A RESOLUTION ENCOURAGING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF COMMUNITY EMERGENCY SUPPLY DEPOTS IN STRATEGIC FLOOD-PRONE AND HIGH-RISK AREAS IN QUEZON CITY TO IMPROVE DISASTER RESPONSE CAPACITY AND COMMUNITY RESILIENCE

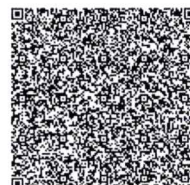

WHEREAS, Quezon City experiences various natural and human-induced hazards such as flooding, fires, earthquakes, and severe weather events that may disrupt transportation, communication, and access to essential supplies during emergencies;

WHEREAS, the immediate availability of emergency equipment and basic relief supplies during the first critical hours of a disaster can significantly improve rescue operations and protect lives and property;

WHEREAS, community-level emergency supply depots strategically located in high-risk areas can help ensure that basic rescue tools, first aid materials, emergency lighting, water purification equipment, and other life-saving supplies are accessible even before external responders arrive;



WHEREAS, decentralizing disaster response resources within communities strengthens local preparedness and empowers residents to respond quickly and effectively while awaiting additional assistance from city authorities;

WHEREAS, the Quezon City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Department (QCDRRMD), in coordination with relevant city departments, plays a vital role in strengthening disaster preparedness systems and promoting community-based disaster risk reduction initiatives;

WHEREAS, encouraging barangays, community organizations, and private sector partners to support the establishment and maintenance of community emergency supply depots can greatly enhance the overall disaster resilience of Quezon City.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, to encourage, as it does hereby encourage, the establishment of community emergency supply depots in strategic flood-prone and high-risk areas in Quezon City to improve disaster response capacity and community resilience.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that the Quezon City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Department (QCDRRMD), in coordination with the Department of Public Order and Safety (DPOS), the City Engineering Department, the Social Services Development Department (SSDD), and other relevant city offices, is encouraged to assist in identifying appropriate locations and guidelines for the establishment of such depots.

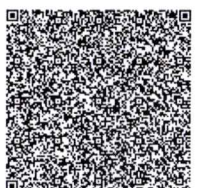
RESOLVED FURTHERMORE, that these depots may contain essential emergency supplies such as rescue tools, first aid kits, emergency lighting, communication devices, portable water filtration systems, life vests, inflatable boats where applicable, and other equipment necessary for immediate community response.

RESOLVED FURTHERMORE, that barangays are encouraged to work with community leaders, homeowners associations, and civic organizations in identifying secure and accessible locations for the storage and maintenance of emergency supplies within their jurisdictions.

RESOLVED FURTHERMORE, that Sangguniang Kabataan councils are encouraged to assist in volunteer activities, disaster preparedness campaigns, and youth participation initiatives supporting community emergency readiness.

RESOLVED FURTHERMORE, that civil society organizations, non-governmental organizations, community groups, and academic institutions are encouraged to collaborate with the Quezon City Government in supporting training, resource mobilization, and awareness programs related to community disaster preparedness.

RESOLVED FINALLY, that businesses, private establishments, and other private sector stakeholders are encouraged, where applicable, to support the establishment of emergency supply depots through partnerships, donations of equipment, or corporate social responsibility programs that promote community safety and disaster resilience.

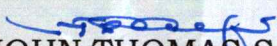
