Councilor Suntay moved for the approval of the foregoing measure.

Before proceeding, *the Presiding Officer yielded the Chair to Councilor Herrera*, after which His Honor declared a recess.

Thereafter, the session resumed.

On motion of Councilor Suntay, duly seconded, **PO23CC-068** was **APPROVED** on its second reading, with the following manifestations, and the adoption of the amendments made:

- The ordinance aims to minimize traffic congestion along Maryland Street in Barangay Pinagkaisahan.
- Section 458 provides the City Council with the power to regulate streets, roads, alleys, etc., within its territorial jurisdiction.
- The Traffic and Transport Management Department (TTMD) interposed no objection to the proposed ordinance.
- The Barangay Council had already conducted the required public hearings.
- In the period of amendments, the Proponent plans to submit an amended version of the document that will incorporate the recommendations made during the hearing of the Committee on Laws.

The Acting Presiding Officer, Councilor Herrera, made on record that a public hearing was conducted in the barangay and all necessary requirements were completed, to which the Proponent answered in the affirmative.

PR23CC-025 – RESOLUTION URGING THE HONORABLE CITY MAYOR AND THE QUEZON CITY HOUSING, COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AND RESETTLEMENT DEPARTMENT (HCDRD) TO CONVENE ALL SUBDIVISION AND CONDOMINIUM DEVELOPERS IN QUEZON CITY TO URGENTLY COMPLY WITH THE MANDATED BALANCED HOUSING REQUIREMENTS PURSUANT TO THE QUEZON CITY HOUSING CODE AND EXISTING NATIONAL HOUSING LAWS *(Introduced by Councilor ATTY. VICENTE BELMONTE JR.)*

The Committees on Laws, Rules & Internal Government; Urban Poor & Human Settlement; City Planning, Building & Zoning; and Subdivision Planning & Real Estate recommended approval, with amendment:

- to include all Councilors present as Co-Introducers of the measure

Councilor Belmonte (Vicente) moved for the approval of PR23CC-025.

Moving on to the discussion, the Proponent explicated that:

- The proposed resolution urges the City Mayor and the Quezon City Housing, Community Development and Resettlement Department (HCDRD) to convene all subdivision and condominium developers to strengthen the implementation of the balanced housing program in accordance with Republic Act No. 7279, Republic Act No. 10884, and Ordinance No. SP-2771, S-2018, the Quezon City Comprehensive Socialized Housing Code.
- The law requires developers to develop an area for socialized housing equivalent to at least 15% of the total project for subdivisions and 5% for condominiums.
- This aligns perfectly with the beloved City Mayor's commitment, during her 2025 Ulat sa Bayan, of giving priority to providing a safe and decent housing for the QCitizens.
- Housing means not just a structure, but stability, dignity, and a chance to stay close to livelihood and opportunity.
- It is echoed in the city's own housing agenda of ensuring housing programs for QCitizens, including the informal settler families.
- The Department of Human Settlements and Urban Development (DHSUD) recently revealed that nearly 600 non-compliant projects are under its zero-backlog program. The DHSUD Secretary Jose Ramon Aliling discovered violations and intends to correct them to enhance the production of socialized housing for the benefit of underprivileged Filipinos.

- For many years, as reflected in the Housing Board meetings and minutes, almost all compliance of the developers was done in Cavite or Bulacan, leaving Quezon City residents unable to benefit from socialized housing meant for them. This goes against the purpose of balanced housing, which is to balance communities, prevent exclusive enclaves, and ensure inclusive development.
- The authority to enforce this is fully grounded in jurisprudence, specifically the Ferrer, Jr. vs. Bautista, G.R. No. 210551, 2015, wherein the Supreme Court upheld Quezon City's housing-related ordinance as a valid exercise of police power. The joint approval of the LGU and DHSUD is likewise needed; hence, this resolution strengthens that coordination.
- The resolution also allows them to refine processes and ensure closer coordination among all stakeholders in balanced housing implementation, as also emphasized by the Mayor in her 2025 Governance Address.
- With this measure, they ensure that every balanced housing obligation is accounted for, implemented within Quezon City, and aligns with the needs of families in danger zones and waterways.
- By convening developers under the Quezon City Housing Board, they promote transparency, harmonize compliance, and strengthen the capacity to build a livable, integrated community.

Upon recognition, Councilor Juico expressed support for the resolution. He noticed that the balanced housing credits are being downloaded to DHSUD.

The Proponent concurred that it is one of the modes of compliance in the balanced housing obligation.

Councilor Juico also observed that the law does not specifically mention that the balanced housing project (15% for subdivision and 5% for condominium) should be done in a particular city. Given that the power to allocate projects for the balanced housing is under DHSUD and that the magnitude of all the projects are done in Quezon City, he proposed to have dialogues with DHSUD and, if possible, to enter into a memorandum of agreement with them indicating that if the housing project is being done in Quezon City, then compliance to balanced housing program should be done in the city as well. For him, discussing merely with the subdivision owner or developer is not sufficient because they only pass it through DHSUD, as part of compliance, either by property or by cash. As such, he reiterated that the conversation should also include DHSUD having the capacity to dictate and pinpoint where a project should be developed.

Further, the good Councilor from the 1st District recalled that a former DHSUD official mentioned that one of the problems they are encountering in putting up a socialized housing in Quezon City using the balanced housing credit is the much higher price per square meter of lot in the city as compared to provinces. With this, he asked for clarity on the true intention of the measure and what they will achieve by simply talking to the developers, and of having the DHSUD as part of the conversation.

Councilor Belmonte (Vicente) affirmed that there is no written memorandum of agreement between the Quezon City Government and DHSUD, however it is in line with the policy of the city government, as explicitly stated in the Quezon City Comprehensive Socializing Housing Ordinance of 2018 that all compliance of balanced housing obligation among all the subdivision and condominium developers who want to have their projects in Quezon City should be done in-city or if outside the city then the Quezon City residents should be the beneficiaries. It was also reflected in the recent Local Housing Board, wherein Mayor Joy Belmonte, being the Chairperson, reported that there has been a definite verbal agreement between DHSUD Secretary Aliling and Her Honor to partner with the local government and agreed that the funds under Escrow will redound to developments that would benefit Quezon City residents.

Councilor Juico inquired if the Proponent has a list of developers that have yet to comply with the Balanced Housing Act, to which the Proponent responded that it is what the resolution aims to accomplish. As such, the former opined that the best they could do is to help DHSUD identify all of those developers, may they be subdivisions or condominiums, and ensure that they comply with the balanced housing requirement. Maybe, on the part of the city government, they could hold or not renew their business permit to oblige them to comply with the Balanced Housing Act. In return, they could request the DHSUD to set aside a portion of the balance housing credit for Quezon City, so the city government could expropriate or allocate funds to buy properties. For him, there are so many ways to use the said funds and also get DHSUD on the city's good side by helping them identify and collect for those who were not able to deliver their promise to support the socialized housing initiatives of the national and local government to address the socialized housing needs of the less fortunate.

The Proponent acceded that it is the main objective of the measure to convene all the developers of housing programs that will be put up in Quezon City. He added that when he presented the resolution to the Local Housing Board, the DHSUD welcomed the idea because this is not overstepping on their powers; it is a collaboration and a partnership in terms of enforcing and implementing the balanced housing requirement of each developer. He further informed the Body that DHSUD will be part of the Technical Working Group, should one be put up during the city-wide conference with all the developers. He stressed that it is a great venue or tool for them to not solely rely on the information that is given to them by DHSUD, but come up with their own data, and check and balance, in line with their commitment and mandate to enforce socialized and balanced housing for every developer in Quezon City.

Analyzing the discussion, the Acting Presiding Officer (Councilor Herrera) opined that this is just the first step and is in the infant stage, but there is a broader plan of strengthening compliance with the balanced housing obligation of the developers in Quezon City. He likewise suggested to make sure that the verbal agreement be made into a written agreement.

Affirming thereto, the Proponent further claimed that it is their duty to guard, ensure, and enforce the developers' obligation for balanced housing.

On the other hand, instead of a resolution urging the City Mayor and the HCDRD, Councilor Atty. Liban (Bong) proposed to convert the same into an ordinance urging the developers in Quezon City to comply with the mandated balanced housing requirement to have the force and effect of law.

In the meantime, a recess was declared.

When the session resumed, Councilor Juico expressed his continued support for the measure, emphasizing the significance as an initial step toward securing housing rights not only for Quezon City but for the whole Philippines, especially those in need of housing. He anticipates upcoming dialogues with the Mayor and developers regarding adherence to the Balanced Housing Act. If compliance is not achieved, he said, the Proponent, as a lawyer, perhaps is willing to advise the City Council on necessary actions to ensure that developers of condominiums and subdivisions meet their obligation, to which Councilor Vicente Belmonte acceded.

Likewise, the manifestations of Councilor Bong Liban were duly noted by the Proponent. He asserted that they already had the Comprehensive Socialized Housing Ordinance of 2018 mandating the developers to do an in-city compliance of the balanced housing requirement or prioritize the QCitizens as beneficiaries if done elsewhere. The city government may opt not to grant them an occupancy permit under the Department of Building Officials, should they not comply with the memorandum of the HCDRD. He said that they have a lot of work to do; after convening all the subdivision and condominium developers and a forum with the Local Chief Executive, along with all the concerned national and local agencies and stakeholders, they could come up with a program and process to look into all the data lapses that transpired over the years. He is hopeful to make Quezon City the benchmark of socialized and balanced housing requirement compliance in the country.

Since there are no other comments, the period of discussion was terminated, and the following amendments were adopted:

- To adopt all the amendments made at the committee level, especially the Committee on Laws.
- To include all the councilors present as co-introducers of the measure.

Finally, on motion, duly seconded, **PR23CC-025** was **APPROVED** on its second reading, as amended.
