*WHEREAS, the Quezon City Government is committed to protecting the
health, safety, and well-being of its residents;*

*WHEREAS, climate change has contributed to rising temperatures and
more frequent extreme heat events that pose significant health risks to the
public;*

*WHEREAS, prolonged exposure to high temperatures may lead to heat
exhaustion, dehydration, and heat stroke, which may particularly affect
children, senior citizens, outdoor workers, commuters, and other vulnerable
sectors;*

*WHEREAS, public health experts emphasize the importance of
hydration, access to shade, and cool environments in preventing heat-related
illnesses;*

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WHEREAS, many cities around the world have adopted the concept of cooling stations or cooling centers during periods of extreme heat to provide temporary relief for residents;

WHEREAS, Quezon City, as one of the largest urban centers in the Philippines, has a responsibility to promote awareness and encourage preventive measures that can help protect residents from heat-related health risks;

WHEREAS, this Resolution strongly supports the Heat Action Plan of Quezon City and the Enhanced Local Climate Change Action Plan (ELCCAP) 2021-2050.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, to strongly support, as it does hereby strongly support, the establishment of community cooling and hydration stations in Quezon City during periods of extreme heat.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that barangays are encouraged to designate accessible areas such as barangay halls, covered courts, community centers, waiting sheds, transport terminals, and other shaded public spaces that may serve as temporary cooling areas for residents and commuters during extreme heat.

RESOLVED FURTHERMORE, that private establishments such as malls, commercial buildings, restaurants, convenience stores, and other businesses are likewise encouraged to voluntarily allow access to shaded or cooled areas, or provide drinking water stations that may help residents and commuters temporarily seek relief from extreme heat.

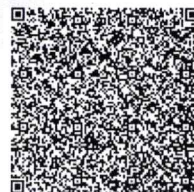
RESOLVED FURTHERMORE, that managers of transport terminals, transport hubs, and major waiting areas for commuters are encouraged to provide shaded areas, seating spaces, and hydration access where feasible to help protect commuters from extreme heat.

RESOLVED FURTHERMORE, that barangays and Sangguniang Kabataan (SK) Councils are encouraged to organize community information campaigns promoting proper hydration, heat illness awareness, and safety reminders during hot weather conditions.

RESOLVED FURTHERMORE, that community volunteers, youth organizations, and civic groups are encouraged to support initiatives such as providing drinking water stations, distributing water to outdoor workers and commuters, and promoting awareness on heat-related health risks.

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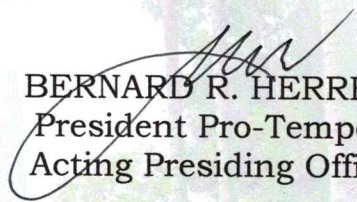
RESOLVED FURTHERMORE, that public awareness campaigns be encouraged to inform residents about the signs and symptoms of heat exhaustion and heat stroke and the appropriate first aid response.

RESOLVED FINALLY, that copies of this Resolution be furnished to the Quezon City Health Department, the Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Department, the Parks Development and Administration Department, all barangays in Quezon City, and other concerned offices for their information and appropriate action.
