On motion of Councilor Antonio, duly seconded, **PO23CC-037** was **APPROVED** on its second reading, with the following manifestations from the Proponent, and the adoption of the amendment **to include all councilors present as co-introducers** of the measure:

- The ordinance seeks to position Quezon City as the leading hub for innovation, creative industries, and technology-driven entrepreneurship in the Philippines.
- The measure is a refiling of the previous ordinance, PO22CC-010, that underwent extensive committee deliberations and was approved by the Committees on Micro, Small, and Medium Business & Entrepreneurship Development and Cooperatives on August 31, 2024, and Information and Communications Technology on September 7, 2024, but was put on hold while waiting to finalize the SP-3296, the Quezon City Incentive Code.

- The startup incentives program is to align with the city's broader fiscal and investment framework, as the Incentive Code has already been enacted.
- The Quezon City Bridging Incentives Towards Innovative Startups (QC-BITIS) is designed to bridge the innovative startups with resources, mentorship, and incentives as they need to thrive, scale up, and contribute to job creation and technological growth in the city.
- Supporting startups also invests in a future-ready economy and ensures Quezon City remains a hub for innovation and entrepreneurship.
- The ordinance was a product of a thorough review and ensures it aligns with the existing incentive structure.
- Quezon City is home to top universities and tech talents. However, due to the lack of a structured support system, there is a risk of losing these local talents as many graduates and innovators migrate to other places with stronger incentives. However, this ordinance addresses these challenges by providing the following: 1. bridging incentives for startups, including tax discounts, streamlined business permits, and access to city-accredited co-working spaces; 2. innovation grants and seed funding in partnership with local universities, accelerators and private investors; 3. capacity building through mentorship programs, training, and networking events for founders and entrepreneurs; 4. integration with national policies such as the “*Innovative Startup Act*” R.A. No.11337, and the “*Ease of Doing Business Act*” R.A. No. 11032, to ensure alignment with national priorities.
- QC-BITIS provides both financial and non-financial support to help startups survive, scale and thrive and through the ordinance, it is expected to attract and retain local talents and prevent brain drain, encourage innovation in sectors like health, climate solutions, education, and e-commerce, generate new employment opportunities for Quezon City residents, position Quezon City as the startup capital of the Philippines and strengthen the city's competitiveness and revenue basis.
- As submitted by the different departments and included in the amended version of the measure, the refinements ensure QC-BITIS is aligned with the city's investment incentive framework, promoting ease of doing business and providing a stronger policy foundation for startup development and local innovation support.
- The Proponent believed in the ability of startup owners in Quezon City and expressed a desire to help them achieve their dreams. As their business grows, more jobs will be created for QCitizens, and the economy will also grow.

Councilor Juico manifested support for the ordinance, given that the majority of the generated income comes from micro and small businesses. It will assist startup companies and receive support from the local government, as their first two years are difficult; hence, giving them incentives or a tax holiday for the first few years.

The Proponent thanked Mayor Ma. Josefina G. Belmonte and Vice Mayor Gian G. Sotto for supporting and being part of the whole process of the ordinance, which will attract more businesses that will help the local economy of Quezon City.

The Presiding Officer noted that this is one of the priority programs of Mayor Ma. Josefina G. Belmonte, which caters to the slogan “Sama-samang Pag-unlad.”

On motion of Councilor Delarmente, duly seconded, **PR23CC-059** was **APPROVED** on its second reading, with the following manifestations from the Lady Proponent and adoption of the proposed amendments:

- It was inspired by the initiative of Senator Francis Pangilinan recently donated to the city fresh vegetables directly from the farmlands of Talavera, Nueva Ecija, demonstrating how partnerships between LGUs and agricultural communities provide mutual benefit, ensuring farmers have a guaranteed market for their food produce while supplying the city with fresh, affordable, and high-quality crops.

- The collaboration helps strengthen local food systems, promote inter-LGU solidarity, and reduce post-harvest losses among farmers often affected by typhoons and natural hazards.

- It further supports the city's goal of feeding healthy foods to the evacuees.
- The measure only provides a policy framework and legal authority for the City Mayor to negotiate and enter into inter-LGU agreements, subject to existing budgeting, procurement, accounting, and auditing regulations; hence, a certificate of availability of funds is not applicable.
- The necessary funds for any implementations will be drawn from the respective departments, particularly the SSDD, ensuring that the measure is physically sound and compliant with statutory and regulatory requirements.
- The proposal institutionalizes a system that eliminates unnecessary intermediaries, supports local producers, and safeguards the financial interests of the city government. A genuine farm to city partnership rooted in shared progress and community resilience.
- **Amendments:**

 - o To adopt amendments made during the committee hearings.
