A RESOLUTION URGING THE QUEZON CITY GOVERNMENT, (THE QUEZON CITY HEALTH DEPARTMENT AND ITS QUEZON CITY EPIDEMIOLOGY AND SURVEILLANCE DIVISION, BARANGAY HEALTH TEAMS, AND OTHER APPROPRIATE OFFICES) TO CONDUCT A COMPREHENSIVE ANTI-LEPTOSPIROSIS DRIVE AND A CITY-WIDE PLAN TO ADDRESS RISING CASES AND PROTECT THE HEALTH AND SAFETY OF QUEZON CITY RESIDENTS


*WHEREAS, leptospirosis is a bacterial disease that can be contracted through contact with water or soil contaminated with the urine of infected animals; it can result in severe illness or death if not promptly treated;*

*WHEREAS, recent reports indicate a rise in leptospirosis cases in various parts of Quezon City, necessitating urgent and coordinated public health action to prevent further spread and protect vulnerable populations, including children, the elderly, and outdoor workers;*

*WHEREAS, the Quezon City Government recognizes the importance of proactive measures, encompassing environmental sanitation, vector/rodent control, public education, vaccination where applicable, and access to timely medical care, to reduce transmission and mitigate outbreaks;*

WHEREAS, the Quezon City Health Department and its Quezon City Epidemiology and Surveillance Division, Barangay Health Teams, and other relevant offices are capable of implementing joint campaigns, surveillance, and preventive activities in partnership with local communities, non-governmental organizations, and private sector stakeholders.


NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, to urge, as it does hereby urge, the Quezon City Government, (the Quezon City Health Department and its Quezon City Epidemiology and Surveillance Division, Barangay Health Teams, and other appropriate offices) to conduct a Comprehensive Anti-Leptospirosis Drive and a City-wide plan to address rising cases and protect the health and safety of Quezon City residents.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that the Quezon City Government, (the Quezon City Health Department, the Quezon City Epidemiology and Surveillance Division, Barangay Health Teams, and appropriate offices) shall:

1. conduct City-wide public information campaigns on leptospirosis prevention, including practical steps to avoid exposure, recognition of early symptoms, and the importance of seeking timely medical care;
2. implement environmental sanitation and rodent/animal control measures in flood-prone and high-risk areas, including cleanup drives, proper waste management, drainage rehabilitation, and sanitary facilities for informal settlements;
3. strengthen surveillance and reporting systems for suspected cases, ensure rapid testing and access to treatment, and facilitate contact tracing where applicable;
4. provide or facilitate access to affordable or free diagnostic tests, antibiotics, and healthcare services for suspected or confirmed cases, including outreach clinics in barangays;
5. promote vaccination where approved and appropriate, in accordance with Department of Health guidance and local health policies, for populations at higher risk if vaccines become available and recommended;
6. engage communities through schools, churches, employers, and local organizations to foster personal hygiene and protective behaviors and to report potential outbreaks;

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
7. ensure that funds, resources, and personnel are mobilized and that a clear timeline and monitoring framework are established to measure outcomes and impact; and
8. submit periodic progress reports to the Sangguniang Panlungsod and coordinate with Barangay Health Teams for localized action.

RESOLVED FINALLY, that copies of this Resolution be furnished to the Quezon City Health Department and its Quezon City Epidemiology Surveillance Division, Barangay Health Teams, the City Mayor, and other relevant offices for appropriate action.


