A RESOLUTION ENCOURAGING THE QUEZON CITY GOVERNMENT, THROUGH THE SOCIAL SERVICES DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT (SSDD), BARANGAYS, AND OTHER CONCERNED OFFICES, TO STRENGTHEN INFORMATION AND EDUCATION CAMPAIGNS REGARDING THE RIGHTS, BENEFITS, AND SERVICES AVAILABLE TO SOLO PARENTS UNDER EXISTING LAWS AND CITY PROGRAMS

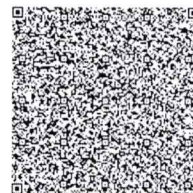
WHEREAS, the Quezon City Government recognizes the important role of solo parents who, despite the challenges of raising their children alone, continue to contribute to the well-being of their families and communities;

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 11861, otherwise known as the Expanded Solo Parents Welfare Act, provides various benefits and protections for solo parents, including social protection programs, employment support, and government services access;

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WHEREAS, the Quezon City Government further strengthened its commitment to the welfare of solo parents through the enactment of Ordinance No. SP-3299, S-2024, otherwise known as the Expanded Solo Parents Welfare Ordinance of Quezon City, which adopted the provisions of Republic Act No. 11861 and provided registered solo parents with enhanced benefits, including monthly subsidies, healthcare support, special discounts on basic necessities, and other forms of assistance to improve their quality of life and that of their families;

WHEREAS, despite the existence of these laws and programs, many solo parents remain unaware of the full range of benefits, services, and assistance available to them;

WHEREAS, strengthening public information and education campaigns can help ensure that solo parents are properly informed about their rights and are able to access the programs designed to support them;

WHEREAS, barangays serve as the primary point of contact for many citizens seeking government assistance and are therefore well-positioned to help disseminate information about programs and services available to solo parents;

WHEREAS, effective information campaigns may include community seminars, barangay-level orientations, distribution of informational materials, and the use of digital and social media platforms to reach more QCitizens;

WHEREAS, empowering solo parents with knowledge about their rights and available support systems helps promote their welfare and enables them to better provide for their children.

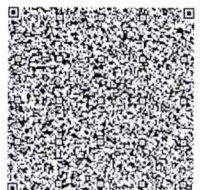
NOW, THEREFORE,

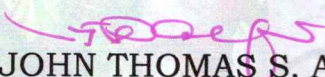

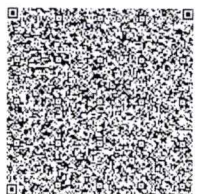
