- The proposed Social Hygiene Clinic shall be the primary provider of STI, HIV, and AIDS Prevention and Consult Services, which include but are not limited to diagnostic, treatment, and referral facility for patients with sexually transmitted diseases, and offering comprehensive services to address the healthcare needs of the community.
- With the reported surge in human immunodeficiency virus cases across the city, the city government has committed to further boost testing capabilities to minimize HIV transmission and provide immediate treatment to those who test positive for the viral disease through the Social Hygiene Clinics.
- At present, five (5) Social Hygiene Clinics have been established in each district of Quezon City except in District 6.
- The establishment of a Social Hygiene Clinic in District 6 is necessary as it will be a strategic response to the growing public health concern surrounding sexually transmitted infections and diseases in the city, and will complete the citywide network of accessible and equitable health services for all, providing timely diagnosis, comprehensive sexual treatment, and prevention services.
- A certificate of availability of funds for the Plantilla position and reconstruction of the Social Hygiene Clinic in Barangay Talipapa is also available.

- MOVE was initially launched in 2018 and was relaunched in 2022 as one of the offshoots of the widespread advocacy during the 18-day campaign to end violence against women.
- MOVE has been instrumental in promoting gender equality, challenging harmful social norms, and fostering safe, respectful communities across the city.
- Through educational campaigns, community workshops, and advocacy initiatives, MOVE empowers men to become active allies in eliminating gender-based violence while raising awareness among the wider population about respect, consent, and equality as the city now adopts a zero-tolerance policy against all forms of violence, abuse, and sexual harassment in the city.
- Due to its notable success, institutionalizing the MOVE Program through legislation is critical to ensure the sustainability of the advocacy programs, provide dedicated resources, enhance monitoring and accountability, and strengthen gender equality efforts.
- MOVE is already an existing program and is included in the annual 5% GAD budget of the city.
- **Amendments:**
 - o To add a last Whereas clause, which reads: “**WHEREAS**, institutionalizing MOVE in Quezon City will serve to strengthen the city’s efforts in strengthening VAWC by engaging men as allies, advocates, and champions of gender justice.”
 - o Section 2, Institutionalization of MOVE Movement, shall be entirely deleted and replaced with “**Declaration of Policy.**”

- to put the names of District III Councilors and Councilor Mikey F. Belmonte before the other Councilors.

Councilor Delarmente moved to approve PO23CC-080 on its second reading.

For her sponsorship speech, the Lady Proponent indicated that the proposed ordinance addresses a very practical yet critical concern affecting the city, the proper restoration and cleanup of construction sites. As Quezon City continues to grow and develop, recurring problems also arise — construction sites left with piles of soil, sand, and debris, open excavations, obstructed sidewalks, unsafe roads, and clogged drainage systems that contribute to flooding and pose risks to both pedestrians and motorists. Despite existing regulations, there are gaps in enforcement and compliance, as cleanup and restoration are often treated as an afterthought rather than an essential part of project completion, which the ordinance seeks to correct. She stressed that development must come with responsibility.

Moving on, Councilor Delarmente enumerated the key features of the ordinance, to wit:

- Establishes a clear policy that all construction projects, whether public or private, must be completed in a safe, orderly, and environmentally responsible manner.
- Places the responsibility of cleanup and restoration on the project proponent, whether individual, contractor, developer, or government agency, and must ensure that their project site is properly restored – free from debris, safe for public use, and compliant with environmental standards.
- Introduces the Certificate of Site Restoration and Cleanup Compliance (CSRCC) to be issued only after proper inspection and verification that the construction site has been cleared, restored, and made safe. This certificate is a prerequisite for the issuance of occupancy permits, certificate of completion, project turnover, or the release of performance bonds.
- Strengthens coordination among key implementing agencies, including the Department of the Building Official, Department of Engineering, Department of Sanitation and Cleanup Works, District Action Offices, and barangays in monitoring compliance on the ground.
- Defines prohibited acts and provides corresponding penalties for violations, which include failure to restore construction sites, improper disposal of debris, and actions that endanger public safety or obstruct public infrastructure.
- Recognizes and encourages compliance by providing incentives and recognition for responsible developers who consistently follow proper restoration practices.

The Lady Proponent also pointed out that progress should not come at the expense of safety, cleanliness, and order. Every construction made should leave the city better, not burdened with hazards and wastes. The city government must lead the way, ensure that its systems are clear, enforceable, and fair, and consistently uphold the same.

To conclude, Councilor Delarmente clarified that the ordinance is not to hinder development, but to ensure that development is responsible, accountable, and sustainable. Through this measure, they protect the communities, preserve the environment, and promote a culture of discipline and responsibility among all stakeholders. She then encouraged her colleagues to support the approval of this measure. She also recalled that the measure was filed last July or August, went through two (2) successful public hearings, and was revised several times. The final amended version, mainly for form and style, will be submitted later.

Upon recognition, Councilor Melendez manifested support for the ordinance. She concurred that every development in the city comes with responsibility. Approving the ordinance would enable them to monitor the cleanup of disarray and sidewalk damage, as restoration and cleanup are non-negotiable. She highly commended the author for passing the ordinance, a mandate for all developers to follow.

Similarly, Councilor Medina (Candy) strongly supported the ordinance and urged its approval. She observed that some construction companies really clean their project sites and hoped for its continuity. Every day, their constituents walk along sidewalks and drive through roads filled with debris, construction waste, and open excavations, posing a danger that can lead to accidents, injuries, and even death. Hence, the proposed ordinance ensures that construction does not leave behind hazards, and it compels developers and contractors to take responsibility not only for building construction but also for ensuring safety.

Councilor Lagumbay likewise supported the measure, pointing out that construction debris can really clog the esteros and drainage system. He further noticed that flooding during typhoons worsened in Araneta Avenue, District I, due to the construction of the Skyway. The ordinance is one way of reminding not only private but also public works to be very mindful and not to clog the drainage system with debris. He urged the Department of Building Official and the Engineering Department to ensure that contractors remove construction debris.

On the other hand, Councilor Juico emphasized that this ordinance is a collaboration of the Legislative and Executive Departments, especially the Building Official, the Sanitation Department, the Office of the City Administrator, and all stakeholders. As mentioned by the Proponent, two (2) public hearings were held for this measure to gather input from construction companies, Manila Waters, and Maynilad, reflecting the growing demand for establishments to be more responsible in managing their wastes. He also highlighted one salient provision of the ordinance requiring construction companies to sign a certificate of undertaking before starting the construction, which identifies where they will dispose of their trash or debris; if they cannot, the city government can assist, but the responsible parties must pay a fine. He expressed his hope that the ordinance will help address issues.

With this, the Lady Proponent thanked her fellow councilors who helped in crafting this ordinance, as well as in attending all the public consultations and committee hearings, particularly Councilors Rillo, Lagumbay, Melendez, Medina (Candy), Medalla (Aly), Juico, Liquigan, Suntay, Herrera, Bernardo, and Belmonte (Vicente). She mentioned that all other councilors will be included as co-introducers of the measure. Since the ordinance is considered a landmark legislation, she hoped for its proper implementation to address post-construction problems in Quezon City.

There being no other manifestations, the discussion was terminated, and the following amendments were adopted:

- Under Section 7, letter d, Application Process, to add in No. 5 the Deed of Undertaking to identify where the construction wastes will be disposed of (as also mentioned earlier by Councilor Juico).
- The final amended version of the measure, merely for form and style, will be submitted to the Secretary of the Sanggunian later.
- To include all councilors present as co-introducers of the measure.
- To adopt all the amendments made during the committee hearings.

Finally, as moved and seconded, **PO23CC-080** was **APPROVED** on its second reading, as amended.

- that Atty. Thomas Andal, representative from the HRMD, has expressed support to the proposed Ordinance, recognizing its importance and positive impact; and
- the proponent will submit an amended version during the Committee Meeting on Laws, Rules & Internal Government.

On motion of Councilor Juan, duly seconded, **PO23CC-120** was **APPROVED** on its second reading, with the following manifestations and adoption of the amendments made:

- The ordinance seeks to institutionalize a Filipino Values, Etiquette, and Moral Uprightness Program that will be implemented in all sectors of local governance in Quezon City.
- Today, society faces challenges like declining social values and a detachment from the virtues that define Filipino identity, which is reflected in how they interact with one another and govern their localities.
- Studies show that corruption is linked to a lack of moral values, and it remains one of the most pervasive challenges in governance that undermines public trust.
- While laws exist to combat corruption, a key solution that should not be overlooked is strengthening moral values.
- Corruption is not merely a problem of bad laws or weak implementation, but a failure of character; to effectively combat it and create lasting change, society must strengthen its moral foundations.
- The core goal of the ordinance is to instill and reinforce the values that have always been the heart of Filipino’s identity – “*pagiging maka-Diyos, makatao, makakalikasan, makabansa at makabayan.*”

- Key to this initiative is the creation of a Local Council on Filipino Values Formation, which will be responsible for coordinating the implementation, monitoring, and evaluation of the program. The Council will also work closely with educational institutions, civil society organizations, and community leaders to ensure the program’s effectiveness and reach.
- The ordinance provides not only a strategic framework for combating corruption, but also aims to bring them back to being a true Filipino guided by honor, dignity, and a strong sense of duty to others.
- **Amendments:**
 - In Section 4, Establishment of a Local Council on Filipino Values Formation:

The resolution expresses support for Senate Bill No. 1482, otherwise known as the *Classroom-Building Acceleration Program (CAP Act)*, which aims to prioritize measures designed to fast-track and construct school facilities, and decentralize the process.

The Proponent presented data highlighting that Metro Manila has a congestion rate of approximately 60.1%, with a ratio of one (1) teacher for every fifty (50) students per average-sized classroom. To illustrate the situation, the following examples were cited:

- Batasan Hills National High School, with over fifteen thousand (15,000) enrollees, implements a rotation-blended learning program to ensure that students receive quality education.
- President Corazon C. Aquino Elementary School, with eight thousand five hundred (8,500) students, adopts a double-shift system, with classes held in the morning and afternoon.
- Payatas B Elementary School uses a 3-2 days flipped learning model, wherein students attend in-person classes for three (3) days and engage in distance learning for two (2) days.

Councilor Juico further manifested that one of the reasons for pushing the said Senate bill is that in 2025, the Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) had a target of constructing one thousand seven hundred (1,700) classrooms for that year, but only 22 classrooms were actually completed. This indicates a disconnect in prioritizing education and ensuring that projects are properly coordinated with Local Government Units (LGUs).

During the public deliberations and committee hearings, Ms. Susan Baetiong and Ms. Kayen De Vera, representatives from the Quezon City Schools Division Office (SDO) and Education Affairs Unit (EAU), respectively, were invited and manifested their support for the proposed resolution. It is noted that thirty percent (30%) of the Special Education Fund is being used to facilitate and construct more classrooms.

Likewise, the LGUs will ensure the provision of essential utilities, such as electricity and water, and coordinate with the Department of Education for the deployment of teachers. Thereupon, on motion of Councilor Liban (Shay), duly seconded, **PO23CC-081** was **APPROVED** on its second reading, with the following manifestations from the Proponent, and the adoption of the amendments made:

- The proposed ordinance establishes a systematic framework for the Quezon City Government to maintain vital operations during emergencies. Recognizing that governance cannot come to a standstill during calamities. The measure shifts the city's approach from reactive staffing to a proactive, role-mapped, and highly trained workforce model.
- By bridging the gap between human resources and disaster risk management, the ordinance ensures that the city's essential services are always available and not just "open for business" during a crisis, but are operated by personnel specifically equipped to handle the unique challenges of work suspensions.
- The primary intent of the ordinance is to build a resilient and responsive local government through the following objectives:
 - Continuous Service Delivery - to guarantee that residents have uninterrupted access to essential services such as healthcare, social welfare, public safety, even when regular government work is suspended due to natural or man-made disasters.
 - Strategic Role-Mapping - to move beyond a generic list of employees by identifying specific essential personnel and defining their exact roles with the city's Incident Command System.
 - Enhance Disaster Preparedness - to mandate specialized training for these personnel, ensuring they are proficient in hazard-specific protocols, such as food response, bio-safety of emergency procurement, rather than just their day-to-day administrative tasks.
 - Institutional Coordination – to formalize a partnership between the Human Resource Management Department (HRMD) and the Quezon City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office for annual audits and the maintenance of a real-time digital database of emergency responders.
 - Accountability and Readiness – to empower the City Mayor and the department heads to periodically update mobilization protocols, ensuring the city's emergency response.
- Public service is a continuous service; thus, they should cater to the urgent needs of the community at the right time.
- After the committee conducted its review and hearing and incorporated comments and suggestions from the HRMD and City Administrator's Office, it was determined that certain provisions needed to be amended to be responsive to current community needs.

As moved by Councilor Matias, **PO23CC-121** was **REVERTED on its second reading** to manifest all the amendments as required by the City Secretary, together with the rationale behind the refinements.

- The proposed ordinance aims to promote healthy lifestyles and prevent overweight and obesity in Quezon City by institutionalizing a comprehensive and multi-sectoral anti-obesity program. It recognizes obesity as a major risk factor for non-communicable diseases such as diabetes, cardiovascular diseases, hypertension, and certain cancers. It also seeks to address this growing public health concern through coordinated strategies, including health promotion, improved food environments, and increased opportunities for physical activity.
- In the interest of transparency and sound legislation, the measure has undergone several revisions from its original version to the current amended version as of March, which has already been submitted to the Office of the Secretary to the Sangguniang Panlungsod.
- The Lady Proponent expressed her sincere appreciation to the Honorable Body, as well as to the various departments and offices of Quezon City, for their valuable comments, technical inputs, and recommendations in refining this ordinance.

Amendments:

- Section 4 - Definition of Terms

This section was refined to ensure alignment with World Health Organization and Department of Health standards and to correct references, particularly the Calorie Labelling Ordinance. Its purpose is to ensure technical accuracy and consistency with recognized health standards.

- Section 6 - Institutional Mechanisms

The Parks Development and Administration Department was added as a coordinating office and Task Force member. Its purpose is to recognize that access to parks and open spaces is essential in promoting physical activity, thereby strengthening the whole-of-city approach.

- Section 8 - Nutrition, Education, and Advocacy

The provision on city events was revised from a mandatory requirement to encourage, where practicable and appropriate. The purpose is to avoid unintended penal implications and to align with the advisory role of implementing offices such as PAISD.

- Section 9 - Regulation of Food and Beverage Environments

This section underwent substantial refinement:

1. A clear distinction was made between mandatory provisions, internal policy directives, and voluntary measures.

2. The provision on restaurants was clarified to be purely voluntary and non-penal.
3. Regulation of advertising was aligned under the Business Permits and Licensing Department.
4. Enforcement was revised to ensure that only acts expressly declared unlawful shall be subject to penalties, and only under existing applicable ordinances and laws.

- Section 10 – Funding

Funding provisions were streamlined, including the removal of references that may imply reliance on penalties as a funding source. Its purpose is to ensure that the program remains policy-driven and not penalty-driven.

- Section 12 - Monitoring, Evaluation, and Reporting

A Data Privacy clause was expressly incorporated, requiring compliance with RA No. 10173.

- Section 13 - Incentives and Penalties

This section was significantly revised:

1. All newly created penalties in the original version were removed.
2. The ordinance now adopts the rule that penalties shall be imposed only under the existing applicable ordinances and laws.

- Section 13(d) - Citizen complaints

The provision on complaints was revised to utilize existing reporting mechanisms, including Helpline 122, instead of creating a new system. The purpose is to ensure efficiency, avoid duplication, and align with PAISD recommendations.

- Section 14 - Implementing Rules and Regulations

This section was substantially improved:

1. The ordinance was declared self-executory.
2. The issuance of guidelines was made supplemental and not mandatory.
3. The Quezon City Anti-Obesity Task Force is now tasked to determine whether guidelines are necessary, with such determination reflected in its official minutes.
4. Guidelines may take the form of IRR, manual of operations, technical protocols, or other issuances.
5. Member agencies may propose guidelines subject to Task Force approval.

The Committees on Laws, Rules & Internal Government; and Health & Sanitation recommended approval, with amendments/remarks:

- to submit an amended version of the proposed measure; and
- to include all Councilors present as Co-Introducers of the measure.

On motion of Councilor Matias, duly seconded, **PO23CC-162** was **APPROVED** on its second reading, with the following manifestations from the Lady Proponent, and the adoption of the amendments made:

- The proposed ordinance aims to strengthen the Quezon City Animal Welfare Program under the City Veterinary Department, pursuant to Ordinance No. SP-2854, S-2019, as amended by Ordinance No. SP-3023, S-2021.
- The measure also provides for the temporary suspension of certain veterinary service fees to expand access to basic veterinary services, promote responsible pet ownership, and support the City’s broader public health objectives.
- During the Committee’s review, it was emphasized that the Quezon City Veterinary Department plays a critical role not only in animal welfare but also in safeguarding public health, particularly in the prevention of zoonotic diseases such as rabies.
- The Committee further noted that ensuring affordable access to veterinary services, such as vaccination, pet registration, and preventive care, is essential to increasing compliance among pet owners and strengthening the City’s rabies prevention efforts.
- The Committee recognized the ongoing initiatives of the Quezon City Government, including mass anti-rabies vaccination campaigns, the establishment of the Quezon City Animal Care and Adoption Center, and the adoption of digital innovations such as pet registration and microchipping systems.

- To adopt the amendments as reflected in the amended version of the proposed ordinance, the summary of the amendments is as follows:

 - In Section 5, the prior non-collection of fees was reframed as a valid exercise of administrative discretion, and a safeguard was inserted stating that no refund or claim shall arise against the City Government.

 - In Section 8, it was clarified that funding shall come from existing appropriations included in future annual investment plans and annual budgets, and that no expenditure shall exceed available appropriations.

- The QCPBFI is a non-stock and non-profit foundation registered with the Securities & Exchange Commission (SEC) that aims to uplift the general welfare and benefits of former Punong Barangays in the city. It is a CSO accredited by the 23rd Quezon City Council and currently has around 260 members.
