With no other questions, the period of discussion was terminated.

- He further emphasized that presently there is no vaccine for leptospirosis, but he hoped it would be readily available in the future.

The Minority Floor Leader, Councilor Delarmente, expressed her support for the measure, noting the need to intensify the campaign on leptospirosis. She emphasized that prophylaxis can save lives, which costs less than Twenty Pesos (₱20.00), as having leptospirosis may result in costly expenses, including the need for regular dialysis.

The Acting Presiding Officer, Councilor Bernard Herrera, acknowledged that many individuals are not aware of the availability of free medication for leptospirosis at Barangay Health Centers. He stressed the importance of launching a massive information campaign regarding this service and expressed gratitude to Councilor Lagumbay for sponsoring the initiative.

Councilor Lagumbay further informed everybody that leptospirosis is not contracted only through exposure to floodwaters. He noted that even the ingestion of contaminated food may lead to leptospirosis. Thus, it is important to intensify the information campaign, as he believes prevention is better than a cure.
