee or his/ her legal heirs.

**RULE III
MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS**


ARTICLE 14. FUNDING. The necessary funds to cover the service award of Qualified Barangay Officials for the period of 1994 -2023 in the amount of Fifty

– Nine Million Pesos (Php 59,000,000.00) and the appropriation for the succeeding years necessary to cover the grant of Service Award for Qualified Barangay Officials completing their third (3rd) consecutive term after calendar year 2023 shall be sourced from any available funds of the City Government, subject to accounting rules and regulations.

ARTICLE 15. EFFECTIVITY. These Implementing Rules and Regulations shall take effect immediately upon approval by the City Mayor.

PROPOSED ORDINANCE NO. _____, S-2025

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE QUEZON CITY COOPERATIVE CODE TO COMPLEMENT AND STRENGTHEN THE IMPLEMENTATION OF REPUBLIC ACT NO. 6938, AS AMENDED BY REPUBLIC ACT NO. 9520, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE "PHILIPPINE COOPERATIVE CODE OF 2008" AND OTHER RELATED NATIONAL LAWS

Introduced by COUNCILOR CHARM M. FERRER, CPA, MPA, JD

WHEREAS, Section 15, Article XII of the 1987 Philippine Constitution recognizes the role of cooperatives as instruments of social justice, equity and people empowerment and mandates the State to promote the viability and growth of cooperatives as instruments of social justice, equity, and economic development;

WHEREAS, Republic Act (RA) No. 6938, as amended by RA No. 9520, otherwise known as the "Philippine Cooperative Code of 2008", declares the policy of the State to foster the creation and growth of cooperatives as a practical vehicle for promoting self-reliance and harnessing people power towards the attainment of economic development and social justice;

WHEREAS, the Cooperative Development Authority (CDA), as the national regulatory and developmental agency for cooperatives, recognizes the critical role of local government units in supporting and supplementing national cooperative programs through localized initiatives, partnerships, and resource mobilization;

WHEREAS, RA No. 7160, or the "Local Government Code of 1991", grants cities the power to enact ordinances, approve comprehensive development plans and codify related ordinances into subject-specific local codes, provided that these measures remain consistent with national laws and policies;

WHEREAS, Quezon City, as the largest local government unit in the National Capital Region, hosts the highest number of active cooperatives across various types and categories that contribute substantially to the city's local economy and community development initiatives;

WHEREAS, a comprehensive and localized Cooperative Code in Quezon City will harmonize existing ordinances, institutionalize programs, define clear roles and responsibilities for city offices and councils and provide a cohesive framework for planning, implementation and evaluation of cooperative development efforts in the city;

WHEREAS, the proposed Quezon City Cooperative Code will likewise align the city's cooperative initiatives with national priorities such as poverty alleviation, micro enterprise development, inclusive economic growth and the promotion of social enterprises, while tailoring programs to the unique socio-economic context of Quezon City;

WHEREAS, this Code seeks to establish a localized framework for the promotion and development of cooperatives within the City, consistent with the provisions of Philippine Cooperative Code of 2008 and other applicable laws, rules, and regulations, without prejudice to the regulatory functions of the CDA;

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED:

ARTICLE I GENERAL PROVISIONS

SECTION 1. TITLE. — This Ordinance shall be known as the “Quezon City Cooperative Code”.

SECTION 2. DECLARATION OF POLICY. — It is hereby declared the policy of the Quezon City Government to:

- (a) Recognize cooperatives as vital partners in governance, socio-economic development and service delivery;
- (b) Provide enabling mechanisms for the growth and sustainability of cooperatives;
- (c) Promote inclusive cooperative development among women, youth, senior citizens, persons with disabilities (PWDs), farmers, workers, indigenous peoples and other relevant sectors;
- (d) Strengthen the integration of cooperatives in the City's socioeconomic development agenda; and
- (e) Ensure consistency with national cooperative laws and CDA mandates.

SECTION 3. LEGAL BASES. — This Code is established in conformity with the provisions of the following laws and issuances:

- (a) Republic Act (RA) No. 6938, as amended by RA No. 9520 or the “Philippine Cooperative Code of 2008”;
- (b) RA No. 11364 or the “Cooperative Development Authority Charter of 2019”;
- (c) RA No. 7160 or the “Local Government Code of 1991”;

- (d) RA No. 11535 or “An Act Making the Position of a Cooperatives Development Officer Mandatory in the Municipal, City and Provincial Levels, Amending for the Purpose Republic Act No. 7160, Otherwise Known as the "Local Government Code Of 1991', as Amended”;
- (e) RA No. 10744 or the “Credit Surety Fund Cooperative Act of 2015”;

SECTION 4. OBJECTIVES. — This Code shall pursue the following objectives for the cooperatives duly registered and operating within Quezon City:

- (a) Establish institutional structures for cooperative promotion and development;
- (b) Provide comprehensive programs and services for cooperative strengthening;
- (c) Integrate cooperative strategies in local development planning;
- (d) Mobilize local and external resources to support cooperative growth;
- (e) Foster accountability, transparency, and good governance in cooperative operations.

SECTION 5. DEFINITION OF TERMS. — For purposes of this Code, the following terms shall be defined as follows:

- (a) Accreditation of Cooperatives – is a formal process where the Sangguniang Panlungsod of Quezon City recognizes and certifies a cooperative as meeting specific criteria to be eligible to participate in the Quezon City’s local special bodies as may be provided by law, and to avail of financial assistance, grants, subsidies, and other programs and support extended by the Quezon City Government;
- (b) Audited Financial Statement - the financial report of a cooperative, consisting of its financial statements and notes, audited by an accredited external auditor or the cooperative’s/federation’s audit committee and submitted to the CDA in accordance with law and regulations;
- (c) Barangay Clearance for Businesses/Cooperatives – the certification issued by the barangay, pursuant to Section 152(c) of Republic Act No. 7160 and relevant Quezon City ordinances, attesting that the applicant business or cooperative has complied with barangay requirements and has no pending violation, which shall be presented as a prerequisite for the issuance or renewal of business or cooperative permits and licenses by the City Government;
- (d) Business Permits and Licensing Department (BPLD) – the city

office responsible for issuing and renewing business and occupational permits, regulating business operations and conducting inspections to ensure compliance with laws and regulations, with authority to revoke permits or close establishments for violations;

- (e) City Cooperative Development Officer – the head of the Quezon City Small Business and Cooperatives Development and Promotions Office duly appointed by the City Mayor, subject to existing civil service laws, rules and regulations, to oversee, coordinate, and implement cooperative development policies, plans, and programs in the city;
- (f) City Development Council – the multi-sectoral body created under Executive Order No. 02, Series of 2019, chaired by the City Mayor and composed of all barangay chairpersons and designated representatives of non-government organizations/people's organizations (NGOs/POs), serving as the partner in city building by formulating and approving long-term, medium-term and annual socioeconomic development plans and investment programs, prior to submission to the City Council;
- (g) City Planning and Development Department (CPDD) – the department of the City Government primarily responsible for formulating integrated economic, social, physical and other development plans and policies, coordinating and monitoring the implementation of programs and projects, and providing technical assistance to the City Development Council and other local special bodies to ensure alignment with the city's development priorities and compliance with national policies
- (h) City Procurement Plan and/or Program – the procurement framework of the Quezon City Government, pursuant to Republic Act No. 12009 (The New Government Procurement Act), which outlines the acquisition of goods, works and services in a transparent and competitive manner, and provides opportunities for qualified cooperatives to participate as suppliers, contractors or service providers;
- (i) City Treasurer's Office (CTO) – the department of the City Government responsible for the administration, custody, and disbursement of public funds, including the collection of applicable taxes, fees and charges from cooperatives and for ensuring that cooperatives granted incentives, exemptions, or privileges comply with applicable laws and city ordinances;
- (j) Compliance – the fulfillment by cooperatives of all regulatory requirements set by the Cooperative Development Authority (CDA) under RA No. 9520 and other national laws, as well as local requirements under Quezon City ordinances, including submission of reports, payment of fees, securing of permits and adherence to standards of good governance and cooperative practices;

- (k) Community – a social group of any size whose members are residing or living in a specific locality, with a common characteristic, cultural and historic heritage or interest or within a larger society;
- (l) Community Development – Cooperatives play a vital role in community development by empowering local populations and addressing priority issues through collective action. Their initiatives—ranging from infrastructure development and disaster risk reduction to peace-building efforts and support for vulnerable sectors—reflect a commitment to inclusive growth and social equity.
- (m) Cooperative – an autonomous and duly registered association of persons, with a common bond of interest, who have voluntarily joined together to achieve their social, economic, and cultural needs and aspirations by making equitable contributions to the capital required, patronizing their products and services, and accepting a fair share of the risks and benefits of the undertaking in accordance with universally accepted cooperative principles;
- (n) Cooperative Development Authority (CDA) – the government regulatory agency created under Republic Act No. 6939, as amended by Republic Act 11364, which is mandated to promote the viability and growth of cooperatives as instruments of equity, social justice, and sustainable economic development, and which has the sole power to register, regulate, supervise, and develop cooperatives in the Philippines;
- (o) CDA Gawad Parangal – the annual national awards and recognition program of the CDA that honors outstanding cooperatives, cooperative leaders, cooperative development officers, local chief executives, and partner stakeholders for their exemplary performance, best practices, good governance, and contributions to cooperative development;
- (p) Cooperative Development Plan – the medium-term plan for the promotion and growth of cooperatives in Quezon City, formulated with the cooperative sector, endorsed by the Quezon City Cooperative Development Council and aligned with the City Development Plan and CDA framework;
- (q) Data Privacy – the right of an individual to control the collection, use, storage and sharing of personal information, in accordance with Republic Act No. 10173, otherwise known as the “Data Privacy Act of 2012”;
- (r) Grants - financial or in-kind assistance provided to cooperatives by the City Government, without obligation of repayment, intended to support their establishment, capacity building, operations or participation in programs and projects that promote cooperative development and community welfare;
- (s) Legitimate Cooperatives – cooperatives that are duly registered

with the CDA, possess a valid Certificate of Compliance (COC), and meet the regulatory requirements set by the Quezon City Small Business and Cooperatives Development and Promotions Office;

- (t) Local Special Bodies – the participatory bodies of the City Government composed of representatives from the government and duly accredited non-government organizations, people’s organizations or private sector, tasked to assist in the formulation of policies and programs through consultation, coordination and sectoral representation at the local level;
- (u) Manuel L. Quezon Gawad Parangal Awards – the highest recognition awarded by the Quezon City Government to individuals and institutions for their significant and exemplary contributions to the city and the country;
- (v) Mayor's and/or Business Permit – an official document issued by the Quezon City Business Permits and Licensing Department that grants permission to a cooperative to operate its business or businesses within the city;
- (w) Officers of the Cooperative – the members of the board of directors, members of the different committee created by the general assembly, general manager or chief executive officer, secretary, treasurer and members holding other positions as may be provided for in their bylaws;
- (x) Quezon City Cooperative Development Council (QCCoopDC) – the local cooperative development council organized pursuant to CDA Memorandum Circular No. 2022-03 and Quezon City Ordinance No. SP-2098, S-2011, as amended, composed of representatives of cooperatives and relevant government offices in the city and other related institutions and organizations, tasked to serve as a forum for consultation, coordination and recommendation of policies, programs, and projects that advance cooperative development within Quezon City;
- (y) Quezon City Green Awards - the awards and recognition program of the City Government for organizations and institutions that helps protect the environment and take action in disaster risk reduction management.
- (z) Quezon City Small Business and Cooperatives Development and Promotions Office (QC-SBCDPO) – the department of the City Government tasked to formulate, implement, coordinate and monitor policies, plans, programs, and projects for the promotion, growth, and development of micro, small, and medium enterprises (MSMEs) and cooperatives and to provide support services that enhance their viability and competitiveness;
- (aa) Quezon City University (QCU) – the local university established and maintained by the Quezon City Government mandated to provide affordable, accessible and quality higher education and

training programs that promote academic excellence, professional competence, and social responsibility in line with the City's development goals;

- (bb) Social Audit – the process by which a cooperative evaluates its social impact and ethical performance against its mission, vision, goals and code of social responsibility, to account for its social performance and community impact;
- (cc) Taxes, Fees and Any Dues – all revenue-raising measures and other financial obligations imposed by the City Government under its local tax laws; and
- (dd) Trade Center – a facility or venue operated by cooperatives or cooperative federations, that serve as common hubs for the marketing, display and distribution of cooperative products and services, and as support centers for capacity building, networking and market linkage.

SECTION 6. CATEGORIES OF COOPERATIVE. — Cooperatives shall be categorized according to membership and territorial considerations as follows:

In terms of membership, cooperative shall be categorized into:

- (a) Primary Cooperative — The members of which are natural persons;
- (b) Secondary Cooperative — The members of which are primaries; and
- (c) Tertiary Cooperative — The members of which are secondary cooperatives; and

In terms of territory, cooperatives shall be categorized according to areas of operations which may or may not coincide with the political subdivisions of the country.

SECTION 7. TYPES OF COOPERATIVE. — Cooperatives may fall under any of the following types:

- (a) Credit Cooperative – is one that promotes and undertakes savings and lending services among its members. It generates a common pool of funds in order to provide financial assistance to its members for productive and provident purposes;
- (b) Credit Surety Fund Cooperative – is a special type of cooperative that is partnered with a local government unit (LGU) and is composed of well-capitalized and well-managed member cooperatives or non-governmental organizations (NGOs) that meet the qualifications set by the CDA, LGUs, government financial institutions (GFIs), and other relevant agencies. Established under RA No. 10744, it is created primarily and exclusively to administer the city's credit surety fund;

- (c) Consumers Cooperative – is one of the primary purpose of which is to procure and distribute commodities to members and non-members;
- (d) Producers Cooperative – is one that undertakes a joint production whether agricultural or industrial. It is formed and operated by its members to undertake the production and processing of raw materials or goods produced by its members into finished or processed products for sale by the cooperative to its members and non-members. Any end product or its derivative arising from the raw materials produced by its members, sold in the name and for the account of the cooperative, shall be deemed a product of the cooperative and its members;
- (e) Marketing Cooperative – is one which engages in the supply of production inputs to members and markets their products;
- (f) Service Cooperative – is one which engages in medical and dental care, hospitalization, transportation, insurance, housing, labor, electric light and power, communication, professional and other services;
- (g) Multipurpose Cooperative – is one which combines two (2) or more of the business activities of these different types of cooperatives;
- (h) Advocacy Cooperative – is a primary cooperative which promotes and advocates cooperativism among its members and the public through socially-oriented projects, education and training, research and communication, and other similar activities to reach out to its intended beneficiaries;
- (i) Agrarian Reform Cooperative – is one organized by marginal farmers majority of which are agrarian reform beneficiaries for the purpose of developing an appropriate system of land tenure, land development, land consolidation or land management in areas covered by agrarian reform;
- (j) Cooperative Bank – is one organized for the primary purpose of providing a wide range of financial services to cooperatives and their members;
- (k) Dairy Cooperative – is one whose members are engaged in the production of fresh milk which may be processed and/or marketed as dairy products;
- (l) Education Cooperative – is one organized for the primary purpose of owning and operating licensed educational institutions notwithstanding the provisions of Republic Act No. 9155, otherwise known as the Governance of Basic Education Act of 2001;
- (m) Electric Cooperative – is one organized for the primary purpose of undertaking power generations, utilizing renewable energy sources, including hybrid systems, acquisition and operation of

sub transmission or distribution to its household members;

- (n) Financial Service Cooperative – is one organized for the primary purpose of engaging in savings and credit services and other financial services;
- (o) Fishermen Cooperative – is one organized by marginalized fishermen in localities whose products are marketed either as fresh or processed products;
- (p) Health Services Cooperative – is one organized for the primary purpose of providing medical, dental and other health services;
- (q) Housing Cooperative – is one organized to assist or provide access to housing for the benefit of its regular members who actively participate in the savings program for housing. It is co-owned and controlled by its members;
- (r) Insurance Cooperative – is one engaged in the business of insuring life and property of cooperatives and their members;
- (s) Transport Cooperative – is one which includes land and sea transportation, limited to small vessels, as defined or classified under the Philippine maritime laws, organized under the provisions of this Code;
- (t) Water Service Cooperative – is one organized to own, operate and manage waters systems for the provision and distribution of potable water for its members and their households;
- (u) Workers Cooperative – is one organized by workers, including the self-employed, who are at same time the members and owners of the enterprise. Its principal purpose is to provide employment and business opportunities to its members and manage it in accordance with cooperative principles; and
- (v) Other types of cooperatives as may be determined by the CDA.

SECTION 8. FUNCTIONS OF A FEDERATION OF COOPERATIVES. — A federation of cooperatives shall undertake the following functions:

- (a) To carry on any cooperative enterprise authorized under Article 6 that complements augments, or supplements but does not conflict, compete with, nor supplant the business or economic activities of its members;
- (b) To carry on, encourage, and assist educational and advisory work relating to its member cooperatives;
- (c) To render services designed to encourage simplicity, efficiency, and economy in the conduct of the business of its member cooperatives and to facilitate the implementation of their bookkeeping, accounting, and other systems and procedures;

- (d) To print, publish, and circulate any newspaper or other publication in the interest of its member cooperatives and enterprises;
- (e) To coordinate and facilitate the activities of its member cooperatives;
- (f) To enter into joint ventures with national or international cooperatives of other countries in the manufacture and sale of products and/or services in the Philippines and abroad; and
- (g) To conduct risk-based supervision to cooperatives, if recognized/accredited/authorized by the CDA; and
- (h) To perform such other functions as may be necessary to attain its objectives.

A federation of cooperatives may be registered by carrying out the formalities for registration of a cooperative.

Registered cooperatives may organize a federation according to the type of business activity engaged in by the cooperatives.

SECTION 9. COOPERATIVE UNIONS. — Registered cooperatives and federations at the appropriate levels may organize or join cooperative unions to represent the interests and welfare of all types of cooperatives at the provincial, city, regional, and national levels. Cooperative unions may have the following purposes:

- (a) To represent its member organizations;
- (b) To acquire, analyze, and disseminate, economic, statistical, and other information relating to its members and to all types of cooperatives within its area of operation;
- (c) To sponsor studies in the economic, legal, financial, social and other phases of cooperation, and publish the results thereof;
- (d) To serve as the voice of the cooperative sector to promote and lobby for its advocacy activities;
- (e) To serve as a training provider of all cooperatives, when accredited by the CDA;
- (f) To promote the knowledge of cooperative principles and practices;
- (g) To develop the cooperative movement in their respective jurisdictions;
- (h) To advise the appropriate authorities on all questions relating to cooperatives;

- (i) To raise funds through membership fees, dues and contributions, donations, and subsidies from local and foreign sources whether private or government; and
- (j) To do and perform such other non-business activities as may be necessary to attain the foregoing objectives.

Cooperative unions may assist the national and local governments in the latter's development activities in their respective jurisdictions.

SECTION 10. CATEGORIES BY ASSET SIZE — Cooperative Categorization by asset size in accordance with the guidelines set by the CDA issuances such as CDA Memorandum Circular No. 2007-07:

- (a) Micro Cooperative - Cooperative whose asset is Php 3 million (P3,000,000.00) and below;
- (b) Small Cooperative - Cooperative whose asset is more than Php 3 million (P3,000,000.00) up to Php 15 million (P15,000,000.00);
- (c) Medium Cooperative - Cooperative whose assets is more than Php 15 million (P15,000,000.00) up to Php 100 million (P100,000,000.00);
- (d) Large Cooperative - Cooperative whose asset is above One Hundred Million Pesos (P100,000,000.00)

The assets of the cooperatives will be based upon the Financial Statement of the cooperatives in the previous calendar year.

ARTICLE II INSTITUTIONAL MECHANISMS

SECTION 11. CITY COOPERATIVE DEVELOPMENT OFFICE. — The Quezon City Small Business and Cooperatives Development and Promotions Office (QC-SBCDPO) shall serve as the official Cooperative Development Office of the City pursuant to RA No. 11535, otherwise known as "An Act Making the Position of a Cooperatives Development Officer Mandatory in the Municipal, City and Provincial Levels, amending for the Purpose Republic Act No. 7160, Otherwise Known as the 'Local Government Code of 1991'", as amended.

SECTION 12. CITY COOPERATIVES DEVELOPMENT OFFICER. — There shall be a City Cooperatives Development Officer who shall serve as the lead implementer of the cooperative development programs of the City. The City Cooperatives Development Officer shall be appointed by the City Mayor, subject to existing civil service laws, rules, and regulations.

SECTION 13. ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF COOPERATIVES DEVELOPMENT OFFICER. — In accordance with RA No. 11535, the City's Cooperatives Development Officer shall take charge of the office for the

development of cooperatives registered with the CDA and shall:

- (a) Shall lead the formulation of the comprehensive cooperative development plan of the city for the consideration of the Sangguniang Panlungsod, and provide technical assistance and support to the City Mayor, as the case may be, in carrying out measures to ensure the delivery of basic services and provision of facilities through the organizing, promotion and development of cooperatives, and in providing access to such services and facilities;
- (b) Develop cooperative annual investment plans and strategies in consultation with the cooperative sector and, upon approval thereof by the City Mayor, as the case may be, implement the same, particularly those which have to do with the integration of cooperatives values, principles and practices in programs and projects which the mayor is empowered to implement and upon approval by the Sangguniang Panlungsod;
- (c) In addition to the foregoing duties and functions, the cooperatives development officer shall:
 - (i) Take the lead in identifying groups, sectors or communities that can be organized into cooperatives with the objective that the cooperatives to be organized shall be vehicles in poverty reduction, job creation and socioeconomic development of the City;
 - (ii) In collaboration with the CDA, provide assistance to prospective cooperatives in the conduct of the required pre-registration seminar and/or pre-membership education seminar and in the preparation of required documents for registration;
 - (iii) In partnership with the CDA, Department of Trade and Industry, other government agencies with cooperative development programs, cooperative unions and federations, the academe, and other private organizations, provide technical and other forms of assistance to duly registered cooperatives to enhance their viability as an economic enterprise and social organization including, but not limited to, training and education, business management, finance and financial management;
 - (iv) Conduct mandatory trainings to cooperative officers, members, and/or staff in compliance with the Certification Program of the CDA and requirements of other government agencies;
 - (v) Assist cooperatives in establishing linkages with government agencies, cooperative unions and federations, the academe and nongovernment organizations involved in the promotion and integration of the concept of cooperatives in the livelihood of the people and other community activities;
 - (vi) Assist cooperatives in the development and implementation of risk management plans and business continuity plans and management as a response to anticipated or unexpected man-made and natural calamities and disasters, to aid in their survival and, if necessary, subsequent rehabilitation.

SECTION 14. QUEZON CITY COOPERATIVE DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL. — The Quezon City Cooperative Development Council (QCCoopDC), established under Ordinance No. SP-2098, S-2011, as amended, is hereby institutionalized as the primary consultative and coordinating body for the development and promotion of cooperatives in the City. Its functions, organization, structure, and operations shall be in accordance with the guidelines issued by the CDA and consistent with its mandates.

It shall be responsible for reviewing and endorsing the Cooperative Development Plan for integration into the City Development Plan. To ensure consistency with the City's broader economic and spatial development objectives, the Cooperative Development Plan shall be formally forwarded to the City Planning and Development Department, through its Economic Development Planning Division, for inclusion in the City Development Plan.

SECTION 15. LINKAGE BETWEEN THE QUEZON CITY COOPERATIVE DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL AND THE QC-SBCDPO. — The QCCoopDC shall function as a policy advisory and consultative body, while the QC-SBCDPO shall act as the implementing arm of the City Government on cooperative development and promotion. The QC-SBCDPO, through the City Cooperative Development Officer, shall provide technical and secretariat support to the QCCoopDC, ensure that its recommendations are considered in program implementation and regularly report to the Council on the status of cooperative development initiatives in the City. Both institutions shall operate in a development-focused capacity, without encroaching upon the regulatory powers and functions of the CDA.

SECTION 16. PARTNERSHIP WITH COOPERATIVE UNIONS, FEDERATIONS, ACADEME, AND MEDIUM AND LARGE-SCALE COOPERATIVES. — The City shall promote the sustainable growth and strengthening of cooperatives by leveraging the resources, expertise and networks of cooperative unions, federations, academe, and medium and large-scale cooperatives. Initiatives shall include mentorship, capacity-building, joint ventures, collective market access, policy support, and programs that ensure inclusive and sustainable community impact. The QC-SBCDPO, in collaboration with QCCoopDC and CDA, shall coordinate and monitor these efforts.

SECTION 17. ACCREDITATION OF COOPERATIVES WITH THE SANGGUNIANG PANLUNGSOD. — All cooperatives duly registered with the CDA and operating within the territorial jurisdiction of Quezon City may apply for accreditation with the Sangguniang Panlungsod in accordance with existing guidelines for the accreditation of people's organizations, non-governmental organizations and cooperatives.

Accredited cooperatives shall be entitled to participate in the Quezon City's local special bodies as may be provided by law and shall be given preference for financial assistance, grants, subsidies, and other programs and support extended by the Quezon City Government.

Provided, however, that non-accreditation shall not affect the juridical personality or operations of the cooperative as recognized by the CDA but shall preclude access to the foregoing privileges.

SECTION 18. COOPERATIVE DATA AND INFORMATION MANAGEMENT

SYSTEM. — There is hereby established a Cooperative Data and Information Management System within the Quezon City Government, to be maintained and operated by the QC-SBCDPO and other relevant offices within the City Government, for the purpose of collecting, consolidating, updating, and disseminating relevant data on cooperatives operating within the City.

- (a) Objectives - The Cooperative Data and Information Management System shall aim to:
 - (i) Provide timely, accurate, and reliable cooperative data and information to support planning, policy formulation, monitoring, and evaluation of cooperative development programs;
 - (ii) Facilitate effective collaboration and coordination between the City Government, the CDA, and other stakeholders;
 - (iii) Enable targeted interventions, particularly in the areas of compliance, capacity-building, and financial assistance; and
 - (iv) Ensure transparency, accountability, and accessibility of cooperative data, subject to applicable data privacy laws.
- (b) Duty to Submit - All cooperatives operating within the territorial jurisdiction of Quezon City shall be required to submit to the QC-SBCDPO, on an annual basis or as may be required by regulation, certified copies of their reports submitted to the CDA, including but not limited to the Annual Report, Audited Financial Statements and Social Audit Reports.
- (c) Coordination with CDA and Relevant City Government Offices - The QC-SBCDPO shall coordinate closely with the CDA and other relevant regulatory offices under the City Government in order to access, verify and reconcile data on cooperatives registered in Quezon City, and to ensure consistency of records. For this purpose, the QC-SBCDPO may likewise collaborate with cooperative unions, federations and other umbrella organizations duly registered with the CDA to obtain sectoral data, facilitate reporting compliance of their affiliates and enhance the accuracy and completeness of cooperative profiles within the City.
- (d) Data Access and Utilization - The data and information collected under this Section shall be used exclusively for cooperative development planning, policy-making and program implementation. Access to cooperative data shall be governed by Republic Act No. 10173, otherwise known as the “Data Privacy Act of 2012” and other relevant laws.

ARTICLE III PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

SECTION 19. EDUCATION AND CAPACITY BUILDING. — The City Government shall implement continuing education and training programs for cooperative leaders, officers, members and employees. Such programs shall promote competency, good governance and cooperative sustainability, and

may be conducted in partnership with the CDA, Quezon City University (QCU), other accredited institutions and training providers. These shall include:

- (a) Cooperative Principles and Values - Orientation on cooperative identity, ethical standards, and the seven international cooperative principles;
- (b) Enterprise and Business Development - Training on business planning, feasibility studies, product development, marketing strategies, value chain integration, business continuity planning and community development projects;
- (c) Financial Literacy, Accounting and Audit - Financial planning, credit discipline, savings mobilization, basic bookkeeping and accounting for non-accountants, records management, internal control systems, audit management and compliance with cooperative audit standards;
- (d) Leadership, Governance and Organizational Management - Democratic leadership, strategic planning, succession planning, parliamentary procedures, rules formulation, conflict management, cooperative standards, and effective board management;
- (e) Digitalization and Technology - E-commerce platforms, cashless transactions, data privacy, cybersecurity and ICT tools to modernize or make cooperative operations more efficient;
- (f) Sustainability and Resilience - Climate resilience, sustainable development, environmental stewardship, disaster and natural hazard preparedness, relief and recovery; and
- (g) Other relevant training, as may be identified by the QC-SBCDPO, QCCoopDC, CDA and other stakeholders, to respond to emerging needs of the sector.

SECTION 20. COOPERATIVE FORMATION SUPPORT. — To encourage and guide emerging groups or associations in establishing their own cooperatives, the City Government, in close collaboration with the CDA, shall institutionalize mechanisms such as a Cooperative Clinic, which shall serve as a support hub for cooperative formation. Its functions shall include, but not be limited to:

- (a) Pre-Assessment of Readiness – Evaluating the organizational maturity, financial capacity, and shared purpose of groups aspiring to register as cooperatives;
- (b) Pre-Registration Seminar – Facilitating access to mandatory orientation sessions to be conducted exclusively by the CDA, in compliance with existing laws and guidelines;
- (c) Registration Assistance – Providing guidance in completing requirements and ensuring smooth processing through the Cooperative Registration Information System;
- (d) Post-Registration Mentoring – Conducting post-registration meetings and advisory sessions to assist newly registered cooperatives in their initial operations, governance, and compliance requirements;
- (e) Continuing Advisory Services – Offering coaching, technical support, and linkages to education, financing and market opportunities to ensure

cooperative sustainability.

The QC-SBCDPO, in partnership with the CDA and other relevant organizations, shall serve as the lead facilitator of the Cooperative Clinic or any other related mechanisms and ensure the provision of technical and institutional support to emerging cooperatives.

SECTION 21. REGULATORY COMPLIANCE SUPPORT. — To ensure that cooperatives in the City remain compliant with legal and regulatory requirements, the City Government, through the QC-SBCDPO in coordination with the QCCoopDC and the CDA, other government agencies and related organizations shall provide specialized support services. Such support shall include, but not be limited to:

- (a) Regulatory advisory services – Guidance and technical assistance on CDA-prescribed reporting, registration renewals, amendments to Articles of Cooperation and By-Laws and compliance with mandatory trainings and audit requirements;
- (b) Capacity-building on compliance – Training sessions on records management, mandatory reports preparation, internal controls, governance standards and adherence to cooperative laws and issuances;
- (c) Handholding caravans – Dedicated one-stop desks or scheduled large-scale sessions to assist cooperatives, especially micro and small cooperatives, in completing CDA reports, audit compliance, tax exemptions, and other government filings;
- (d) Legal and administrative referrals – Linkages with accredited legal aid, accounting professionals and cooperative federations/unions to provide further assistance on complex compliance matters;
- (e) Monitoring and early warning – Development of a system for early identification of compliance gaps and challenges with advisory interventions provided before penalties or sanctions are incurred.

SECTION 22. FINANCIAL SUPPORT MECHANISMS. — To ensure access to financial resources, the City Government has the option to establish financial support programs to strengthen cooperative viability, including, but not limited to:

- (a) Grants – Provision of accessible financing for startup cooperatives, capacity enhancement and sectoral cooperatives (such as women, youth, workers, PWDs, IPs, and senior citizens).
- (b) Credit facilitation – Linkage with government financial institutions (GFIs), microfinance institutions (MFIs) and private banks to expand cooperative access to credit.
- (c) Quezon City Credit Surety Fund (QCCSF) Cooperative – Strengthening and integrating the role of the QCCSF Cooperative as a partner in cooperative financing, consistent with Republic Act No. 10744 or the “Credit Surety Fund Cooperative Act of 2015” and CDA guidelines.

The QCCSF Coop, as formally recognized official credit surety fund cooperative of Quezon City, shall serve as a strategic instrument in enhancing the creditworthiness of cooperatives, micro, small, and

medium enterprises (MSMEs) and NGOs within Quezon City's territorial jurisdiction in order to promote local economic growth, financial inclusion and sustainable enterprise development.

Provided, that the provision of financial support mechanisms is subject to availability of City Government funds and the existing regulations. Provided, further, that only cooperatives that are in good standing with the CDA and compliant with reporting and auditing requirements (including COA, if applicable) shall be eligible to avail of City Government financial support, incentives and other development programs.

SECTION 23. FINANCIAL AND PROGRAM ACCOUNTABILITY. — Cooperatives receiving financial assistance or other forms of support from the City Government shall be subject to auditing rules and guidelines, in addition to CDA financial compliance standards. They, shall, likewise ensure that all city-supported programs and projects are implemented in accordance with approved plans, project objectives and the principles of transparency and good governance.

Provided, that failure to comply with reporting, auditing, or program implementation requirements may result in:

- (a) Suspension or termination of city support;
- (b) Requirement to return funds or assets; and
- (c) Other administrative or legal remedies as provided under existing laws, ordinances and cooperative rules.

SECTION 24. USE OF CITY-OWNED PROPERTY BY COOPERATIVES. — All City-owned movable or immovable property loaned, rented or otherwise made available to cooperatives shall remain the property of the Quezon City Government under the custody of the City General Services Department (CGSD). Any such use shall require prior written authorization from the City Mayor or their duly authorized representative, upon endorsement by the CGSD. All property issued to cooperatives shall be properly tagged, recorded, and included in the City's annual inventory reports and shall be subject to inspection, retrieval, or disposal in accordance with the applicable auditing rules.

SECTION 25. MARKET DEVELOPMENT. — To improve cooperative access to markets, the City Government shall provide support mechanisms including, but not limited to:

- (a) City Procurement Plan and/or Program – Inclusion of cooperatives in the City's procurement system, in line with RA No. 12009 or the "New Government Procurement Act";
- (b) Trade and distribution hubs/centers – Establishment of cooperative trade centers/posts (e.g., "bagsakan" hubs for agricultural produce, pasalubong outlets and cooperative stalls in public spaces, among others), subject to availability of resources such as land and infrastructure and alignment with the City's existing development plans and city-wide goals;

- (c) Promotion of cooperative products – Support for participation in fairs, trade expos, exhibits and digital marketplaces such as the Co-opBiz and all other safe and equitable platforms;
- (d) Marketing support services – Branding, packaging and product standardization assistance for cooperatives under the City Government’s existing programs and other initiatives that may be developed in partnership with government agencies such as, but not limited to, the Department of Trade and Industry, Department of Science and Technology, Food and Drug Administration, and private institutions or service providers.

SECTION 26. INCLUSIVE DEVELOPMENT. — The City Government shall promote cooperative growth that is inclusive and socially responsive, through:

- (a) Sectoral cooperatives – support for women, youth, senior citizens, workers, and PWDs, among others;
- (b) Integration into social programs – inclusion of cooperatives in social protection, health, livelihood and housing initiatives of the City Government; and
- (c) Capacity-building for sectoral empowerment – tailored education and financial support for marginalized groups to ensure their active participation in the cooperative movement.

SECTION 27. ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AND DISASTER RESILIENCE. — Recognizing the role of cooperatives in sustainable development, the City shall:

- (a) Promote green cooperatives – encourage eco-friendly production, renewable energy use, waste reduction and sustainable consumption practices in support of the City Government’s thrust towards sustainable and environment-friendly business practices;
- (b) Disaster preparedness and response – strengthen cooperatives’ capacity for disaster risk reduction, emergency response, relief distribution, recovery, business continuity and pandemic preparedness;
- (c) Climate adaptation – capacitate cooperatives in adopting climate-resilient practices, technologies and community development initiatives.
- (d) Resilience Building - shall support and capacitate cooperatives in disaster preparedness, response, and recovery through continuous education, training, and resource mobilization. It shall likewise promote resilient initiatives, innovative practices, and knowledge-sharing among cooperatives to strengthen community-based disaster risk reduction and climate change adaptation efforts.

- (d) Resilience Building - shall support and capacitate cooperatives in disaster preparedness, response, and recovery through continuous education, training, and resource mobilization. It shall likewise promote resilient initiatives, innovative practices, and knowledge-sharing among cooperatives to strengthen community-based disaster risk reduction and climate change adaptation efforts.
- (e) Participation in the Quezon City Green Awards - cooperatives shall be encouraged to participate in the annual Quezon City Green Awards to recognize and promote exemplary practices in environmental management, sustainability, and disaster resilience. The City shall promote the active engagement of cooperatives in this program to foster innovation and inspire wider community participation in environmental stewardship and disaster resiliency.

SECTION 28. COOPERATIVE MONTH. — Pursuant to Proclamation No. 493, s. 2003, the City shall observe the celebration of Cooperative Month every October and provide funds therefor. The QC-SBCDPO shall create a program and budget proposal for the activities to be held annually.

SECTION 29. OTHER PROGRAMS AND SERVICES. — The City Government, through the QC-SBCDPO and in coordination with the QCCoopDC, CDA, cooperative unions and federations, academe and other relevant stakeholders may design and implement other programs, projects, or services that advance cooperative development, in response to emerging trends, sectoral needs or policy directions.

ARTICLE IV INTEGRATION WITH LOCAL DEVELOPMENT

SECTION 30. COOPERATIVE MAINSTREAMING. — Recognizing cooperatives as key instruments for inclusive growth and local economic development, the City Government shall ensure that cooperative development strategies are integrated into its overall development framework.

- (a) Integration in City Planning documents – Cooperative development shall be mainstreamed into the City’s following:
 - (i) Comprehensive Development Plan – by identifying cooperative development as a strategic priority, linking it to socio-economic, environmental and infrastructure planning, among others;
 - (ii) Comprehensive Land Use Plan – by allocating land and facilities for cooperative enterprises, shared service centers, production hubs and trading venues, among others; and
 - (iii) Annual Investment Program – by earmarking budgetary allocations for cooperative capacity-building, infrastructure, market development, financial assistance, and other support mechanisms, among others.

- (b) Collaboration and coordination – The QC-SBCDPO, in coordination with the QCCoopDC, City Planning and Development Department (CPDD), and other relevant offices, shall ensure that cooperative priorities are systematically reflected in all development programs and projects.
- (c) Monitoring of integration – The City Planning and Development Office, together with the QC-SBCDPO, shall periodically review plans and programs to ensure that cooperative development objectives are consistently incorporated and aligned with citywide development goals.

ARTICLE V

LOCAL TAX AND FEES EXEMPTION, INCENTIVES AND SUPPORT

SECTION 31. LOCAL TAX EXEMPTIONS FOR COOPERATIVES. — All legitimate cooperatives, transacting business with members only or with both members and non-members, notwithstanding their taxability for national internal revenue purposes, shall be exempt from all local taxes imposed by the City Government in relation to their operations.

Regulatory fees imposed and collected by the national government such as but not limited to the Fire Safety Inspection Certificate (FSIC) issued by the Bureau of Fire Protection shall not form part of the exemptions declared under this Section.

SECTION 32. MAYOR'S PERMIT. Cooperatives transacting with non-members shall, however, be required to secure a Mayor's Permit in accordance with the exercise of the City Government's police power and the General Welfare Clause under Section 16 of the Local Government Code to protect public interest. While exempt from the payment of local taxes under the preceding Section, these cooperatives shall pay regulatory fees to cover the commensurate cost of regulation, inspection, and surveillance of their operations.

SECTION 33. PAYMENT OF SERVICE CHARGES OR RENTAL FEES. Cooperatives transacting with both members and non-members are obliged to pay service charges or rentals for the use of property and equipment or public utilities owned by the local government such as charges for actual water consumption, electric power, toll fees for the use of public roads and bridges, and the like, in accordance with MC No. 2010-120 issued by the Department of Interior and Local Government, citing BLGF MC No. 2010-120.

SECTION 34. REQUIREMENT TO SECURE COMMUNITY TAX CERTIFICATE. — All covered cooperatives shall likewise be required to secure a Community Tax Certificate (CTC) and pay the corresponding basic community tax of not more than Five Hundred Pesos (P500.00) as a juridical entity, in accordance with the provisions of the Local Government Code of 1991. This CTC payment shall be made on top of, and in addition to, all prescribed regulatory fees.

SECTION 35. RECOGNITION OF COOPERATIVES AND OTHER KEY CONTRIBUTORS IN COOPERATIVE DEVELOPMENT. — The City Government shall recognize cooperatives, cooperative leaders and other key contributors to cooperative development through award programs, including the Manuel L. Quezon Gawad Parangal Awards for Outstanding Individuals and Institutions. Eligible cooperatives and contributors may nominate themselves or be nominated under categories such as Human and Social Services, Environment and Climate Change, Economic Development, Urban Development, Institutional Development, and others as determined by the City Government. The QC-SBCDPO shall disseminate program information, provide technical assistance in preparing nominations, and coordinate with award committees to ensure cooperative achievements are duly considered. Support shall also extend to other City awards, including the QC Green Awards. The City Government, through the QC-SBCDPO and QC-CoopDC, shall encourage participation in national recognition programs such as the CDA Gawad Parangal and may establish a dedicated award program exclusively for cooperatives.

ARTICLE VI NETWORKING AND PARTNERSHIPS

SECTION 36. INTER-COOPERATIVE COLLABORATION. — The City Government shall encourage the following forms of collaboration as a means of strengthening collective capacity, enhancing competitiveness and promoting shared prosperity within the sector:

- (a) Koop Kapatid Program – Participation in the CDA’s program wherein the “Partner-Cooperative” extends assistance to the “Beneficiary-Cooperative” to accelerate the latter’s development;
- (b) Ugnayan sa Kooperatiba – a session or forum that aims to link the cooperatives to the QC-LGU, CDA, and other government agencies to address the issues and concerns that affects their operation;
- (c) Federations and Unions – Promotion of membership in federations, unions, and secondary or tertiary cooperative organizations for pooling of resources and collective voice;
- (d) Shared service arrangements – Establishment of common facilities, joint marketing initiatives, shared logistics, bulk procurement and distribution networks;
- (e) Inter-cooperative projects – Collaboration in enterprise ventures such as agro-processing centers, cooperative marketing/shopping centers, financial services and digital platforms;
- (f) Knowledge exchange – Peer learning, mentoring and best practice sharing across cooperatives.

SECTION 37. EXTERNAL PARTNERSHIPS. — The City Government shall facilitate cooperatives’ partnerships to advance their growth and

sustainability:

- (a) Government linkages – collaboration with the CDA, national government agencies (such as Department of Agriculture, DTI, Department of Labor and Employment, Department of Social Welfare and Development, Technical Education and Skills Development Authority, Bureau of Internal Revenue and others) and relevant GFIs to align cooperative programs with national policies and avail of complementary resources;
- (b) Private sector engagement – promotion of public-private partnerships that support cooperatives through access to technology, markets, training, financing and corporate social responsibility (CSR) initiatives;
- (c) Academe collaboration – partnership with universities and colleges such as the QCU and other training institutions to strengthen cooperative education, research, innovation and community development programs and initiatives.
- (d) International cooperation – linkages with international organizations, donor agencies, and cooperative development networks for technical assistance, capacity building and access to global best practices.

SECTION 38. QUEZON CITY COOPERATIVE CONGRESS. — The City shall establish a Quezon City Cooperative Congress as a regular multi-stakeholder venue/platform for consultation, dialogue, and collaboration among cooperatives, government agencies, the private sector, academe, and international partners. Accordingly, such congress shall have the following objectives:

- (1) Provide a venue for policy dialogue and program alignment; (2) Foster networking and partnership opportunities;
- (3) Present cooperative success stories and innovations;
- (4) Identify gaps and emerging challenges in cooperative development;
- (5) Formulate collective resolutions and action plans for city-wide implementation.

Provided, that the congress shall be conducted at least once every two (2) years, without prejudice to the holding of special consultations or thematic forums as necessary.

Provided, further, that the QC-SBCDPO, with assistance from the QCCoopDC, shall serve as the Secretariat to the congress and ensure continuity, documentation and follow-through of recommendations.

Provided, finally, that resolutions, recommendations or action plans agreed upon during the congress shall be endorsed to the QCCoopDC and/or the City Development Council, for possible integration into the Cooperative Development Plan, Comprehensive Development Plan, Annual Investment

encroach upon the regulatory powers of the CDA.

SECTION 40. ADOPTION OF NATIONAL LAWS AND POLICIES. — In the event of amendments, revisions or new enactments in national laws, regulations or policies governing the regulation and development of cooperatives, the City Government shall adopt and align its cooperative development programs, services and policies accordingly to ensure consistency with national standards.

SECTION 41. MONITORING AND EVALUATION. — The QC-SBCDPO, through the City Cooperative Development Officer, shall provide technical and secretariat support to the QCCoopDC, ensure that its recommendations are considered in program implementation and regularly report to the Council on the status of cooperative development initiatives in the City. Both institutions shall operate in a development-focused capacity, without encroaching upon the regulatory powers and functions of the CDA.

SECTION 42. APPROPRIATIONS. — The annual fund necessary for the operation and projects of the Quezon City Cooperative Development Council shall be included in the Annual Budget of the Quezon City Government.

SECTION 43. IMPLEMENTING RULES AND REGULATIONS (IRR). — The QC-SBCDPO, in consultation with the CDA and the QCCoopDC and other relevant offices of the City Government, shall promulgate the IRR within ninety (90) days from effectivity.

The City Mayor shall issue an Executive Order creating a Technical Working Group that will assist in the formulation of the IRR of this Code.

The QC-SBCDPO shall be the Secretariat of the Technical Working Group.

SECTION 44. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. — If any provision of this ordinance is subsequently declared unconstitutional or invalid, the validity of the remaining provisions hereof shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 45. REPEALING CLAUSE. — All ordinances and other issuances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed or amended accordingly.

SECTION 46. EFFECTIVITY. — This Ordinance shall take effect upon its publication for three (3) consecutive days in a newspaper of local circulation.



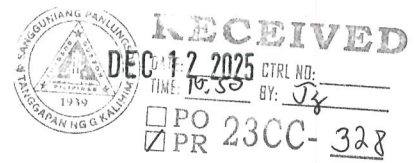

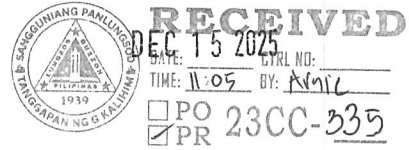

WHEREAS, the city government adheres to the principle that the appointments in the civil service shall be made only according to the merit and fitness pursuant to section 12, Rule VI of the Omnibus Rules Implementing Book V of the Administrative Code of 1987, requiring a system of merit promotion in the selection and promotion of employees and officials;

WHEREAS, in order to effectively implement the rules under CSC Resolution No. 2500358 or the 2025 Omnibus Rules on Appointments and other Human Resources Actions, there is hereby a need to reconstitute the existing HRMPSB which is responsible for the adoption of a formal screening procedure and formulation of criteria for evaluation of candidates credentials for selection and promotion.

WHEREAS, Executive order No. 29, Series 2022, reconstituted the HRMPSB for the Executive and Legislative branches of the Quezon City Government.

WHEREAS, in support of Executive Order No. 29, Series of 2022, officials and employees were formally designated as member of the HRMPSB by virtue of Office Order No. 184, Series of 2025.

NOW, THEREFORE

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, to ratify, Executive Order No. 29, series of 2022 and Office Order No. 184, Series of 2025, reconstituting the Human Resource Merit Promotion and Selection Board (HRMPSB) of the Quezon City Government.

Each subcommittee shall have a designated Team Leader and Members to be appointed by the Chairperson.

- B. Conduct hazard mapping, risk assessment, and community drills;

- F. Implement disaster prevention and mitigation programs;
- G. Conduct information and capacity – building activities for residents.

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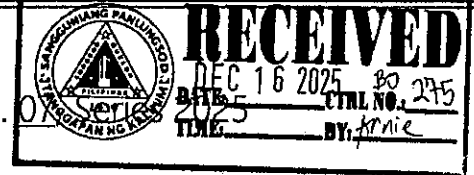

- Report and monitor criminal incidents, threats or disturbances within the barangay;
- Ensure the safety of children, women, the elderly, PWD and vulnerable groups;
- Strengthen community participation through Barangay Peacekeeping Operations;
- Maintain and activate the Barangay Peace and Order Information System;
- Submit regular reports and updates to the City/Municipal Peace and Order Council.

Section 3. CREATION OF PEACE AND ORDER SUB-COMMITTEES

The following sub-committees are hereby established:

1. Crime Prevention and Community Safety Sub-Committee
2. Anti-Illegal Drugs Sub-Committee
3. Barangay Peacekeeping Action Team (BPAT) Sub-Committee
4. Public Safety and Emergency Response Sub-Committee
5. Monitoring and Reporting Sub-Committee

The Chairperson shall designate members and team leaders for each sub-committee.

Section 4. SUPPORT AND COORDINATION

All barangay officials, tanods and relevant organizations shall extend full support to the BPOC for the effective implementation of peace and order programs.

Section 5. FUNDING

The necessary expenses for the operation of the BPOC shall be charged to the Barangay Peace and Order Fund or other available barangay funds, subject to standard accounting and auditing rules.

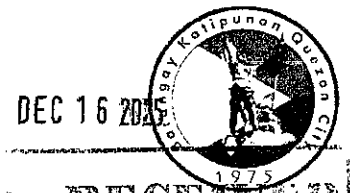

AN EXECUTIVE ORDER REORGANIZING AND STRENGTHENING THE
BARANGAY COUNCIL FOR THE PROTECTION OF CHILDREN (BCPC) OF
BARANGAY KATIPUNAN, PURSUANT TO DILG MEMORANDUM CIRCULARS
AND RELATED LAWS AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

WHEREAS, the right of every child to protection, development,
participation and survival is enshrined under national law – including Republic
Act 9344 (Juvenile Justice and Welfare Act), Republic Act 7610 (Special
Protection of Children Against Abuse, Exploitation and Discrimination Act), and
related laws;

WHEREAS, local government units are mandated to establish child-
protection mechanisms at all levels, including barangays;

WHEREAS, the DILG has issued successive memoranda to guide the
organization and monitoring of Local Councils for the Protection of Children
(LCPC), including at barangay level, notably: DILG Memorandum Circular 2002-
121 (dated 5 August 2002) and DILG Memorandum Circular 2008-126 (dated 21
August 2008) the former enjoining the creation/reorganization of LCPCs, and
the latter providing revised guidelines for monitoring functionality.

WHEREAS, a more recent issuance, DILG Memorandum Circular 2021-
039, provides "Comprehensive Guidelines for the Establishment, Strengthening
and Monitoring of the Local Council for the Protection of Children (LCPC) at All
Levels," updating standards, monitoring procedures and functionality criteria for
BCPCs and other LCPCs.

WHEREAS, it is imperative that Barangay BCPC of Barangay
Katipunan be reorganized in full compliance with these national guidelines, to
ensure a functional, accountable and child-responsive council;

NOW THEREFORE, I, ELMER S. BARAL Punong Barangay of Barangay
Katipunan, District I, Quezon City, by virtue of the powers vested in me under
law, do hereby order the following:

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The BCPC membership may be expanded or adjusted to suit the context and resources of the barangay, provided that representation of key child welfare sectors is maintained

SECTION 2. FUNCTIONS AND MANDATES OF THE BCPC

The Barangay Council for the Protection of Children shall perform the following functions – in line with national law, DILG guidelines and the principle of child-rights based governance:

- a. Formulate, adopt and regularly updated the Barangay Child Protection and Development Plan, aligned with the local development agenda.
- b. Maintain and manage an updated, disaggregated child registry / baseline data of all children in the barangay – for monitoring their status, vulnerabilities and needs.
- c. Identify, monitor and intervene in cases of child abuse, neglect, exploitation, trafficking, bullying and other child- at- risk situations; provide referral and support mechanisms in coordination with relevant agencies.
- d. Implement programs and services to promote children's right -including but not limited to early childhood care and development (ECCD), health and nutrition, education support, psychosocial support, recreational and welfare programs.
- e. Develop and implement preventive and intervention measures for children in conflict with the law (CICL) and children-at-risk (CAR), including mechanisms for rehabilitation, diversion and appropriate restorative programs, in compliance with existing laws and policies.(e.g. as guided by updated frameworks such as those referenced in recent DILG issuances.)
- f. Advocate for and coordinate passage/adoption of local ordinances or barangay resolutions as necessary – for child protection, anti-abuse, anti-exploitation (including online sexual abuse / exploitation), ensuring children's right in all barangay operations. (Recent national efforts emphasize local anti-OSAEC ordinances.)
- g. Conduct community education, information dissemination, advocacy and capacity-building for parents, guardians, children and community members: topics may include children's rights, positive parenting, child protection ,early childhood development, child safety and participation of children in community affairs.
- h. Meet regularly (at least quarterly, or as prescribed by DILG MC) and document minutes, actions taken and progress – to ensure transparent governance, accountability and compliance with functionality standards.
- i. Prepare and submit periodic reports (quarterly / annual) to the municipal/city LCPC and cooperate with Inter-Agency Monitoring Task Force (IMTF) for periodic assessment of BCPC functionality.

j. Ensure budget allocations for child protection and development programs – through barangay funds, GAD budget (if applicable), and other available sources. Ensure proper accounting and transparency of such funds.

Section 3. SUB-COMMITTEES. To ensure efficient implementation, the following Sub-Committees under the BCPC are hereby created (chairs to be designated by the BCPC Co-Chairperson / Vice-Chair):

- Child Protection & Case Management Sub-Committee – handles abuse/neglect cases, referrals, rescue, coordination with social welfare agencies.
- Health, Nutrition and Early Childhood Care & Development (ECCD) Sub-Committee – focuses on health, nutrition, immunization, daycare, early childhood programs.
- Education, Participation & Youth Development Sub – Committee – addresses issues related to schooling, youth participation, child rights education, extracurricular / development programs.
- Advocacy, Information and Community Awareness Sub-Committee – Conducts community education, advocacy, campaigns on child rights, prevention of abuse/exploitation, online safety, child participation.
- Monitoring, Documentation & Reporting Sub-Committee – maintains child registry database, tracks program implementations, compiles reports, ensures compliance with DILG monitoring requirements.

Additional sub-committees may be formed depending on emerging needs (e.g. Rehabilitation & Reintegration for CICL, Disaster Preparedness for children, etc.)

Section 4. COORDINATION, SUPPORT AND LINKAGES.

The BCPC shall coordinate with relevant government agencies (e.g. social welfare office, health office, education office, police, justice), non-government organizations (NGOs/CSOs), community-based organizations (CBOs), faith-based and civic groups, parent-teacher associations, youth organizations, and other stakeholders. This ensures an integrated, multi-sectoral approach to child protection and welfare, in line with national standards and the spirit of DILG guidelines.



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SECTION 5. FUNDING

All necessary expenses for the operations, programs, and activities of the BCPC shall be charged against the following sources (subject to sound budgeting, accounting, and auditing rules):


- Barangay Child Protection and Development Fund (or similar fund)
- Barangay GAD Budget, if applicable
- Other available barangay or local funds, donations, grants, or support from partner agencies/organizations

The BCPC must prepare and submit a Work and Financial Plan (WFP) annually, and ensure its integration into the Barangay Annual Investment Program or Local Development Plan, per DILG monitoring requirements.

SECTION 6. EFFECTIVITY

This Executive Order shall take effect immediately upon approval and shall remain in force unless amended or repealed by a subsequent order or local ordinance.

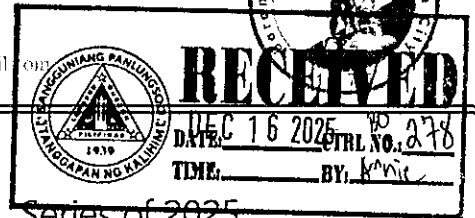

"AN ORDER REORGANIZING THE BARANGAY ECOLOGICAL SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE (BESWMC) AND STRENGTHENING THE IMPLEMENTATION OF ECOLOGICAL SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT IN BARANGAY KATIPUNAN"

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 9003, otherwise known as the Ecological Solid Waste Management Act of 2000, mandates all barangays to implement a comprehensive, ecological, and sustainable solid waste management program;

WHEREAS, the Department of Environment and Natural Resources – Environmental Management Bureau (DENR-EMB) issued renewed directives in 2025 urging all LGUs to strictly comply with RA 9003, including establishment of functional MRFs, segregation at source, and reduction of residual waste;

WHEREAS, DILG Memorandum Circular No. 2018-112 directs all barangays to create or reorganize their Barangay Ecological Solid Waste Management Committee (BESWMC) within sixty (60) days of assumption to office;

WHEREAS, the barangay plays a frontline role in ensuring waste segregation, recycling, composting, collection management, and reduction of waste entering sanitary landfills;

NOW THEREFORE, I, ELMER S. BARAL Punong Barangay of Barangay Katipunan, District 1, Quezon City, by virtue of the powers vested in me by law, do hereby order the following:

SECTION 1. REORGANIZATION OF THE BESWMC.

The Barangay Ecological Solid Waste Management Committee (BESWMC) of Barangay Katipunan is hereby reorganized to strengthen the implementation of ecological solid waste management.

SECTION 3. FUNCTIONS OF THE COMMITTEE.

The BESWMC shall perform the following functions:

1. Formulate, update, and implement the Barangay Ecological Solid Waste Management Plan, aligned with the Municipal/City SWM Plan.



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2. Ensure segregation at source and proper household compliance.
3. Establish, maintain, or participate in a functional Materials Recovery Facility (MRF) or clustered MRF, with provisions for composting and recycling.
4. Implement 2025 DENR-EMB directives on reducing residual waste and improving diversion rates.
5. Conduct regular barangay-wide IEC campaigns, trainings, and orientations.
6. Organize street/zone/area coordinators to ensure consistent implementation and monitoring.
7. Establish an ESWM Data and Monitoring System for collection schedules, compliance, and waste volume reporting.
8. Strengthen coordination with the City/Municipal Solid Waste Management Board, and submit regular reports.
9. Promote waste-reduction programs such as composting, barangay recycling centers, plastic and bottle redemption, and zero-waste initiatives.
10. Recommend funding for inclusion in the Annual Investment Plan (AIP) for ESWM.

SECTION 4. FUNDING.

All expenses necessary for the implementation of this Executive Order shall be sourced from the Barangay Budget, and other sources allowed by law, subject to existing accounting and auditing rules and regulations.


SECTION 5. COORDINATION WITH DENR, DILG, AND LGU OFFICES.

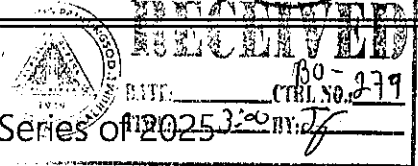

WHEREAS, Barangay Katipunan recognizes the importance of a well-functioning Barangay Nutrition Committee to address malnutrition, stunting, wasting, micronutrient deficiencies, and other nutrition-related issues in the community;

NOW THEREFORE, I, ELMER S. BARAL , Punong Barangay of Barangay Katipunan, District 1, Quezon City , by virtue of the powers vested in me by law, hereby order the following:

SECTION 1. REORGANIZATION OF THE BARANGAY NUTRITION COMMITTEE (BNC).

The Barangay Nutrition Committee (BNC) of Barangay Katipunan is hereby reorganized, strengthened, and updated to effectively lead the implementation of nutrition programs and the reduction of malnutrition in the barangay.

SECTION 3. FUNCTIONS AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE BNC.

The BNC shall perform the following duties:

A. Nutrition Governance

1. Formulate and update the Barangay Nutrition Action Plan (BNAP) aligned with the Municipal/City Nutrition Action Plan.
2. Integrate nutrition-related interventions into the Barangay Development Plan and Annual Investment Plan.
3. Ensure implementation of the Philippine Plan of Action for Nutrition (PPAN) strategies at the community level.

B. Program Implementation

4. Conduct Operation Timbang (OPT) Plus for all 0–59 months children yearly.



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5. Identify nutritionally-at-risk groups including:

Underweight, stunted, or wasted children
Pregnant and lactating women
Low-birth-weight infants
Adolescents

6. Implement priority nutrition interventions such as:

Supplemental feeding
IYCF education
Vitamin supplementation
Nutrition education classes
Home and school gardening

C. Monitoring and Reporting

7. Maintain an updated Barangay Nutrition Profile and submit all required NNC and LGU reports.
8. Track progress of children enrolled in nutrition and rehabilitation programs.
9. Monitor Maternal, Infant, and Young Child Nutrition (MIYCN) indicators.
10. Evaluate the performance and functionality of the BNC annually.

D. Community Engagement

11. Lead nutrition campaigns, assemblies, and health promotion activities.
12. Mobilize civil society groups, youth organizations, and parent leaders.
13. Coordinate with the Municipal/City Nutrition Office and RHU for technical support.

E. Resource Management

14. Allocate and utilize funds for BNC programs as provided in the barangay's budget.
15. Mobilize additional resources through partnerships with NGOs, private groups, and national programs.

SECTION 4. MEETINGS.

The BNC shall conduct regular monthly meetings, and special meetings may be called by the Chairperson as necessary.



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SECTION 5. FUNDING.


Funds for the implementation of nutrition programs shall be sourced from:

The Barangay Annual Budget,
The 20% Development Fund,
Donations or grants, and
Other lawful sources.

SECTION 6. EFFECTIVITY.

This Executive Order shall take effect immediately upon signing.

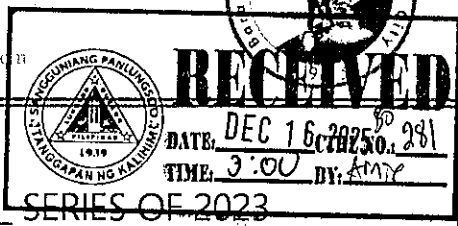

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EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 13 SERIES OF 2023

AN ORDER SETTING UP DIFFERENT MECHANISM TO PREVENT AND RESPOND TO GENDER-BASED SEXUAL HARASSMENT THE BARANGAY ANTI-SEXUAL HARASSMENT (ASH) DESK, THE BARANGAY ANTI-SEXUAL HARASSMENT ENFORCERS (ASHEs) AND ESTABLISHING THE ANTI SEXUAL HARASSMENT REFERRAL NETWORK

WHEREAS, the states values the dignity of every human person and guarantees full respect of human rights and recognizes the role of women in nation building;

WHEREAS, Republic Act 11313 otherwise known as the Safe Space Act (SSA) expands the law on sexual harassment in the country to cover all of its forms including verbal, non-verbal and physical; and secure all persons regardless of sex, sexual orientation and gender identity and expression from all kinds of gender-based violence and discrimination such as sexual harassment, not only in private spaces bur also in private spaces;

WHEREAS, Section 8 of the Safe Spaces Act mandates all LGUs to prevent and respond to gender-based sexual harassment (GBSH) in streets and public spaces;

WHEREAS, duties and responsibilities of the barangay government are stipulated in DILG PCW Joint Memorandum Circular No. 2020-001 re: Localization of the Safe Space Act;

NOW THEREFORE, I, ELMER S. BARAL, Punong Barangay of Barangay Katipunan, District I, Quezon City by virtue of the powers vested in me by law do hereby order the Setting Up of Different Mechanisms to Prevent and Respond to Gender Based Sexual Harassment (GBSH).

Section 1. ESTABLISHMENT OF THE ASH DESK

1A. Purpose and Location

The Barangay ASH Desk is established for the purpose of expediting the receipt and processing of complaints and reports of sexual harassment. The ASH Desk is set up at the 2nd floor in Barangay Hall to ensure that the right to privacy of the victim-survivor is protected at all times. It shall have the necessary furniture and fixtures such as but not limited to tables, chair and separate filing cabinet where the logbook and tools/equipment for documentation are stored.

1B. Designation of ASH Desk Officer

The Barangay ASH Desk Officer is the Barangay VAW Desk Officer MS. Andrea A. Camilon, a woman, who shall be directedly in charge of the daily operations of the ASH Desk. For this purpose the ASH Desk woman, who shall be trained to develop her skills and capacities necessary in the performance of her functions. The trainings shall include and is not limited to following:

1. Gender Sensitivity Training,
2. Salient Provision of the Safe Spaces Act
3. Salient provisions of other laws protecting women, children, and members of SOGIE including but not limited to: Anti Sexual Harassment Act; Anti Violence Against Women and their Children (RA 9262); Anti Photo and Video Voyeurism (RA9995); Anti-Child Pornography Act (RA 9775); Special Protection of Children Against Abuse, Exploitation and Discrimination Act (RA 7610); Anti-Trafficking in Persons Act (RA 9208 and RA 10364); Provisions of the Revised Penal Code which are related to gender-based violence, Relevant Provisions of the Family Code
4. Existing services of the City/Municipal government and those provided under the ASH network.
5. Protocols in Handling gender-based sexual harassment

1C. Functions of the ASH Desk Officer

The ASH Desk Officer shall have the following functions:

1. Receive, document and respond to complaints and reports of GBSH in streets and public spaces.
2. Facilitate the referral of cases and persons to appropriate public and private service providers for further assistance such as legal, medical, psychosocial, safety, security and other services;
3. Record the number of cases of GBSH in streets and public spaces received and referred to other agencies, and submit a quarterly report to the DILG City/Municipal Field Office and the City/Municipal Social Welfare and Development Office (C/MSWDO);
4. Keep case records confidential and secure and ensure that only authorized personnel have access to these records;
5. Assist in the formulation/updating of policies, development of plans, programs, projects and activities, and educational and awareness campaigns to address GBSH in streets and public spaces;
6. Coordinate with pertinent agencies in monitoring the status of GBSH-related complaints and reports;
7. Perform other related functions as may be assigned

2B. Functions of the ASHEs

The ASHEs shall have the following functions:

1. Receive complaints on GBSH in streets and public spaces;
2. Immediately apprehend the perpetrator if caught in the act of committing a crime;
3. Immediately bring the perpetrator to the nearest police station for appropriate action
4. Together with the Women and Children's Desk of the PNP stations, keep a ledger of perpetrators for the purpose of determining if the perpetrator is a first-time, second-time or third-time offender.

Section 3. ESTABLISHING THE ANTI SEXUAL HARASSMENT REFERRAL NETWORK

An ASH referral network is established to strengthen the coordination among public and private service providers in addressing the needs of victims-survivors of GBSH in streets and public spaces.

An ASH Referral Network is a mechanism in the barangay established to strengthen the coordination among public and private service providers in addressing the needs of victim-survivors of gender-based sexual harassment. It shall provide safety, security, and other relevant services. Further, the members of ASH Referral Network shall receive and efficiently act on referrals from the ASH Desk and ASH Hotline for the provision of services needed by victim-survivors and witnesses of gender-based sexual harassment. Protocols in this connection shall be formulated through an executive order, ordinance or memorandum of agreement among service providers.

preparedness, response, monitoring, coordination, and community health
protection;

emergencies in accordance with national and local guidelines;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ELMER S. BARAL, Barangay Captain of Barangay
Katipunan, by virtue of the powers vested in me by law, do hereby order:

SECTION 1. UPDATED ORGANIZATION OF THE BARANGAY HEALTH
EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM (BHERT).

SECTION 2. ACTIVATION OF THE BHERT.

The BHERT is hereby immediately activated to ensure continuous readiness and availability in responding to all health emergencies, including disease outbreaks, pandemics, and post-disaster medical assistance.

SECTION 3. FUNCTIONS AND MOBILIZATION.

Upon activation, the BHERT shall be mobilized to perform the following updated functions:

1. Conduct community health surveillance, monitoring, and reporting of suspected illness clusters or unusual health events.
2. Assist the City/Municipal Health Office in implementing public health programs, vaccination activities, and emergency health operations.
3. Undertake health risk communication and barangay-wide information dissemination.
4. Provide first aid, basic life support, and health emergency response during incidents and disasters.
5. Facilitate contact tracing, case monitoring, and health data reporting, as required by DOH or LGU.
6. Coordinate with the Barangay DRRM Committee, Barangay Peace and Order Council, and other sectoral committees for integrated emergency response.

SECTION 4. DEPLOYMENT.

The BHERT is hereby deployed barangay-wide to ensure:

- Immediate response to health emergencies;
- Wider coverage of health surveillance in all sitios/purok;
- Rapid coordination with the City/Municipal Health Office;
- Visible presence in strategic areas during alerts or outbreaks;
- 24/7 readiness as required by the situation.

SECTION 5. CAPACITY BUILDING.

All BHERT members shall undergo updated training, including:

- Basic Life Support (BLS)
- First Aid and Emergency Response
- Disease surveillance procedures
- DOH-aigned public health protocols

Training may be coordinated with the LGU, DOH, DILG, or accredited providers.

SECTION 6. FUNDING.

Funds necessary for the operations, mobilization, training, and deployment of the BHERT shall be sourced from the:

- Barangay General Fund
- Barangay Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Fund (BDRRMF)
- Local and national government support funds
- Other lawful sources

All disbursements shall be subject to existing accounting and auditing rules.

SECTION 7. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE.

The rules and the designated Quiet Hours shall be clearly posted on conspicuous signage at the court facility for the information and guidance of all residents and guests.



AN ORDINANCE CREATING A BARANGAY COMPREHENSIVE BANCHETTO LIVELIHOOD PROGRAM IN BARANGAY MILAGROSA

Introduced by: **Kgd Mowie Wowie V. Cordez**
Co-Introduced by: Kgds Isabelita Buyco, J. Abraham Valle, Antonio Dacanay, Maritess Roxas, Carmencita Balocating, Josephine Jarabelo and SKC Christiane Paras

WHEREAS, the Sangguniang Barangay has unanimously approved to provide opportunities to Small Scale and Medium Sized Entrepreneurs of the Barangay earn income through barangay initiated projects and programs,

WHEREAS, the Sanggunian also aims to provide opportunities to new and aspiring entrepreneurs to participate in the afore mentioned programs,

WHEREAS, relative to RA 6977 as amended by RA 9501 otherwise known as the **MAGNA CARTA FOR MICRO, SMALL, AND MEDIUM ENTERPRISES**, state that;

SEC. 2. Declaration of Policy. – Recognizing that MSMEs have the potential for more employment generation and economic growth and therefore can help provide a self-sufficient industrial foundation for the country, it is hereby declared the policy of the State to promote, support,, strengthen and encourage the growth and development of MSMEs in all productive sectors of the economy particularly rural/agri-based enterprises. To this end, the State shall recognize the specific needs of the MSMEs and shall recognize the specific needs of the MSMEs and shall undertake to promote entrepreneurship, support entrepreneurs, encourage the establishments of MSMEs and ensure their continuing viability and growth and thereby attain countryside industrialization by:

(1) Enact ordinances as may be necessary to discharge the responsibilities conferred upon it by law or ordinance and to promote the general welfare of the inhabitants therein;

(2) Enact tax and revenue ordinances, subject to the limitations imposed in this Code;

WHEREAS, with all the foregoing, it is imperative as it is inherent for the Sangguniang Barangay to create programs for the benefit of not only the SMSEs but the constituents of the barangay that will advantage as end users of this program,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE SANGGUNIANG BARANGAY OF BARANGAY MILAGROSA, on a motion made by **Kgd Mowie Wowie V. Cordez**, duly seconded, without any objection from the members of the council present, in a session assembled for the deliberation of this measure, **BE IT ENACTED THAT;**

SECTION 1. TITLE - This Ordinance shall hereunto be referred to as the, **"COMPREHENSIVE BANCHETTO LIVELIHOOD PROGRAM OF BARANGAY MILAGROSA"**

SECTION 2. PURPOSE – This program aims:

- A. To provide seasonal income generating opportunities for Barangay MSMEs that already has existing and ready businesses for banchetto type settings.
- B. To provide opportunities to new and aspiring MSMEs in the Barangay
- C. Generate additional income for the Barangay
- D. Provide quality goods and services to the Barangay Consumer Constituency

SECTION 3. GENERAL PROVISIONS – The Barangay shall encourage and call all MSMEs, NGOs and CSOs to participate and install their stores during the period provided for Banchetto within the Barangay. They will be provided with tents, electricity, chairs and lights for their stores. The Banchetto Area shall be staged at the Barangay Milagrosa People's Park (5K). They will also be mandated monthly fees for income generation and maintenance and other operating expenses of the Barangay.

SECTION 4. BENEFICIARIES - The beneficiaries of this program shall be:

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- a. Existing MSMEs ready with Banchetto style businesses residing in Barangay Milagrosa
- b. New and aspiring Banchetto type sellers residing in Barangay Milagrosa
- c. Accredited Barangay NGOs and CSOs that would like to put up their own stalls as their Organization's stall
- d. Existing MSMEs ready with Banchetto style businesses
- e. End User Consumer

Section 5. APPLICATION PROCESS – Aspiring Sellers for this program shall undergo the following application process:

- 1. Submission of Fully Accomplished Application Form
- 2. At least 2 Government Issued IDs indicating Residence in Barangay Milagrosa | Photocopies
- 3. At Least 2 Government Issued IDs (for Non-Milagrosa Applicants) | Photocopies
- 4. Photos of previous Banchetto Set ups in the Barangay or in other places
- 5. Menu or List of goods and services to be offered

Section 6. SCREENING AND APPROVAL PROCESS – The Punong Barangay shall appoint a Special Committee Chairman for this Program whom shall appoint the membership of the 4-man committee. They shall oversee the application process of aspiring banchetto sellers which shall be comprised of but not limited to:

- a. Review of documents submitted
- b. Interviewing Applicants
- c. Select Qualified Applicants
- d. Submit reports to the Punong Barangay and Other Recommendations

SECTION 7. SCHEDULE OF BANCHETTO OPERATIONS – The Barangay Banchetto shall be operational on the following time and days:

SECTION 8. EQUIPMENT TO BE PROVIDED – The Barangay shall be responsible in providing the following equipment to all approved sellers for this program:

a. Tents

b. Lighting

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- c. Chairs
- d. Extension Cords
- e. Entertainment (Acoustic Performers, Buskers)
- f. Park Entrance Lighting
- g. Business Tarpaulins

SECTION 9. SELLERS' EQUIPMENT – All participating sellers shall bring the following their own equipment to supplement needed tools and materials in their stalls such as:

- a. Tables
- b. Chairs
- c. Extension Cords
- d. Trash Bags
- e. Trash BINS for Bio-degradable and Non Bio-Degradable Waste
- f. Goods and Services

SECTION 10. BANCHETTO FEES/DUES – All approved and participating sellers shall pay the amount of **one thousand pesos only (P 1,000.00) per month which shall be collected every first Friday of the month of Operations up until the last month of the Program.** Upon payment, the Sellers shall be issued official receipts and an official Banchetto Sellers Permit. Qualified Sellers are shall also be required to pay a **five hundred peso (P 500.00) Seller's Bond** to ensure that all sellers shall fulfill all the agreed terms of selling are met. The Sellers' Bond shall be refunded upon the end of the season; and/or shall be forfeited if the sellers are not able to fulfill or abruptly disqualified due to violations to the terms.

SECTION 11. PLACEMENT OF STALLS – A week before opening, a coordination meeting shall be conducted by the barangay wherein, the determination of placement of banchetto stalls shall be determined via drawing of lots. The said placement shall be the permanent placement of stall until the last day of the program.

SECTION 12. DIVISION OF GOODS AND SERVICES – All food services shall be joined together in one section of the Banchetto; and All dry goods shall be joined together in one section of the Banchetto.

SECTION 13. GROUNDS FOR REVOCATION OF PERMIT – The following shall be the grounds for revocation of seasonal permits in the Barangay Banchetto Program:

- a. Failure to Open Stall for 3 consecutive Days
- b. Failure to Segregate and Dispose Waste
- c. Operating under the influence of Alcohol and/or Illegal Drugs
- d. Failure to Maintain Cleanliness in Respective Area
- e. Causing untoward incidents during operating hours

The Method of citation of offenses and penalization are as follows:

- 1. Verbal Warning
- 2. Written Warning
- 3. Final Written Warning
- 4. Revocation of Permit

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SECTION 14. CLEANLINESS AND ORDERLINESS- Banchetto sellers are tasked to ensure the cleanliness in and around their stalls including the immediate dining area in front of their stalls.

Section 15. Repealing Clause. All previous issuances, ordinances, rules and regulations, provisions or parts thereof, which are inconsistent or in conflict with provisions of this Ordinance, are hereby repealed, or modified accordingly

Section 16. Separability Clause. If for any reason, any part of this Ordinance is deemed irregular or illegal or unconstitutional, other sections hereof which are not affected shall continue to be in full force or in effect.

Section 17. Effectivity. This Ordinance shall take full effect upon the review and approval of the Sangguniang Panglungsod.

WHEREAS, the barangay is committed to maintaining peace and order, protecting public health, and promoting a clean and safe environment;

WHEREAS, the uncontrolled presence of stray or unregistered dogs and cats in the community pose a threat to public safety, sanitation, and may result in the spread of rabies and other zoonotic diseases;

WHEREAS, the Anti-Rabies Act of 2007 (R.A 9482) and the Animal Welfare Act (R.A. 8485 as amended by R.A. 10631) mandate local government units to implement animal control measures, pet registration, and responsible pet ownership;

WHEREAS, to effectively monitor and control the pet population, there is a need to involve the community in identifying pet owners who fail to register or restrain their dogs and cats through verified reports and photographic evidence;

WHEREAS, residents who are willing to serve as Barangay Animal Control Officers (BACO) may be designated by the Barangay and shall act as authorized witnesses to document and report cases of stray or unregistered dogs and cats in the community;

WHEREAS, to encourage active participation and reporting, the Barangay shall provide a modest incentive to each BACO for every verified report accompanied by clear photographic evidence of a stray or unregistered dogs and cats, subject to validation by the Barangay Council and in coordination with the Quezon City Veterinary Office;

6. The barangay shall ensure that all data gathered and submitted shall be treated with confidentiality and used solely for the purpose of animal control and public safety;
7. This program shall be implemented in collaboration with the Barangay Peace and Order Committee, the Committee on environment.



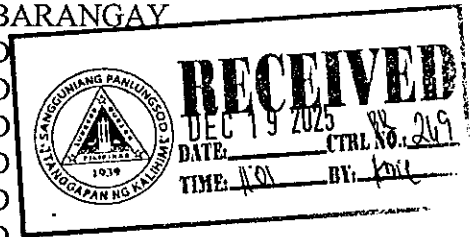

WHEREAS, the barangay shall refuse collection of garbage from households or establishments that fail to segregate waste according to the categories defined.



WHEREAS, Section 16 of the Republic Act No. 7160 expressly states that every local government unit shall exercise the powers expressly granted, those necessarily implied there from, as well as powers necessary, appropriate, or incidental of its efficient and effective governance, and those which are essential to the promotion of the general welfare;

WHEREAS, Section 391 Republic Act No. 7160 otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, states that the Sangguniang Barangay, as a legislative body of the barangay, shall enact ordinances as may be necessary to discharge the responsibilities conferred it by law or ordinance and to promote the general welfare of the inhabitant of the barangay.

WHEREAS, Quezon City operates 66 health centers, each staffed by at least one doctor, aiming to provide comprehensive healthcare services to residents including adolescents;

WHEREAS, the Quezon City General Hospital (QCGH) reported 5,154 individuals with mental and psychosocial cases accessing outpatient psychiatric services as of November 2022;

WHEREAS, as part of its mandate to involve the youth and the larger community in health initiatives and to offer residents accessible healthcare services through teleconsultation, the Sangguniang Kabataan (SK) of Barangay Sauyo is dedicated to incorporating the SKonsulta Program into the 10 Centers of SK Participation, with a special emphasis on the Health Center of Participation, thereby guaranteeing proactive participation in the promotion of public health and wellness;

WHEREAS, the Sangguniang Barangay (SK) of Barangay Sauyo recognizes the significance of offering its citizens, especially the youth, a free and high-quality healthcare services, particularly in the face of growing healthcare issues and restricted access to physical, mental, and medical facilities;

WHEREAS, advancement in digital technology and online communication platforms, which have made teleconsultation an effective and cost-effective of providing healthcare

services allows the youth to obtain medical advice, diagnosis, and referrals from licensed healthcare professionals without leaving their houses;

WHEREAS, teleconsultation has been recognized as an effective means of delivering timely medical advice and support, particularly for non-urgent cases, thereby improving accessibility of healthcare services within the community;

WHEREAS, the launching of a teleconsultation program in Barangay Sauyo aims to improve access to medical treatment, particularly for individuals experiencing financial and/or physical difficulties in availing in-person consultations, and provides a proactive approach to promoting community health and wellness

WHEREAS, staying true to its mantra's "Tayo ang Bagong Simula", Sangguniang Kabataan (SK) of Barangay Sauyo partnered with medical experts, are dedicated to putting the Teleconsultation program into action as a means of advancing public health, wellbeing, and the effective use of medical resources for the community's citizens;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE SANGGUNIANG BARANGAY OF BARANGAY SAUYO, DISTRICT 6, QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, upon motion of Hon. Bryan Rolly G. Maliwat duly seconded by Hon. Symond R. Del Mundo to wit:

SECTION 1: TITLE

This Ordinance shall be known as the "SKonsulta Health Program" Ordinance.

SECTION 2. OBJECTIVES

The purpose of this ordinance is to officially institutionalize the Sangguniang Kabataan Online Teleconsultation Program (SKonsulta) in Barangay Sauyo, with the goal of providing accessible healthcare services to all members of Katipunan ng Kabataan, ages 15-30 years old, through teleconsultation, blood donation and request access, animal bite treatment, and mental health help line. This program aims to raise health awareness, provide immediate medical help, and ensure that Katipunan ng Kabataan have access to basic healthcare services.

SECTION 3. DEFINITION OF TERMS

For the purpose of this ordinance, the following terms are defined as follows:

- a. **SKonsulta** – The Sangguniang Kabataan's online teleconsultation program that provides accessible healthcare services to residents of Barangay Sauyo.
- b. **Teleconsultation** – A medical consultation provided remotely, wherein residents can access healthcare services via Now Serving for non-urgent health concerns.

c. **Blood Bank** – A service providing access to donated blood for emergency medical situations, in partnership with the Philippine Red Cross Quezon City Chapter.

d. **Animal Bite Treatment** – A service providing treatment and necessary medical care for individuals who have been bitten by animals, including post-exposure prophylaxis (PEP) for rabies, in partnership with healthcare professionals.

e. **Psychologist** – A licensed professional trained to assess, diagnose, and provide therapy for mental, emotional, and behavioral concerns.

f. **Non-Urgent Cases** – Refers to health concerns that do not require immediate or emergency medical intervention, including minor illnesses, minor injuries, mild symptoms of chronic conditions, and routine health concerns such as medication refills or non-urgent test requests.

g. **Katipunan ng Kabataan (KK)** – The assembly of youth aged fifteen (15) to thirty (30) years residing in a barangay, registered with the Commission on Elections, and recognized as the consultative body of the Sangguniang Kabataan.

SECTION 4. SCOPE OF THE PROGRAM

4.1 Teleconsultation services

The SKonsulta Program will connect the youth with Dr. Margie Sergio Hementera-Isidro, MD, a Physician at The Medical City, ER Department - Non-Urgent Cases through the SKonsulta website (<https://skonsulta.sksauyo.com>)

Residents can receive guidance of non-urgent medical concerns but not limited to:

Minor illness: Colds, Sore Throat, Mild Fever

Minor Injuries: Small cuts, Sprains, or Bruises

Chronic Condition Symptoms: Mild flare-ups of asthma, back pain, or headaches

Routine Concerns: Medication refills or non-urgent test requests

The application will allow for real-time consultations with Dr. Hementera-Isidro who offers advice, recommends treatments, and provides prescriptions as needed.

4.2 Blood Bank Services

In partnership with the Philippine Red Cross – Quezon City Chapter, the SKonsulta Health Program will facilitate the access of the youth to free blood, provided they present a Blood Request from the hospital. The program will also organize regular blood drives in Barangay Sauyo to support residents in need of blood transfusions. This service is made possible through the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) signing conducted between the Barangay and the Philippine Red Cross – Quezon City Chapter.

4.3 Medicine Assistance Services

In collaboration with Generika Pharmacy – Sauyo Road Branch, and pursuant to the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) executed with the Sangguniang Kabataan of Barangay Sauyo, the SKonsulta Health Program shall provide medicine assistance to beneficiaries. Requests may be filed through the official website (skonsulta.sksauyo.com), provided that a valid medical prescription is submitted. Approved requests shall be processed and forwarded to Generika Pharmacy, the official partner pharmacy, which shall supply the prescribed medicines.

4.4 Animal Bite Treatment

The program will offer 24/7 prompt treatment for residents who have been bitten by animals, including post-exposure rabies prophylaxis (PEP), in partnership with medical professionals of DR Animal Bite Clinic.

4.5 Online Mental Health Support

The SKonsulta Health Program integrates mental health support by offering teleconsultation services with licensed psychologists and counselors.

SECTION 5. LIMITATION OF THE PROGRAM

1. This service is allowed for Katipunan ng Kabataan members; 15 years old to 30 year old. For those in ages of 15-17 (minors), a parent or legal guardian must read the terms and conditions at the checkout page and provide their consent.
2. Our psychologist does not provide medical prescriptions, only psychotherapy and counselling services.
3. SKonsulta is not an emergency clinical service and is not recommended for clients experiencing crisis situations or urgent mental health concerns

SECTION 6. IMPLEMENTATION AND ACCESS

The SKonsulta Health Program shall be implemented through partnerships with accredited health institutions, licensed professionals, and community stakeholders in accordance with executed Memoranda of Agreement (MOA). To ensure accessibility and public awareness, the program shall be promoted through Information, Education, and Communication (IEC) campaigns, barangay assemblies, social media platforms, the official website (<https://skonsulta.sksauyo.com>), and public events organized by the Sangguniang Kabataan of Barangay Sauyo.

1. Teleconsultation Access

Katipunan ng Kabataan members may access teleconsultation services by sending a message through the official Sangguniang Kabataan of Barangay Sauyo Facebook Page or by calling the program helpline at +63 975 470 4827.

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Upon booking, a unique code shall be issued to the client, and the implementing agency shall process the request based on the client's preferred date and time. The confirmed schedule shall then be endorsed to Dr.Hementera-Isidro, the program's accredited physician, who shall facilitate the teleconsultation through either video or audio calls.

2. Blood Bank Access

Qualified members of the Katipunan ng Kabataan may request assistance from the SKonsulta Blood Bank. Requests shall be subject to approval upon completion of the required documents. Once approved, a unique code shall be issued and forwarded to both the beneficiary and the Philippine Red Cross – Quezon City Chapter to facilitate the release and pick-up of the requested blood. The Sangguniang Kabataan of Barangay Sauyo, in collaboration with the Philippine Red Cross, shall ensure the availability and proper management of blood donations.

3. Animal Bite Treatment Access

Residents who have been bitten by animals may report immediately through the SKonsulta platform for proper assessment and treatment. Requests shall be processed through the booking system, wherein a unique code shall be issued to the client. The implementing agency shall schedule the treatment based on the client's preferred date and time and endorse the case to the designated partner clinic. The clinic shall administer the necessary medical care, including rabies post-exposure prophylaxis (PEP), while the Sangguniang Kabataan shall conduct follow-up to ensure continuity of care and recovery.

4. Mental Health Support Access

Members of the Katipunan ng Kabataan experiencing concerns such as anxiety, depression, stress, or in need of emotional support may avail of teleconsultation services through the official program website (<https://skonsulta.sksauyo.com>). Upon booking, a unique code shall be issued to the client, and the implementing agency shall process the request based on the client's preferred date and time. The confirmed schedule shall then be endorsed to the accredited psychologist, who shall conduct the teleconsultation. The Sangguniang Kabataan shall provide follow-up to ensure continuity of care and support.

5. Medicine Request

In collaboration with Generika Pharmacy – Sauyo Road Branch, and pursuant to the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with the Sangguniang Kabataan of Barangay Sauyo, the SKonsulta Health Program provides free medicine assistance to qualified beneficiaries. Requests shall be filed through the official program website (skonsulta.sksauyo.com) together with a valid medical

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prescription. The Sangguniang Kabataan Health Committee shall review and validate each request, after which an approval shall be issued along with a unique code. This code shall be forwarded to Generika Pharmacy, the official partner pharmacy, and to the beneficiary, who may then claim the prescribed medicines free of charge. All transactions shall be documented and monitored by the Sangguniang Kabataan to ensure accountability, transparency, and sustainability of the program.

SECTION 7. Responsibilities

1. Sangguniang Kabataan (SK)

The Sangguniang Kabataan of Barangay Sauyo, specifically SK Chairperson Bryan Rolly G. Maliwat along with Committee Chairperson of Health and Wellness SK Kagawad Rejina Baje, shall be responsible for managing and overseeing the SKonsulta Health Program.

2. Philippine Red Cross Quezon City Chapter

The SKonsulta Health Program, in collaboration with the Philippine Red Cross – Quezon City Chapter, shall ensure the availability of blood donations for medical emergencies and shall facilitate regular blood drives in Barangay Sauyo, pursuant to the executed Memorandum of Agreement (MOA).

3. Healthcare Partners

Healthcare providers and professionals, including doctors and specialists, shall assist in the delivery of teleconsultation services under the SKonsulta Health Program. They shall ensure that residents receive accurate and timely medical advice, subject to the scope of non-urgent cases as defined by the program.

4. Partner Pharmacy

The official partner pharmacy shall dispense prescribed medicines in accordance with approved requests under the SKonsulta Health Program. It shall honor transactions endorsed with a valid unique code issued by the implementing agency, ensure the availability of commonly prescribed medicines, and maintain accurate records of all dispensed items. The partner pharmacy shall likewise coordinate with the Sangguniang Kabataan for reporting, monitoring, and replenishment of supplies as may be required under the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA).

5. Volunteers

Organizing teleconsultation appointments, coordinating with healthcare providers, managing blood donation drives, ensuring the smooth operation of



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animal bite treatment services, and assisting youth to connect with mental health professionals.

6. Peer Educators

Shares information about mental health, importance of seeking help, and the availability of mental health services through the SKonsulta Health Program. They shall promote open conversations about mental well-being to foster a supportive environment in the community.

SECTION 8. Funding

8.1 Annual Operation and Maintenance Requirements

The funding for the SKonsulta Health Program, will be sourced from the Sangguniang Kabataan budget and other possible sources, including donations, grants, and partnerships with healthcare organizations. These funds will be used to maintain the operational costs of the program, including application creation and maintenance, medical supplies, and coordination with partner organizations.

To ensure the sustainability of SKonsulta Health Program, an annual operation and maintenance budget of at least P300,000.00 is allocated from the budget of Committee on Health and Wellness, covering the following:

1. **Professional fee:** Honoraria for the health care professionals and partner organizations
2. **Internet and Communication:** Subscription fees for internet providers and communication tools.
3. **Program Monitoring, Implementation, and Evaluation:** Costs for tracking program outcomes and community impact

SECTION 9. CONFIDENTIALITY AND DATA PROTECTION

All personal and medical information provided by Katipunan ng Kabataan members during SKonsulta Health Program consultations will remain totally confidential. Healthcare providers, such as medical professionals, counselors, and other program personnel, must respect and protect the confidentiality of all residents' health information.

9.1 Data Protection Compliance

The SKonsulta Program will rigorously follow the provisions of the Republic Act No. 10173 or the Data Privacy Act of 2012 and other applicable data protection legislation in the Philippines. All data gathered, including medical records, consultation details, and personal information, must be stored and handled in line with legal regulations to ensure its security and confidentiality.

9.2 Consent for Data Collection and Sharing



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Residents must provide informed consent prior to any teleconsultation or healthcare service, indicating their understanding of the data collection procedure, how their data will be used, and the measures in place to keep it confidential. Residents will also be informed of their right to withdraw consent at any moment, preventing continued use of their personal information.

9.3 Prohibition on Disclosure

Personal or medical information obtained through the SKonsulta Health Program will not be released to any other party without the resident's explicit, written consent, unless needed by law for legal or medical reasons. This includes, but is not limited to, sharing data with third-party businesses, government agencies, or individuals.

SECTION 10. MONITORING AND EVALUATION

The SKonsulta program will be monitored and evaluated semi-annual by the Sangguniang Kabataan of Barangay Sauyo. An Evaluation Committee will be formed to assess the effectiveness of the program, ensure its sustainability, and provide regular reports to the Sangguniang Kabataan Council, Barangay Council, Quezon City Youth Development Office (QCYDO), Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG) - Quezon City, and Sangguniang Kabataan Federation of Quezon City. Recommendations for improvements will be implemented accordingly.

SECTION 11. PENALTIES

Any person found to be violating any provision of this Ordinance shall, without prejudice to the imposition of penalties herein provided, also be held liable for other offenses under the Revised Penal Code or any other applicable special penal laws, whenever the acts committed constitute a violation thereof, and shall be prosecuted accordingly in accordance with law.

SECTION 12. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE

If any provision or part hereof is held invalid or unconstitutional, the remainder of the law or the provision not otherwise affected shall remain valid and subsisting.

SECTION 13. REPEALING CLAUSE

Any Barangay ordinance or executive order inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance is hereby repealed, modified, or amended accordingly.

SECTION 14. EFFECTIVITY CLAUSE

This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon approval of the Quezon City Council.

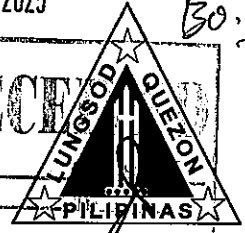

AN ORDINANCE MANDATING ALL BARANGAY ELECTED OFFICIALS AND APPOINTED STAFF TO COMPLETE A GENDER SENSITIVITY TRAINING ANNUALLY UNDER THE GENDER AND DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM IN BARANGAY SAUYO, DISTRICT 6, QUEZON CITY

WHEREAS, Section 16 of the Republic Act No. 7160 expressly states that "Every local government unit shall exercise the powers expressly granted, those necessarily implied therefrom, as well as powers necessary, appropriate, or incidental for its efficient and effective governance, and those which are essential to the promotion of the general welfare.

WHEREAS, Section 391 Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, states that the Sangguniang Barangay, as a legislative body of the barangay, shall enact ordinances as may be necessary to discharge the responsibilities conferred on it by law or ordinance and to promote the general welfare of the inhabitants of the barangay.

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 9710, otherwise known as the Magna Carta of Women, and Republic Act No. 7192, the Women in Development and Nation-Building Act, mandate gender equality and the integration of gender perspectives in governance and public service;

WHEREAS, gender sensitivity is essential in ensuring that elected and appointed barangay officials are aware of and responsive to the different needs, rights, and roles of all genders in the community;

WHEREAS, Barangay Sauyo, being one of the largest barangays in Quezon City, recognizes the necessity of equipping its officials and staff with adequate knowledge and training to prevent gender bias, promote inclusivity, and strengthen service delivery to its constituents;

WHEREAS, the Sangguniang Barangay of Sauyo recognizes the necessity of institutionalizing Gender Sensitivity Training (GST) to ensure that all barangay public servants deliver gender-responsive services and implement equitable local governance programs;

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NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Sangguniang Barangay of Barangay Sauyo, District 6, Quezon City, in regular session assembled, upon motion of Kagawad Karina Joyce D. Quilo-Diaz, duly seconded by Kagawad Luz P. Savilla, to wit:

SECTION 1. Title. This Ordinance shall be known as the “**Barangay Sauyo Mandatory Annual Gender Sensitivity Training Ordinance of 2025.**”

SECTION 2. Declaration of Policy. It is the declared policy of the Barangay Sauyo to promote gender equality and women’s empowerment by continuously educating its public servants on gender issues, eliminating gender bias, and ensuring the mainstreaming of gender perspectives in all its operations, services, and policies.

SECTION 3. Scope and Coverage. This Ordinance shall apply to ALL duly elected and appointed officials and staff of Barangay Sauyo, District 6, Quezon City, including:

- The Punong Barangay.
- All Members of the Sangguniang Barangay.
- The Sangguniang Kabataan (SK) Chairperson and SK Members.
- The Barangay Secretary, Barangay Treasurer and Lupong Tagapamayapa members
- All other appointed Barangay Staff, including but not limited to Barangay Tanods, Barangay Health Workers (BHWs), Barangay Nutrition Scholars (BNS), and contract of service employees.

SECTION 4. Mandatory Annual Gender Sensitivity Training. All officials and staff covered in Section 3 shall be required to complete a minimum of one (1) Gender Sensitivity Training (GST) session or workshop annually, as organized and facilitated by the Barangay GAD Focal Point System (BGFPS) or its accredited partners.

SECTION 5. Training Content and Accreditation. The GST shall cover essential topics, including, but not limited to: basic gender concepts, gender roles, gender biases, and the legal framework for women’s rights in the Philippines (e.g., MCW, Anti-VAWC). The BGFPS shall ensure that the training modules are updated and consistent with the standards set by the Philippine Commission on Women (PCW) or other accredited institutions. The training shall be conducted for a minimum of one (1) full-day session annually. Completion certificates shall be issued to participants. Attendance shall form part of the official personnel record of barangay officials and staff.

SECTION 6. Funding. An initial amount of P80,000.00 will be allocated for the implementation of this ordinance, which shall be taken from the 5% allocation of the GAD Annual Budget of Barangay Sauyo.

SECTION 7. Penalties and Administrative Action for Non-Compliance. Any official or staff covered by this Ordinance who, without justifiable cause, fails or refuses to participate in the mandated Annual Gender Sensitivity Training shall be subject to the following administrative sanctions:

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A. Any elected barangay official who, without a valid and justifiable reason approved by the Punong Barangay, fails to attend the mandatory Gender Sensitivity Training (GST) and Orientation shall be penalized as follows:

1. First Offense:
 - o A Written Reprimand from the Punong Barangay.
2. Second Offense:
 - o A Fine not exceeding Five Hundred Pesos (P500.00) to be deducted from his/her honoraria.
3. Third Offense:
 - o A Fine not exceeding One Thousand Pesos (P1,000.00) to be deducted from his/her honoraria.

B. Any appointed barangay Staff who, without a valid and justifiable reason approved by the Punong Barangay, fails to attend the mandatory Gender Sensitivity Training (GST) and Orientation shall be penalized as follows:

1. First Offense:
 - o A Written Reprimand from the Punong Barangay.
2. Second Offense:
 - o A Fine not exceeding Five Hundred Pesos (P500.00).
3. Third Offense:
 - o Grounds for the termination and the non-renewal for the following fiscal year, following due process.

SECTION 8. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. - If a court of competent jurisdiction declares any provision of this ordinance unconstitutional or invalid, such declaration shall not affect the validity of the other provisions of this ordinance.

SECTION 9. REPEALING CLAUSE. - Any Barangay ordinance and/or executive order consistent with the Ordinance's provisions is hereby repealed, modified, or amended accordingly

SECTION 10. EFFECTIVITY CLAUSE. - This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon the approval of the Quezon City Council.

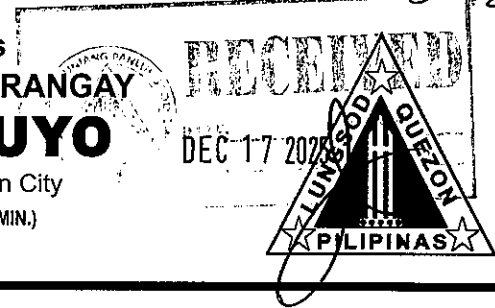

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE "CHILD-LABOR-FREE BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENT SEAL" IN BARANGAY SAUYO, DISTRICT 6, QUEZON CITY, AND PROVIDING GUIDELINES FOR ITS ISSUANCE, MONITORING, AND REVOCATION, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS FOR THE PURPOSES THEREOF.

WHEREAS, Section 16 of the Republic Act No. 7160 expressly states that "Every local government unit shall exercise the powers expressly granted, those necessarily implied therefrom, as well as powers necessary, appropriate, or incidental for its efficient and effective governance, and those which are essential to the promotion of the general welfare.

WHEREAS, Section 391 Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, states that the Sangguniang Barangay, as a legislative body of the barangay, shall enact ordinances as may be necessary to discharge the responsibilities conferred on it by law or ordinance and to promote the general welfare of the inhabitants of the barangay.

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 7610, as amended by Republic Act No. 9231 (The Anti-Child Labor Law), strictly prohibits the employment of children in hazardous and worst forms of child labor;

WHEREAS, Barangay Sauyo won Quezon City's First Most Child-Friendly Award in 2023 and 1st Runner Up on both 2024 and 2025, recognizing its commitment to creating a safe and nurturing environment for children;

WHEREAS, Mayor Joy Belmonte envisions and campaigns for Zero Child Labor in Quezon City in 2025, and this ordinance is one of Barangay Sauyo's responses to participating in the campaign;

WHEREAS, Barangay Sauyo has passed ordinances addressing the eradication of child labor, including Barangay Ordinance No. 005, S-2022, "AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ELIMINATION OF THE WORST FORMS OF CHILD LABOR AND AFFORDING STRONGER PROTECTION FOR THE WORKING CHILD AGAINST CHILD ABUSE, EXPLOITATION, AND DISCRIMINATION IN THE ENTIRE BARANGAY OF SAUYO, DISTRICT 6, QUEZON CITY", and Barangay Ordinance No. 007, S-2023, "CREATION OF TASK FORCE ACE";

WHEREAS, the Barangay Council for the Protection of Children (BCPC) is mandated to monitor and report cases of child abuse and exploitation, and implement programs for children's welfare;



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WHEREAS, the Barangay Sauyo aims to encourage and recognize business establishments that adhere to the Anti-Child Labor Law and actively promote the welfare of children and youth in the community;

WHEREAS, the establishment of a "Child-Labor-Free Establishment Seal" shall serve as a non-monetary incentive and a public declaration of compliance and commitment to ethical business practices within the territorial jurisdiction of the Barangay;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Sangguniang Barangay of Barangay Sauyo, District 6, Quezon City, in regular session assembled, upon motion of Kagawad Karina Joyce D. Quilo-Diaz, duly seconded by Kagawad Dendo M. Alvarez, to wit:

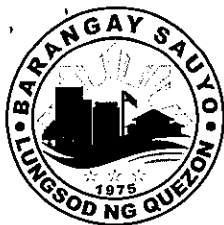
SECTION 1. Title. This Ordinance shall be known as the "Barangay Sauyo Child-Labor-Free Establishment Seal Ordinance of 2025."

SECTION 2. Declaration of Policy. It is the declared policy of Barangay Sauyo to eliminate child labor, protect the rights of children, and recognize and incentivize business establishments that strictly observe all provisions of the Anti-Child Labor Law (RA 9231) and other related statutes.

SECTION 3. Definition of Terms. For this ordinance, the following terms shall be defined as follows:

- A. Establishment: Shall refer to any private or public business and office operating within the territorial jurisdiction of Barangay Sauyo.
- B. Child - refers to an individual under the age of 18 years or who has not attained the legal age of majority, or those over but are unable to fully take care of themselves or protect themselves from abuse, neglect, cruelty, exploitation, or discrimination because of physical, mental, intellectual, or sensory disability or condition.
- C. Child labor - any form of work or economic activity performed by a child that is mentally, physically, socially, or morally harmful and interferes with the child's right to education, health, and overall development. It typically involves employing children in exploitative, hazardous, or inappropriate conditions for their age, depriving them of their childhood, and placing them at risk of physical, mental, or emotional harm. Child labor includes but is not limited to activities that are physically demanding, mentally abusive, morally compromising, or involve hazardous substances or dangerous machinery, as defined under RA 9231.
- D. Child Labor Free - refers to an establishment that has been verified to comply with all regulations and measures to prevent and eliminate child labor within its premises or operations.
- E. Seal: Shall refer to the "Child-Labor-Free Establishment Seal," a certificate and physical emblem issued by the Barangay to recognized compliant establishments.

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- F. **TASK FORCE ACE Validator** - this person would be responsible for reviewing the profiles of children suspected or known to be engaged in child labor and verifying information such as their age, working conditions, and other relevant details. He/She is also responsible for inspecting and monitoring establishments.

SECTION 4. Establishment of the Seal. The Child-Labor-Free Establishment Seal is now established in Barangay Sauyo to signify the barangay's commitment to combat child labor and create a safe environment for children within the barangay, to be awarded annually to establishments that meet the compliance criteria set forth herein.

SECTION 5. Guidelines for Issuance of the CLFES. To qualify for the CLFES, an establishment must:

- Be legally registered to operate within Barangay Sauyo.
- Submit a notarized Affidavit of Undertaking stating that the establishment, its owners, and managers do not and will not employ children in any form of child labor, as defined by existing laws.
- Have a clear and documented policy prohibiting child labor, which is disseminated to all employees.
- Pass the mandatory inspection and validation conducted by the TASK FORCE ACE VALIDATOR to confirm non-engagement in child labor.
- Cooperate fully with the Barangay in all monitoring and inspection activities.
- Must have no reported cases of child labor in the previous year.
- Owner/s and Employees must know of mechanisms for reporting and addressing violations

SECTION 6. Application, Validation Process, and Issuance.

- The BCPC shall issue public notices annually for the application period.
- The application shall be filed with the BCPC Secretariat, which is the office of the Barangay Secretary.
- The BCPC Monitoring Team, consisting of Task Force ACE Validator and the Punong Barangay or his/her representative, shall conduct an on-site validation of the applicant establishment.
- Upon successful validation, the Punong Barangay shall sign the certificate and issue the Seal, which the establishment shall publicly display.

SECTION 7. Validity and Renewal. The CLFES shall be valid for one (1) year from the date of issuance and must be renewed annually by complying with the criteria in Section 5.

SECTION 8. INCENTIVES AND RECOGNITION. Establishments that comply with the criteria will be awarded the **Child Labor Free Establishment Seal** and shall be entitled to incentives and recognition from the Barangay Council of Sauyo, including but not limited to:

- Publicly recognized during the Barangay's annual celebration of Children's Month or during the Barangay Assembly.
- Feature in the barangay publications, newsletters, and social media platforms.
- Priority invitation to participate in barangay-led events, trade fairs, or markets.
- Access to training and development programs offered by the barangay.



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- Opportunities for collaboration with barangay projects aimed at child welfare and community development.
- Given priority or fast-lane processing for the issuance of Barangay Clearance for business renewal, subject to existing rules.

SECTION 9. MONITORING AND EVALUATION. The Barangay Council for the Protection of Children of Sauyo and the Task Force ACE are hereby designated as the lead entity for the implementation and monitoring of this Ordinance. The BCPC and Task Force ACE are authorized to conduct regular and surprise inspections of CLFES-awarded establishments.

SECTION 10. Grounds for Revocation. The CLFES shall be immediately revoked, and the Seal retrieved, upon finding of any of the following:

- Violation of any of the criteria outlined in Section 5.
- Falsification of the Affidavit of Undertaking or any supporting documents.
- Confirmation, through due process, that the establishment engaged in or tolerated child labor after the Seal was issued.

SECTION 11. Consequence of Revocation. Revoked establishments shall be permanently ineligible to apply for the CLFES and shall be officially reported to the Quezon City Social Service and Development Department (QC-SSDD), Quezon City Public Employment Service Office (QC-PESO), Quezon City Business Permits and Licensing Department (QC-BPLD), and the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE) for appropriate legal action.

SECTION 12. FUNDING. An initial amount of P80,000.00 will be allocated for the implementation of this ordinance, including the design, printing, and issuance of the Seal and Certificates, and expenses for monitoring and validation activities shall be taken from the 5% allocation of the BCPC Annual Budget of Barangay Sauyo.

SECTION 13. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. - If a court of competent jurisdiction declares any provision of this ordinance unconstitutional or invalid, such declaration shall not affect the validity of the other provisions of this ordinance.

SECTION 14. REPEALING CLAUSE. - Any Barangay ordinance and/or executive order consistent with the Ordinance's provisions is hereby repealed, modified, or amended accordingly

SECTION 15. EFFECTIVITY CLAUSE. - This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon the approval of the Quezon City Council.

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

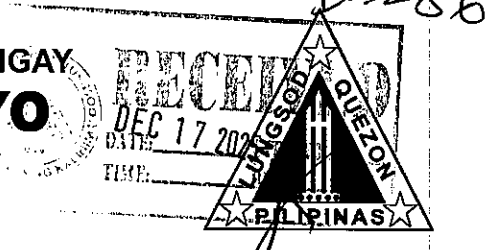

AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING ALL NEW AND EXISTING COMPUTER SHOP OWNERS AND OPERATORS IN BARANGAY SAUYO, DISTRICT 6, QUEZON CITY, TO UNDERGO A MANDATORY ORIENTATION SEMINAR ON PREVALENT LAWS GOVERNING COMPUTER SHOPS, THE ANTI-ONLINE SEXUAL ABUSE AND EXPLOITATION OF CHILDREN (OSAEC) LAW, CHILD LABOR LAW, AND OTHER CHILD PROTECTION LAWS, AND PROVIDING FOR MECHANISMS AND PENALTIES FOR NON-COMPLIANCE.

WHEREAS, Section 16 of the Republic Act No. 7160 expressly states that "Every local government unit shall exercise the powers expressly granted, those necessarily implied therefrom, as well as powers necessary, appropriate, or incidental for its efficient and effective governance, and those which are essential to the promotion of the general welfare.

WHEREAS, Section 391 Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, states that the Sangguniang Barangay, as a legislative body of the barangay, shall enact ordinances as may be necessary to discharge the responsibilities conferred on it by law or ordinance and to promote the general welfare of the inhabitants of the barangay.

WHEREAS, the Barangay Council of Barangay Sauyo recognizes the significant role of computer shops in the community as hubs for internet access, education, and recreation; as well as potential venues where violations against children, such as online sexual abuse and exploitation (OSAEC) and child labor, may occur;

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 11930 (The Anti-OSAEC and Anti-Child Sexual Abuse or Exploitation Materials Act) mandates the protection of children from all forms of online abuse and exploitation;



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WHEREAS, the Barangay Council for the Protection of Children (BCPC) is mandated to ensure the safety and welfare of children, which includes regulating sensitive business establishments;

WHEREAS, it is imperative to ensure that computer shop owners are fully informed and compliant with the laws and regulations that govern their operations to protect the welfare and safety of minors and other vulnerable members of the community;

WHEREAS, there is a growing concern regarding the potential risks and illegal activities that can occur within these establishments, including but not limited to online sexual abuse and exploitation of children, child labor, and other forms of child endangerment;

WHEREAS, it is imperative to ensure that computer shop owners are fully informed and compliant with the laws and regulations that govern their operations to protect the welfare and safety of minors and other vulnerable members of the community;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Sangguniang Barangay of Barangay Sauyo, District 6, Quezon City, in regular session assembled, upon motion of Kagawad Karina Joyce D. Quilo-Diaz, duly seconded by Kagawad Dendo M. Alvarez, to wit:

SECTION 1. Title.

This Ordinance shall be known as the **"Barangay Sauyo Computer Shop Owners' Mandatory Legal Orientation Ordinance of 2025."**

SECTION 2. Declaration of Policy.

It is the declared policy of Barangay Sauyo to promote responsible business conduct, protect children from online and physical exploitation, and ensure that all commercial establishments are fully aware of and compliant with all relevant laws about child welfare and business operations.

SECTION 3. Objectives.

The objectives of this Ordinance are to:



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1. Ensure that all computer shop owners and operators are knowledgeable of laws governing their operations, particularly those related to child protection.
2. Prevent the occurrence of online sexual abuse and exploitation of children (OSAEC), child labor, and other child endangerment activities within computer shops;
3. Strengthen the role of the Barangay Council for the Protection of Children (BCPC) in regulating and monitoring computer shops;
4. Promote a safe, child-friendly environment in all computer shops operating in Barangay Sauyo.
5. Include this compliance in the checklist for the application to renew the Business Permit.

SECTION 4. Mandatory Orientation Seminar.

All new applicants for computer shop permits and licenses shall be required to attend the orientation seminar before their barangay clearance is issued.

All existing computer shop owners and operators shall likewise undergo the orientation seminar within sixty (60) days from the effectivity of this Ordinance.

The seminar shall cover, but not be limited to:

- Republic Act No. 11930 (Anti-OSAEC Law)
- Child Labor Law (Republic Act No. 9231 and related provisions)
- Other relevant child protection laws and barangay ordinances
- Rules and regulations governing computer shop operations

SECTION 5. Implementing Mechanisms.

- The BCPC, in coordination with the Barangay Business Permits and Licensing Office, shall design and conduct the orientation seminar.
- Attendance shall be duly recorded, and certificates of completion shall be issued to participants.
- No barangay clearance or renewal shall be granted without proof of compliance with the orientation requirement.
- The Barangay Peace and Order Committee (BPOC) must ensure the full implementation of this ordinance.

SECTION 6. Monitoring and Compliance.

- The BCPC shall maintain a registry of computer shop owners and operators who have completed the orientation.

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- Barangay officials shall conduct periodic inspections of computer shops to ensure compliance with child protection laws and barangay regulations.
- Reports of violations shall be submitted to the Sangguniang Barangay for appropriate action.

SECTION 7. Penalties.

- Failure to attend the mandatory orientation seminar shall result in the **denial or suspension of barangay clearance** for the computer shop for having incomplete requirements.
- Any computer shop found to be in violation of child protection laws shall be subject to **immediate closure** and referral to the Quezon City Business Permits and Licensing Department for prosecution.

SECTION 8. Separability Clause. - If any provision or part hereof is held invalid or unconstitutional, the remainder of the law or the provision not otherwise affected shall remain valid and subsisting.

SECTION 9. Repealing Clause. - Any law, presidential decree or issuance, executive order, letter of instruction, administrative order, rule, or regulation, contract to or inconsistent with the Ordinance's provisions is hereby repealed, modified, or amended accordingly.

SECTION 10. Effectivity Clause. - This Ordinance shall take effect immediately after the approval of the Quezon City Council.

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

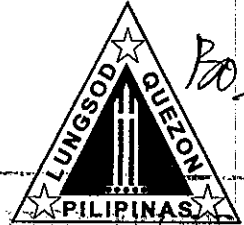

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 10121 (Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Act of 2010) mandates the institutionalization of disaster risk reduction and management (DRRM) programs at all local government levels;

WHEREAS, the Barangay Council for the Protection of Children (BCPC) and the Barangay Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Committee (BDRRMC) are jointly mandated to ensure the safety and welfare of children before, during, and after any hazard event;

WHEREAS, empowering children as advocates and participants in DRRM activities enhances community resilience and ensures that preparedness measures are child-sensitive;

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WHEREAS, children are among the most vulnerable sectors during disasters, and they must be equipped with age-appropriate knowledge, skills, and attitudes on disaster preparedness and safety;

WHEREAS, since 2022, the BCPC has been conducting Disaster Preparedness and Basic First Aid Training for children from identified disaster-prone areas in the barangay;

WHEREAS, the BCPC-LEAD Program has won a Green Award under the Resilience Category last November 2025;

WHEREAS, there is a need to institutionalize a continuing program that will empower children to actively participate in disaster preparedness and risk reduction activities in the barangay;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Sangguniang Barangay of Barangay Sauyo, District 6, Quezon City, in regular session assembled, upon motion of Kagawad Karina Joyce D. Quilo-Diaz, duly seconded by Kagawad Camille J. Dela Cruz, to wit:

SECTION 1. Title: This Ordinance shall be known as the **“Barangay Sauyo BCPC-LEAD Program Ordinance of 2025.”**

SECTION 2. Declaration of Policy: It is the declared policy of Barangay Sauyo to promote a culture of safety and resilience, recognizing children not merely as victims but as active agents of change in disaster preparedness. The BCPC-LEAD Program shall serve as the primary vehicle for achieving child-inclusive DRRM.

SECTION 3. Objectives: The BCPC-LEAD Program aims to:

1. Educate children on common hazards specific to Barangay Sauyo (e.g., fire, flood, earthquake);
2. Promote child awareness and participation in community-based DRRM and develop practical, age-appropriate skills in emergency response, first aid, and evacuation procedures;
3. Integrate the unique needs of children into the overall Barangay Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Plan (BDRRMP);
4. Mainstream disaster preparedness in child protection and development activities
5. Formally recognize BCPC-LEAD members as Junior Volunteers of the BDRRMC;
6. Establish and strengthen the BCPC-LEAD as a continuing program for child empowerment in resilience building.

SECTION 4. Implementing Mechanisms.

- The BCPC, in coordination with the BDRRMC, shall design and conduct age-appropriate training modules on disaster preparedness, first aid, and resilience.



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- Schools, faith-based organizations, and youth groups within Barangay Sauyo shall be tapped as partners in the implementation of the program.
- A roster of BCPC-LEAD members shall be maintained and updated annually.

SECTION 5. Monitoring and Evaluation.

- The BCPC shall submit a semi-annual report to the Sangguniang Barangay on the status of the BCPC-LEAD Program.
- The BDRRMC shall integrate the program's outcomes into the barangay's DRRM Plan.
- Feedback mechanisms involving children and parents shall be established to ensure inclusivity and effectiveness.

SECTION 6. Funding. An initial amount of P150,000.00 will be allocated for the implementation of this ordinance, which shall be taken from the 5% allocation of the BCPC Annual Budget of Barangay Sauyo.

SECTION 7. Separability Clause. - If any provision or part hereof is held invalid or unconstitutional, the remainder of the law or the provision not otherwise affected shall remain valid and subsisting.

SECTION 8. Repealing Clause. - Any law, presidential decree or issuance, executive order, letter of instruction, administrative order, rule, or regulation, contract to or inconsistent with the Ordinance's provisions is hereby repealed, modified, or amended accordingly.

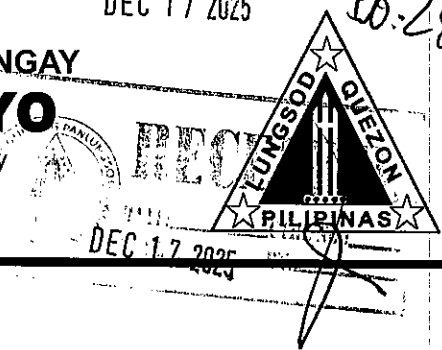

BARANGAY ORDINANCE NO. 014, Series of 2025

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE SALE, DISTRIBUTION, AND PROMOTION OF VAPE PRODUCTS AND PARAPHERNALIA TO MINORS WITHIN BARANGAY SAUYO, DISTRICT 6, QUEZON CITY, ESTABLISHING ENFORCEMENT PROTOCOLS, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF.

WHEREAS, Section 16 of the Republic Act No. 7160 expressly states that "Every local government unit shall exercise the powers expressly granted, those necessarily implied therefrom, as well as powers necessary, appropriate, or incidental for its efficient and effective governance, and those which are essential to the promotion of the general welfare.

WHEREAS, Section 391 Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, states that the Sangguniang Barangay, as a legislative body of the barangay, shall enact ordinances as may be necessary to discharge the responsibilities conferred on it by law or ordinance and to promote the general welfare of the inhabitants of the barangay.

WHEREAS, the State, as provided in the Constitution, recognizes the vital role of the youth in nation-building and shall promote and protect their physical, moral, intellectual, and social well-being;

WHEREAS, the sale of vaporized nicotine and non-nicotine products (vapes) to persons below eighteen (18) years of age is strictly prohibited under Republic Act No. 11900 (The Vape Law);

WHEREAS, the Barangay Sauyo recognizes the escalating health risks associated with vaping among minors and the need for stringent local measures to protect the youth and enforce existing national laws;

WHEREAS, the Barangay has the inherent power to promote the general welfare of its inhabitants, including the protection of public health and safety;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Sangguniang Barangay of Barangay Sauyo, District 6, Quezon City, in regular session assembled, upon motion of Kagawad Karina Joyce D. Quilo-Diaz, duly seconded by Kagawad Camille J. Dela Cruz to wit:

SECTION 1. TITLE.

This Ordinance shall be known as the “Barangay Sauyo Prohibition of Sale of Vape Products and Paraphernalia to Minors Ordinance of 2025.”

SECTION 2. DECLARATION OF POLICY.

It is the declared policy of Barangay Sauyo to safeguard the health and well-being of minors by strictly prohibiting the sale, distribution, and promotion of vape products and paraphernalia to persons below eighteen (18) years of age, in accordance with Republic Act No. 11900 (The Vape Law) and other child protection laws.

SECTION 3. OBJECTIVES.

This Ordinance seeks to:

1. Protect minors from the harmful effects of vaping and exposure to vape products;
2. Ensure strict compliance with national laws prohibiting the sale of vape products to minors;
3. Strengthen barangay-level enforcement mechanisms to regulate vape-related activities;
4. Promote awareness among residents and business establishments regarding the dangers of vaping among minors.

SECTION 4. PROHIBITED ACTS.

The following acts are hereby prohibited within Barangay Sauyo:

1. Physical and Online selling or distributing vape products and paraphernalia to persons below eighteen (18) years of age;
2. Promoting, advertising, or endorsing vape products in a manner that targets or appeals to minors;
3. The use or consumption of vape products by minors within computer shops, convenience stores, or other establishments.
4. Displaying vape products in areas accessible to minors.

SECTION 5. ENFORCEMENT.

- The Barangay Council, through the Barangay Peace and Order Committee (BPOC) and the Barangay Council for the Protection of Children (BCPC), shall enforce the provisions of this Ordinance.
- Routine inspections shall be conducted at establishments that sell vape products.
- Reports of violations may be filed by any resident, parent, guardian, or concerned citizen.
- Mandatory posting of Point-of-Sale Signage of all Vape Shops.
“The sale or distribution of Vaporized Nicotine and Non-Nicotine Products to or by persons below eighteen (18) years of age is illegal. These products are harmful and contain nicotine which is a highly addictive substance. It is not

recommended for use by nonsmokers." or "Ang pagbenta at pagbili ng Vaporized Nicotine and Non-Nicotine Products sa at ng mga taong wala pang labingwalong (18) taong gulang ay pinagbabawal. - Confiscated vape products shall be turned over to the Barangay for proper disposition.

SECTION 6. PENALTIES.

Violations of this Ordinance shall be penalized as follows:

For Vape Shop:

- **First Offense:** Written warning and a fine of Five Hundred Pesos (₱500).
- **Second Offense:** Fine of One Thousand Pesos (₱1,000) and confiscation of vape products.
- **Third Offense:** Fine of One Thousand Pesos (₱1,000), confiscation of vape products, and revocation of barangay clearance, with recommendation for closure of the establishment.
- Any minor found in possession of vape products shall be referred to the BCPC for counseling and intervention, without prejudice to parental responsibility.

SECTION 7. Separability Clause. - If any provision or part hereof is held invalid or unconstitutional, the remainder of the law or the provision not otherwise affected shall remain valid and subsisting.

SECTION 8. Repealing Clause. - Any law, presidential decree or issuance, executive order, letter of instruction, administrative order, rule, or regulation, contract to or inconsistent with the Ordinance's provisions is hereby repealed, modified, or amended accordingly.

SECTION 9. Effectivity Clause. - This Ordinance shall take effect immediately after the approval of the Quezon City Council.

ORDINANCE NO. 4, Series of 2025

BARANGAY ORDINANCE REGULATING THE USE OF BARANGAY STREETS BY BARANGAY RESIDENTS FOR SPECIAL EVENTS AND OTHER ACTIVITIES AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF

Sponsored By: Kagawads Annabel M. Martin, Rolando S. Malangen, Joel C. Astada, Jose Mari V. Caduco, Joener A. Letada and Jasper Jan C. Adorador

WHEREAS, Section 391 of the Local Government Code of 1991 states that the Sangguniang Barangay shall: "Enact ordinances as may be necessary to discharge the responsibilities conferred upon it by law and to promote the general welfare of the inhabitants therein."

WHEREAS, barangay roads and streets are public places intended primarily for transportation and public movement;

WHEREAS, it has been observed that some residents use barangay streets for private events and activities without proper notice, coordination, or consideration of public order and safety, accessibility, and traffic flow;

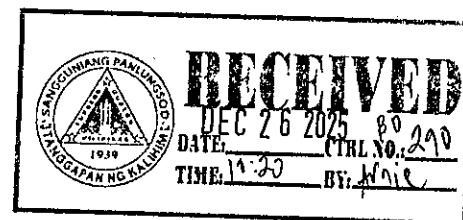
WHEREAS, it is imperative to regulate such use to ensure order, safety, and shared responsibility among all residents.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Sangguniang Barangay of Barangay Dona Imelda to regulate the use of barangay streets by barangay residents for private or special events and activities.

Section 1. TITLE. This Ordinance shall be known as the "Barangay Dona Imelda Street Use Ordinance".

Section 2. a. COVERAGE. This Ordinance shall apply to all barangay residents, organizations, or entities intending to use any portion of barangay streets, private or public events, such as but not limited to:

- A. Birthdays
- B. Weddings
- C. Wakes
- D. Reunions
- E. Street parties
- F. Sporting events
- G. Community celebrations Section



2. b. CLEARANCE REQUIREMENT. Any person or group intending to use a barangay street must:

- A. File a written request at least three (3) days before the event;
- B. State the nature, date, and inclusive time or duration of the event;
- C. Secure a Barangay Street Use Clearance;
- D. Commit to clean up, remove all chairs, tables, tents, and other appliances, and restore the street to its original state immediately after the event (a form may be prepared for this undertaking).

Section 3. CONDITIONS FOR APPROVAL. The Barangay may grant the clearance for the use of a barangay street provided that:

- A. The event does not obstruct traffic flow or emergency passage;
- B. There is prior information with affected neighbors or residents;
- C. Security and safety assistance are in place such as BPSO assistance, barricades, etc.);
- D. The event is limited to reasonable hours (not beyond 10:00 PM unless approved otherwise)

Section 4. PROHIBITED ACTS. It shall be unlawful for any person or group to:

- A. Use barangay streets for any activity without a permit;
- B. Block access to emergency vehicles or nearby residences;
- C. Leave garbage and debris or any damage after the event; \
- D. Cause excessive noise or disturbance beyond 10:00 PM

Section 5. PENALTIES. Violations of this Ordinance shall be subject to the following:

Offense Penalty

- First Offense** : Verbal Warning and Immediate Cessation of Activity/Event
- Second Offense** : P500 fine or 8 hours of community service.
- Third Offense** : P1,000.00 fine or 16 hours of community service and disqualification from the Future Street for 6 months

Section 6. ENFORCEMENT. The Sangguniang Barangay, in coordination with the Barangay Public Safety Officers (BPSO) shall ensure the proper enforcement of this Ordinance.

Section 7. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. If any part or provision of this Ordinance is declared invalid or unconstitutional, the other parts shall remain in effect. Section

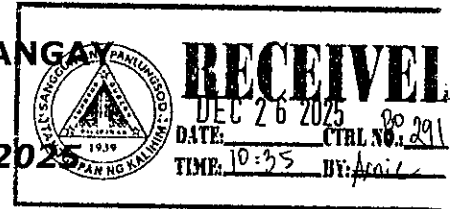

AN ORDINANCE STRICTLY IMPLEMENTING SEC. 30 OF RA 7279 or OTHERWISE KNOWN AS URBAN DEVELOPMENT AND HOUSING ACT OF 1992 TO DETER THE PROLIFERATION OF SQUATTING/ILLEGAL SQUATTING AND CONSTRUCTION OF ANY KIND OF DWELLING UNITS OR STRUCTURE WITHIN THE AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY OF BARANGAY NOVALICHES PROPER, DISTRICT V, QUEZON CITY, NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION, METRO MANILA PROVIDING PENALTIES THEREOF.

WHEREAS, there's a need to strictly implement Sec. 30 of RA 7279 (Prohibition Against New Illegal Structures) to deter the proliferation of squatting/illegal squatter and construction of any kind of dwelling especially in danger areas such as esteros, riverbanks, waterways, and public places such as sidewalks, roads, parks and playgrounds,

WHEREAS, the proliferation of these illegal structures made overnight by Informal Settlers worsens the situation of flooding especially in low lying areas due to climate change and man-made factors such as reclamation of riverbanks, illegally constructed structures on top of the waterways and indiscriminate throwing of garbage and other solid waste materials that causes clogging endangering their lives. Rescuers and other people affected by flooding,

WHEREAS, the ever-worsening floods not only in our barangay and other adjacent barangays are at a great extent caused by unabated illegal encroachments on rivers, creeks, esteros, and other drainage channels,

WHEREAS, the Local Government Code of the Philippines or the RA 7160 reiterated by the DILG memorandum Circular NO. 2011-17 and Memorandum measures to prevent and control the proliferation of squatters and mendicants in the Barangay;

WHEREAS, illegal occupancy of a private and public/gov'n't. Lot is a gross violation of the tenet of land ownership, privacy and development,

WHEREAS, the rampant proliferation of informal settlers has been a nagging perennial problem that besets particularly urban governments in spite

of gov'n't efforts, informal settlements thrive and by necessary implication are the unsightly manifestations of Urban decay and intergenerational neglect.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Executive Order No. 129 issued by the Quezon City Mayor, Honorable Ismael A. Mathay Jr. dated November 17, 1993 all shanties and structures built on private lots without the consent of the owner public domain and in hazard areas undergoing construction on after March 28, 1992 summarily demolish in accordance with Sec. 28 of RA. No. 7279 or the Urban Development and Housing Act of 1992 (UDHA).

WHEREAS, Section 391-18 of the RA. No. 7160 or the Local Government Code of 1991 the Sangguniang Barangay as the Legislative body of the barangay shall adopt measures to prevent and control the proliferation of squatters and mendicants in the barangay.

WHEREAS, Sec. 4-2 of Quezon City Ordinance No. SP. 2491-S-2016 prohibits to construct residential extension or annexes (vertical or horizontal) to an already built houses, shanties or residential units for the purpose of selling/leasing and;

Sec. 4-3 to construct new structures or building or subdivide vacant lands within the same barangay without the authority of the landowner or appropriate permit from the government.

NOWTHEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE SANGGUNIANG BARANGAY OF NOVALICHES PROPER IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED.

SECTION I - This Ordinance shall be known as the "Anti-Illegal Squatting Act of Barangay Novaliches Proper

SECTION II – Definition of Terms: For purposes of this Ordinance the following terms shall be defined as follows.

- A. **Areas of Priority Development** – refers to areas declared as such as under statutes and pertinent executive issuances.
- B. **Blighted lands** – refer to the areas where the structures are dilapidated obsolete and unsanitary tending to depreciate the value of the land and prevent normal development and use of the area.
- C. **Consultation** – refers to the constitutionally mandated process whereby the public on their own or through people's organizations is provided an opportunity to be heard and participate in the decision-making process on matters involving the protection and promotion of its legitimate collective interests which shall include appropriate documentation and feedback mechanisms.
- D. **Land Use Plan** – refers to rational approach of allocating available land resources as equitability as possible among competing user groups and for different functions consistent with the development plan of the areas and the program under RA 7279.
- E. **On Site Development** – refers to the process of upgrading and rehabilitation of blighted and urban areas with a view of minimizing displacement of dwellers in said areas and with provisions for basic

services as provided for in Section 21 (Basic Services-Socialized Housing or Resettlement areas shall be provided by the local gov'n't units or the National Housing Authority (NHA) in cooperation with the private developers and concerned agencies with the following basic services facilities. Ex. Potable water, electricity, access to primary roads, sewerage facilities) of RA 7279.

- F. **Professional Squatters** – individual groups who occupy lands w/o the express consent of the land owners and who have sufficient income for legitimate income for legitimate housing. Also refers to persons who apply and have been previously awarded house lots or housing units by the government who sold, leased or transferred the same to settle illegally in the same place or in another urban area and non-Bonafide occupants and introducers of land reserved for socialized housing. The term shall not apply to individuals or groups who simply rent land and housing from professional squatters or squatting syndicates.
- G. **Security of Tenure** – refers to the degree of protection afforded to qualified program beneficiaries against infringement or unjust unreasonable and arbitrary eviction or disposition by virtue of the right ownership lease agreement, usufruct and other contractual arrangements.
- H. **Small Property Owners** – refers to those whose only real property consists of residential lands not exceeding three hundred square meters (300 sq. m.) in highly urbanized cities and eight hundred square meters (800 sq. m.) in other urban areas.
- I. **Socialized Housing** – refers to housing programs and projects covering houses and lots or home lots only undertaken by the Government or the private sector for the under privileged and homeless citizens which shall include sites and services development, long term financing, liberalized terms on interest payments, and such other benefits in accordance with the provisions of RA 7279.
- J. **Under Privileged and Homeless Citizens** – refers to the beneficiaries of RA 7279 and to individuals or families residing in urban and urbanized areas whose income or combined household income falls within the poverty threshold as defined by the National Economic Development Authority and who do not own housing facilities. This shall include those who live in makeshift dwelling units and do not enjoy Security of tenure.
- K. **Squatting Syndicates** – refers to group of persons engaged in the business of squatter housing for profit or gain.
- L. **Urban Areas** – refers to all cities regardless of their population density and to municipalities with a population density of at least five hundred pesos (₱500) persons per square kilometer.
- M. **Affordable Cost** – refers to the most reasonable price of land and shelter based on needs and financial capability of program beneficiaries and appropriate financing schemes.
- N. **Violators of RA 7279** – Squatters who built houses after its effectivity on 28 March 1992
- O. **Cleared Area** – refers to danger areas originally occupied by ISFs which have been cleared of ISFs partially or in full.

- P. **Danger Area** – refers to riverbanks, shorelines, creeks, waterways, esteros, railroad tracks, garbage dumps, landfills, Public Cemeteries, and which when occupied for residential purposes actually pose danger for the life, safety and property of either the concerned residents on the general community. The danger is due to an unavoidable source of probable harm to human life on wellbeing.
- Q. **Informal Settlements** – refers to dwelling units found on no building zones.
- R. **No Build Zones** – refers to easement areas defined under existing laws and policies and areas that are not recommended for human habitation by virtue of the danger that it poses to human life and/or property.
- S. **Police Assistance** – refers to peacekeeping and law enforcement support of the Philippine National Police during the conduct of demolition and or eviction.

SECTION III – Monitoring and Reporting – All Elected/Interim officers, members and non-members of ISF's are hereby mandated to monitor and report to the Punong Barangay or to the Committee Chair of the Barangay Urban Poor Housing and Community Development for ISF (BUPHCD) any act of squatting, professional squatting within their jurisdiction or any Area of Responsibility of this Barangay.

SECTION IV – Implementing Office – The Punong Barangay or the Chairman of the BUPHCD for ISF shall direct the BPSO with the assistance of the Police Officers to implement the demolition of the ongoing construction of shanties and structures within the area of responsibility of this Barangay.

SECTION V – It shall be unlawful for any person or group of persons to illegally occupy private lots without the consent of the owner, public domain such as esteros, roads, parks, playgrounds and hazard areas such as esteros, drainage channels, waterways, public cemeteries, riverbanks to construct shanties or any structures in any ISF Cluster areas or in any Privately owned lots within the area of responsibility of Barangay Novaliches Proper, District V, Quezon City.

SECTION VI – PENALTY – Any person or persons found violating the provision of this Ordinance shall be meted by:

- 1) A fine of ₱1,000 shall be imposed to any person found violating any provisions of this Ordinance.
- 2) Confiscation of Materials intended for illegal ongoing construction of shanties or structures.
- 3) Be disqualified to avail the city socialized housing project of the Quezon City Government.

If the offender is a corporation or association the penalty of one thousand pesos (₱1,000) shall be imposed to the President, Director, Manager or any managing Partners thereof, and in the case of Partnership, Sole Proprietorship and Corporation additional sanctions shall be imposed by recommending to the Business Permit and Licensing Department (BPLD) for the closure of their business.


SECTION VII – Separability Clause – In the event that any provision of this Ordinance is declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid, all other provisions thereof not affected shall continue to be in force and effect.

SECTION VIII – Repealing Clause – All Ordinances, Resolutions, Executive Orders, Memorandum Circulars, and Administrative Orders and other issuances or parts thereof which are inconsistent with any provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.



BARANGAY ORDINANCE NO. 012, SERIES OF 2025

AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING ALL NEW AND EXISTING COMPUTER SHOP OWNERS AND OPERATORS IN BARANGAY SAUYO, DISTRICT 6, QUEZON CITY, TO UNDERGO A MANDATORY ORIENTATION SEMINAR ON PREVALENT LAWS GOVERNING COMPUTER SHOPS, THE ANTI-ONLINE SEXUAL ABUSE AND EXPLOITATION OF CHILDREN (OSAEC) LAW, CHILD LABOR LAW, AND OTHER CHILD PROTECTION LAWS, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR NON-COMPLIANCE.

WHEREAS, Section 16 of the Republic Act No. 7160 expressly states that "Every local government unit shall exercise the powers expressly granted, those necessarily implied therefrom, as well as powers necessary, appropriate, or incidental for its efficient and effective governance, and those which are essential to the promotion of the general welfare.

WHEREAS, Section 391 Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, states that the Sangguniang Barangay, as a legislative body of the barangay, shall enact ordinances as may be necessary to discharge the responsibilities conferred on it by law or ordinance and to promote the general welfare of the inhabitants of the barangay.

WHEREAS, the Barangay Council of Barangay Sauyo recognizes the significant role of computer shops in the community as hubs for internet access, education, and recreation; as well as potential venues where violations against children, such as online sexual abuse and exploitation (OSAEC) and child labor, may occur;

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 11930 (The Anti-OSAEC and Anti-Child Sexual Abuse or Exploitation Materials Act) mandates the protection of children from all forms of online abuse and exploitation;

WHEREAS, the Barangay Council for the Protection of Children (BCPC) is mandated to ensure the safety and welfare of children, which includes regulating sensitive business establishments;

WHEREAS, it is imperative to ensure that computer shop owners are fully informed and compliant with the laws and regulations that govern their operations to protect the welfare and safety of minors and other vulnerable members of the community;

WHEREAS, there is a growing concern regarding the potential risks and illegal activities that can occur within these establishments, including but not limited to online sexual abuse and exploitation of children, child labor, and other forms of child endangerment;

WHEREAS, it is imperative to ensure that computer shop owners are fully informed and compliant with the laws and regulations that govern their operations to protect the welfare and safety of minors and other vulnerable members of the community;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Sangguniang Barangay of Barangay Sauyo, District 6, Quezon City, in regular session assembled, upon motion of Kagawad Karina Joyce D. Quilo-Diaz, duly seconded by Kagawad Dendo M. Alvarez, to wit:

SECTION 1. Title.

This Ordinance shall be known as the "Barangay Sauyo Computer Shop Owners' Mandatory Legal Orientation Ordinance of 2025."

SECTION 2. Declaration of Policy.

It is the declared policy of Barangay Sauyo to promote responsible business conduct, protect children from online and physical exploitation, and ensure that all commercial establishments are fully aware of and compliant with all relevant laws about child welfare and business operations.

SECTION 3. Objectives. The objectives of this Ordinance are to:

1. Ensure that all computer shop owners and operators are knowledgeable of laws governing their operations, particularly those related to child protection.
2. Prevent the occurrence of online sexual abuse and exploitation of children (OSAEC), child labor, and other child endangerment activities within computer shops;
3. Strengthen the role of the Barangay Council for the Protection of Children (BCPC) in regulating and monitoring computer shops;
4. Promote a safe, child-friendly environment in all computer shops operating in Barangay Sauyo.
5. Include this compliance in the checklist for the application to renew the Business Permit.

SECTION 4. Coverage/Mandatory Orientation Seminar. All computer shop owners, new and old, operating within the territorial jurisdiction of Barangay Sauyo, Quezon City, shall be required to attend the orientation seminar before a barangay clearance is issued.

The seminar shall cover, but not be limited to:

- Republic Act No. 11930 (Anti-OSAEC Law)

- Child Labor Law (Republic Act No. 9231 and related provisions)
- Other relevant child protection laws and barangay ordinances
- Rules and regulations governing computer shop operations

SECTION 5. Implementing Mechanisms.

- The BCPC, in coordination with the Barangay Business Permits and Licensing Office, shall design and conduct the orientation seminar.
- Attendance shall be duly recorded, and certificates of completion shall be issued to participants.
- No barangay clearance or renewal shall be granted without proof of compliance with the orientation requirement.
- The Punong Barangay, together with the Barangay Peace and Order Committee (BPOC), must ensure the full implementation of this ordinance.

SECTION 6. Monitoring and Compliance.

- The BCPC shall maintain a registry of computer shop owners and operators who have completed the orientation.
- The Punong Barangay and/or his authorized representative shall conduct periodic inspections of computer shops to ensure compliance with child protection laws and barangay regulations.
- The Punong Barangay or the BPOC shall submit Reports of violations to the Sangguniang Barangay for appropriate action.

SECTION 7. Penalties. FINE shall be imposed upon the owner of the computer shop for failure to attend the mandatory orientation seminar in the following manner:

- **First Offense** – P1,000.00 and denial and/or revocation of barangay clearance;
- **Second Offense** – P1,000.00 and recommendation for closure of business to the Quezon City Business Permits and Licensing Department;

SECTION 8. Separability Clause. - If any provision or part hereof is held invalid or unconstitutional, the remainder of the law or the provision not otherwise affected shall remain valid and subsisting.

SECTION 9. Repealing Clause. - Any barangay ordinance, executive order, administrative order, and rules and regulations, contrary to or inconsistent with the Ordinance's provisions are hereby repealed, modified, or amended accordingly.

SECTION 10. Effectivity Clause. - This Ordinance shall take effect immediately after the approval/confirmation of the Quezon City Council.

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



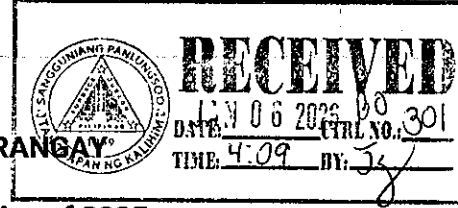

AN EXECUTIVE ORDER MANDATING ALL BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENTS OPERATING WITHIN THE JURISDICTION OF BARANGAY SOUTH TRIANGLE, QUEZON CITY, TO ENSURE THEIR EMPLOYEES UNDERGO AUTHORIZED DRUG TESTING AND TO SUBMIT A CERTIFICATE OF A DRUG-FREE WORKPLACE AS A PREREQUISITE FOR THE ISSUANCE OR RENEWAL OF THEIR BARANGAY BUSINESS CLEARANCE

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 9165, the "Comprehensive Dangerous Drugs Act of 2002", is the primary Philippine law that authorizes and mandates drug testing for various sectors, including the workplace, schools, and specific license applicants with the goal of promoting a drug-free environment and deter drug use;

WHEREAS, it is the policy of the Barangay Government of South Triangle, Quezon City, to promote a drug-free community, ensure public health and safety, and protect the youth from the evils of drug abuse;

WHEREAS, this Executive Order applies to all business establishments, commercial entities, and non-government organizations (NGOs) operating within the territorial jurisdiction of the barangay;

WHEREAS, businesses should formulate and implement a "Drug-Free Workplace Policy" within their internal rules and regulations;

WHEREAS, the business establishment must submit a "Certificate of a Drug-Free Workplace" issued by the appropriate authority (e.g., City Anti-Drug Abuse Council) along with a list of employees who underwent testing, as a mandatory requirement prior to the annual renewal or initial issuance of their Barangay Business Clearance and subsequent business permits;

WHEREAS, testing must be conducted by a drug testing laboratory accredited by the Department of Health (DOH).

NOW THEREFORE, by virtue of the powers vested in me by law, I, **BEVERLY GRACE C. 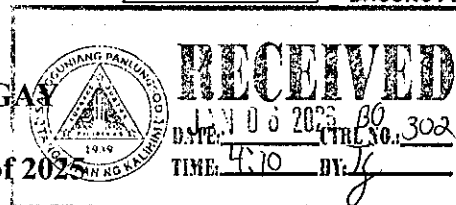

- f. Provide guidance and support to other barangay officials and personnel in using the system.

SECTION 3. EFFECTIVITY. This Executive Order shall take effect immediately upon signing.

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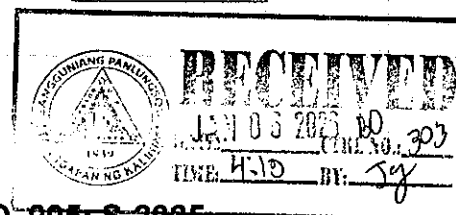

BARANGAY ORDINANCE NO. 005, S-2025

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING A BIRTHDAY INCENTIVE OF FIVE (5) KILOGRAMS OF RICE TO ALL QUALIFIED SENIOR CITIZENS, PERSONS-WITH-DISABILITY (PWDs), AND SOLO PARENTS/RESIDENTS OF BARANGAY SOUTH TRIANGLE, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR.

Introduced by: Kagawad RAFFY T. TURINGAN

WHEREAS, the Constitution of the Republic of the Philippines provides for the care and assistance to the elderly;

WHEREAS, the Local Government Code of 1991 (RA 7160) empowers local government units to enact ordinances, approve resolutions, and appropriate funds for the general welfare of their constituents;

WHEREAS, it is a declared policy of Barangay South Triangle to honor and recognize the invaluable contributions of its senior citizens and provide them with additional support to augment their daily subsistence and needs;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Sangguniang Barangay, Barangay South Triangle, Quezon City, that:

SECTION 1. TITLE. This Ordinance shall be known as the **Barangay South Triangle Senior Citizens, PWDs, and Solo Parents Birthday Rice Incentive Ordinance of 2025**”.

SECTION 2. DECLARATION OF POLICY. It is the policy of Barangay South Triangle to promote a just and dynamic social order that values the dignity of every human person, particularly its senior citizens, PWDs, and solo parents and guarantees full respect for their rights by providing programs and activities that will enhance their quality of life.

SECTION 3. COVERAGE. This Ordinance shall cover all senior citizens, PWDs, and solo parents who are *bonafide* residents of Barangay South Triangle, registered with the Office of Senior Citizens Affairs (OSCA), Persons-With-Disability Office (PDAO), and Solo Parents (SSDD), and holders of a valid Identification Card issued by said offices.

SECTION 4. THE INCENTIVE. All qualified senior citizens, PWDs, and solo parents as defined in the preceding section shall be granted a yearly birthday incentive consisting of **Five (5) Kilograms of Rice**. *This incentive shall be given to each senior citizen, PWD, and solo parent during the month of their birth.*

SECTION 5. MECHANISM AND PROCEDURE FOR DISTRIBUTION.

- a. The Punong Barangay and the Barangay Kagawad Chairperson on Senior Citizens Affairs, shall be the lead implementors of this Ordinance;
- b. The Kagawad/Chairperson and Barangay Treasurer shall maintain and validate a database of all registered senior citizens and identify qualified beneficiaries;
- c. A systematic, orderly schedule and process for the distribution of the rice incentive, which may be done at the barangay, or through a delivery system, shall be followed, ensuring proper documentation (e.g., proof of identification and receipt);

SECTION 6. APPROPRIATIONS. The necessary funds for the implementation of this Ordinance shall be sourced from Barangay South Triangle's annual budget and shall be included in the annual budget of the Barangay Committee on Senior Citizens Affairs. The amount shall be subject to the annual appropriation ordinance of Barangay South Triangle.

SECTION 7. PENALTY CLAUSE. Any person who shall in any manner misrepresent, commit fraud, or exploit the benefits provided under this Ordinance shall be penalized according to existing laws and ordinances.

SECTION 8. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. If any provision of this Ordinance is declared unconstitutional or invalid, the other sections or provisions not affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.

SECTION 9. REPEALING CLAUSE. All ordinances, resolutions, and executive orders or parts thereof, which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance, are hereby repealed, modified, or amended accordingly.

SECTION 10. EFFECTIVITY. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its approval and confirmation by the Quezon City Council.

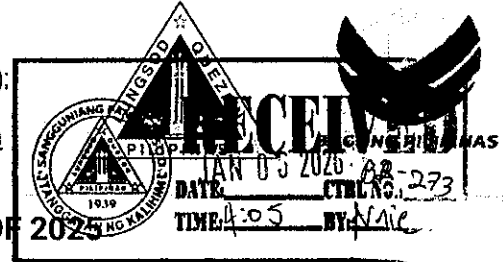

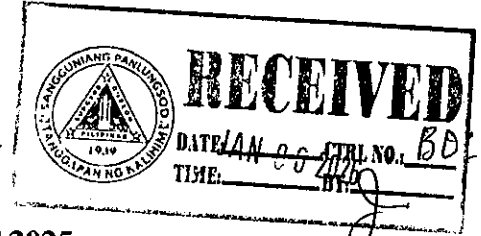

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 07, SERIES OF 2025

GUIDELINES IN REDUCING PLASTIC WASTES IN THE BARANGAY TALAYAN OFFICES THROUGH THE BAN OF THE SINGLE-USE PLASTICS WITHIN THE OFFICES AND OTHER FACILITIES OF THE BARANGAY TALAYAN.

WHEREAS, the Barangay Talayan Council needs to set an example to the residents for the implementation of the anti-plastic Quezon City Ordinances such as the Plastic Bag Ban (SP 2868, S-2019), Single-Use Plastic/Disposable Materials Ban Ordinance (SP-2876, S-2019).

WHEREAS, there is a need to implement the ban on the use of plastic within the Offices and other facilities of Barangay Talayan.

NOW THEREFOR, by virtue of the power vested in me by law, I JERRY L. ONGTAUCO Punong Barangay of Barangay Talayan, District 1, Quezon City, do hereby orders the following measures:

SECTION 1. Definition. The following terms shall apply as defined under the existing regulations:

- 1.1. Plastic bags - refers to plastic carryout bags with handles, holes or string made of plastic film or plastic materials.
- 1.2. Single-use plastics/paper/disposables - refers to disposable materials, such as, but not limited to, PET bottles, plastic spoon and fork, knives, plastic/paper/styro cups, plastic/paper/sytro plates, plastic/paper straws, coffee stirrers, soap sachets, shampoo sachets, condiment cups with lids, ketchup/soy sauce packets, and other similar plastic and disposable materials.

SECTION 2. Prohibiting the use of plastic bags and styro in all Barangay Offices and facilities.

SECTION 3. The use of unnecessary plastic (i.e. plastic bags as carry out bags, single-use/disposable food containers, plastic packaging) in the workplace, during scheduled meetings and events, is prohibited.

SECTION 4. REPEALING CLAUSE. All executive orders, circulars, memoranda, and other issuances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

SECTION 5. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. The provisions of this Executive Order are hereby declared separable and in the event that any such provisions are declared unconstitutional, the other provisions which are not affected thereby shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 6. This Executive Order shall take effect immediately upon its signing.

Executive Order No. 017 Series of 2025

AN ORDER ESTABLISHING AND ORGANIZING THE BARANGAY ROAD CLEARING TASK FORCE (BRCTF) OF BARANGAY BAGUMBUHAY, DISTRICT III, QUEZON CITY, DEFINING ITS COMPOSITION AND FUNCTIONS

WHEREAS, the President of the Philippines has directed all local government units (LGUs) to reclaim public roads and sidewalks used for private ends, and to rid them of illegal structures and constructions to ensure public safety and accessibility;

WHEREAS, the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) has issued various Memorandum Circulars, including MC No. 2019-121, MC No. 2020-145, MC No. 2022-085, and MC No. 2023-017, obliging all LGUs, from the provincial down to the barangay level, to implement comprehensive road clearing operations;

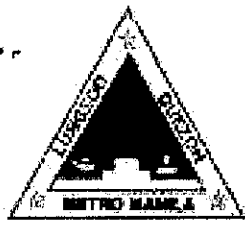
WHEREAS, there is a need to create a dedicated Barangay Road Clearing Task Force (BRCTF) to effectively and efficiently implement the road clearing and sidewalk recovery program within the jurisdiction of Barangay Bagumbuhay;

NOW THEREFORE, I, **Celestino N. Martinez, Jr.**, Punong Barangay of Bagumbuhay, by virtue of the power vested in me by law, do hereby order the following:

Section 1. Creation of the Barangay Road Clearing Task Force (BRCTF). The Barangay Road Clearing Task Force (BRCTF) of Barangay Bagumbuhay, District III, Quezon City is hereby created.

Section 2. Composition. The BRCTF shall be composed of the following members;

- d. Notify the owners who caused such obstructions the abatement to be made in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance; and
- e. Coordinate with the Quezon City District 3 Action Office or any appropriate government agency those obstructions that cannot be removed by the Barangay.

Section 4. Separability Clause – Should any provision of this Executive Order or any part thereof be declared invalid, the other provisions, insofar as they are separable from the invalid ones, shall remain in full force or effect.



BARANGAY ORDINANCE NO.05-S-2025

A BARANGAY ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE BARANGAY DISASTER RISK REDUCTION AND MANAGEMENT COUNCIL (BDRRMC) OF BAGUMBUHAY, DISTRICT III, QUEZON CITY, TO IMPLEMENT A "PRE-EMPTIVE OR FORCED EVACUATION" IN AREAS DECLARED TO BE IN IMMINENT DANGER OF LOSS OF LIVES IN TIMES OF DISASTER AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

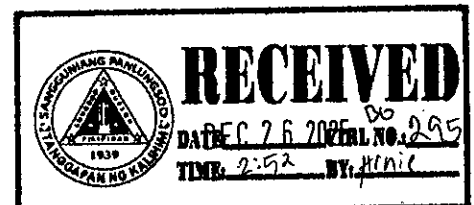

WHEREAS, WHEREAS, under section 2(a), Republic Act 10121, otherwise known as "AN ACT STRENGTHENING THE PHILIPPINE DISASTER RISK REDUCTION AND MANAGEMENT SYSTEM, PROVIDING FOR THE NATIONAL DISASTER RISK REDUCTION MANAGEMNET PLAN, APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES", it is the policy of the state to uphold the people's constitutional rights to life and property by addressing the root cause of vulnerabilities to disasters, strengthening the country's institutional capacity for disaster risk reduction and management and building the resilience of local communities to disasters including climate change impacts;

WHEREAS, under Section (3) Rule 5, Implementing Rules and Regulation, Republic Act 10121, LDRRMMCs, are mandated to recommend the implementation of forced or preemptive evacuation of local residents, if necessary;

WHEREAS, Punong Barangays [Section 389 (b) (6)] and city Mayors [Section 455 (b) vii] are mandated under the Local Government Code of 1991 "to carry such emergency measures as may be necessary during and in the after-math of man-made and natural disasters and calamities";

WHEREAS, the LGUs through the Sangguniang Panlungsod are enjoined under DILG Memorandum Circular No. 2012-35 dated 21 February 2012, to cause the enactment of local ordinances for the implementation of forced evacuation when a disaster or emergency has been declared and danger of loss of lives in imminent within their areas of jurisdiction;

WHEREAS, it has been observed that there are residents in the flood prone areas in Barangay Bagumbuhay that opt to remain in their residence during flooding, inclement weather and in an obviously imminent danger just to safeguard their properties of for other reasons despite clear and timely warnings;

WHEREAS, in order to prevent loss of lives, ensure public safety and mitigate the adverse effects of human-induced and natural disasters and calamities, the Barangay Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (BDRRMC) headed by the Punong Barangay, may enforce emergency measures such as forced evacuations;

WHEREAS, the uncertainty of the nature of disasters might disable emergency response personnel to reach residents who refuse to evacuate should disaster situations escalate;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, BY THE SANGGUNIANG BARANGAY OF BARANGAY BAGUMBUHAY, DISTRICT 3, QUEZON CITY, IN SESSION DULY ASSEMBLED, THAT:

Section 1. Title - The ordinance shall be known as the "Bagumbuhay Forced Evacuation Ordinance".

Section 2. Policy Statement - to protect the lives of the residents of Barangay Bagumbuhay at all times and whenever possible, mitigates the effects of natural and human-made disasters.

Section 3. Definition of terms - as a general rule, words and phrases embodied in this ordinance not herein specifically defined shall have the same meaning as found in legal dictionaries as well as in existing laws. Provided that, the following terms as used in this ordinance shall be construed to mean:

BDRRMC - the Barangay Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council;

Disaster - means the result of a natural or human-made event which causes loss of life, injury, and property damage, including but not limited to natural disasters such as hurricane, tornado, storm, flood, high winds, and other weather related events, and humanmade disasters, including but not limited to nuclear power plant incidents, hazardous materials incidents, oil spill, civil disturbances, public calamity, acts of terrorism, hostile military action, and other events related thereto;



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Evacuation – means an operation whereby all or part of a particular population is temporarily relocated, whether individually or in an organized manner, from an area in which a disaster or emergency has been declared and is considered dangerous for health or safety of the public;

Forced evacuation – means an evacuation ordered as a last resort when a disaster or emergency has been declared and danger of loss of life is imminent, and conditions exist that critically imperil or endanger the lives of those in a defined area;

Imminent danger – means an imminent threat of harm to human lives and destruction of property; an unforeseen/ impending event that may cause a greater risk to human lives and property

PAGASA – Philippine Atmospheric Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration

QCDRRMO – the QUEZON CITY DISASTER RISK REDUCTION AND MANAGEMENT OFFICE

Section 4. Training and Orientation on Disaster Risk Reduction and Management.

The Barangay Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (BDRRMC) shall organize and conduct training and orientation on the possible natural hazards, vulnerabilities and climate change risks as well as knowledge management activities on disaster risks reduction and management within the barangay at least once a year.

The foregoing trainings, orientations, activities and information dissemination shall be intensified and made every 2nd quarter of the year.

During the aforesaid trainings and orientations, the BDRRMC shall also discuss and highlight in language known to them RA 10121 otherwise known as the Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Act of 2010; DILG MC No. 2012-35 dated 21 February 2012, regarding the Guidelines in Ensuring Public Safety During Man-Made and Natural Disaster; this Ordinance; and other laws, rules and regulations on disaster risk reduction and management.



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The BDRRMC shall conceptualize posters, newsletters, brochures and pamphlets regarding disaster risk reduction and management and cause the same to be posted at the conspicuous places within the territorial jurisdiction of the barangay and through different social media platforms of the barangay.

A budget necessary for the training and orientation as well as knowledge management activities on disaster risk reduction and management shall be included in the annual Appropriation Ordinance of Barangay Bagumbuhay under Barangay Disaster Fund.

Section 5. Funding. The funds for the establishment and continuous implementation of this Ordinance shall be included in the Annual Budget and in succeeding appropriations of Barangay Bagumbuhay subject to availability of funds.

Section 6. Procedures in the declaration and enforcement of forced evacuation.

Upon assessment or determination of the BDRRMC the conditions that critically imperil or endanger the lives of those in a defined area exist, the BDRRMC headed by the Punong Barangay shall immediately declare and subsequently cause the implementation of Forced Evacuation.

6.1. Procedures for the enforcement of Forced Evacuation shall include, but not limited to the following, to wit;

6.1.1. An Early Warning (EW) shall be issued to the residents by the BDRRMC. The QCDRRMO shall provide the necessary warning to the constituents. A specific period of time shall be announced as the time for pre-emptive evacuation.

6.1.2. The designated evacuation center of the barangay will be the temporary shelter for the affected individuals or families;

6.1.3. Pick-up points shall be designated for vehicles or rescue boats to be used in the transportation of evacuees, if needed;

6.1.4. Ensure the safety and security of the evacuees in the evacuation areas;

6.1.5. The BDRRMC shall assign law enforcement personnel to secure the properties of the evacuees from looting, theft, robbery, etc, in any possible means;

6.1.6. Evacuated local residents shall stay in the evacuation centers until the issuance of an order from the BDRRMC headed by the Punong Barangay declaring that the imminent danger within the affected area/s have cease to exist; and

6.1.7. The Eco personnel of Bagumbuhay shall take custody of and transport affected animals to the barangay's facility for animals located at the Eco Center for temporary shelter or until such time that their affected owners will be returning to their respective homes.

Section 7. Assistance from other government agencies.

In the implementation/enforcement of forced evacuation, the BDRRMC may ask for assistance from other government agencies such as PNP, BFP or Philippine Army reservists.

All emergency measures adopted shall be a coordinative and collaborative effort between the BDRRMC, BFP units and AFP units.

Section 8. Refusal of local residents to abide to abide by the declaration of forced evacuation or after evacuating, go back to their respective homes without an order allowing them to do so.

In the event that local residents refuse to leave their homes, or after evacuating, go back to their homes/ affected areas without an order issued to this effect by the BDRRMC, the members of the mobilized units of the PNP and AFP may use such physical force that is commensurate under the circumstances, without discrimination and with conscious attention to the need of vulnerable sectors such as children, women, elderly, and persons with disabilities, to safely secure lives.

Any person who willfully and deliberately disregard or oppose the order of forced of pre-emptive evacuation issued by the BDRRMC headed by the Punong Barangay, the Sangguniang Barangay of Bagumbuhay and the BDRRMC shall release them from any liability for the former's injury or death attributed to his disobedience.

During evacuation, priority shall be given to persons who willfully comply with the order of forced evacuation, If, for some reasons, residents who refused evacuation despite appropriate warnings were not forcefully evacuated, they shall no longer be entertained for their call for rescue should the disaster situation escalate. This is to ensure the safety the other evacuees, but to the emergency responders as well.

Section 9. Guidelines of Implementation.

The BDRRMC shall be required to inform all the residents of the barangay regarding this Ordinance and Early Warning Device and system with color-coded flood water level indicator and houses/addresses under "Annex A" of this ordinance, that are in flood prone areas and identified in imminent danger during heavy downpour of rain. Evacuees through the head of the family shall declare all the members of their family in the form provided by the barangay for recording purposes and shall submit themselves for headcount conducted by the barangay personnel to ensure that all evacuees are accounted while in the evacuation center.

Section 10. Amendments

These Rules and Regulations may be amended and/or modified from time to time by the BARANGAY DISASTER RISK REDUCTION AND MANAGEMENT COUNCIL (BDRRMC).

Section 11. Repealing Clause – all ordinances, resolutions, executive orders or parts thereof, which are inconsistent with any of the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

Section 12. Separability Clause – if for any reason or reasons, any provision of this ordinance be held unconstitutional or invalid, the other parts or provision hereof which are not affected shall continue to be in full force and effect.

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

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

BARANGAY ORDINANCE ALLOWING THE ISSUANCE OF DRUG-CLEARED OPERATOR AND DRIVER STICKER WITH CUSTOMIZED QUICK RESPONSE CODE (QR CODE) TO EACH UNIT OF HI-TOP TODA WHOSE OPERATORS AND DRIVERS HAVE UNDERGONE MANDATORY RANDOM DRUG TESTING AND WERE ISSUED A WORKING CLEARANCE IN COMPLIANCE WITH BARANGAY BAGUMBUHAY ORDINANCE NO. 05-S-2024

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 9165 (The Comprehensive Dangerous Drugs Act) and the Barangay Drug Clearing Program mandate that barangays participate in the national campaign against illegal drugs;

WHEREAS, Quezon City Ordinance SP-2575, S-2017 requires all tricycle drivers and operators to undergo mandatory drug testing;

WHEREAS, Barangay Bagumbuhay has enacted Ordinance No. 05-S-2024 to require all working individuals within its jurisdiction, including Tricycle Operators and Drivers Association (TODA) members, to secure a working clearance;

WHEREAS, to effectively enforce these policies and provide proper identification for compliant operators and drivers, there is a need to issue a standardized "Drug-Cleared" sticker;

WHEREAS, the issuance of such stickers will assure the riding public of their safety and contribute to the peace and order of the community;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, AS IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED, by the Sangguniang Barangay of Bagumbuhay:

SECTION 1. Title. This ordinance shall be known as the "Drug Cleared Operator and Driver Sticker" Ordinance of Barangay Bagumbuhay."

SECTION 2. Declaration of Policy. This ordinance is enacted based on the powers vested in the Sangguniang Barangay by the Local Government Code of 1991, as well as in accordance with all relevant national and city laws and regulations pertaining to the anti-illegal drug campaign.

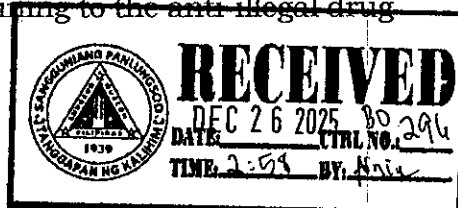

SECTION 3. Scope and Coverage. This ordinance applies to all operators and drivers of the HI-TOP TODA operating within the territorial jurisdiction of Barangay Bagumbuhay.

SECTION 4. Implementing Rules.

- **Sticker Issuance.** The The Barangay shall issue a "Drug-Cleared Operator and Driver Sticker" with customized Quick Response Code (QR Code) indicating the names of the operator and driver/s of each qualified HI-TOP TODA units.
- **Qualification.** An operator or driver qualifies for the sticker if they have:
 - Successfully passed a random drug test conducted or authorized by the Quezon City Anti-Drug Abuse Advisory Council (QCADAAC) or the Barangay Anti-Drug Abuse Council (BADAC).
 - Secured a valid working clearance as mandated by Barangay Ordinance No. 05-S-2024.
- **Validity.** The sticker will be valid for a specified period, after which operators and drivers must undergo re-evaluation and re-testing to renew their clearances and stickers.
- **Placement.** The sticker must be prominently displayed on the tricycle unit as specified by the barangay to ensure visibility and easy identification.

SECTION 5. Penalties and Sanctions.

- **Violations.** Operators and drivers found operating without a valid "Drug-Cleared" sticker shall be fined with the following;
 - 1st Offense : Fine of Php 500.00
 - 2nd Offense : Fine of Php 1,000.00
 - 3rd Offense : Non issuance of Barangay Clearance for tricycle registration to Tricycle Regulatory Division (TRD) and Tricycle Franchising Board (TFB)
- **Falsification.** Any person found forging or tampering with the stickers or clearances will be subject to appropriate legal action.

b. Roles and Responsibilities

- Prepare and maintain a confidential list of suspected users, pushers, financiers and/or protectors of illegal drug trade found in the LGU's area of jurisdiction to be submitted to the City/Municipal Anti-Drug Special Operations Task Force (AIDSOTF); and
- Establish rehabilitation/referral desks and process applications for rehabilitation of drug dependents.

Pre-Operations

- Identification of drug affected house clusters, work places, streets, puroks and sitios where manufacture, delivery, sale, or use of illegal drugs are being conducted and to report the same immediately to the PNP or the Philippine Drug Enforcement Agency (PDEA).

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- Conduct Administrative searches of suspected drug dens/laboratories.
- Conduct briefings, meetings prior to the launching of operations to ensure positive results and safety of the operating teams and the community.

During Operations

- Ensure safety of the community and regularity of the operations.
- Any elected barangay official present during the operations to witness the inventory of seized drugs/paraphernalia.
- Extend such other necessary assistance to the PDEA and PNP authorities in its operation against illegal drugs including but not limited to the prevention of evidence and protection of witness and suspects against unlawful acts.

Post Operations

- The elected barangay official present during the operations shall execute an affidavit and acts as witness in court hearings in the prosecution of drug cases.
- Submit reports of drug-clearing operations conducted, if any, to the City/Municipal Anti-Drug Abuse Council copy furnished the DILG City/Municipal Field Office.

For operations conducted/initiated by the PDEA/PNP, an elected barangay official should be involved immediately after the raid and be present to stand as witness during the conduct of inventory.

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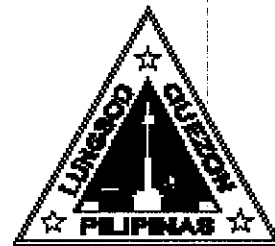

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING CIVIL SERVICE EXAMINATION FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE (CSEFA) TO BARANGAY EAST KAMIAS RESIDENTS

INTRODUCED BY:

KAGAWAD. CYREL M. FLORES

WHEREAS, Section 16 of the Local Government Code grants local government units the authority to enact measures that promote the general welfare of their constituents;

WHEREAS, Barangay East Kamias recognizes the importance of supporting its citizens in securing opportunities in government service by providing assistance for the Civil Service Examination (CSE);

WHEREAS, Financial constraints can hinder individuals from taking the Career Service Examination – Pen and Paper Test (CSE-PPT), limiting access to public service employment opportunities;

WHEREAS, the access to civil service career is a vital pathway to stable employment and the availability of financial aid for civil service exam ensures equal opportunity to public service.

SECTION 1. TITLE

This ordinance shall be known as the **“Civil Service Examination Assistance Program (CSEFA)”**.

SECTION 2. OBJECTIVE

To provide financial support to qualified residents of Barangay East Kamias who intended to take the Civil Service Examination, thereby promoting employment accessibility and career development within the government sector.

SECTION 3. FORMS OF ASSISTANCE

Barangay East Kamias shall provide the following:

- a) Examination Fee Coverage – PHP 500 per applicant
- b) Transportation Allowance – PHP 100 per applicant on examination day
- c) Allowance for Ball Pen – PHP 50 per applicant
- d) CSC Passport Size Photo Requirement Allowance – PHP 150 per applicant
- e) Food Allowance – PHP 200 per applicant

Total Financial Assistance per Applicant: PHP 1,000 253

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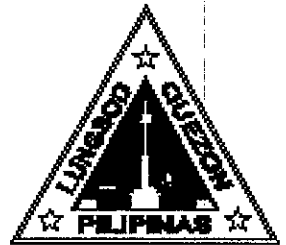

SECTION 4. QUALIFICATIONS

Residents of Barangay East Kamias may avail of the program if they meet the following criteria:

- a) *Must have resided in the barangay for at least six (6) months and can present proof of residency (Barangay ID, utility bills, and any government issued IDs).*
- b) *Must meet the Civil Service Commission's eligibility requirements for the examination*
- c) *Only one (1) member of the family per household shall be allowed to avail of the assistance per examination period to ensure distribution.*
- d) *Applicants availing assistance for the second time within the same year must present a photocopy of their previous CSC receipt together with a new online appointment or proof of application for the Civil Service Examination.*

SECTION 5. APPLICATION PROCESS

- a) *The Barangay shall allocate twenty-five (25) slots per examination period, with a maximum of fifty (50) slots per calendar year.*
- b) *Once the twenty-five (25) slots are filled for a given examination period, the application process shall automatically close.*
- c) *Applications must be submitted in person at the Barangay Office for verification.*
- d) *Applications shall be processed on a first-come, first-served basis.*

SECTION 6. DOCUMENTARY REQUIREMENTS

Applicants must submit the following documents upon application:

- a) *Proof of residency such as Barangay ID, utility bills, or any government-issued ID.*
- b) *Official booking confirmation or schedule of application from the Civil Service Commission.*
- c) *Photocopy of the official receipt or proof of payment for purposes of reimbursement if already paid.*
- d) *For second-time availment within the same year, photocopy of the previous CSC receipt and a new online appointment or proof of application for the Civil Service Examination.*

SECTION 7. DISQUALIFICATION

The following applicants shall not be eligible for assistance:

- a) *Residents who have already availed of financial assistance more than twice in the same calendar year.*
- b) *Applicants found to have provided false or misleading information in their application.*



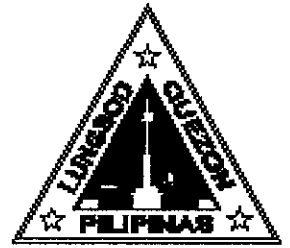

SECTION 10. SUSTAINABILITY PLAN

To ensure continuous implementation and accessibility of the Civil Service Examination Financial Assistance (CSEFA) Program, the Barangay East Kamias shall include the program in its proposed budget each year. The annual funding shall be maintained based on program demand and available resources.

SECTION 11. APPROPRIATION

Funds for the Civil Service Examination Financial Assistance (CSEFA) Program shall be allocated from the Barangay East Kamias annual budget. The funding for this program shall be in the amount of not less than Fifty Thousand Pesos (P50,000.00) annually, which shall be appropriated under the Barangay's Maintenance and Other Operating Expenses (MOOE) or any other available allocation within the Barangay Annual Budget.

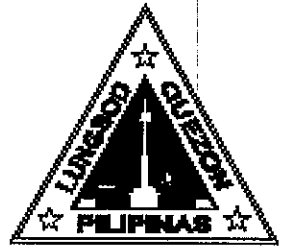

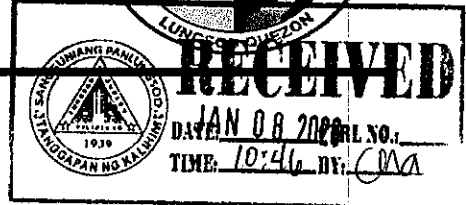

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 01
Series of 2026

AN EXECUTIVE ORDER MANDATING THE IMMEDIATE FORCED EVACUATION OF RESIDENTS IN 4 KATIPUNAN AVENUE, CLIFF DRIVE, HIGHLAND DRIVE OF BARANGAY BLUE RIDGE A DUE TO IMMINENT THREAT FIRE, WIND SHEAR AND LANDSLIDE.

WHEREAS, Section 16 of RA No. 7160 or the Local Government Code of 1991, mandates local government units to promote the health, safety, and general welfare of their inhabitants;

WHEREAS, RA No. 10121, the Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Act of 2010, emphasizes preparedness and immediate response to disasters;

WHEREAS, the Barangay Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Committee (BDRRMC) has determined the imminent danger to the lives of residents in 4 Katipunan, Cliff Drive, Highland Drive due to the threat of fire, wind shear and landslide;

WHEREAS, pre-emptive measures have proven insufficient, necessitating forced evacuation to prevent loss of life;

NOW, THEREFORE, I Gabriel C. Legaspi, Punong Barangay of Barangay Blue Ridge A, District III, Quezon City, by virtue of the powers vested in me by law do hereby order:

SECTION 1. MANDATORY FORCED EVACUATION:

All residents of 4 Katipunan, Cliff Drive and Highland Drive are hereby ordered to immediately evacuate to their designated safe areas/evacuation center.

SECTION 2. DESIGNATED EVACUATION AREA:

The Covered Basketball Court is designated as the primary evacuation center.

SECTION 3. ROLE OF BDRRMC AND BARANGAY OFFICIALS:

The BDRRMC and other Barangay Officials shall lead, facilitate, and ensure the orderly, safe, and peaceful relocation of residents.

A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING THE BARANGAY SYSTEM FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE DEAD, MISSING, AND INJURED (MDM) DURING DISASTERS AND EMERGENCIES

Author: Hon. Federick Vincent D. Marcelo, Hon. Ponciano R. Quizon, Jr.

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 10121, otherwise known as the *Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Act of 2010*, mandates local government units, including barangays, to establish disaster preparedness, response, and recovery mechanisms;

WHEREAS, the Barangay is the first responder during disasters, calamities, accidents, and other emergencies, and must ensure the proper management of the dead, missing, and injured to uphold public health, human dignity, and community safety;

WHEREAS, there is a need to institutionalize a clear system and procedures for the identification, documentation, reporting, referral, and coordination of cases involving the dead, missing, and injured during emergencies;

WHEREAS, effective coordination with the Municipal/City DRRMO, PNP, BFP, health offices, hospitals, and other concerned agencies is essential for efficient response operations;

NOW, THEREFORE, on motion of **Hon. Federick Vincent D. Marcelo**, duly seconded by **Hon. Ponciano R. Quizon, Jr.**

BE IT RESOLVED, AS IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, to establish and adopt a **Barangay Management of the Dead, Missing, and Injured (MDM) System**, with the following provisions:

SECTION 1. Creation of the Barangay MDM Team

A Barangay MDM Team is hereby created, composed of the following:

- Punong Barangay – Team Leader (**Hon. WILFREDO L. CARA**)
- Barangay Kagawad (Chair, Committee on Disaster Risk Reduction or Health) – Deputy Leaders (**Hon. Ponciano R. Quizon, Jr. and Hon. Federick Vincent D. Marcelo**)
- Barangay Secretary – Documentation and Records (**Ms. Beberly C. Galang**)
- Barangay Health Workers (BHWs) (Mr. Danilo Orines and Mr. Eduardo Ablazo)
- Barangay Public Order and Safety – Maj. Eduardo C. Cuaresma, Ret.
- Barangay Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Committee (BDRRMC) Members

SECTION 2. Functions and Responsibilities

The Barangay MDM Team shall:

- a. Conduct rapid assessment and reporting of casualties during disasters and emergencies;
- b. Ensure proper documentation, identification, and listing of the dead, missing, and injured;
- c. Coordinate with concerned agencies for medical assistance, retrieval, transport, and identification of victims;
- d. Assist families of affected individuals in accessing medical, legal, and psychosocial services;
- e. Ensure respectful and culturally appropriate handling of human remains;
- f. Maintain and submit updated MDM reports to the Quezon City DRRMO.

SECTION 3. Establishment of MDM Procedures

The Barangay shall adopt standard operating procedures (SOPs) covering:

- Search, rescue, and retrieval
- First aid and medical referral
- Temporary holding and identification of remains
- Reporting and validation of missing persons
- Coordination and information management

SECTION 4. Capacity Building

The Barangay shall ensure regular training, drills, and orientation for MDM Team members in coordination with concerned government and non-government agencies.

SECTION 5. Funding

Funds necessary for the implementation of this Resolution shall be charged against the Barangay Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Fund (BDRRMF), subject to applicable accounting and auditing rules.

SECTION 6. Effectivity

This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon approval.

MEMORANDUM ON APPEAL

Complainant-Appellee, Henry R. Giron, by himself, and unto this Honorable Office, most respectfully states:

PRELIMINARY STATEMENT

“WHEREFORE, respondents Arnaldo A. Cando, Christian A. Cando, Rafael G. Pongyan, Edgardo C. Dominguez and Casey Lann C. Creencia are hereby **REPRIMANDED**. They are further **WARNED** that repetition of the same or similar infraction will be dealt with severely. Let this Decision be entered in respondents’ 201 File (personal record) as public officers.”¹

The records² submitted by complainants clearly show that in 2006, one of the respondents in the case, then Kagawad now Punong Barangay Christian A. Cando was already **REPRIMANDED** and expressly **WARNED** by the Office of the Ombudsman that “repetition of the same or similar infraction will be dealt with severely.” And let this Decision be entered in respondents’ 201 File (personal record) as public officers. This prior administrative penalty is not an isolated fact but a material circumstance that must now be given full legal effect, consistent with established administrative jurisprudence.

In the case of Tobias vs. Veloso³ a warning, in ordinary parlance, has been defined as "an act or fact of putting one on his guard against an impending danger, evil consequences or penalties," while an admonition, "refers to a gentle or friendly reproof, a mild rebuke, warning or reminder, counselling, on a fault, error or oversight, an expression of authoritative advice or warning". They are not considered as penalties. A reprimand, on the other hand, is of a more severe nature, and has been defined as a public and formal censure or severe reproof, administered to a person in fault by his superior officer or a body to which he belongs. It is more than just a warning or an admonition.

A reprimand accompanied by a stern warning constitutes a final and executory administrative judgment. Jurisprudence is settled that any future misdeed of the same character transforms the prior warning into a legal basis for imposing heavier sanctions, including suspension, dismissal, or forfeiture of benefits, depending on the gravity of the repeated violation.

The conduct of the respondent Punong Barangay Christian Cando after 2006 demonstrates clear defiance of this warning. Instead of showing reform, respondent repeated the same or similar misconduct, thereby manifesting disrespect for the authority of the Ombudsman, disregard of the disciplinary system of the Civil Service, and contempt for the rule of law. Moreover, the principle of progressive discipline requires that an offender who repeats the same offense must not be treated as a first-time violator. Such behavior is incompatible with the high standards of public service required under Article

XI, Section 1 of the Constitution and Section 4 of the Code of Conduct and Ethical Standards for Public Officials and Employees (RA 6713).

The complaint submitted is not a criminal case but administratively. In criminal cases, the complainant normally has the burden of proof to establish the facts that would hold the respondent liable. This is based on the principle that he who alleges must prove. However, in the present case, the issue is not about a private dispute but about whether a government officer failed to: Whether there was an official and valid invitation for Barangay Assembly; Whether the Barangay issued Annual Financial Report during the said Assembly and Financial Report submitted to City Accountant; Whether the Barangay posted the summary of income and expenditures; Whether there was a citizens' charter handbook and whether it was published online; Whether the LGU created an archival system; Whether there was a barangay library or reading center; Whether *katarungang pambarangay* process has been obeyed; Whether drugs suspect photo can be posted in the Barangay's Facebook. These are documentary duties mandated by law, not factual controversies requiring testimonial proof.

Because the duties are ministerial and mandatory, the burden should shift to the public officer to prove compliance. This is consistent with: Presumption of regularity in public functions—but once challenged, the officer must show the record of compliance particularly when the matter alleged pertains to acts or omissions of public officials which are ministerial in character and whose performance is documented by official records that are within the custody and control of said officials. Thus, the complainants need only allege non-performance, the public officer must then produce the official record showing compliance. If none exists, the omission speaks for itself.

However, despite the extensive and overwhelming evidence submitted by the complainants, the Quezon City Council still proceeded, during its regular session on October 20, 2025, to confirm the recommendation of the Special Investigation Committee on Administrative Cases Against Elective Barangay Officials, which dismissed the complaint and subsequently denied the Motion for Reconsideration — even though five (5) out of the six (6) Committee members did not sign the September 4, 2025 report.

even though five (5) out of the six (6) Committee members did not sign the September 4, 2025 report.

The narrow 6–5 vote in favor of the respondent — considering that the Chairman’s vote is counted only in the event of a tie — clearly demonstrates that the findings were far from unanimous, thereby justifying a reinvestigation; yet, the Quezon City Council nevertheless proceeded to confirm the Committee’s recommendation.

Moreover, a significant procedural issue arises as to whether a newly constituted City Council may lawfully confirm or adopt the incomplete work of a previous Council’s investigative committee — raising a cross-over concern that squarely calls into question the validity and regularity of the confirmation itself.

It was also later discovered, upon receipt of the Journal of Proceedings, that during the First Committee Hearing held on May 9, 2024, only four (4) members were present, including the Chairman, out of eleven (11) designated committee members. This number was insufficient to constitute a quorum, thereby rendering the said hearing invalid, irregular, and void for lack of authority to act.

Accordingly, the filing of an appeal has become not only justified but imperative.

8. That Complainants received an URGENT NOTICE OF POSTPONEMENT dated Sept 28, 2023 citing the 90-day election ban and no investigation shall be held within 90 days immediately prior to any election, a certified true copy hereto attached as **Annex “D”**;

9. The respondent filed his Verified Answer on February 26, 2024, a certified true copy hereto attached as **Annex “E”**;

10. That Complainants received a NOTICE OF HEARING dated February 29, 2025 setting the date of hearing on March 20, 2025, a certified true copy hereto attached as **Annex “F”** which was postponed;

11. That the complainants received a Notice of Hearing dated April 22, 2024, setting the hearing on May 9, 2025, a certified true copy hereto attached as **Annex “G”**; which hearing was duly pursued;

12. A copy of MINUTES for May 9, 2024 was received, a certified true copy hereto attached as **Annex “H”**;

13. A copy of Journal of Proceedings for May 9, 2024 Hearing was reproduced by Committee Secretariat and received by complainant on May 24, 2025, a certified true copy hereto attached as **Annex “I”**;

14. The complainants filed a SUPPLEMENTAL AFFIDAVIT on May 24, 2024, a certified true copy hereto attached as **Annex “J”**

15. Again, the complainants filed a SECOND SUPPLEMENTAL on May 28, 2024, a certified true copy hereto attached as **Annex “K”**;

16. A Resolution of the SPECIAL INVESTIGATIVE COMMITTEE ON ADMINISTRATIVE CASE AGAINST ELECTIVE BARANGAY OFFICIALS dated November 29, 2024 dismissing the complaint was received, a certified true copy hereto attached as **Annex “L”**;

17. The complainants on January 28, 2025 filed a MOTION FOR RECONSIDERATION, a certified true copy hereto attached as **Annex “M”**

18. A Resolution on the MOTION FOR RECONSIDERATION of the SPECIAL INVESTIGATIVE COMMITTEE ON ADMINISTRATIVE CASE AGAINST ELECTIVE BARANGAY OFFICIALS dated September 4, 2025 Denying the Motion for Reconsideration and Confirmed by the City Council was received by the Complainants on October 29, 2025, a certified true copy hereto attached as **Annex “N”**;

19. That complainant filed a NOTICE OF APPEAL to the Office of the President on November 11, 2025, a copy of the original hereto attached . as **Annex “O”**;

20. That the 15-day period within which to appeal the Resolution will expire on November 12, 2025 hence the filing of this Appeal is within the 15-day reglementary period;

21. That the Memorandum on Appeal was filed this December 10, 2025 hence the filing of this Appeal Memorandum is within the 30-day reglementary period;

III. STATEMENT OF FACTS

22. Complainants Henry R. Giron, Egmedio C. Suela, Jr., and Marcelo B. Macasinag are all bona fide residents of Barangay Capri, Novaliches, Quezon City. Mr. Giron and Mr. Suela have previously served as Barangay Kagawad of Barangay Capri, while Mr. Macasinag is a senior citizen and long-time resident of the same barangay. Respondent Christian A. Cando is the incumbent Punong Barangay of Barangay Capri, Novaliches, Quezon City.

23. On July 3, 2023 complainants filed twelve (12) complaints before the Office of the Ombudsman Main Office against Punong Barangay Christian A. Cando summarized as follows:

1. Violation of Section 6 of Republic Act No. 11032 and Section 1, Rule IV of the Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) of Republic Act No. 11032, for failure to implement and maintain a Citizen's Charter in Barangay Capri since August 2019.

2. Violation of Section 352 of the Local Government Code of 1991 and DILG Memorandum Circular No. 2010-83 dated August 31, 2010, pertaining to the full disclosure of local budget, finances, and bids and public offerings, as affirmed by the Supreme Court in Villafuerte vs. Robredo.

3. Violation of DILG Memorandum Circular No. 2010-138, reiterating the proper use of the 20% Development Fund component of the IRA and the list of expenditures for which the fund must not be utilized.

4. Violation of Section 410 of the Katarungang Pambarangay Law under the Local Government Code of 1991.

5. Violation of Section 374 of the Local Government Code of 1991, requiring the establishment of an archival system in the barangay.

6. Violation of Section 397 of the Local Government Code of 1991, requiring the regular conduct of a Barangay Assembly.

7. Violation of DILG Memorandum Circular No. 2010-101 dated September 23, 2010, prohibiting the use of names, initials, images, or pictures of government officials in billboards, signages, and materials related to government programs, projects, and properties.

8. Violation of Section 323 of the Local Government Code of 1991, pertaining to the failure to enact the Annual Appropriations Ordinance.

9. Violation of Article 425(e) of the IRR of the Local Government Code of 1991, requiring the submission of financial records.

10. Violation of Republic Act No. 10631, which amends Republic Act No. 8485, otherwise known as the Animal Welfare Act of 1998.

11. Violation of Section 17 of the Local Government Code of 1991 for failure to establish a Barangay Reading Center or Library, which is part of the basic services devolved to barangays.

12. Violation of the Philippine Constitution, Republic Act No. 9745 (Anti-Torture Act), and Republic Act No. 6713 (Code of Conduct and Ethical Standards for Public Officials and Employees).

ON THE CITIZENS' CHARTER

Violation of Section 6 of Republic Act No. 11032 and Section 1, Rule IV of the Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) of Republic Act No. 11032, for failure to implement and maintain a Citizen's Charter in Barangay Capri since August 2019

24. This Complaint is filed to compel accountability and to address the continuing, deliberate, and repeated violations committed by Punong Barangay Christian A. Cando, who has persistently failed to implement the Citizen's Charter of Barangay Capri as expressly required under Republic Act No. 11032 (Ease of Doing Business and Anti-Red Tape Act of 2018), notwithstanding the fact that he had already been reprimanded and sternly warned by the Office of the Ombudsman in a previous administrative case (2006) for similar misconduct;

25. Instead of a complete handbook and online version, respondent merely placed a small tarpaulin (less than 2 meters) inside the Barangay Hall — not outside;

26. Further, the barangay does not maintain an official email address as part of citizens' charter to report complaints. There is no mention in his verified answer⁴ that Barangay Capri has official email address;

27. From 2013 until the present, respondent failed to produce and no publish citizens charter handbook and any post in online a complete, accessible, and legally compliant Citizen's Charter thus, depriving us and residents of Barangay Capri the right to transparent, predictable, and efficient public service;

28. On May 24, 2024 the complainants submitted a Supplemental Affidavit⁵ with the attached ARTA Memorandum Circular No. 2019-002-A Series of 2019 as Supplemental Guidelines on the Implementation of Citizens Charter but until now no Handbook or Online posting of the said charter. This is despite the fact that Barangay Capri under the management of the respondent received and expended

annual budgets from 2018 up to 2023⁶ totaling more than One Hundred Twenty-One Million Pesos (P121,000,000.00), broken down as follows:

29. On the said Supplemental Affidavit, the complainants attached a certified true copy of Ombudsman Decision (2006)⁷ reprimanding the respondent when he still serving as kagawad of Barangay Capri, the dispositive portion reads:

“WHEREFORE, respondents Arnaldo A. Cando, Christian A. Cando, Rafael G. Pongyan, Edgardo C. Dominguez and Casey Lann C. Creencia are hereby **REPRIMANDED**. They are further **WARNED** that repetition of the same or similar infraction will be dealt with severely. Let this Decision be entered in respondents’ 201 File (personal record) as public officers.” *Underlined Ours*

30. Again on May 28, 2024 the complainants submitted a Second Supplemental⁸ with attached Response Letter from ARTA dated May 24, 2024 stating that our barangay has no Citizens Charter submission as of said date;

31. The City Council despite of these clear evidence dismissed the complaint on November 29, 2024 and Denied the Motion for Reconsideration on September 4, 2025;

I. ISSUES

I. WHETHER THE RESPONDENT IS LIABLE FOR CONTINUOUS AND REPEATED VIOLATION OF RA 11032 FOR FAILURE TO PUBLISH A CITIZEN'S CHARTER HANDBOOK AND ONLINE POSTING ON BARANGAY OFFICIAL WEBSITE

ARGUMENTS

38. Respondent violated Republic Act 11032 by failing to produce and publish a complete Citizen's Charter. RA 11032 requires: A full Citizen's Charter in handbook form and Online posting, including official email and feedback mechanisms. A 2-meter tarpaulin inside the barangay hall is grossly insufficient and not compliance. Respondent failed to do this for 12 years;

39. Without an official email address or online reporting, residents have no immediate, accessible channel for complaints, which is mandatory under government standards for frontline services. Continued non-compliance for 12 years constitutes Neglect of Duty and Gross Inefficiency;

40. From 2013 up to the present, the Respondent consistently failed to comply with RA 11032, even after receiving annual budgets totaling ₱121 Million Pesos covering fiscal years 2018–2024;

41. This non-compliance demonstrates not mere oversight but a systematic disregard for the law;

II. WHETHER THE CITY COUNCIL ERRED IN CONFIRMING THE RESOLUTION OF THE SPECIAL INVESTIGATIVE COMMITTEE ON ADMINISTRATIVE CASES AGAINST ELECTIVE BARANGAY OFFICIALS WHICH DISMISSED THE COMPLAINT, DESPITE THE RESPONDENT'S UNDISPUTED FAILURE TO PUBLISH A CITIZEN'S CHARTER IN HANDBOOK FORM AND TO POST THE SAME ONLINE ON AN OFFICIAL BARANGAY WEBSITE, IN VIOLATION OF REPUBLIC ACT NO. 11032

ARGUMENTS

42. The City Council gravely erred when it confirmed the Resolution of the Special Investigative Committee dismissing the complaint despite the existence of clear, documentary, and undisputed violations of RA 11032. This law on Ease of Doing Business Act aside from Information Board requires complete Citizen's Charter in handbook form and Online posting of the Citizen's Charter on an official website with official email, feedback, and complaint mechanisms. The Respondent had none of these. What existed was only a 2-meter tarpaulin inside the barangay hall—grossly insufficient and not compliant with RA 11032;

43. The Hearing Committee ignored the Respondent's prior Ombudsman Reprimand (2006), which aggravates liability. The Ombudsman previously reprimanded and warned the same Respondent in 2006, with the warning: "Repetition of the same or similar infraction will be dealt with severely." Despite this, the Council: Ignored the prior penalty; Ignored the repeated nature of the violations; Treated the case as if it involved a first-time offender; This is improper, unreasonable, and contrary to the Ombudsman's directive;

ON THE VIOLATION OF SECTION 352 OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE OF 1991 AND DILG MEMORANDUM CIRCULAR NO. 2010-83

Violation of Section 352 of the Local Government Code of 1991 and DILG Memorandum Circular No. 2010-83 dated August 31, 2010, pertaining to the full disclosure of local budget, finances, and bids and public offerings, as affirmed by the Supreme Court in *Villafuerte vs. Robredo*.

44. That Punong Barangay Christian Cando violated Section 352 of the Local Government Code of 1991 and DILG Memorandum Circular No. 2010-83 dated August 31, 2010, which require the full disclosure of local budget and finances, and bids and public offerings—provisions affirmed by the Supreme Court *En Banc* in *Villafuerte vs. Robredo*, G.R. No. 195390, December 10, 2014;

45. Section 352 of RA 7160 provides:

“SECTION 352. Posting of the Summary of Income and Expenditures.
– Local treasurers, accountants, budget officers, and other accountable officers shall, within thirty (30) days from the end of each fiscal year, post in at least three (3) publicly accessible and conspicuous places in the local government unit a summary of all revenues collected and funds received including the appropriations and disbursements of such funds during the preceding fiscal year.”

46. The term “Local Treasurers” applies to Provincial Treasurers, City Treasurers, Municipal Treasurers, and Barangay Treasurers, because under Section 4 (Scope of Application) of the Local Government Code, RA 7160 applies to all provinces, cities, municipalities, and barangays.

47. Respondent Punong Barangay is accountable officer of the barangay being the chief executive. However, from 2017 up to the present, we have never seen any posting of: the full disclosure of local budget and finances, the summary of income and expenditures, the bids and public offerings, as required under Section 352, in the three (3) publicly accessible and conspicuous places within Barangay Capri.

48. Although a single disclosure is posted inside the barangay hall, this is: not easily visible to the public, not “publicly accessible and conspicuous,” and insufficient, because the law requires posting in at least three (3) locations.

49. The relevant law and DILG directives use the word “shall,” which the Supreme Court has consistently held as a word of command, indicating that compliance is compulsory and not discretionary.

50. Aside from the barangay hall, there are two (2) other crowded and strategic locations in Barangay Capri where the mandatory postings should have been placed: Public market / talipapa, Barangay plaza, Other suitable areas include: the barangay entrance gate (information board), the frontage of the elementary school, the area in front of the church, yet the Punong Barangay failed to post in any of these areas.

51. The failure to post: the summary of income and expenditures, the local budget and finances, and the bids and public offerings, constitutes a clear violation of RA 7160 and DILG Memorandum Circulars, and may amount to: Dereliction of Duty Grave Misconduct, Gross Neglect of Duty, Violation of RA 11032 (Ease of Doing Business) and may give rise to administrative and criminal liability under existing transparency and anti-graft laws;

52. Aside from the Barangay Annual Budget, the Barangay Development Plans (BDPs) must likewise be posted in three (3) conspicuous and populated places. Copies of the BDPs of Barangay Capri from 2018 to 2022, which we obtained from the City Budget Office of Quezon City Hall, are attached as: Exhibit "I" – BDP 2018; Exhibit "J" – BDP 2019; Exhibit "K" – BDP 2020; Exhibit "L" – BDP 2021; Exhibit "M" – BDP 2022 was not posted and continuous Non-Compliance up to present;

II. ISSUES

III. WHETHER THE RESPONDENT IS LIABLE OF VIOLATING SECTION 352 OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE OF 1991 AND DILG MEMORANDUM CIRCULAR NO. 2010-83, WHICH MANDATE FULL DISCLOSURE OF LOCAL BUDGET, FINANCES, AND BIDS AND PUBLIC OFFERINGS, AS AFFIRMED BY THE SUPREME COURT IN VILLAFUERTE VS. ROBREDO

53. That Respondent Punong Barangay Christian Cando is liable for violating Section 352 of the Local Government Code of 1991 (RA 7160) and DILG Memorandum Circular No. 2010-83 dated August 31, 2010, both of which mandate full disclosure of local budget, finances, and bids and public offerings—requirements expressly upheld by the Supreme Court *En Banc* in Villafuerte vs. Robredo, G.R. No. 195390, December 10, 2014. As explained above, the factual circumstances leave no doubt that Respondent's violations of Section 352 of the Local Government Code and DILG Memorandum Circular No. 2010-83 are clear, continuous, and intentional, thereby establishing undisputed administrative liability;

54. THUS, THE CITY COUNCIL ERRED IN CONFIRMING THE RESOLUTION OF THE SPECIAL INVESTIGATIVE COMMITTEE ON ADMINISTRATIVE CASES AGAINST ELECTIVE BARANGAY OFFICIALS WHICH DISMISSED THE COMPLAINT, DESPITE VIOLATING SECTION 352 OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE OF 1991 AND DILG MEMORANDUM CIRCULAR NO. 2010-83, WHICH MANDATE FULL DISCLOSURE OF LOCAL BUDGET, FINANCES, AND BIDS AND PUBLIC OFFERINGS, AS AFFIRMED BY THE SUPREME COURT IN VILLAFUERTE VS. ROBREDO

On violation of DILG Memorandum Circular No. 2010-138, reiterating the proper use of the 20% Development Fund component of the IRA and the list of expenditures for which the fund must not be utilized.

55. That the respondent Punong Barangay committed a clear violation of DILG Memorandum Circular No. 2010-138, entitled "Utilization of the 20% Component of the Annual Internal Revenue Allotment (IRA) Shares", a copy of which is attached as Annex "Q" of the Complaint-Affidavit. Said Circular strictly implements Section 287 of the Local Government Code of 1991, which mandates that the 20% Development Fund shall be utilized exclusively for development projects, not for administrative or ordinary operating expenses.

56. That DILG MC No. 2010-138 expressly prohibits the following expenditures under the 20% Development Fund:

"5. Construction, repair or refinishing of administrative offices; purchase of administrative office furniture, fixtures, equipment, or appliances."

57. That, in fact, DILG MC No. 2010-138 further clarifies that supplies, materials, furniture, equipment, appliances, repairs, or any other expenditures intended for administrative operations must properly be charged under the barangay's Maintenance and Other Operating Expenses (MOOE) and not from the 20% IRA Development Fund.

58. That despite the explicit prohibition, the respondent Punong Barangay utilized substantial portions of the 20% Development Fund to purchase or procure supplies, materials, equipment, and improvements clearly intended for the administrative office—constituting a direct misuse of public funds and a deliberate circumvention of the legally earmarked purpose of the barangay's development fund.

59. That the misuse of the 20% Development Fund constitutes DERELICTION OF DUTY and GRAVE MISCONDUCT, as it directly violates Section 287 of the Local Government Code, DILG MC No. 2010-138, and established COA rules on the proper allocation of public expenditures.

60. That such improper utilization of the Development Fund deprived the community of projects mandated by law, including: infrastructure development beneficial to the public, socio-economic programs and services, environmental management and disaster preparedness improvements, and other development initiatives essential for the welfare of Barangay Capri.

61. That the respondent's actions further demonstrate habitual disregard of DILG, COA, and statutory requirements, aggravating in nature, especially considering his prior administrative reprimand in the 2006 Ombudsman case, where he was expressly WARNED that repetition of similar infractions "shall be dealt with severely."

62. Accordingly, the respondent's misuse of the 20% Development Fund is a clear and punishable violation of law and regulations warranting the imposition of the appropriate administrative sanctions.

III. ISSUES

IV. WHETHER THE RESPONDENT IS LIABLE FOR VIOLATION OF DILG MEMORANDUM CIRCULAR NO. 2010-138, WHICH REITERATES THE PROPER USE OF THE 20% DEVELOPMENT FUND COMPONENT OF THE INTERNAL REVENUE ALLOTMENT (IRA) AND ENUMERATES THE SPECIFIC EXPENDITURES FOR WHICH THE FUND MUST NOT BE UTILIZED.

63. That the respondent Punong Barangay is liable for having committed a clear violation of DILG Memorandum Circular No. 2010-138, entitled "Utilization of the 20% Component of the Annual Internal Revenue Allotment (IRA) Shares," a copy of which is attached as Annex "Q" of the Complaint-Affidavit. The said Circular strictly implements Section 287 of the Local Government Code of 1991, which mandates that the 20% Development Fund shall be utilized exclusively for development projects, and expressly prohibits its use for administrative, personal services, or ordinary operating expenses. As explained above, the factual circumstances leave no doubt that Respondent's violations of the mandate on the proper use of NTA (IRA) 20% development fund are clear, continuous, and intentional, thereby establishing undisputed administrative liability;

64. THUS, THE CITY COUNCIL ERRED IN CONFIRMING THE RESOLUTION OF THE SPECIAL INVESTIGATIVE COMMITTEE ON ADMINISTRATIVE CASES AGAINST ELECTIVE BARANGAY OFFICIALS WHICH DISMISSED THE COMPLAINT, DESPITE VIOLATING MEMORANDUM CIRCULAR NO. 2010-138, WHICH REITERATES THE PROPER USE OF THE 20% DEVELOPMENT FUND COMPONENT OF THE INTERNAL REVENUE ALLOTMENT (IRA) AND ENUMERATES THE SPECIFIC EXPENDITURES FOR WHICH THE FUND MUST NOT BE UTILIZED.

On violation of Section 410 of the Katarungang Pambarangay Law under the Local Government Code of 1991.

65. That Punong Barangay Christian Cando violated Section 410 of the Local Government Code of 1991, which mandates the strict procedure for amicable settlement of disputes. Section 410 provides:

“SECTION 410. Procedure for Amicable Settlement. —

(a) Who may initiate proceeding — Upon payment of the appropriate filing fee, any individual who has a cause of action against another individual involving any matter within the authority of the lupon may complain, orally or in writing, to the lupon chairman of the barangay.

(b) Mediation by lupon chairman — Upon receipt of the complaint, the lupon chairman shall, within the next working day, summon the respondent(s), with notice to the complainant(s), for them and their witnesses to appear before him for mediation of their conflicting interests. If he fails in his mediation effort within fifteen (15) days from the first meeting of the parties before him, he shall forthwith set a date for the constitution of the pangkat in accordance with this Chapter.”

66. That the law is explicit: the initial mediation before the Punong Barangay is mandatory, and only upon failure of such mediation may the dispute be elevated to the Pangkat ng Tagapagkasundo.

67. That despite this requirement, the respondents’ Counter-Affidavit is conspicuously silent and does not attach a single summons or notice showing that the Punong Barangay performed his statutory mediation duties under Section 410(b). Likewise, respondents failed to attach any Monthly Report submitted to the Municipal Trial Court (MTC), as required under the Katarungang Pambarangay system and Section 421 of RA 7160.

68. That complainants specifically identified several cases which should have undergone mandatory mediation, yet respondents failed to produce any documentary evidence whatsoever—such as summons, notices, minutes, or mediation reports—to prove that mediation actually occurred.

69. That by failing to conduct mandatory mediation proceedings, failing to issue summons, and failing to submit monthly reports to the MTC, the respondent Punong Barangay committed dereliction of duty;

70. Such omission demonstrates not only failure to perform an official duty mandated by law but also tolerance of violations of the Katarungang Pambarangay system, thereby constituting administrative misconduct and criminal liability.

IV. ISSUES

V. WHETHER THE RESPONDENT IS LIABLE FOR VIOLATION OF SECTION 410 OF THE KATARUNGANG PAMBARANGAY LAW UNDER LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE OF 1991

71. That Punong Barangay Christian Cando is liable for violating Section 410 of the Local Government Code of 1991, which prescribes the mandatory procedure for amicable settlement of disputes under the Katarungang Pambarangay system;

72. That the legal requirement is explicit and mandatory: initial mediation by the Punong Barangay/ Lupon Chairman must first occur before any dispute may be elevated to the Pangkat ng Tagapagkasundo. The law imposes upon the Punong Barangay a clear ministerial duty to issue summons, conduct mediation, and document the proceedings.

73. That despite this mandatory requirement, the Respondents' Counter-Affidavit is conspicuously silent on this issue and fails to attach any summons, notice, mediation minutes, or acknowledgment indicating that Punong Barangay Cando performed his statutory duties under Section 410(b). Respondents likewise failed to attach any Monthly KP Reports supposedly submitted to the Municipal Trial Court, as required under Section 421, RA 7160. As explained above, the factual circumstances leave no doubt that Respondent's violations of Section 410 of the Local Government Code of 1991 are clear, continuous, and intentional, thereby establishing undisputed administrative liability;

74. **THUS, THE CITY COUNCIL ERRED IN CONFIRMING THE RESOLUTION OF THE SPECIAL INVESTIGATIVE COMMITTEE ON ADMINISTRATIVE CASES AGAINST ELECTIVE BARANGAY OFFICIALS WHICH DISMISSED THE COMPLAINT, DESPITE VIOLATION OF SECTION 410 OF THE KATARUNGANG PAMBARANGAY LAW UNDER LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE OF 1991;**

**On Violation of Section 374 of the Local Government Code of 1991,
requiring the establishment of an archival system in the barangay.**

74. That the establishment of an archival system in every local government is mandated by Section 374 of the Local Government Code of 1991:

“SECTION 374. Establishment of an Archival System. — Every local government unit shall provide for the establishment of an archival system to ensure the safety and protection of all government property, public documents or records such as records of births, marriages, property inventory, land assessments, land ownership, tax payments, tax accounts, and business permits, and such other records or documents of public interest in the various departments and offices of the provincial, city, or municipal government concerned.”

75. That on May 19, 2002, the Sangguniang Barangay of Barangay Capri enacted Ordinance No. 4, S-2002, “AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE BARANGAY ARCHIVES OF BARANGAY CAPRI GOVERNMENT AS MANDATED BY THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE OF 1991,” which was approved by the Sangguniang Panlungsod; a copy is attached as Exhibit “R” to the Complaint Affidavit.

76. That the Quezon City Council likewise passed Resolution No. SP-2011, S-2003, “A RESOLUTION URGING ALL BARANGAY COUNCILS WITHIN THE JURISDICTION OF QUEZON CITY TO ADOPT AND ESTABLISH THEIR ARCHIVAL SYSTEM AS MANDATED BY THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE OF 1991,” a copy of which is attached as Exhibit “S” of the complaint affidavit (Annex “A”);

77. That to this day, our Barangay has failed to show the existence of a Barangay Archives in accordance with the detailed requirements of Ordinance No. 4, S-2002, “AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE BARANGAY ARCHIVES OF BARANGAY CAPRI GOVERNMENT AS MANDATED BY THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE OF 1991.”

78. That the respondent, in his Answer, merely attached old blotter records of Barangay Tanod (BSDO) as supposed proof of an “archive,” claiming that such records spanning more than ten (10) years of his administration are already sufficient. This assertion is patently misleading and does not satisfy the mandatory requirements of Section 374 of the Local Government Code of 1991, which requires the establishment and maintenance of a functional Barangay Archives.

79. The respondent deliberately avoids the truth that Barangay Capri has NO functional archival system, as required by law. The submission of old blotters—loose, disorganized, and limited only to BSDO entries—does not constitute an archive, nor does it reflect compliance with the statutory obligation to create an organized, updated, complete, and accessible records management system for all barangay documents.

80. Such evasive presentation of incomplete and selective records demonstrates the respondent’s continued neglect, misrepresentation, and failure to comply with Section 374, thereby further strengthening the case against him.

V. ISSUES

VI. WHETHER THE RESPONDENT IS LIABLE FOR VIOLATION OF SECTION 374 OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE OF 1991, REQUIRING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF AN ARCHIVAL SYSTEM IN THE BARANGAY

81. The respondent is liable because he failed to establish a proper archival system, as required by Section 374 of the Local Government Code of 1991. The law clearly mandates every barangay to keep organized, complete, and accessible records of all official documents.

82. Instead of showing a real archive, the respondent only presented old BSDO blotter records, which do not meet the legal requirement. This proves that the barangay does not have a proper, functional archive. Because he did not follow what the law requires, he violated Section 374.

83. Therefore, the respondent is clearly liable for failing to maintain the required barangay archives.

84. THUS, THE CITY COUNCIL ERRED IN CONFIRMING THE RESOLUTION OF THE SPECIAL INVESTIGATIVE COMMITTEE ON ADMINISTRATIVE CASES AGAINST ELECTIVE BARANGAY OFFICIALS WHICH DISMISSED THE COMPLAINT, DESPITE OF VIOLATION OF SECTION 374 OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE OF 1991, REQUIRING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF AN ARCHIVAL SYSTEM IN THE BARANGAY ;

On Violation of Section 397 of the Local Government Code of 1991, requiring the regular conduct of a Barangay Assembly.

85. That Punong Barangay Christian Cando issued an INVITATION addressed only to CAC Purok Leaders and Heads of Associations for a supposed “meeting” scheduled on March 25, 2023, 5:00 p.m., at the 2/F Capri Multi-Purpose Hall; a copy of said invitation is attached to the Complaint-Affidavit as Exhibit “T”;

86. That on March 25, 2023 (Saturday), the invited Purok Leaders arrived at the Capri Multi-Purpose Hall wearing yellow shirts bearing the faces of three barangay officials—Punong Barangay Christian Cando, Kagawad Arnaldo Cando, and Kagawad Agnes Cando—thereafter submitting their attendance; a copy of the attendance sheet is attached as Exhibit “U” of the complaint affidavit;

87. That complainants do not claim that no Assembly occurred on March 25, 2023 however, the complaint pertains instead to the deceptive manner of issuing the invitation, which was limited only to Purok Leaders, making the gathering appear as an internal meeting, thereby HIDING from the general public that a Barangay Assembly—mandated to be a COMMUNITY-WIDE activity—was supposedly taking place.

88. That the clear intent of limiting the notice to Purok Leaders constitutes DECEIT, designed to avoid the participation of the broader barangay population who are entitled to question the officials' financial report and public expenditures, including but not limited to: why the barangay's annual MERALCO bill reaches ₱900,000.00 despite no major infrastructure requiring such usage; why in the "Cando Cup" basketball tournament, players were required to procure their own uniforms and pay quotas despite nearly ₱20 million in barangay funds and an SK budget of almost ₱2,000,000.00; and other questions, comments, and proposals that the residents are entitled to raise during a Barangay Assembly.

89. That because of this deception, the legally intended purpose of a Barangay Assembly—to widely disseminate public information, discuss community issues, and present the barangay's financial report—was not achieved, since the meeting was disguised as a mere "purok leaders' meeting.";

90. That during the Assembly, the barangay treasurer presented NO financial report, contrary to express requirements of Section 397(c)(1) of the Local Government Code;

91. That complainants conducted a detailed review of the official Facebook page of Punong Barangay Christian Cando, which he uses as a primary public information platform, and no notice or announcement of any Barangay Assembly for March 25, 2023 was posted from March 18 to March 24, 2023;

92. That complainants further reviewed posts from March 11 to March 17 and still found no announcement of any Barangay Assembly scheduled for March 25, 2023;

93. That based on the evidence submitted—specifically, (a) the Notice addressed only to Purok Leaders and (b) the Purok Leaders' Attendance Sheet, both of which respondent does not deny—the respondent FAILED to issue or post a Notice of Meeting for a Barangay Assembly, in violation of:

(a) Section 397(b) of the Local Government Code of 1991, which requires that a Barangay Assembly “shall meet at least twice a year... at the call of the punong barangay or upon written petition of at least five percent (5%) of the barangay voters, with proper notice to the residents.”

VI. ISSUES

VII. WHETHER THE RESPONDENT IS LIABLE FOR VIOLATION OF VIOLATION OF SECTION 397 OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE OF 1991, REQUIRING THE REGULAR CONDUCT OF BARANGAY ASEMBLY

94. The respondent is liable. Section 397 of the Local Government Code requires every Barangay to hold a regular Barangay Assembly where the entire community must be invited to attend. During the assembly, officials must present: the accomplishment report, the financial report, and allow residents to ask questions, raise issues, and make proposals. In this case: The respondent did not issue a public notice for a Barangay Assembly. Instead, he sent invitations only to Purok Leaders, making the meeting appear like a small, internal gathering. No announcement was posted on the barangay’s official Facebook page or in any public place for at least one week before the date of the meeting. Because the notice was limited to a few selected individuals, the general public was not informed, and the residents were not given the chance to attend, ask questions, or hear the financial report. During the meeting itself, no financial report was presented, which is a required part of every Barangay Assembly under the law. These acts show that: The respondent did not properly call and conduct a Barangay Assembly as required by Section 397; The “assembly” was deceptively disguised as a purok leaders’ meeting; The public was intentionally excluded, which defeats the purpose of transparency and community participation. Therefore, by failing to issue a proper public notice, failing to invite all residents, and failing to present the financial report, the respondent violated Section 397 of the Local Government Code and is administratively liable.

95. THUS THE CITY COUNCIL ERRED IN CONFIRMING THE RESOLUTION OF THE SPECIAL INVESTIGATIVE COMMITTEE ON ADMINISTRATIVE CASES AGAINST ELECTIVE BARANGAY OFFICIALS WHICH DISMISSED THE COMPLAINT, DESPITE VIOLATION OF SECTION 397 OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE OF 1991, REQUIRING THE REGULAR CONDUCT OF BARANGAY ASEMBLY;

99. That due to time and financial constraints the additional complaints will be submitted on December 11, 2025, otherwise the Complaint Affidavit, Supplementals and Motion for Reconsiderations be used in reviewing the Appeal Memorandum being a part of it.

PRAYER

WHEREFORE, premises considered, it is most respectfully prayed that:

1. The Resolutions of the SPECIAL INVESTIGATIVE COMMITTEE ON ADMINISTRATIVE CASES AGAINST ELECTIVE BARANGAY OFFICIALS and Confirmation of the QUEZON CITY COUNCIL dismissing the complaints be REVERSED and SET ASIDE;
2. That such other reliefs just and equitable under the premises be likewise granted.

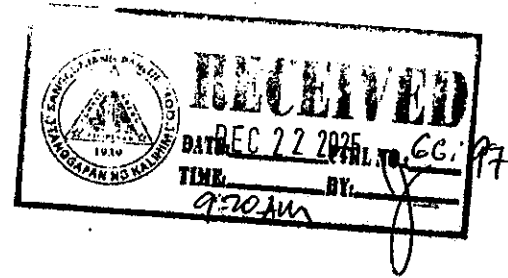

SUPPLEMENTAL TO MEMORANDUM ON APPEAL

Complainant-Appellee, Henry R. Giron, by himself, and unto this Honorable Office, most respectfully states:

1. That I submitted yesterday December 10, 2025 the Memorandum on Appeal pertaining to Administrative Case filed against Punong Barangay Christian A. Cando on the violations mentioned above;

A copy of first page of the Memorandum on Appeal with QR Code as proof of receipt hereto attached as Annex "P" and be made integral part of the appeal.

2. That I submitted the following as supplemental in continuous numbering and be part of the Memorandum on Appeal;

VIOLATION OF DILG MEMORANDUM CIRCULAR NO. 2010-101 (“BANNING NAMES OR INITIALS AND/OR IMAGES OR PICTURES OF GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS IN BILLBOARDS AND SIGNAGES OF GOVERNMENT PROGRAMS, PROJECTS AND PROPERTIES.

96. That Punong Barangay Christian Cando violated DILG Memorandum Circular No. 2010-101 dated September 23, 2010, which prohibits the display of names, initials, images, or pictures of government officials on billboards, signages, equipment, and other government properties or projects. This policy is commonly known as the “Anti-Epal Policy”;

97. That in the First Paragraph of the said Memorandum Circular, a copy of which is attached as Exhibit “X” in the complaint affidavit, it clearly states the rationale behind the prohibition:

“The practice of putting up billboards or signages bearing the names, initials and images of government officials on government programs and projects has been noticeably abused and misused by some public officials for their personal interest and has taken the credit away from the taxpayers who are the ones paying for such programs or projects through their tax payment.” (Emphasis supplied.)

It further mandates:

“Towards this end, all Local Chief Executives are hereby directed to revisit all government projects and properties and to ensure that this policy is strictly prohibited.”

98. That the repeated violation of Punong Barangay Christian Cando of this Memorandum Circular is proven by the photographs attached in as Exhibit “Y” of complaint affidavit clearly showing the placement of his name on barangay projects

funded by public funds of Barangay Capri. Such act is expressly prohibited and constitutes an intentional use of government projects for personal promotion or credit-grabbing.

99. That the violations committed by Punong Barangay Christian Cando constitute clear administrative offenses, including but not limited to: Grave Abuse of Authority for abusing official authority to use barangay funds and projects for personal promotion; Grave Misconduct — for deliberately defying an explicit policy issued by the DILG pursuant to law and regulations; and Violation of Republic Act No. 6713 (Code of Conduct and Ethical Standards for Public Officials) — because placing one's name on government-funded projects demonstrates self-promotion and personal interest, contrary to the principles of public accountability and avoidance of conflict of interest;

VII. ISSUES

WHETHER THE RESPONDENT IS LIABLE FOR VIOLATION OF DILG MEMORANDUM CIRCULAR NO. 2010-101 (“BANNING NAMES OR INITIALS AND/OR IMAGES OR PICTURES OF GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS IN BILLBOARDS AND SIGNAGES OF GOVERNMENT PROGRAMS, PROJECTS AND PROPERTIES.

100. The respondent is liable because DILG MC 2010-101 clearly prohibits government officials from placing their names, initials, or pictures on any government-funded project or property. despite this rule, the respondent repeatedly placed his name on barangay projects funded by public money. this is considered “epal,” a misuse of government resources for personal promotion.

101. This act is a violation of official policy and shows abuse of authority and misconduct. the dilg memo has been in effect since 2010, and the respondent continued to disregard it. therefore, he is liable for violating dilg mc 2010-101.

102. THUS THE CITY COUNCIL ERRED IN CONFIRMING THE RESOLUTION OF THE SPECIAL INVESTIGATIVE COMMITTEE ON ADMINISTRATIVE CASES AGAINST ELECTIVE BARANGAY OFFICIALS WHICH DISMISSED THE COMPLAINT, DESPITE VIOLATION OF DILG MEMORANDUM CIRCULAR NO. 2010-101 (“BANNING NAMES OR INITIALS AND/OR IMAGES OR PICTURES OF GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS IN BILLBOARDS AND SIGNAGES OF GOVERNMENT PROGRAMS, PROJECTS AND PROPERTIES.

VIOLATION OF SECTION 323 OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE OF 1991 (FAILURE TO ENACT THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATIONS)

103. That Section 323 of the Local Government Code of 1991 provides:

“SECTION 323. Failure to Enact the Annual Appropriations. – In case the sanggunian concerned fails to pass the ordinance authorizing the annual appropriations at the beginning of the ensuing fiscal year, it shall continue to hold sessions, without additional remuneration for its members, until such ordinance is approved, and no other business may be taken up during such sessions. If the sanggunian still fails to enact such ordinance after ninety (90) days from the beginning of the fiscal year, the ordinance authorizing the appropriations of the preceding year shall be deemed reenacted and shall remain in force and effect until the ordinance authorizing the proposed appropriations is passed by the sanggunian concerned. However, only the annual appropriations for salaries and wages of existing positions, statutory and contractual obligations, and essential operating expenses authorized in the annual and supplemental budgets for the preceding year shall be deemed reenacted and disbursement of funds shall be in accordance therewith.”

104. That under the leadership and supervision of Punong Barangay Christian Cando, Barangay Capri failed to enact an annual budget for Fiscal Year 2023 even after the entire month of December 2022 had already lapsed. This constitutes a clear violation of the mandated budget calendar under the Local Government Code.

105. That pursuant to Section 323, the Sangguniang Barangay of Capri was required to continue holding sessions—strictly without taking up any other business—until the annual budget ordinance was approved. This legal mandate was not complied with.

106. That based on the statement of incumbent Barangay Kagawad Mary Lamp Aragdon, no discussion, deliberation, or approval of the 2023 annual budget was ever conducted from January to March 2023. This indicates a complete failure of the Sanggunian to perform its most fundamental fiscal function.

107. That proof of this fact is found in the Facebook Messenger exchange between Henry Giron and Kagawad Mary Lamp Aragdon attached as Exhibit “Z” in the Complaint-Affidavit, where the latter confirmed that no budget ordinance for 2023 was taken up during the relevant period.

VIII. ISSUES

WHETHER THE RESPONDENT IS LIABLE FOR VIOLATION OF SECTION 323 OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE OF 1991 (FAILURE TO ENACT THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATIONS)

108. The respondent is liable because the law requires that the sanggunian must approve the annual budget at the start of every fiscal year. if they fail to do so, they must continue holding sessions—with no other agenda—until the budget ordinance is passed. In this case, under the leadership of the respondent, barangay capri failed to enact the 2023 annual budget on time, and according to a barangay kagawad, no budget discussion happened from January to March 2023. this is a clear failure to perform a mandatory duty. Such neglect of an essential legal duty makes the respondent liable for dereliction of duty.

109. **THUS THE CITY COUNCIL ERRED IN CONFIRMING THE RESOLUTION OF THE SPECIAL INVESTIGATIVE COMMITTEE ON ADMINISTRATIVE CASES AGAINST ELECTIVE BARANGAY OFFICIALS WHICH DISMISSED THE COMPLAINT, DESPITE VIOLATION OF SECTION 323 OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE OF 1991 (FAILURE TO ENACT THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATIONS);**

**VIOLATION OF ARTICLE 425 (e) OF THE IRR OF THE
LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE OF 1991 (SUBMISSION
OF FINANCIAL RECORDS TO THE CITY
ACCOUNTANT)**

110. Article 425(e) of the Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) of the Local Government Code of 1991 clearly requires that all financial records of a barangay — including books of accounts, ledgers, statements of income and expenditures, balance sheets, trial balances, and similar documents — must be submitted and kept in the Office of the City or Municipal Accountant in a prescribed and simplified format determined by the Commission on Audit (COA). Therefore, all barangays must regularly submit their complete financial documents to the City Accountant. This ensures transparency, proper audit, and legal compliance.

111. That the Barangay Government of Barangay Capri has not been submitting financial records in recent years, according to a verbal report we received from the City Accountant's Office.

112. The respondent failed to present any certification from the City Accountant proving that Barangay Capri submitted the required financial documents for the years 2018 to 2023.

IX. ISSUES

**WHETHER THE RESPONDENT IS LIABLE FOR VIOLATION
OF ARTICLE 425 (e) OF THE IRR OF THE LOCAL
GOVERNMENT CODE OF 1991 (SUBMISSION OF
FINANCIAL RECORDS TO THE CITY ACCOUNTANT)**

113. The respondent, as Punong Barangay, failed to submit the required financial records of Barangay Capri to the City Accountant's Office, in violation of Article 425(e) of the IRR of the Local Government Code of 1991, which mandates that all barangay financial documents must be submitted and kept in the office of the city or municipal accountant.

114. The respondent also failed to produce any certification from the City Accountant proving compliance for the years 2018 to 2023, confirming the non-submission.

115. Under Article 416 of the IRR, the Punong Barangay is primarily responsible for the execution of the budget and full accountability of barangay funds; therefore, the failure to render financial records rests solely on the respondent.

116. **THUS THE CITY COUNCIL ERRED IN CONFIRMING THE RESOLUTION OF THE SPECIAL INVESTIGATIVE COMMITTEE ON ADMINISTRATIVE CASES AGAINST ELECTIVE BARANGAY OFFICIALS WHICH DISMISSED THE COMPLAINT, DESPITE VIOLATION OF ARTICLE 425 (e) OF THE IRR OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE OF 1991 (SUBMISSION OF FINANCIAL RECORDS TO THE CITY ACCOUNTANT)**

VIOLATION OF REPUBLIC ACT NO. 10631 (“AN ACT AMENDING CERTAIN SECTIONS OF REPUBLIC ACT NO. 8485, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS ‘THE ANIMAL WELFARE ACT OF 1998’”)

117. That in September 2018, the respondent Punong Barangay Christian Cando spearheaded the launch of “OPLAN: DOGHANG” in Barangay Capri, a barangay project publicly promoted through a tarpaulin—which is hereto attached as Exhibit “BB” in the complaint affidavit;

118. That in September 13, 2018, the Philippine Animal Welfare Society (PAWS), the country’s foremost animal-welfare organization, issued an official statement publicly condemning Barangay Capri’s “Oplan: Doghang,” which was posted on its official Facebook page. The PAWS statement reads in part:

“PAWS condemns the Oplan ‘Dog’-Hang launched by Barangay Capri, Novaliches QC.

The use of the term ‘dog’-hang whether as an allusion to ‘tokhang’ (used colloquially to mean ‘to summarily kill someone’) or as a way to encourage violent acts towards animals is wrong.

Animal control or collection of strays must be done humanely under the Animal Welfare Act (RA 8485, as amended by RA 10631).

Using ‘tokhang’ to refer to the killing or rounding up of animals... is dangerous and irresponsible...

By telling the public to surrender their animals to the pound, Barangay Capri officials encourage pet abandonment instead of responsible pet ownership...

RA 9482 (Anti-Rabies Act) penalizes irresponsible owners—not the animals.

PAWS believes in due process for all humans and animals. ‘Tokhang’ is not acceptable.”

A copy of the said post is attached as Exhibit “CC”, with link:

119. That the PAWS post generated strong public outrage, with numerous comments condemning Barangay Capri’s project for promoting violence against animals, encouraging pet abandonment, and violating established animal-welfare protocols.

120. That the controversy surrounding “Oplan: Doghang” reached national media, including a televised news segment by ABS-CBN’s Bandila, which reported on the matter and highlighted the public backlash. The video (YouTube link: <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=GFcBCOu7aBk>) is attached as Exhibit “DD” (USB) in the complaint affidavit;

121. This news exposure caused embarrassment and damage not only to the reputation of Barangay Capri but also to the image of the country seen by viewers worldwide.

122. That the PAWS Facebook post—attached as Exhibit “EE” of the complaint affidavit —garnered massive negative public reaction, with approximately 3.9K comments, 9K shares, and 13K reactions, the overwhelming majority of which condemning the barangay’s program.

123. That a public official, especially a Punong Barangay, is expected to exemplify responsible leadership, lawful conduct, and adherence to national laws.

124. The launching of “Oplan: Doghang” recklessly promoted harmful, inhumane, and unlawful treatment of animals, contrary to the standards required under RA 8485 as amended by RA 10631, RA 9482, and other animal-welfare regulations.

125. That by initiating and publicly endorsing Oplan: Doghang, the respondent Punong Barangay Christian Cando: Violated Republic Act No. 8485 (Animal Welfare Act) as amended by RA 10631, which requires humane treatment, proper procedures, and due process in the handling of animals; Promoted an unlawful and irresponsible animal-control practice condemned by PAWS and other sectors; Encouraged pet abandonment, in violation of RA 9482 (Anti-Rabies Act), which places responsibility and penalties upon owners—not the animals; Embarrassed the barangay and eroded public trust, thereby committing an act prejudicial to public interest; and Committed Gross Misconduct, as defined under administrative law, by executing an unlawful, irresponsible, and publicly damaging program.

X. ISSUES

WHETHER THE RESPONDENT IS LIABLE FOR VIOLATION OF REPUBLIC ACT NO. 10631 (“AN ACT AMENDING CERTAIN SECTIONS OF REPUBLIC ACT NO. 8485, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS ‘THE ANIMAL WELFARE ACT OF 1998’”)

126. The respondent Punong Barangay Christian Cando is liable for violating Republic Act No. 10631. He launched and promoted the program “Oplan: Doghang”, which: Encouraged inhumane, harmful, and unlawful animal control practices, directly prohibited under RA 8485 as amended by RA 10631; Promoted

actions that result in animal suffering and abandonment, contrary to the humane treatment standards mandated by the law; Misled the public into believing that violent or punitive treatment of animals is acceptable, which is expressly condemned by animal-welfare authorities; and was publicly denounced by the Philippine Animal Welfare Society (PAWS) as dangerous, irresponsible, and violative of the Animal Welfare Act;

127. By initiating and endorsing “Oplan: Doghang,” the respondent committed a clear violation of RA 10631, constituting Gross Misconduct, Abuse of Authority, and an act Prejudicial to the Public Interest.

128. THUS THE CITY COUNCIL ERRED IN CONFIRMING THE RESOLUTION OF THE SPECIAL INVESTIGATIVE COMMITTEE ON ADMINISTRATIVE CASES AGAINST ELECTIVE BARANGAY OFFICIALS WHICH DISMISSED THE COMPLAINT, DESPITE VIOLATION OF REPUBLIC ACT NO. 10631 (“AN ACT AMENDING CERTAIN SECTIONS OF REPUBLIC ACT NO. 8485, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS ‘THE ANIMAL WELFARE ACT OF 1998’”);

VIOLATION OF SECTION 17 OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE OF 1991 (ABSENCE OF A BARANGAY READING CENTER OR LIBRARY)

129. That under Section 17(1) of the Local Government Code of 1991, one of the Basic Services and Facilities to be provided by a local government unit, such as a barangay, is the establishment of information and reading centers, such as a public library.

130. That from 2018 to the present, the funds of Barangay Capri have exceeded One Hundred Million Pesos (₱100,000,000.00), yet no reading center or library has been established.

131. That ten percent (10%) thereof pertains to the Sangguniang Kabataan, or roughly Ten Million Pesos (₱10,000,000.00), yet no library has been established for the youth.

132.. That, according to an SK Councilor of our barangay, SK Bryan Abalos, they attempted to establish a library but were told by the barangay that there was no available space.

133. That the Sangguniang Kabataan is under the general supervision of the Punong Barangay.

134. That attached hereto is the chat message between Henry Giron and the said SK Councilor as Exhibit “FF” to the complaint affidavit.

135. That, by reason thereof, the respondent Punong Barangay violated Section 17 of the Local Government Code of 1991—specifically, the failure to establish a reading center or library in our barangay—and is liable for dereliction of duty.

XI. ISSUES

WHETHER THE RESPONDENT IS LIABLE FOR VIOLATION OF SECTION 17 OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE OF 1991 (ABSENCE OF A BARANGAY READING CENTER OR LIBRARY)

136. The respondent Punong Barangay is liable.

137. Section 17 of the Local Government Code of 1991 expressly requires every barangay to provide basic services and facilities, including information and reading centers, such as a barangay library. This is a mandated obligation—not optional.

138. Despite Barangay Capri receiving more than ₱100 million in funds from 2018 to present (including roughly ₱10 million for the Sangguniang Kabataan), no reading center or library has been established.

139. An SK councilor (SK Bryan Abalos) confirmed that the SK attempted to create a library, but the barangay refused due to “no available space,” even though the Punong Barangay has control over barangay facilities and supervises the SK.

140. This is a clear neglect of a legally mandated basic service, constituting dereliction of duty.

141. **THUS THE CITY COUNCIL ERRED IN CONFIRMING THE RESOLUTION OF THE SPECIAL INVESTIGATIVE COMMITTEE ON ADMINISTRATIVE CASES AGAINST ELECTIVE BARANGAY OFFICIALS WHICH DISMISSED THE COMPLAINT, DESPITE VIOLATION OF SECTION 17 OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE OF 1991 (ABSENCE OF A BARANGAY READING CENTER OR LIBRARY);**

VIOLATION OF HUMAN RIGHTS — REPUBLIC ACT NO. 9745, REPUBLIC ACT NO. 6713 SECTION 4(c), AND THE PHILIPPINE CONSTITUTION

142. That Punong Barangay Christian Cando has repeatedly conducted public displays of arrested “drug suspects” by posting their photographs on his personal Facebook account, a social media platform accessible not only within the Philippines but worldwide.

143. That the said posts featuring arrested individuals are attached as Exhibit “HH” to the Complaint-Affidavit.

144. That such public exhibition of arrested persons constitutes cruelty, humiliation, and debasement, not only to the individuals involved but also to their families and relatives who share the same surname—thereby exposing them to public shame, ridicule, and social stigma.

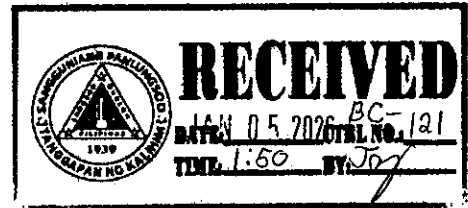

FORMAL ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLAINT

SECTION I

PARTIES AND NATURE OF THE COMPLAINT (Identity of Parties and Cause of Action)

This Complaint is filed by **MA. LUISA LAPUS MADRAZO**, of legal age, Filipino, and a resident of Barangay Greater Lagro, Quezon City (hereinafter referred to as the "Complainant"), against **LEO GARRA**, Barangay Captain; **VINCENT TESORO**, Barangay Executive Officer; **CANDY TABONES**, Barangay Secretary; **EMMANUEL FELIX TUZON**, BADAC Focal Person; and other barangay officials and personnel whose identities shall be ascertained during investigation (hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Respondents").

Respondents are charged with **Grave Misconduct, Gross Neglect of Duty, Abuse of Authority, Dishonesty, Conduct Prejudicial to the Best Interest of the Service**, and acts giving rise to **criminal liability under the Revised Penal Code**, arising from the **illegal assumption of custody, misrepresentation of authority, and undocumented surrender of Complainant's son to law enforcement**, which resulted in his prosecution for a serious criminal offense wholly unrelated to the barangay incident.

SECTION II

ANTECEDENT FACTS (Chronological and Factual Narrative)

On **9 December 2025**, at approximately **5:05 in the afternoon**, Complainant sought barangay assistance from **Barangay Executive Officer Vincent Tesoro** to respond to her residence after observing that **two of her children had been drinking alcohol**. The request was made **solely for pacification and safety**, consistent with the barangay's mandate under the **Local Government Code of 1991**.

Barangay personnel responded to the residence. At no point was any crime committed in their presence. Nevertheless, **one of Complainant's sons, Mikael Kristopher Medina, voluntarily went with the barangay personnel**. There was **no arrest, no coercion, and no resistance**.

Upon arrival at the barangay, **Mikael Kristopher Medina voluntarily submitted to a drug test**. He was later informed by barangay personnel that he tested **positive**.

Upon learning this, Complainant immediately stated that **she would have her son undergo rehabilitation**, expressly rejecting any criminal prosecution, especially since **her son was not caught in a buy-bust operation and was not in possession of illegal drugs**.

Following this, Complainant met with **Emmanuel Felix Tuzon**, the barangay's **BADAC focal person**, who showed her documents allegedly indicating that her son was included in the **barangay drug watch list**.

1Thereafter, Complainant, together with her daughter **Mary Faith Madrazo**, went to the office of **Barangay Secretary Candy Tabones**, where Complainant was **directed to write a formal request letter** for the rehabilitation of her two sons, **Mikael Kristopher Medina** and **Sebastian Madrazo**. The letter was **addressed to Barangay Captain Leo Garra**. Complainant was informed that there was a **process for rehabilitation**, and that **in the meantime, the barangay would take temporary custody of Mikael Kristopher Medina while the necessary documents were being processed**.

1Later that same day, at around **8:04 in the evening**, **Vincent Tesoro** called the **Complainant** and stated, "*Ate, ipakulong na lang natin 'to.*" Complainant immediately rejected this and reiterated that **a rehabilitation request letter had already been prepared**, and that **her son was not lawfully arrestable**, having neither been caught in a buy-bust operation nor found in possession of illegal drugs. This was **the last conversation between Complainant and Vincent Tesoro on that day**.

On **13 December 2025**, at around **1:58 in the afternoon**, Vincent Tesoro sent Complainant a message greeting her. Upon her reply, he sent another message stating: "*Paki-dalhan na lang ng damit, CIDG Crame na siya, ate.*" Complainant was **shocked**, as this was the **first time she learned** that her son had been **turned over to the Criminal Investigation and Detection Group (CIDG)**, **without her knowledge or consent**, and **in direct contradiction to the agreed rehabilitation process**.

On **15 December 2025**, **Gelly Ann Mancera**, the partner of Complainant's son, personally went to **CIDG Crame** to inquire about his condition. It was **only then** that the family learned that **a criminal case for illegal possession of firearms** had been filed against him.

Immediately thereafter, Complainant contacted the **Barangay Secretary**, who referred her to **Barangay Captain Leo Garra**, to whom Complainant narrated the entire sequence of events.

Later that same day, at around **4:00 in the afternoon**, **Vincent Tesoro** went to **Complainant's residence** and stated that **there was nothing more he could do**, and that **he only helped Complainant**. This statement further confused and distressed Complainant, considering that **her son had voluntarily submitted to the barangay under assurances of rehabilitation**, only to end up facing a serious criminal charge.

After the visit of **Gelly Ann Mancera to CIDG Crame**, she sent Complainant **voice messages** narrating what transpired. According to her, **Mikael Kristopher Medina was personally "pina-arbor" or endorsed by Vincent Tesoro to CIDG Crame**, without any lawful basis or documentation.

SECTION III

ADMINISTRATIVE OFFENSES OF RESPONDENTS (Barangay Officials)

Respondents are administratively liable for **Grave Misconduct**, having willfully disregarded established laws and procedures governing barangay authority, drug-related interventions, and custodial handling of civilians. The **unauthorized assumption of custody**, followed by the **undocumented surrender of a civilian to law enforcement**, constitutes flagrant disregard of law and procedure.

Respondents are likewise liable for **Gross Neglect of Duty**, for failing to record critical incidents in the barangay blotter, failing to protect the rights of a person who voluntarily sought barangay assistance, and failing to follow mandatory referral procedures under applicable laws and policies.

Respondents further committed **Abuse of Authority, Dishonesty, and Conduct Prejudicial to the Best Interest of the Service**, by misrepresenting the intended rehabilitation process, inducing Complainant's reliance, and thereafter facilitating or tolerating the unlawful turnover of her son to CIDG, thereby eroding public trust in barangay governance.

SECTION IV

CRIMINAL LIABILITY (PRIMA FACIE)(Revised Penal Code)

The acts complained of give rise to **prima facie criminal liability** for **Arbitrary Detention (Article 124), Unlawful Arrest (Article 269), and Falsification by Omission (Articles 171 and 172)**, considering the deliberate failure to generate required official records documenting custody and transfer. Liability may further arise under **Article 208** for negligence or tolerance of unlawful acts.

SECTION V

SUBSTANTIAL EVIDENCE AND PROOF

Substantial evidence exists in the form of:

- (a) the sworn narrative of Complainant;

- (b) the rehabilitation request letter (*in possession of respondent Candy Tabones*);
- (c) electronic messages and calls from Barangay Executive Officer Vincent Tesoro;
- (d) video footage and screenshots of conversation with barangay personnel Vincent Tesoro, et al. (**USB "A"**); and
- (e) the complete absence of barangay blotter entries or turnover documentation.

SECTION VI

JURISDICTION AND VENUE

This Complaint is properly filed before the **Office of the City Mayor of Quezon City**, which exercises **general supervision over barangays** and disciplinary authority pursuant to **Section 60 of Republic Act No. 7160**.

SECTION VII

PRAYER

WHEREFORE, premises considered, Complainant respectfully prays that:

1. Respondents be **formally charged and investigated**;
2. Appropriate **administrative sanctions**, including **preventive suspension**, be imposed;
3. The matter be **referred for criminal investigation** where warranted; and
4. **Protective measures** be granted to Complainant and her family.

Other reliefs just and equitable are likewise prayed for.

SECTION VIII

VERIFICATION AND CERTIFICATION OF NON-FORUM SHOPPING

I, **MA. LUISA LAPUS MADRAZO**, of legal age, Filipino, and a resident of Barangay Greater Lagro, Quezon City, after having been duly sworn in accordance with law, hereby depose and state:

1. I am the Complainant in the foregoing Administrative Complaint. I have read the contents thereof and I hereby certify that the allegations stated therein are **true and correct based on my personal knowledge and authentic records** in my possession or custody.

2. I hereby certify that I have not commenced any other action or proceeding involving the same issues, causes of action, and parties before any court, tribunal, or quasi-judicial agency; that to the best of my knowledge, no such action or proceeding is pending in any court, tribunal, or quasi-judicial agency; and that should I thereafter learn that a similar action or proceeding has been filed or is pending, I undertake to promptly inform this Honorable Office within five (5) days from knowledge thereof.
3. This Complaint is filed in good faith, solely to seek administrative accountability for the acts complained of, and not to harass, vex, or unduly prejudice the Respondents.
