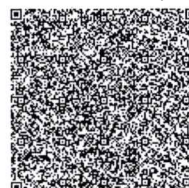
A RESOLUTION ENCOURAGING THE CLIMATE CHANGE AND ENVIRONMENTAL SUSTAINABILITY DEPARTMENT (CCESD), IN COORDINATION WITH CONCERNED CITY DEPARTMENTS, TO DEVELOP AND PUBLISH A REGULAR PLASTIC AND SOLID WASTE ENFORCEMENT SCORECARD TO STRENGTHEN THE IMPLEMENTATION OF EXISTING ENVIRONMENTAL ORDINANCES IN QUEZON CITY

WHEREAS, Quezon City has been recognized as one of the leading local governments in the Philippines in advancing environmental protection and sustainable development initiatives;

WHEREAS, the Quezon City Government has enacted landmark policies to reduce plastic waste and promote responsible consumption, including Ordinance No. SP-2868, S-2019, which regulates the use of plastic bags, and Ordinance No. SP-2876, S-2019, which regulates single-use plastics and disposable materials within the City;



WHEREAS, these measures were enacted to address the growing problem of plastic pollution which contributes to the degradation of the environment, flooding caused by clogged drainage systems, and threats to public health and ecosystems;

WHEREAS, effective implementation of environmental policies requires consistent monitoring, transparency, and public awareness, particularly in ensuring compliance among commercial establishments, institutions, and the general public;

WHEREAS, the development of a Plastic and Solid Waste Enforcement Scorecard may serve as a tool to measure and publicly communicate progress in the enforcement of environmental policies, including data on inspections conducted, compliance rates, warnings issued, and enforcement actions taken;

WHEREAS, such a Scorecard may help strengthen accountability, encourage compliance among establishments, and support evidence-based policy improvements for environmental protection;

WHEREAS, transparency in environmental enforcement empowers barangays, civil society organizations, businesses, and residents to actively participate in the City's sustainability efforts.

NOW, THEREFORE,

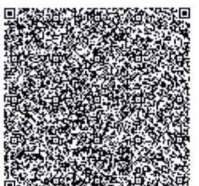
BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, to encourage, as it does hereby encourage, the Climate Change and Environmental Sustainability Department (CCESD), in coordination with concerned city departments, to develop and publish a regular Plastic and Solid Waste Enforcement Scorecard to strengthen the implementation of existing environmental ordinances in Quezon City.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that the proposed Scorecard may include among others: data on inspections conducted, number of establishments found compliant or non-compliant with plastic and waste regulations, warnings or penalties issued, and other indicators that may help assess the effectiveness of environmental policy enforcement.

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RESOLVED FINALLY, that copies of this Resolution be furnished to the Climate Change and Environmental Sustainability Department (CCESD), the Business Permits and Licensing Department (BPLD), the Department of Public Order and Safety (DPOS), the Quezon City Health Department (QCHD), and other concerned offices for their information and appropriate action.

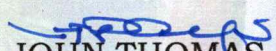
