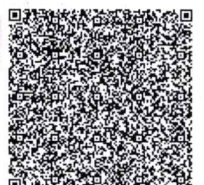

WHEREAS, the month of March is observed nationwide as Fire Prevention Month, emphasizing the importance of heightened vigilance and preparedness during the hot and dry season when fire incidents significantly increase;

WHEREAS, Quezon City is composed of diverse communities, including densely-populated residential areas, commercial zones, and informal settlements, many of which face elevated fire risks due to congestion, limited access roads, and electrical overloading;

WHEREAS, barangays serve as the frontline units of governance and play a critical role in disaster risk reduction, community awareness, and immediate emergency response;

WHEREAS, conducting community-based fire risk assessments allows barangays to identify high-risk areas, check the accessibility of fire trucks, monitor the condition of fire hydrants, and evaluate the readiness of volunteer brigades;



WHEREAS, strengthening coordination with the Bureau of Fire Protection and the Quezon City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office can further enhance local preparedness efforts and promote compliance with fire safety standards;

WHEREAS, proactive planning, community drills, and localized awareness campaigns significantly reduce casualties, property damage, and disruption of livelihoods in the event of fire incidents.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, to encourage, as it does hereby encourage, all barangays in Quezon City to conduct community-based fire risk assessments and strengthen their local fire preparedness and response mechanisms.

RESOLVED FINALLY, that copies of this Resolution be furnished to all barangays and concerned offices for their information and guidance.
