**A RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE REVISED QUEZON CITY COMPREHENSIVE DEVELOPMENT PLAN FOR THE PERIOD OF 2026-2031**

*WHEREAS, the 1987 Constitution of the Republic of the Philippines provides the overarching legal and moral foundation for sustainable local development planning, as articulated in various provisions that uphold social justice, equitable economic growth, environmental sustainability, and the delivery of essential services. These include:*

- a. Sections 9, 10, 14, 15, 16, and 17, Article II thereof, which mandate the State to promote a just and dynamic social order, uphold social justice and gender equality, protect the right to health and a balanced ecology, and prioritize education, science, and culture;*
- b. Sections 11 and 13, Article XIII thereof, which provide for an integrated approach to health development and the inclusion of persons with disabilities in society;*



- c. Sections 1 and 2(1), Article XIV thereof, which guarantee access to quality education through a complete, adequate, and integrated system;
- d. Sections 1, 6, and 9, Article XII thereof, which outline the goals of a just and inclusive national economy and affirm the social function of property; and
- e. Section 5, Article X thereof, which empowers local government units to create their own sources of revenue and supports autonomy in development planning;

WHEREAS, Section 106 of the Local Government Code of 1991 mandates each local government unit to prepare a comprehensive multi-sectoral development plan to be initiated by its local development council and approved by its Sanggunian, while Section 109 thereof prescribes the functions of the Local Development Council, including the formulation of long-term, medium-term, and annual socio-economic development plans and policies;

WHEREAS, the Quezon City Government, through the City Development Council (CDC), has undertaken the revision of the City's Comprehensive Development Plan (CDP) in response to significant demographic, economic, social, and ecological transformations since the adoption and implementation of the previous plan in 2021, which was officially adopted through Quezon City Resolution No. SP-8524, S-2021, covering the period 2021-2025;

WHEREAS, the Quezon City Government has prioritized the updating of the City's development plans to ensure policy coherence and continuity, while integrating innovative, data-driven strategies aimed at enhancing urban resilience, promoting social inclusivity, and achieving sustainable and equitable growth for Quezon City;

WHEREAS, the formulation of the CDP involved the active participation of the five (5) development sectors represented in the CDC Committees, in coordination with relevant local government departments and agencies, through a series of capacity-building activities, technical workshops, and multi-stakeholder consultations with sectoral representatives, subject matter experts, and national government partners, in adherence to participatory, inclusive, and evidence-based planning principles;

WHEREAS, the CDC of Quezon City, in a special session held on October 15, 2025, passed a Resolution adopting and endorsing to the City Council the Revised Quezon City Development Plan for the period 2026-2031;

WHEREAS, the Revised Quezon City Comprehensive Development Plan 2026-2031 is harmonized with key national and regional development frameworks to ensure vertical alignment and policy coherence, including AmBisyon Natin 2040, the Philippine Development Plan (PDP) 2023-2028, the National Capital Region Regional Development Plan (RDP) 2023-2028, and the Metro Manila Greenprint 2030, thereby reinforcing Quezon City's commitment to contribute to broader national development goals and sustainable urban transformation;

WHEREAS, the Revised Quezon City Comprehensive Development Plan for the period 2026-2031 is aligned with the City's local development agenda and it serves as a key instrument in advancing the realization of its development goals;

WHEREAS, the Revised Quezon City Comprehensive Development Plan (CDP) for the period 2026-2031 consolidates the programs, projects and services designed to carry out the five (5) development sectors goals and objectives that reflect the aspirations and address the needs of the Quezon City and its constituents;

WHEREAS, the adoption of the Revised Quezon City Comprehensive Development Plan is imperative to institutionalize a coherent and integrated development framework that aligns Quezon City's development vision, strategic priorities, and sectoral interventions with its local executive and legislative agenda, ensures consistency with regional and national development frameworks, and supports and aligns the City's contribution to the achievement of global development commitments, including the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, to adopt, as it does hereby adopt, the Revised Quezon City Comprehensive Development Plan for the period of 2026-2031.


