WHEREAS, collaboration between local government units and faith-based organizations can enhance the reach, effectiveness, and sustainability of social development initiatives;

WHEREAS, barangays and City offices serve as important platforms for coordination and partnership with faith-based organizations in addressing community needs;

WHEREAS, partnerships with faith-based organizations promote volunteerism, compassion, and shared responsibility while respecting religious diversity and the separation of church and state;

WHEREAS, the Quezon City Government recognizes the value of inclusive and voluntary partnerships with faith-based organizations in advancing social development and community well-being.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, to encourage, as it does hereby encourage, partnerships with faith-based organizations for social development programs in Quezon City.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that barangays be encouraged to coordinate with faith-based organizations in the planning and implementation of social development initiatives such as health services, feeding programs, disaster preparedness and response, educational support, and community outreach activities.

RESOLVED FURTHERMORE, that concerned City offices be encouraged to collaborate with faith-based organizations, as appropriate, in aligning social development programs with community needs, subject to existing laws, policies, and guidelines.

RESOLVED FURTHERMORE, that youth organizations, including the Sangguniang Kabataan, be encouraged to participate in faith-based partnership initiatives that promote volunteerism, civic engagement, and social responsibility among the youth.
