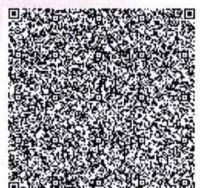
A RESOLUTION ENCOURAGING THE ESTABLISHMENT AND STRENGTHENING OF A QUEZON CITY NUTRITION DATA MONITORING AND INFORMATION SYSTEM TO IMPROVE THE COLLECTION, CONSOLIDATION, AND UTILIZATION OF NUTRITION DATA FOR EVIDENCE-BASED PROGRAMS AND POLICIES

WHEREAS, the Quezon City Government recognizes that accurate and timely nutrition data are essential in designing effective programs to address malnutrition, stunting, wasting, and obesity among children and families;

WHEREAS, various nutrition-related programs in Quezon City such as Operation Timbang Plus, school-based nutrition monitoring, and Child Development Center nutrition assessments generate valuable data that can guide public health interventions;



WHEREAS, consolidating nutrition data into an integrated City-level monitoring system can help identify trends, priority communities, and program gaps in order to strengthen nutrition programs and services;

WHEREAS, improved nutrition data systems support evidence-based policy making and allow the Quezon City Government to better allocate resources and implement targeted interventions;

WHEREAS, strengthening nutrition monitoring requires cooperation among the local government unit, barangays, schools, community organizations, and the private sector;

WHEREAS, this proposed measure is anchored on Quezon City Ordinances on nutrition promotion, health monitoring, nutrition information systems, and preventive healthcare measures.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, to encourage, as it does hereby encourage, the establishment and strengthening of a Quezon City Nutrition Data Monitoring and Information System to improve the collection, consolidation, and utilization of nutrition data for evidence-based programs and policies.

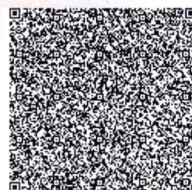
RESOLVED FURTHER, that the Quezon City Government, through the Quezon City Health Department, the Quezon City Nutrition Committee, the Social Services Development Department, and other relevant offices, is encouraged to strengthen systems for collecting, analyzing, and consolidating nutrition data from various City programs and institutions.

RESOLVED FURTHERMORE, that the concerned departments of the Quezon City Government may coordinate with schools, health centers, and Child Development Centers in ensuring that nutrition data are regularly monitored and appropriately shared to improve program planning.

RESOLVED FURTHERMORE, that barangays are encouraged to assist in the collection and reporting of nutrition data through barangay health workers and barangay nutrition scholars, particularly in identifying children who may require nutrition support services.

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RESOLVED FURTHERMORE, that the Sangguniang Kabataan (SK) Councils may assist in promoting community awareness on nutrition monitoring activities and supporting youth-led information campaigns on health and nutrition.

RESOLVED FURTHERMORE, that community organizations and non-governmental organizations may collaborate with the Quezon City Government in conducting community-based nutrition monitoring activities and supporting outreach programs that promote proper nutrition.

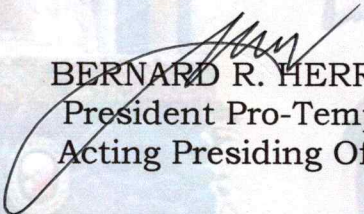
RESOLVED FURTHERMORE, that the private sector, particularly technology partners and corporate organizations, may support initiatives that strengthen nutrition information systems through partnerships, digital innovation, and corporate social responsibility programs.

RESOLVED FINALLY, that copies of this Resolution be furnished to the Quezon City Health Department, the Social Services Development Department, the Quezon City Nutrition Committee, and all barangays in Quezon City for their information and appropriate action.
