- The measure is limited solely to the health agreements and covers only those instruments necessary for the implementation of legislated health programs, hospital operations, regulatory compliance, and inter-agency partnerships.
- To safeguard fiscal accountability, the ordinance provides that agreements already covered by Ordinance No. SP-3194 is excluded, and any funding must be part of the City's budget or the National Government's General Appropriations Act, and all executed agreements shall be transmitted to the Office of the Secretary to the Sangguniang Panlungsod (OSSP) within one month for archiving and oversight.
- As emphasized by the City Legal Department, while it has no objection to the passage of the measure, it clarified that the MOA need not be presented at this stage, nor is it necessary for the City Legal Department's comments to be incorporated into the ordinance itself.
- All future Memoranda of Agreement (MOA) that shall be executed under this ordinance are mandated to specify the funding source and purpose. This requirement is crucial when the funds originate from the Department of Health or other national government agencies, as it ensures transparency and prevents the co-mingling of these funds with the City's General Funds.
- In passing this ordinance, the City Council empowers the City Mayor to act swiftly in the interest of public health while, at the same time, affirming its commitment to transparency, accountability, and fiscal discipline.
- Ordinance No. SP-3194 provides a broad general authority, while the present measure establishes a focused authority confined exclusively to health-related matters, thereby striking a proper balance between executive efficiency and legislative oversight.

- As this is a new program that was not foreseen during the last budget cycle, no specific funding has yet been allocated for its initial implementation. Nevertheless, this should not deter the City Council from legislating, as its role is to provide the necessary policy framework, while funding shall follow in accordance with the law through the regular budgeting process.
- While the City Legal Department's comments on the funding provision were already substantially reflected in the original draft, particularly that all expenses are subject to the usual budgeting, accounting, and auditing rules, the phrase "*duly appropriated*" for the purpose by the Sangguniang Panlungsod was still expressly included. In the Amendment, Section No. 11, to remove any ambiguity and to clearly affirm that no funds may be disbursed without prior legislative appropriation.

- The Certificate of the Availability of Funds was issued by the City Budget Department, ensuring the financial viability of this undertaking.
- **Amendments:**
  - o To include Councilor Joseph Juico as a main proponent of the measure and all the other councilors present as co-introducers.
  - o To adopt all the amendments made at the committee level.

- This is rooted in City Ordinances Nos. SP-2319, S-2013, as amended, and SP-3301, S-2024, mandating the Quezon City Economic Development and Investment Board (QC-EDIB) to update and approve the City Investment and Development Plan every three (3) years in alignment with the City's Comprehensive Land Use Plan and the Comprehensive Development Plan.
- The QC-EDIP prioritizes circular and sustainable infrastructure, creative economy, innovation and technology, and inclusive economy; and supports the 14-Point Agenda of Mayor Joy Belmonte by encouraging investments, generating employment, and developing growth hubs.
- Approval of the resolution will strengthen institutional support and investment and ensure a clear and coherent direction for the city's economic development for the next four (4) years.

**PR23CC-317** – A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MAYOR, HONORABLE MA. JOSEFINA G. BELMONTE TO ENTER INTO A MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT (MOA) WITH THE UNIVERSITY OF THE PHILIPPINES, PUMAPUBLIC PRODUCTIONS CORPORATION, FYT MEDIA ORGANIZATION, INC., AND PROBE PRODUCTIONS, INC., FOR THE ORGANIZATION AND IMPLEMENTATION OF “MAKI-FIESTA! A CELEBRATION OF MEDIA, FREE EXPRESSION, AND A CREATIVE PHILIPPINES (FESTIVAL).” (*Introduced by Councilors KARL EDGAR CASTELO and ALY MEDALLA*)

- The ordinance seeks to extend the deadline for submission of complete documents and payment schedule for business taxes, fees, and charges for the first and second quarters of the Years 2026, 2027, and 2028, without surcharges or interest, consistent with the provisions of Sections 167 and 168 of the Local Government Code of 1991 and relevant sections of the Quezon City Revenue Code.
- The measure provides temporary relief for business owners facing financial challenges, while ensuring compliance with the local tax regulations.
- This approach was preceded by Ordinance No. SP-3151, S-2022, granting similar extensions to support the business community during periods of financial difficulty.
- Additional justifications for the proposed extension are: there are 79,000 business taxpayers in Quezon City; given its limited manpower, the City Treasurer's Office could not accommodate so many; and the financial reports of different establishments are usually available in April.
- For the first quarter, January 20 will be extended to January 30; and for the second quarter, April 20 will be extended to April 30; this will apply for the Years 2026, 2027, and 2028.
- **Amendments:**
  - o To include additional Whereas clauses, viz:
 

“WHEREAS, there are approximately 79,000 business taxpayers in Quezon City, and many of them submit their approved audited financial statements only by the month of April, making it necessary to provide an extended period to accommodate their compliance requirements.

WHEREAS, the City Treasurer's manpower and resources are limited, and a high volume of business taxpayers within the short period provided for payment poses challenges in efficiently processing collections, necessitating an extension to ensure proper facilitation and service to all taxpayers.”
  - o To include all councilors as co-introducers of the measure.

At this point, Councilor Vargas stated that he had previously intended to defend and confirm PR23CC-093 under suspended rules; however, upon consultation with the Majority Floor Leader, he decided that such action was no longer necessary and would instead wait for the confirmation of the proposal next year.
