A RESOLUTION RECOMMENDING THE IMPLEMENTATION OF A SOLARIZATION AND RENEWABLE ENERGY PROGRAM FOR QUEZON CITY GOVERNMENT FACILITIES AND BARANGAYS IN SUPPORT OF THE NATIONAL ENERGY EMERGENCY RESPONSE

WHEREAS, the President of the Republic of the Philippines has declared a State of National Energy Emergency, emphasizing the need to ensure energy security and sustainability;

WHEREAS, the transition to renewable energy sources such as solar power is a key strategy in reducing dependence on traditional fuel sources and mitigating energy supply risks;

WHEREAS, Quezon City government facilities, including barangay halls, health centers, schools, and public buildings, can benefit from renewable energy solutions to reduce operational costs and ensure energy reliability;

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WHEREAS, the adoption of solar energy systems can provide long-term savings, environmental benefits, and increased resilience during power disruptions;

WHEREAS, local government units play a vital role in promoting sustainable energy practices and leading by example in the transition to renewable energy.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, to recommend, as it does hereby recommend, the implementation of a solarization and renewable energy program for Quezon City Government facilities and Barangays in support of the national energy emergency response.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that the Quezon City Government, through the General Services Department (GSD), City Engineering Department, and other relevant offices, is hereby encouraged to:

1. identify priority facilities suitable for solar panel installation, including barangay halls, health centers, and public schools;
2. develop a phased implementation plan for solarization across City-owned facilities;
3. explore funding mechanisms, partnerships, and incentives for renewable energy projects;
4. ensure proper maintenance and monitoring of installed systems; and
5. coordinate with national agencies such as the Department of Energy for technical assistance and support.

RESOLVED FURTHERMORE, that barangays are encouraged to explore renewable energy solutions within their respective jurisdictions.

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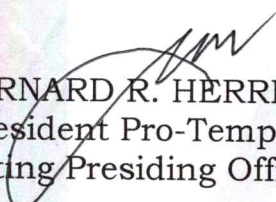
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RESOLVED FINALLY, that copies of this Resolution be furnished to all concerned offices for their information, guidance, and appropriate action.

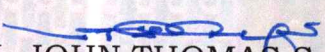

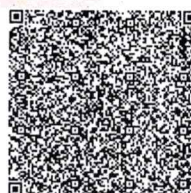
