A RESOLUTION URGING THE INSTALLATION OF SAFETY BARRIERS, ANTI-FALL MEASURES, AND ENHANCED MONITORING IN ELEVATED TRAIN STATIONS AND OTHER PUBLIC INFRASTRUCTURE LOCATED ABOVE MAJOR ROADWAYS TO PROTECT CHILDREN, COMMUTERS, AND MOTORISTS

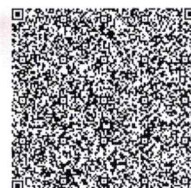

WHEREAS, Quezon City is home to several elevated train stations and public transport facilities that traverse or are located above major roadways, including high-volume highways;

WHEREAS, recent incidents involving individuals, including minors, falling or jumping from elevated public infrastructure have resulted in tragic loss of life, serious injuries, and unintended harm to motorists and commuters;

WHEREAS, such incidents reveal vulnerabilities in the physical design, monitoring, and preventive safeguards of elevated transport facilities, particularly those situated above busy road networks;



WHEREAS, children and minors are among the most vulnerable users of public spaces, and the State, local government units, and transport authorities share the duty to ensure that public infrastructure is designed and maintained with their safety in mind;

WHEREAS, the absence or inadequacy of safety barriers, anti-fall mechanisms, and early detection systems may expose not only commuters but also innocent motorists to harm and legal consequences arising from sudden and unavoidable incidents;

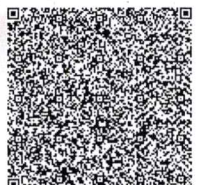
WHEREAS, preventive and proactive safety measures are essential to avoid similar tragedies in the future and to promote a safer urban environment for all.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, to urge, as it does hereby urge, the installation of safety barriers, anti-fall measures, and enhanced monitoring in elevated train stations and other public infrastructure located above major roadways to protect children, commuters, and motorists.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that the Department of Transportation (DOTr), the Light Rail Transit Authority (LRTA), the Metro Rail Transit Corporation (MRTC), concerned station operators, and other relevant agencies are hereby urged to undertake the following:

1. conduct a safety audit of elevated train stations and similar public infrastructure located above major roadways, particularly within Quezon City;
2. install appropriate physical safety measures, including, but not limited to safety barriers, protective fencing, and anti-fall or anti-jump netting, especially in high-risk areas;
3. enhance monitoring and prevention mechanisms through adequate closed-circuit television coverage, trained station personnel, and clear protocols for identifying and assisting distressed or at-risk individuals, particularly minors; and
4. prioritize the implementation of these measures in stations situated above high-traffic highways and major thoroughfares.



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RESOLVED FINALLY, that copies of this Resolution be furnished to the concerned national agencies, transport authorities, and relevant local government offices for their information and appropriate action.
