*WHEREAS, the Constitution and existing national and local policies promote environmental protection, climate action, sustainable development, and gender-responsive governance as essential components of inclusive and resilient communities;*

*WHEREAS, women play a vital role in household and community-level environmental practices, including waste reduction, reuse, recycling, repair, composting, and sustainable consumption, positioning them as key drivers of circular economy initiatives;*



WHEREAS, the circular economy framework advances sustainability by reducing waste, extending the life cycle of materials, and promoting environmentally-responsible production and consumption, while also creating opportunities for livelihood and community-based enterprises;

WHEREAS, women, particularly mothers, solo parents, and community leaders, have demonstrated leadership in grassroots environmental initiatives, eco-entrepreneurship, upcycling, and other sustainable livelihood activities that contribute to both environmental protection and economic empowerment;

WHEREAS, the Quezon City Government, through its Climate Change and Environmental Sustainability Department (CCESD), has been implementing programs and policies that promote climate resilience, waste reduction, and environmental sustainability;

WHEREAS, there is a need to further encourage the integration of gender-responsive approaches in environmental programs and circular economy initiatives to ensure that women are actively included as participants, leaders, and beneficiaries.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, to encourage, as it does hereby encourage, women's participation in circular economy and sustainable environmental practices in Quezon City.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that the Quezon City Climate Change and Environmental Sustainability Department (CCESD), in coordination with the Gender and Development (GAD) Council Office and other concerned City departments, is encouraged to support and strengthen women-inclusive and women-led circular economy initiatives as part of the City's sustainability and climate action programs.

RESOLVED FURTHERMORE, that barangays are encouraged to support community-based circular economy and environmental initiatives involving women, such as materials recovery projects, eco-crafts, upcycling enterprises, composting activities, and environmental education programs.


