A RESOLUTION ENCOURAGING THE ACTIVE PROMOTION OF MUSEUMS LOCATED IN QUEZON CITY, INCLUDING CITY-OWNED AND CITY-MANAGED MUSEUMS AS WELL AS NATIONAL MUSEUMS LOCATED WITHIN THE CITY, TO STRENGTHEN CULTURAL AWARENESS, EDUCATION, AND TOURISM

WHEREAS, Quezon City is home to important museums and heritage spaces that reflect the City's history, identity, cultural development, and contribution to national life;

WHEREAS, museums serve as vital platforms for education, cultural appreciation, creative learning, and historical understanding, especially for students, families, and young people;

WHEREAS, there is a need to further promote museums located in Quezon City to increase public awareness, visitation, and integration into educational, cultural, and tourism programs of the City;

WHEREAS, Quezon City has City-owned and City-managed museums, including Bahay ni Quezon, Bahay Modernismo, the Women's Museum, and the QCX – Quezon City Experience Museum, which is currently under construction;

WHEREAS, Quezon City also hosts national museums owned and managed by the National Historical Commission of the Philippines, including the Museo ni Manuel L. Quezon and the Presidential Car Museum, which, while nationally-owned, are located within the City and are contributory to its cultural and tourism landscape;

WHEREAS, stronger coordination among City offices, schools, tourism stakeholders, and cultural institutions can help maximize the educational and cultural value of these museums for QCitizens and visitors alike.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, to encourage, as it does hereby encourage, the active promotion of museums located in Quezon City, including City-owned and City-managed museums as well as National museums located within the City, to strengthen cultural awareness, education, and tourism.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that concerned City offices be encouraged to highlight and promote City-owned and City-managed museums, namely Bahay ni Quezon, Bahay Modernismo, the Women's Museum, and the QCX – Quezon City Experience Museum, through information campaigns, educational programs, and tourism materials.

RESOLVED FURTHERMORE, that coordination with the National Historical Commission of the Philippines be encouraged to support the promotion of national museums located in Quezon City, including the Museo ni Manuel L. Quezon and the Presidential Car Museum, in a manner consistent with their national mandate.

RESOLVED FURTHERMORE, that public and private schools in Quezon City be encouraged to include museum visits and museum-based learning activities as part of educational enrichment, subject to applicable guidelines.

RESOLVED FURTHERMORE, that the Quezon City Tourism Department and other concerned offices be encouraged to integrate these museums into City tourism routes, family-oriented activities, and cultural promotion programs.

RESOLVED FINALLY, that copies of this Resolution be furnished to all concerned City offices, educational institutions, cultural agencies, and relevant stakeholders for their information, guidance, and appropriate action.


