A RESOLUTION URGING THE QUEZON CITY DISASTER RISK REDUCTION AND MANAGEMENT OFFICE (QCDRRMO) AND THE QUEZON CITY ENGINEERING DEPARTMENT TO IDENTIFY THE COMMON FLOOD-PRONE AREAS IN QUEZON CITY AND TO INSTALL APPROPRIATE SIGNAGES THEREIN TO WARN THE COMMUTERS, MOTORISTS, AND TRAVELERS OF POTENTIAL HAZARDS DURING A HEAVY DOWNPOUR


WHEREAS, it has been recently observed that many areas in Quezon City experienced immediate flooding following a heavy downpour;

WHEREAS, floodwaters, which were previously just gutter-deep or knee-deep, are now rising to around waist-deep to chest-deep, thereby inundating properties, houses, and businesses, posing threat to public health, destroying belongings, suspending school classes and work, damaging vital infrastructure, and preventing access to essential public services;

WHEREAS, lack of information on flood-prone areas surprises commuters, motorists, and travelers who remain unaware that the roads they are navigating are unpassable and there is an impending danger awaits them;

WHEREAS, the identification of common flood-prone areas, coupled by the installation of appropriate signages, will raise awareness and guide commuters, motorists, and travelers to avoid passing through flooded zones;

WHEREAS, awareness on flood prone areas will minimize casualties and save government resources, both human and financial, which are often used or allotted for rescue operations, food and medical supplies, and other related public services.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, to urge, as it does hereby urge, the Quezon City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (QCDRRMO) and the Quezon City Engineering Department to identify the common flood-prone areas in Quezon City and to install appropriate signages therein to warn the commuters, motorists, and travelers of potential hazards during a heavy downpour.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that a copy of this Resolution be forwarded to QCDRRMO and the Quezon City Engineering Department for their information and appropriate action.
