**A RESOLUTION ENCOURAGING THE DEVELOPMENT OF NIGHT ECONOMY AND NIGHT MARKET ZONES IN QUEZON CITY TO SUPPORT LOCAL BUSINESSES, PROMOTE TOURISM, AND STIMULATE ECONOMIC ACTIVITY DURING EVENING HOURS**

*WHEREAS, the 1987 Constitution of the Republic of the Philippines recognizes the role of entrepreneurship and private enterprise in national development and encourages initiatives that stimulate economic growth and employment opportunities;*

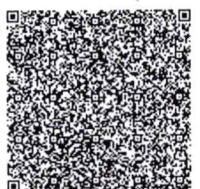
*WHEREAS, Quezon City is one of the largest economic centers in the Philippines, hosting a wide range of restaurants, retail establishments, entertainment venues, and small businesses that contribute significantly to the local economy;*

*WHEREAS, many global cities have successfully developed night economy initiatives such as night markets, evening food districts, cultural events, and extended commercial hours that stimulate tourism and support small businesses;*

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WHEREAS, night markets and evening commercial activities provide opportunities for micro, small, and medium enterprises (MSMEs), food vendors, artisans, and creative entrepreneurs to reach more customers and increase their income;

WHEREAS, properly managed night economy zones may also promote community engagement, cultural activities, and safe public spaces during evening hours;

WHEREAS, encouraging responsible and well-coordinated night economy initiatives may create additional livelihood opportunities while promoting tourism and economic vibrancy in Quezon City.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, to encourage, as it does hereby encourage, the development of night economy and night market zones in Quezon City to support local businesses, promote tourism, and stimulate economic activity during evening hours.

RESOLVED FURTHER, to encourage the Quezon City Government, through the Quezon City Tourism Department, the Small Business and Cooperatives Development and Promotions Office (SBCDPO), the Business Permits and Licensing Department (BPLD), the Department of Public Order and Safety (DPOS), and other concerned offices, to study and explore the establishment of night markets, evening food districts, and similar economic activities in appropriate areas of the City;

RESOLVED FURTHERMORE, to encourage barangays to support community-based night markets, evening bazaars, or cultural activities within their respective areas in coordination with the Quezon City Government and concerned stakeholders.

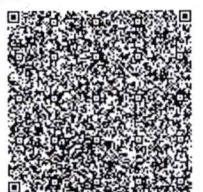
RESOLVED FURTHERMORE, to encourage the Sangguniang Kabataan (SK) and youth organizations to assist in organizing cultural performances, youth markets, and community events that may be integrated into night market activities.

RESOLVED FURTHERMORE, to encourage non-governmental organizations (NGOs), community groups, and cultural organizations to collaborate with the Quezon City Government in organizing safe, inclusive, and culturally-enriching evening activities within designated night economy zones.

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*RESOLVED FURTHERMORE, to encourage schools and universities in Quezon City to participate in entrepreneurship fairs, food festivals, and cultural showcases that may be integrated into night market initiatives.*

*RESOLVED FINALLY, to encourage private sector partners, restaurants, retail establishments, business associations, and commercial centers to collaborate with the Quezon City Government in supporting responsible night economy activities that promote tourism, local commerce, and community engagement.*
