**I. OPENING PRAYER**

Councilor Yap led the opening prayer.

**II. NATIONAL ANTHEM**

The Community Singing of the Philippine National Anthem.

**III. COUNCILORS' CREED**

The members of the City Council recited the Philippine Councilors' Creed led by Councilor Castelo Daza.

**IV. CALL TO ORDER**

The 20<sup>th</sup> Regular Session was called to order at 2:31 P.M. by the Presiding Officer, Vice Mayor Gian G. Sotto.

**V. ROLL CALL**

The Secretary to the Sanggunian Panlungsod, Atty. Alferos, called the roll.

There being a quorum, the Body proceeded with the order of business.

**VI. APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF THE 18<sup>TH</sup> REGULAR SESSION, HELD ON OCTOBER 13, 2025**

There being no correction, observation, and modification, on motion, duly seconded, the minutes of the 18<sup>th</sup> Regular Session, held on October 13, 2025 was **APPROVED**.

**VII. INFORMATIONAL MATTERS**

No informational matters are included in the day's order of business.

**VIII. PRIVILEGE HOUR**

Delivering his privilege speech, Councilor Vargas, Chairperson of the Committee on Disaster Risk Reduction, discussed the preparation needed for earthquakes, especially the "Big One," a matter of utmost concern.

Moving closer to the year 2058, the Speaker lamented that last week, the Director of the Philippine Institute of Volcanology and Seismology (PHIVOLCS) raised the possibility of the "Big One" – an earthquake of catastrophic proportions brought about by the movement of the West Valley Fault, which traverses several cities in Metro Manila, including Quezon City, with a population of over three million. He said that the recent seemingly endless incidents of earthquakes in the Visayas, Mindanao, and even Luzon, the media asked if they are prepared for the "Big One".

Gladly, having seen the action plan, Councilor Vargas praised the comprehensive plan made by the Quezon City Government led by Mayor Joy Belmonte in response to the possible occurrence of the “Big One.” The comprehensive plan aims to prepare the citizens, community, and all sectors for an intense earthquake that hopefully will not occur. The preparations are also intended to minimize both the casualties and damage to properties and infrastructure, as well as help the people and the city recover immediately.

As Chairperson of the Committee on Disaster Risk Reduction, the Speaker committed his full support for these initiatives, as well as for future initiatives to be undertaken in this regard. He believed that all his colleagues in the 23<sup>rd</sup> City Council also shared the same commitment. For him, the success of any plan for disaster response and preparedness depends on the involvement and cooperation of all sectors – public and private, national and local government, barangay and HOAs, and each Filipino.

For this reason, Councilor Vargas emphasized the need of having a Culture of Preparedness, not later, not when earthquakes happen in other areas, but now. He then suggested to institutionalize or culturalize the frequent conduct of earthquake drills at the grassroots level. He stressed that earthquake drills should be part of the daily lives of every QCitizen and Filipino family, in the homes, schools, places of work, or even commercial establishments.

The good Councilor also commended the Quezon City Government for placing markers and signs identifying the exact location of the fault lines in the city. He hoped that said markers would be well-maintained and not tampered with or even removed. As such, he suggested a prompt and regular inventory of the status of such markers and further proposed that additional markings be painted on roads and sidewalks that are visible to pedestrians, motorists, and the general public. He also appealed to the homeowners associations of the concerned communities within the fault line to allow the city government to install these road markers or put ground-level markings inside their subdivisions, as earthquake knows no income class. With this undertaking, he said that the partnership between the city government and the associations will be further strengthened.

Moreso, since some condominiums, businesses, and commercial establishments are constructed on top of or within the immediate proximity of the fault line, he proposed that the concerned government office bring this to the attention of its respective management and ensure that the proper structural measures, response training, and education campaign for residents and patrons are put in place. He added to punish those who violated local ordinances and national laws if there was a violation. He also suggested the adoption of new policies that integrate recent international standards, ensuring that all buildings and structures are resistant to strong earthquakes. In keeping with the focus of the Mayor on science-based approaches to disaster management, recent advances in construction technology should be integrated and reflected in local policies.

In closing, Councilor Vargas stressed that no one could really predict when earthquakes will occur or when the “Big One” will hit Metro Manila. However, with the planning and efforts of the Executive Department, he believed that Quezon City is one of the most, if not the most, prepared LGUs in Metro Manila when it comes to earthquakes. He then enjoined the public officials, employees, residents, and all sectors to work together and pronounced that his Committee will continue to meet, consult, and hear the voices of all the different stakeholders in the pursuit of meaningful and sustainable solutions and policies towards a more resilient and ready citizenry. He reiterated that damages to any calamities could be avoided if everyone is ready, hence the biggest collective and united preparation is needed now.

Again, Councilor Vargas relayed that a briefing regarding the “Big One” led by the QC-DRRMO will be held on Wednesday at 10:00 A.M. and further enjoined the councilors to attend the same to supplement the ordinance and resolutions needed in handling the “Big One.”

During the period of interpellation, Councilor Melendez congratulated the Speaker for a well-impactful speech about being prepared, which is the number one weapon for a disaster like the “Big One” and for emphasizing the importance of unity, education, and proactive planning of the QCitizens. She also enjoined her colleagues to unite, love, and take care of everyone in their beloved Quezon City.

Likewise, Councilor Lagumbay supported the proposals of Councilor Vargas and believed that being prepared is better than nothing. He also assured the support of all the District III councilors, as well as the condominiums management and homeowners associations, for all the programs of the city government in preparation for the “Big One.”

The Majority Floor Leader thanked the Chairperson of the Committee on Disaster Risk Reduction for delivering this timely privilege speech. She clarified that during one of the QC-DRRMC meetings, which Councilor Vargas is also a part of, the data is not to scare everyone but to show that in case the “Big One” happens, it would largely affect the city, both the residents, the area, and structures. For her, it is very important for the Council to take the data into consideration in crafting ordinances and resolutions, to have coordination with the implementing agencies pertinent to the mentioned markers (mojon), and to revisit the laws that are in place. She added that the whole 23<sup>rd</sup> City Council is in support of all Councilor Vargas’ aspirations.

The Presiding Officer urged Council members to take action on a serious issue and to pray for the city and the nation.

With no other manifestations from any of the councilors, the privilege hour was terminated.
