A RESOLUTION ENCOURAGING THE PROTECTION, SUPPORT, AND SOCIAL SECURITY COVERAGE OF INFORMAL AND GIG ECONOMY WORKERS IN QUEZON CITY

WHEREAS, informal and gig economy workers, including delivery riders, freelancers, home-based workers, online sellers, and contractual platform workers, form a growing and essential part of Quezon City's workforce;



WHEREAS, many informal and gig workers face job insecurity, irregular income, insufficient social protection, and limited access to labor information and government services;

WHEREAS, access to social security, health insurance, skills training, and employment information is essential in promoting decent work, dignity, and economic resilience for informal and gig workers;

WHEREAS, the local government, in coordination with national agencies such as the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE), Social Security System (SSS), PhilHealth, Pag-Ibig Fund, Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA), and the Public Employment Service Office (PESO), can help expand awareness and access to available protection and support programs;

WHEREAS, barangays and local communities play a vital role in identifying informal and gig workers and linking them to appropriate government assistance and employment services.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, to encourage, as it does hereby encourage, the protection, support, and social security coverage of informal and gig economy workers in Quezon City.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that concerned City departments are encouraged to coordinate with Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE), Social Security System (SSS), PhilHealth, Pag-Ibig Fund, Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA), and Public Employment Service Office (PESO) to promote registration, orientation, skills training, and access to social protection programs for informal and gig workers.

RESOLVED FURTHERMORE, that Barangays are encouraged to assist in the identification of informal and gig workers in their communities, disseminate information on available programs, and support community-based employment and livelihood initiatives.


