WHEREAS, Overseas Filipino Workers have made significant contributions to the national and local economy through their labor, skills, and remittances;



WHEREAS, many returning OFWs face challenges in reintegration, including unemployment, skills mismatch, financial strain, and psychosocial stress after working abroad;

WHEREAS, effective reintegration programs that include livelihood support, employment facilitation, skills recognition, and financial literacy are essential to ensure a smooth transition back into the local workforce;

WHEREAS, the local government, in coordination with national agencies such as the Department of Migrant Workers (DMW), the Overseas Workers Welfare Administration (OWWA), the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE), the Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA), and the Public Employment Service Office (PESO), can help strengthen reintegration pathways for returning OFWs;

WHEREAS, supporting returning OFWs contributes to local economic development, family stability, and inclusive growth.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, to encourage, as it does hereby encourage, reintegration, livelihood, and employment support programs for returning Overseas Filipino Workers (OFWs) in Quezon City.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that concerned City departments are encouraged to coordinate with the Department of Migrant Workers (DMW), the Overseas Workers Welfare Administration (OWWA), the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE), the Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA), the Public Employment Service Office (PESO), and relevant partner institutions to provide employment matching, livelihood assistance, skills upgrading, certification, and financial literacy programs for returning OFWs.

RESOLVED FURTHERMORE, that Barangays are encouraged to assist in identifying returning OFWs, disseminating information on available programs, and supporting community-based reintegration initiatives.


