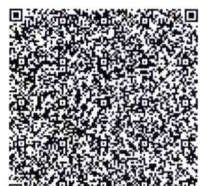

WHEREAS, food security is a critical concern, especially in highly urbanized cities vulnerable to climate change impacts and supply chain disruptions, and a unified plan of action is imperative to ensure a sustainable source of nutritious and affordable food for all citizens;

WHEREAS, the Quezon City Government demonstrates its commitment to health, food security, and sustainability through initiatives such as the "GrowQC" program and the issuance of Quezon City Office of the Mayor Executive Order No. 16, Series of 2021, otherwise known as the "Healthy Public Food Procurement Policy," Quezon City Ordinance No. SP-3252, S-2023, otherwise known as the "Quezon City Healthy Diet for Early Childhood Development Centers, Elementary and High School Students Ordinance," Quezon City Ordinance No. SP-3254, S-2024, otherwise known as the "Calorie Labeling Ordinance of Quezon City," and Quezon City Ordinance No. SP-3430, S-2025, otherwise known as the "Quezon City Vendors' Business School Ordinance";

WHEREAS, the development of a comprehensive and sustainable food security plan requires in-depth research and a feasibility study to gather necessary evidence, understand existing social conditions, and integrate the rights-based approach (RBA) in policy formulation;

WHEREAS, the development the Quezon City Comprehensive Food Policy Framework shall be in line with the Milan Food Policy priorities on engaging all sectors within the food system and developing sustainable food systems that are inclusive, resilient, safe and diverse, that provide healthy and affordable food to all people in a human rights-based framework, that minimize waste and conserve biodiversity while adapting to and mitigating impacts of climate change;

WHEREAS, crafting a Comprehensive Food Policy Framework will support a sustainable and healthy food system that upholds the environment and ensures nutritious food sources for the public.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, to urge, as it does hereby urge, the Quezon City Climate Action Council and the Climate Change and Environmental Sustainability Department (CCESD) to initiate research on developing a Comprehensive Food Policy Framework for Quezon City.


