
RESOLUTION NO. SP- 10252, S-2025

A RESOLUTION STRONGLY SUPPORTING THE GOOD GOVERNANCE ADVOCACY OF THE CITY MAYOR, HONORABLE MA. JOSEFINA G. BELMONTE, TO PRESERVE THE QUEZON CITY GOVERNMENT'S UNBLEMISHED REPUTATION, EXCELLENT PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION, AND OUTSTANDING PUBLIC SERVICE CHARACTERIZED BY TRANSPARENCY, ACCOUNTABILITY, PARTICIPATION, THE RULE OF LAW, EFFECTIVENESS, EFFICIENCY, AND EQUITY

WHEREAS, the Quezon City is well-known not only as a City of stars and a City of good leaders who transformed it into a wealthy and well-managed local government unit, particularly in the areas of fiscal and tax management, but also for emphasizing good governance in the performance of public duty characterized by transparency, accountability, participation, the rule of law, effectiveness, efficiency, and equity;



WHEREAS, at the outset of her incumbency as the Local Chief Executive of Quezon City, City Mayor, Honorable Ma. Josefina G. Belmonte, strengthened the City's advocacy for good governance by instituting various reforms to increase efficiency and effectiveness in public administration, making sure that the City Government's actions and decisions are open to public scrutiny, public officials are held responsible for their actions, and citizens' participation in policy-making processes are widely encouraged to give them the opportunity to express their views on matters that affect their lives;

WHEREAS, in furtherance of her good governance advocacy, when the anomalous flood control projects of the Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) erupted and bomb shelled the entire Country, amid the Senate Investigation, Mayor Belmonte conducted her own investigation to determine if the perennial flooding in Quezon City is associated with the said irregularity;

WHEREAS, the investigation of Mayor Belmonte revealed that in Quezon City, DPWH had numerous flood control projects worth billions of pesos, but only two (2) had been coordinated to the City Government and the rest, including those with poor construction, uncertain locations, duplicated contract costs, questionable details, and those alleged to be "ghost projects" were done clandestinely to the prejudice of the City residents;

WHEREAS, in her tenacious advocacy for good governance, Mayor Belmonte's investigation of the flood control projects anomalies was not bothered by a strong opinion and caution that some of her political allies will be hit or affected, guided by a firm belief that the best interest of the public is of paramount importance;

WHEREAS, while Mayor Belmonte is known for her stellar leadership and utmost dedication in the performance of her duties, she cannot triumphantly achieve the battle for good governance without the unwavering support of her fellow City officials, civil society groups, private sectors, and QCitizens considering the significant challenges that she may face along the way such as the current political uncertainty, deeply embedded corruption, eroding public trust due to inefficient service delivery and waste of public resources, weak civil service capacity and leadership, red tape, and the undermining of government transparency and accountability;


NOW, THEREFORE,
