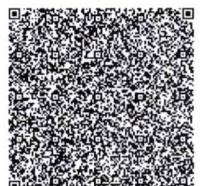

WHEREAS, the passing of Atty. Moises S. Samson on February 21, 2026 is a moment of deep sorrow for the residents of Quezon City, as the community lost a respected leader and a pillar of the First District;

WHEREAS, throughout his life and career, Atty. Samson served as a beacon of professionalism, combining his legal expertise with a genuine heart for public service to uplift the lives of his fellow citizens;



WHEREAS, as a dedicated member of the Sangguniang Panlungsod representing District I during the 12th and 13th City Councils, he played a significant role in the formulation of policies and measures promoting public welfare and good governance;

WHEREAS, during his tenure, he served as Majority Floor Leader and as Chairman of the Committee on Laws, Rules, and Internal Government, and was recognized for his sound legal judgment, principled leadership, and steadfast commitment to upholding the rule of law;

WHEREAS, as a lawyer and legal scholar, he distinguished himself by asserting and defending important principles on the proper exercise of powers within local legislative bodies, positions which were later upheld by the courts and higher judicial authorities;

WHEREAS, his tenure as a City Councilor was marked by an unwavering commitment to his constituents, demonstrating that true leadership is rooted in integrity, humility, and a tireless work ethic;

WHEREAS, among his landmark legislative accomplishments was the authorship and sponsorship of the Real Property Tax Amnesty Ordinance, which granted 100% amnesty on interests, penalties, and other charges on delinquent real property taxes;

WHEREAS, he championed public safety and road discipline through a pioneering ordinance regulating the use of cellular phones and other electronic gadgets while driving, a measure that influenced subsequent traffic regulations;

WHEREAS, Atty. Samson advocated for accessible public health services, including the 24-hour operation of barangay health centers to ensure timely medical care for the underprivileged;

WHEREAS, his dedication earned him recognition as an Outstanding Councilor and Outstanding Punong Barangay, as well as several awards from Rotary International District 3780, including the Governor's Achievement Award;

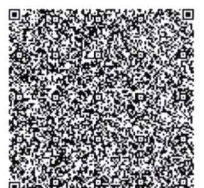
