Meanwhile, the Majority Floor Leader, Councilor Aly Medalla, informed the Body of the presence of Director Emmanuel Borromeo of the Department of the Interior and Local Government – Quezon City (DILG-QC) to present to the Quezon City Council the 2025 Urban Governance Exemplar Award.

Meanwhile, a recess was declared.

Likewise, while on recess, the 23<sup>rd</sup> City Council presented a resolution expressing their sincerest congratulations and commendation of the Quezon City Government, through Quezon City Mayor Ma. Josefina G. Belmonte, Quezon City Vice Mayor Gian G. Sotto, and the members of the 23<sup>rd</sup> Quezon City Council, to the Department of the Interior and Local Government – Quezon City Field Office, represented by Director Emmanuel D. Borromeo, as one of the top three (3) DILG Field Offices in Metro Manila during the 2025 Metro Manila SubayBAYANI Awards.

Likewise, Ms. Mona Celine Yap received a scroll of recognition for being honored as one of the 2025 Obama Leaders.

When the session resumed, the Body proceeded with the order of business.

## VIII. PRIVILEGE HOUR

After the third/final reading and confirmation of ordinances and resolutions, Councilor Ferrer availed of the Privilege Hour to address concerns about recent incidents involving billboards and electronic billboards, prompting her to recommend that the Committee on Public Works and Infrastructure hold a special investigative hearing and invite all stakeholders to determine existing policies and propose necessary legislation. This recommendation followed discussions from public consultations and budget hearings. Councilor Ferrer emphasized the need for a thorough and impartial investigation into the said incident where an electronic billboard collapsed due to strong winds by Typhoon Uwan on Katipunan Service Road, resulting in significant damage and the injury of two individuals.

She said that the unfortunate event underscores the urgent need for stronger enforcement and preventive measures to ensure the safety of their constituents, particularly during severe weather. Billboards, tarpaulins, and other large signage materials, when left unsecured, pose real dangers to life, property, and public infrastructure.

With that, Councilor Ferrer reiterated the importance of the proposed ordinance entitled: **“AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING ALL BILLBOARD AND SIGNAGE OWNERS, OPERATORS, AND LESSORS IN QUEZON CITY TO ROLL DOWN, REMOVE, OR OTHERWISE SECURE TARPAULINS, SIGNAGE MATERIALS, AND OTHER FLEXIBLE DISPLAY MEDIA DURING THE OCCURRENCE OF TYPHOONS, HEAVY RAINS, STRONG WINDS, AND OTHER INCLEMENT WEATHER CONDITIONS AS DECLARED BY PAGASA OR THE QUEZON CITY GOVERNMENT, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF.”**

The Lady Speaker continued that the intent of the measure is simple yet vital—to prevent avoidable tragedies through proactive regulation and compliance. It complements existing city ordinances, such as SP-2109, S-2011, and SP-3044, S-2021, by reinforcing accountability among billboard and signage owners and ensuring that these structures are properly rolled down or secured whenever weather advisories are issued.

The Speaker emphasized the necessity of the investigation, asserting it will uncover the cause and accountability for the recent incident while urging stakeholders to prioritize safety over profit and aesthetics. She advocates for this as a pivotal moment for the City Government to reassess current policies, enhance enforcement, and implement effective measures to protect communities.

In the spirit of public service and disaster risk reduction, she urged the August Body to support a full inquiry into the matter and to consider the immediate passage of the proposed ordinance, or any ordinance that will promote the safety of the citizens and help prevent similar incidents in the future.

Relative thereto, Councilor Rillo stated that she will conduct hearings in the Committee on Public Works and Infrastructure on the matter.

Subsequently, the Privilege Hour was terminated.

After which, as moved by the Majority Floor Leader, the foregoing privilege speech was **REFERRED to the Committee on Public Works and Infrastructure.**

- The budget proposes strategic investments, not only to sustain growth but also to ensure resilience and readiness in times of crisis.
- The proposed ordinance seeks to empower the local communities by directing resources to programs that would uplift the marginalized, senior citizens, solo parents, youth, and Persons with Disabilities (PWDs).
- The Presiding Officer expressed support for the measure that benefits the QCitizens.

Having the same nature, on omnibus motion of Councilor Belmonte (Vicente), duly seconded, **PR23CC-129**, **PR23CC-132**, and **PR23CC-133** were **APPROVED** on second reading, with the following manifestations, and the adoption of the amendments made:

- The issue being discussed is deeply rooted in the Constitution, a reminder that housing is not a privilege but a right. As the former President Ramon Magsaysay once said, “He who has less in life should have more in law.” Hence, he stressed the government's duty to ensure that every Filipino family has access to adequate, decent, and affordable housing, regardless of social status.
- This principle is affirmed by Republic Act No. 7279, otherwise known as the Urban Development and Housing Act of 1992 (UDHA). Under this law, the government, in partnership with the private sector, implements a comprehensive and continuous program for the urban poor. In Quezon City, this is actively implemented through the negotiated sale, one of the methods of land acquisition under the UDHA. Through this system, the city purchases the land occupied by Informal Settler Families (ISFs) from private owners, then later transfers its ownership to the beneficiaries presently occupying the concerned areas at an affordable cost.
- PR23CC-129 refers to the property covered by Transfer Certificate of Title (TCT) No. 82746 registered under H & M Resources, Inc., with a total land area of 15,726 square meters, with 344 families.
- PR23CC-132 refers to the property covered by Transfer Certificate of Title (TCT) No. 004-2019001260 registered under the name of Hipolito I. Illescas, with a total land area of 999 square meters presently occupied by 24 families.

- PR23CC-133 pertains to the properties covered by Transfer Certificate of Title (TCT) Nos. 004-2018016862, 004-2018016863, and 004-2018016864, registered under Norman I. Herrera, with a total area of 1,216 square meters, which is currently occupied by 33 families.
- The purpose of these proposed resolutions is to provide security of tenure to the families who have been residing on the properties for more than 30 years, as they have already established their livelihoods and communities. Many of them live in unsafe areas, but they continue to work hard and pay taxes, hoping that one day they can say, “*Sa wakas, ang lupang tinatapakan ko ay amin na.*” Through these resolutions, their dignity would gradually be restored, giving them hope for stronger and more lasting stability.
- Their mission is not only to build houses, but also to strengthen families and communities toward a more progressive city. Thus, he reaffirmed his commitment to inclusive development and to the duty of ensuring that every QCitizen will have a place they can call their home.

Councilor Belmonte (Mikey) commended Proponent and expressed his support for the measures. He acknowledged the presence of Homeowners Associations (HOAs) in the session hall, who have been waiting for decades to secure property titles. He also outlined the current direction of the city’s programs related to the acquired properties, to wit:

- The property in Barangay Bahay Toro, under the registered owner, Luzviminda O. Cruz, has a current zonal value is Thirty-Four Thousand Pesos (PhP34,000.00) per square meter, but the acquisition price is only Five Thousand Pesos (PhP5,000.00) per square meter to be paid for 25 years through monthly amortization.
- The property in Barangay Commonwealth, owned by Hipolito Illescas, has a current zonal value of Twenty-Two Thousand Pesos (PhP22,000.00) per square meter, but the city's acquisition is only Five Thousand Pesos (PhP5,000.00). And the property under H & M Resources with 344 target beneficiaries/families, the current zonal value is Twelve Thousand Pesos (PhP12,000.00) per square meter, and the acquisition is only Three Thousand Pesos (PhP3,000.00) payable for 25 years.
- The property in Joyful Street, Sitio Veterans, Barangay Bagong Silangan, under the name of registered owner, Norman Herrera, has a current zonal value of Twelve Thousand Pesos (PhP12,000.00), but was acquired for Five Thousand Pesos (PhP5,000.00) per square meter and payable for 25 years. In Doña Facita Street, Barangay Old Balara, under the current registered owner, Philippine Foundation for Cultural and Educational Development, since it is a highly commercialized district, its current zonal value is Forty-Six Thousand Pesos (PhP 46,000.00) per square meter, but the acquisition price is only Five Thousand Pesos (PhP5,000.00).

Councilor Mikey Belmonte emphasized that the Quezon City Government assured the residents of its affordable housing programs. After which, he congratulated all the beneficiaries of the foregoing measures.

Councilor Bernardo expressed his support for the proposed resolutions. He commended the efforts of the city government, particularly Mayor Joy Belmonte, Vice Mayor Gian Sotto, the City Council, and both the former and current Chairpersons of the Committee on Urban Poor Development and Human Settlement, for these significant accomplishments.

- The Committee on Appropriations recommended approval, with amendment:

Councilor Pumaren moved for the omnibus approval of PR23CC-130 and PR23CC-131.

Proceeding with the discussion, the Proponent explicated that:

- The measures intend to give authority to the City Mayor, representing the city government, to acquire through negotiated sale, enter into a contract, and execute a deed of absolute sale to purchase parcels of land, as described in the titles.
- For PR23CC-130 - the existing community of about eight (8) families will be the beneficiaries, with a community association registered under the name of Dancing Ladies Magkakasama Homeowners Association; and for PR23CC-131 – the beneficiaries is about ten (10) families who have been occupying the property for 25 years and with an existing association, Masaganang Samahan Neighborhood Association Inc., duly registered at the Human Settlement and Urban Development.
- Both the HOAs signified their intentions to be included in Quezon City's housing program and will be screened and prequalified by the Beneficiary Selection Committee.
- The owners of the subject properties likewise manifested their willingness to sell the properties to the Quezon City Government in support of the development of socialized housing in favor of the mentioned beneficiaries.
- The concerned parties were present during the committee hearing.
- The budgets for these socialized housing amounting to PhP1,210,506.00 (PR23CC-130) and PhP2,011,576.00 (PR23CC-131) are already included in the 2025 procurement bond of the Housing Community Development & Resettlement Department.
- By passing these resolutions, they are giving these people a chance to have a place to call their home and a better future.

Discussing the proposed measures, Councilor Liban (Bong) expressed his gladness that the beneficiaries of PR23CC-130 have been amended from nineteen (19) or twenty (20) to eight (8) families only, and PR23CC-131 to ten (10) families. He concurred to address the city's housing problem but opined to give a habitable place to live in, one that falls within the required minimum lot size. He asked whether the payment for monthly association dues collected from the renters and sharers had already been returned, to which Councilor Pumaren answered in the affirmative. After which, he congratulated the Proponent on these proposals.

With no other comments, the discussion was terminated, and the following amendments were adopted:

- To adopt all the amendments made in the committee hearings.
- To include all councilors present as co-introducers of the measure, giving preference to District III councilors for PR23CC-130 and District I councilors for PR23CC-131.

Whereupon, on omnibus motion, duly seconded, **PR23CC-130** and **PR23CC-131** were **APPROVED** on second reading, as amended.

Meanwhile, the Presiding Officer thanked Councilor Pumaren for these measures; Councilor Liban (Bong) for raising a valid point about the required minimum lot size; and the QCitizens for the trust and support.

- The Barangay Council desires to have a traffic ordinance regulating street parking (one side, both sides, and no parking) as well as regulations on one-way and two-way traffic for an orderly traffic flow on the concerned streets.
- The Barangay Council likewise enacted a barangay resolution for this purpose, conducted a public hearing, and submitted the minutes, attendance, and certificate of no objection from the Traffic and Transport Management Department (TTMD).
- The Proponent confirmed to the Presiding Officer that the concerned stakeholders have no objection to the proposed ordinance.

**PO23CC-024** – ORDINANCE REGULATING THE USE OF MODIFIED MUFFLERS ON ALL TYPES OF MOTOR VEHICLES WITHIN THE TERRITORIAL JURISDICTION OF QUEZON CITY AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION THEREOF (*Introduced by Councilors ATTY. VOLTAIRE GODOFREDO “Bong” LIBAN III at SHAIRA “Shay” L. LIBAN*)

The Committee on Laws, Rules & Internal Government recommended approval, with amendments/remarks:

- addition of Section 6, where TTMD shall use an instrument that measures the sound emitted by motor vehicles to ensure due process for the motorist/vehicle owner; and
- to include all Councilors present as Co-Introducers of the measure.

The Committee on Transportation recommended approval, with amendment:

- to include all Councilors present as Co-Introducers of the measure.

The Committee on Public Order & Security recommended approval, with amendments/remarks:

- to add a provision that will equip the enforcers with a measuring device; and
- to include all Councilors present as Co-Introducers of the measure.

After moving for its approval, Councilor Liban (Bong) read the 1<sup>st</sup> to 4<sup>th</sup> *Whereas* clauses, emphasizing the allowable sound level of vehicles’ mufflers and the nuisance it may bring to the people upon exceeding 99 decibels.

For the discussion, the Presiding Officer inquired if the ordinance covers all types of vehicles, whether motorcycles, cars, or sports cars, to which the Proponent answered in the affirmative.

The Proponent confirmed that the issue is covered by the LTO memorandum, which prohibits certain conditions. While race cars are allowed on race tracks, they are not permitted on public streets. In response to the Presiding Officer's question about vehicles that produce loud noises due to damage to the muffler, it was clarified that law enforcement will use a device to assess and address these situations.

Councilor Bernardo expressed full support for the ordinance but raised a concern regarding potential conflict with an existing ordinance that addresses operations in the barangay related to apprehending motorcycles with loud mufflers. He questioned whether the new ordinance would overlap with the provisions already in place.

In response to that, the Proponent addressed the absence of any existing city ordinance concerning mufflers. He noted that Councilor Bernardo's observations stem solely from an MMDA resolution that regulates mufflers, which has been assigned to barangay and traffic enforcers. Most cities have established similar ordinances, and now they are just localizing the ordinance and could fund the same and delegate it to their local traffic enforcers. The Proponent emphasized that while the MMDA is apprehending motorcycle violators, the enforcement is not yet localized. He assured Councilor Bernardo that the TTMD will be responsible for enforcing the ordinance, with violators required to pay fines to the city government rather than the MMDA.

On the other hand, the Presiding Officer remarked that they have passed the Environmental Code, where noise pollution is included.

Similarly, the Secretary to the Sanggunian, Atty. Alferos, confirmed that there is a provision in the Environmental Code relative to the sounds of motor vehicles.

Councilor Bernardo subsequently concluded that there is no local ordinance on mufflers, and the Presiding Officer answered that it is not included in the modified mufflers.

There being no other discussants, on motion, duly seconded, **PO23CC-024** was **APPROVED** on its second reading, adopting the amendment **to include the names of all the councilors present as co-introducers of the ordinance.**

At this point, the Presiding Officer thanked Councilor Bernardo for reminding them of the Environmental Code and agreed that there is such a provision; the only difference is that this is regarding modified mufflers.

- Barangay Maharlika is part of the La Loma area, one of the alternate routes for motorists from Manila going to Quezon City.

On the same note, the Presiding Officer likewise commended Councilor Juico for being very supportive and advocating for fencing in Quezon City. His Honor remarked that in the recent Batang Pinoy, the city’s fencing team garnered thirteen (13) gold medals. The good Vice Mayor also encouraged the councilors and the viewers not to hesitate to ask for assistance from the city government in achieving their dreams, particularly in the field of sports.

- During the committee hearing, Juliana Market executed an affidavit of undertaking to comply and submit the other necessary documents within three months, attested by the Market Development and Administration Department, which also assured to conduct close monitoring on the said affidavit of undertaking.
- Evaluating the Juliana Market's application for franchise is important as it gives jobs and affordable food for QCitizens.
