ORDINANCE NO. SP- **3471**, S-2025

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING THE TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT AND SYSTEMATIC PARKING POLICY OF BARANGAY DOÑA AURORA, DISTRICT IV, QUEZON CITY

WHEREAS, Section 16 of Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, provides that:

"Every local government unit shall exercise the powers expressly granted, those necessarily implied therefrom, as well as powers necessary, appropriate, or incidental for its efficient and effective governance, and those which are essential to the promotion of the general welfare. Within their respective territorial jurisdictions, local government units shall ensure and support, among other things, the preservation and enrichment of culture, promote health and safety, enhance the right of the people to a balanced ecology, encourage and support the development of appropriate and self-reliant scientific and technological capabilities, improve public morals, enhance economic prosperity and social justice, promote full employment among their residents, maintain peace and order, and preserve the comfort and convenience of their inhabitants."



WHEREAS, Section 458(a)(5)(vi) of the same Code provides for the powers, duties, and functions of the Sangguniang Panlungsod which include:

“(vi) Regulate traffic on all streets and bridges; prohibit encroachments or obstacles thereon, and when necessary in the interest of public welfare, authorize the removal or encroachments and illegal constructions in public places.”

WHEREAS, Sections 5(e) and (f) of Republic Act No. 7924, creating the Metro Manila Development Authority, have primacy over Section 458(5)(v-vi) of the Local Government Code which empowers the Sangguniang Panlungsod to enact ordinances regulating traffic within their respective cities;

WHEREAS, the inconsiderate and flagrant parking of vehicles on barangay streets despite the fact that the streets are used for mobile vehicles and not as parking space cause traffic congestion in the streets of Barangay Doña Aurora;

WHEREAS, after a detailed study and assessment of the aforementioned parking and traffic problems and situations on the streets of the Barangay, the Sangguniang Barangay of Barangay Doña Aurora, through its Committee on Transportation, deemed it necessary to implement a One-Side Parking Scheme within the jurisdiction of Barangay Doña Aurora to alleviate the current traffic and parking situation in the Barangay.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED:

SECTION 1. TITLE. – This Ordinance shall be known as the “One-Side Parking Ordinance of Barangay Doña Aurora.”

SECTION 2. RATIONALE. – The exacerbating and exasperating traffic problems become a pressing issue within the Barangay for they negatively affect easement, mobility, health, livelihood, and others. Resounding clamor from the constituents goes for a safe, unhampered, and orderly flow of traffic. Hence, a timely need for this Ordinance.

SECTION 3. SCOPE. – This Ordinance shall apply to all road users, whether using motorized and non-motorized vehicles or other means of transportation including push carts, tricycles, motorcycles, electronic vehicles such as electronic bicycles or scooters. This Ordinance shall apply to all roads within the territorial jurisdiction of Barangay Doña Aurora.



SECTION 4. OBJECTIVES. –

- 4.1 Inform, educate, and create awareness relative to the Traffic Management programs and policies to include the systematic parking policy of Barangay Doña Aurora;
- 4.2 Instill discipline, compliance, and cooperation among all road-users for the easement of traffic congestions, road mishaps, and other traffic problems;
- 4.3 Rationalize the use of road space available for a safe, unhampered, and orderly mobility; and
- 4.4 Fine and penalize violators.

SECTION 5. RULES AND REGULATIONS. –

- 5.1 ONE-WAY TRAFFIC FLOW – It is hereby construed that vehicle traverse only in one direction or traffic flow as directed by appropriate signs or signals.
 - a. Lopez Jaena Street, with point of entry from E. Rodriguez Sr. Avenue, up to Sto. Tomas Ext. Street corner N. Ponce Street;
 - b. Lopez Jaena Street, with point of entry from Luskot Street going to N. Ramirez Ext. Street;
 - c. N. Ponce Street, with point of entry from N. Ramirez Ext. to E. Rodriguez Sr. Avenue, except at 5:00 A.M. to 7:00 A.M., 10:00 A.M. to 1:00 P.M., 5:00 P.M. to 7:00 P.M., respectively due to the temporary closing of N. Ponce Street, with point of entry from Luskot Street up to Sto. Tomas Ext. Street, to provide for the safe and orderly ingress and egress of pupils from Aurora Elementary School during classes only;
 - d. P. Paterno Street, with point of entry from E. Rodriguez Sr. Avenue, going to N. Ramirez Ext.;
 - e. Serrano Laktaw Street, with point of entry from Ramirez Ext. Street going to E. Rodriguez Sr. Avenue;



- f. *One-way traffic flow for A. Mabini Street, with point of entry from Jacinto Street to E. Rodriguez Sr. Avenue; and*
- g. *E. Jacinto Street, with point of entry from E. Rodriguez Sr. Avenue to Plaridel Street traffic flow are the same roads tagged as "No Parking Zones."*

5.2 TWO-WAY TRAFFIC FLOW AND NO PARKING ZONES – *The following roads are designated as Two-Way and No-Parking Zones:*

- a. *E. Rodriguez Sr. Avenue;*
- b. *Plaridel Street;*
- c. *Bayani Street;*
- d. *Cordillera Street;*
- e. *Sto. Tomas Ext. Street with point of entry from E. Jacinto Street, up to N. Ponce Street;*
- f. *Luskot Street; and*
- g. *Ramirez Ext. Street with point of entry from Plaridel Street up to N. Ponce Street.*

5.3 ALTERNATING ONE-LANE PARKING – *A One-Lane Parking scheme, wherein vehicles are allowed to park on one side of the road for every 1st day up to the 15th day of the month and alternately on the other side starting the 16th day up to the end of the month and so forth and so on, shall be implemented on the following:*

- a. *Lopez Jaena Street, with point of entry from E. Rodriguez Sr. Avenue, to Sto. Tomas Ext. Street;*
- b. *Lopez Jaena Street, with point of entry from Luskot Street to N. Ramirez Ext.;*
- c. *N. Ponce Street, with point of entry from N. Ramirez Ext. to Luskot Street;*
- d. *P. Paterno Street, with point of entry from E. Rodriguez Sr. Avenue to Sto. Tomas Street;*
- e. *Serrano Laktaw Street, with point of entry from Luskot Street, to E. Rodriguez Sr. Avenue; and*



- f. A. Mabini Street, with point of entry from E. Jacinto Street, corner A. Mabini Street, up to Luskot Street, and A. Mabini Street, with point of entry from Sto. Tomas Ext. to E. Rodriguez Sr. Avenue.

5.4 ONE-SIDE PARKING – When the Alternate One-Lane Parking Scheme is not feasible, a One-Side Parking Scheme shall be implemented on the following:

- a. Lopez Jaena Street with point of entry from Tomas Street (Dead End and side wall of Aurora A. Quezon Elementary School (Left Side);
- b. N. Ponce Street, with point of entry from Luskot Street to Sto. Tomas Ext., (Sidewall of Aurora A. Quezon Elementary School [Left Side]);
- c. P. Paterno Street, with point of entry from Luskot Street to N. Ramirez Ext. (Side wall of commercial parking space [Left Side]);
- d. Serrano Laktaw Street, with point of entry from N. Ramirez Ext. to Luskot Street (Side wall of commercial parking space [Left Side]);
- e. A. Mabini Street, with point of entry in Sto. Tomas Street (Right Side);
- f. E. Jacinto Street side of Barangay Doña Aurora (other side is the jurisdiction of Barangay Doña Imelda);
- g. E. Jacinto Street side of Our Lady of Sacred Heart School (Left Side);
- h. A portion of Sto. Tomas Ext. Street with point of entry from Sto. Tomas Ext. corner Lopez Jaena Street up to Sto. Tomas Ext. Street up to N. Ponce Street (Side of Aurora A. Quezon Elementary School); and
- i. N. Ramirez Ext. with point of entry from N. Ramirez Ext. corner Lopez Jaena Street to N. Ramirez Street corner N. Ponce Street.



5.5 ISSUANCE OF BARANGAY DOÑA AURORA VEHICLE CONTROL STICKER – Registered owners of a vehicle, or unregistered owners with proof of ownership such as, deed of sale and other pertinent or valid documents, shall be issued a vehicle control sticker bearing the seal of Barangay Doña Aurora to be displayed on the vehicles' windshield or to any part of a vehicle, clear and visible for easy identification and shall not impair, or hinder the driver's clear view of traffic signs, symbols, signals and the like.

5.5.1 For security purposes – Any vehicle parked without the vehicle control sticker of Barangay Doña Aurora shall be closely monitored to determine the legal purpose of the driver or passenger/s.

5.5.2 Daytime Parking (Visitors) – Any vehicle parked without the vehicle control sticker of Barangay Doña Aurora will be considered a visitor's vehicle and shall be allowed to be parked within the vicinity of Barangay Doña Aurora but the same shall be closely monitored to ascertain the legal purpose of the driver or passenger/s thereof.

5.5.3 Overnight Parking (Visitors) – Any vehicle other than that with vehicle control sticker of Barangay Doña Aurora shall not be allowed to be parked within the vicinity of Barangay Doña Aurora from 7:00 P.M. to 6:00 A.M. except if the said vehicle was registered or declared by the host resident at the Barangay Public Safety Office. However, said vehicle shall only be allowed for one overnight parking or when an extension is granted if found necessary.

5.5.4 Prevention on the proliferation of vehicles from outside source through parking within the vicinity of Barangay Doña Aurora – Residents shall be prohibited from inviting friends and other acquaintances from outside sources to park their vehicles for free or for a fee within the territorial jurisdiction of Barangay Doña Aurora.

5.5.5 Barangay Database (Vehicles) – A Barangay Database for vehicles shall be maintained to determine and account the volume of residents' vehicles indispensable for future traffic programs and policies.



5.5.6 *Exemption/Immunity from violations – Any vehicle with vehicle control sticker of Barangay Doña Aurora shall not serve as an exemption or immunity of the driver or of the vehicle itself for violations and penalties.*

5.5.7 *Cost of the vehicle control sticker of Barangay Doña Aurora – A reasonable and affordable amount shall be charged for every vehicle control sticker issued to defray the expenses incurred in the production thereof.*

5.6 OTHER PROHIBITED OBSTRUCTIONS.

5.6.1 *Illegal Parking – Vehicles obstructing or otherwise parked in front of any established road right of way, private or public driveways, provision for human ingress and egress, vehicles parked within one meter from a fire hydrant and public safety utility, and vehicles parked within six (6) meters from intersection or corner roads shall be prohibited.*

5.6.2 *Parallel or Double Parking – Considering the limited space available for all roads within Barangay Doña Aurora, parallel or double-parking of vehicles are not feasible and shall be prohibited.*

5.6.3 *Junk vehicle – Any vehicle dilapidated/worn out and no longer in use or in running condition shall not be allowed to be parked on public roads of Barangay Doña Aurora.*

5.6.4 *Reservation of parking spaces – No one is allowed to reserve a portion of a public road and other public open spaces, including the setting up of markings, signs or signages and barriers to denote exclusive use for parking, and all shall strictly comply with the provisions of Quezon City Ordinance No. SP-1465, S-2004 and Quezon City Ordinance No. SP-3423, S-2025.*

5.7 ERECTION AND INTERFERENCE WITH TRAFFIC CONTROL ITEMS SIGNS, SIGNAGES AND MARKINGS – *The Traffic and Transport Management Department and the Sangguniang Barangay are hereby directed to appropriate funds for and to install the necessary traffic signs and announcements to inform all motorists and the general public of the existence and implementation of this Ordinance.*



Traffic control signs, items, signages, and markings shall be placed in all strategic areas visible to the motoring public and must conform with national traffic signs standards.

Disregarding, interfering with, altering, taking down as well as erecting, establishing, placing, maintaining or displaying anything which purport to be or is an imitation to that of the authentic one is tantamount to a violation and shall be penalized herein.

SECTION 6. DEPUTIZATION. – *The Sangguniang Barangay of Barangay Doña Aurora shall designate its personnel, including but not limited to, the Barangay Public Safety Officers (BPSO), as its Barangay Deputized Traffic Enforcers, who shall undergo training and deputization from the Metro Manila Development Authority, to enforce the provisions of this Ordinance through the Traffic and Transport Management Department (TTMD).*

SECTION 7. ENFORCEMENT. – *The TTMD and the Barangay Deputized Traffic Enforcers, as duly deputized, are hereby authorized and empowered to administer and implement all the rules and regulations as provided for in this Ordinance and all existing Quezon City ordinances related to traffic management are hereby adopted.*

SECTION 8. PENALTY. – *Any person found violating any provision of this Ordinance shall be fined in accordance with Quezon City Ordinance No. SP-3172, S-2023 entitled “An Ordinance Revising No. SP-2785, S-2018 or the Revised Traffic Management Code of the Quezon City, pursuant to the Metro Manila Development Authority Resolution No. 2023-02.”*

Where the violator is not a driver, a written notice or citation to the offending party shall be issued by the Deputized Traffic Enforcer.

SECTION 9. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. – *If any section, provision, or part of this Ordinance is held or declared to be unconstitutional, invalid, or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remaining provisions or parts of this Ordinance, and the remaining provisions shall continue to be in full force and effect.*

SECTION 10. REPEALING CLAUSE. – *All ordinances, resolutions, rules and regulations inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed, amended, or modified accordingly.*



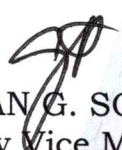
