A RESOLUTION ENCOURAGING THE IMPROVEMENT OF ACCESSIBILITY IN PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION TERMINALS, TRANSPORT STOPS, AND RELATED TRANSPORT FACILITIES IN QUEZON CITY TO BETTER SERVE PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES (PWDs), SENIOR CITIZENS, AND OTHER MOBILITY-CHALLENGED INDIVIDUALS

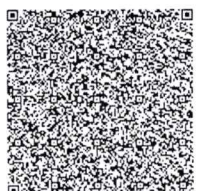
WHEREAS, the Constitution of the Republic of the Philippines recognizes the rights of persons with disabilities to participate fully in society and mandates the State to promote their welfare and integration into the mainstream of society;

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 7277, otherwise known as the Magna Carta for Persons with Disabilities, promotes accessibility and equal opportunities for persons with disabilities in public services and facilities;

WHEREAS, Batas Pambansa Bilang 344 or the Accessibility Law requires the provision of facilities that enhance the mobility of persons with disabilities in public infrastructure and transportation-related facilities;

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WHEREAS, accessible transportation systems play a crucial role in enabling persons with disabilities, senior citizens, and other mobility-challenged individuals to access employment, education, healthcare, and other essential services;

WHEREAS, improving accessibility in transport terminals, waiting areas, pedestrian crossings, sidewalks, and loading or unloading zones can significantly improve mobility and independence for persons with disabilities, senior citizens, and other mobility-challenged individuals;

WHEREAS, Quezon City continues to promote inclusive mobility and accessible public infrastructure through the coordinated efforts of various city departments and stakeholders.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, to encourage, as it does hereby encourage, the improvement of accessibility in public transportation terminals, transport stops, and related transport facilities in Quezon City to better serve Persons with Disabilities (PWDs), senior citizens, and other mobility-challenged individuals.

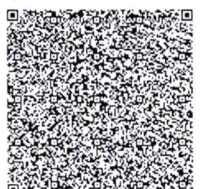
RESOLVED FURTHER, that the Quezon City Government, through relevant offices including the Traffic and Transport Management Department (TTMD), the Persons with Disability Affairs Office (PDAO), the Department of Public Order and Safety (DPOS), the City Engineering Department, the Department of the Building Official, the General Services Department (GSD), and other concerned offices, is encouraged to promote accessibility features in transport-related facilities such as ramps, accessible pathways, priority seating areas, and clearly marked loading and unloading zones.

RESOLVED FURTHERMORE, that barangays are encouraged to identify transport access concerns within their communities, including pedestrian crossings, waiting sheds, and loading zones, and coordinate with the city government to improve accessibility for PWDs, senior citizens, and other mobility-challenged individuals.

RESOLVED FURTHERMORE, that the Sangguniang Kabataan (SK), youth organizations, and community groups are encouraged to promote awareness campaigns on inclusive mobility and respect for priority access facilities for PWDs and senior citizens, and other mobility-challenged individuals.

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RESOLVED FURTHERMORE, that non-governmental organizations, civil society groups, and advocacy organizations are encouraged to collaborate with the Quezon City Government in promoting accessible transportation programs and in providing recommendations to improve mobility for PWDs, senior citizens, and other mobility-challenged individuals.

RESOLVED FURTHERMORE, that transport operators, transport terminal managers, and private sector partners are encouraged to support accessibility improvements and inclusive mobility initiatives that benefit persons with disabilities, senior citizens, and other mobility-challenged individuals.

RESOLVED FINALLY, that copies of this Resolution be furnished to concerned city departments, barangays, transport stakeholders, and relevant organizations for their information and appropriate action.
