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**Proposed Ordinance No. \_\_\_\_\_ S-2026**

**AN ORDINANCE APPROVING THE SUPPLEMENTAL BUDGET NO. 1, GENERAL FUND FOR FISCAL YEAR 2026, IN THE AMOUNT OF TWO BILLION TWO HUNDRED TWELVE MILLION SIX HUNDRED EIGHTEEN THOUSAND AND NINE HUNDRED EIGHTY SEVEN PESOS (P2,212,618,987.00) TO COVER VARIOUS EXPENDITURES OF THE QUEZON CITY GOVERNMENT.**

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**WHEREAS**, Section 321 of Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, provides that the local legislative body may enact supplemental budgets within the current fiscal year given that there are funds actually available as certified by the local treasurer, or new revenue sources to support the additional appropriations;

**WHEREAS**, Ordinance No. SP-3465, S-2025 approved the Annual Budget of the Quezon City Government in the total amount of Forty Three Billion and Three Hundred Thousand Pesos (P43,300,000,000.00) to fund the expenditures of the City Government for Fiscal Year 2026;

**WHEREAS**, there is a need to appropriate a Supplemental Budget in the amount of Two Billion Two Hundred Twelve Million Six Hundred Eighteen Thousand and Nine Hundred Eighty-Seven Pesos (P2,212,618,987.00) to fund various social services programs of the Quezon City Government;

**WHEREAS**, upon the recommendation of the Finance Committee, duly certified by the City Treasure and the City Accountant, the said funds are actually available and there is a need to appropriate the amount of Twelve Million Six Hundred Eighteen Thousand and Nine Hundred Eighty-Seven Pesos (P2,212,618,987.00) to fund various social services programs of the Quezon City Government, and for other purposes;

**WHEREAS**, it is imperative for the *Sangguniang Panlungsod* to approve Supplemental Budget No. 1 General Fund for Fiscal Year 2026 of Quezon City in order to supplement existing appropriations to ensure uninterrupted delivery of vital social services, implement infrastructure developments, and support the administrative operations of the Quezon City Government;

**NOW, THEREFORE,**

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MEMBERS OF THE 23<sup>rd</sup> CITY COUNCIL, IN A REGULAR SESSION DULY ASSEMBLED, THAT:**

**SECTION 1. TITLE.** This Ordinance shall be known as the "**Quezon City Supplemental Budget No. 1 for Fiscal Year 2026.**"

**SECTION 2. SOURCE OF FUNDS.** The total amount of **TWO BILLION TWO HUNDRED TWELVE MILLION SIX HUNDRED EIGHTEEN THOUSAND AND NINE**

**HUNDRED EIGHTY SEVEN PESOS (P2,212,618,987.00)** shall be sourced from the certified free surplus and unappropriated balances of the General Fund as certified by the City Treasurer.

**SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION OF FUNDS.** The aforementioned amount is hereby appropriated to cover various expenditures of the Quezon City Government, distributed as follows:

**SECTION 4. IMPLEMENTATION AND COMPLIANCE.** The disbursement and utilization of the funds appropriated herein shall be subject to existing budgeting, accounting, and auditing laws, rules, and regulations, including the provisions of Republic Act No. 9184 (Government Procurement Reform Act).

**SECTION 5. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE.** If, for any reason, any section or provision of this Ordinance is declared unconstitutional or invalid, the other sections or provisions hereof which are not affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.

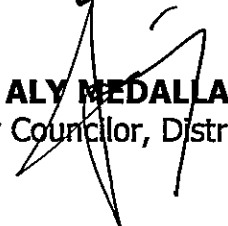
**SECTION 6. EFFECTIVITY.** This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its approval.
