WHEREAS, many women, particularly solo parents, returning mothers, displaced workers, informal workers, and women affected by economic disruptions, face barriers to employment, skills upgrading, and access to sustainable livelihood opportunities;

WHEREAS, skills training, reskilling, and upskilling programs are essential in improving employability, support career transitions, and promoting decent work for women;

WHEREAS, local government units, in coordination with national agencies such as the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE), the Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA), the Public Employment Service Office (PESO), and partner institutions, can help expand access to inclusive and flexible training opportunities;



WHEREAS, promoting women-centered employment initiatives contributes to economic resilience, family stability, and gender-responsive local governance.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, to support, as it does hereby support, skills training, reskilling, and employment programs for women workers in Quezon City.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that concerned City departments are encouraged to coordinate with the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE), the Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA), the Public Employment Service Office (PESO), educational institutions, and private sector partners to provide accessible, community-based, and flexible training programs tailored to the needs of women workers.

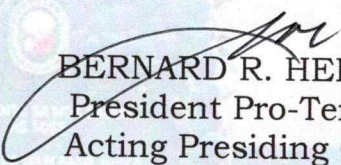

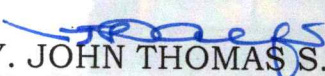
