**PO23CC-033** – ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE QUEZON CITY SAFE SEAL RECOGNITION PROGRAM FOR ACTIVELY PROMOTING SAFETY AND PROTECTION FROM ALL FORMS OF EXPLOITATION, INCLUDING HUMAN TRAFFICKING IN ALL BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENTS WITHIN QUEZON CITY, OTHERWISE REFERRED TO AS “QC SAFE SEAL” (*Introduced by Councilors ALY MEDALLA and JOSEPH JOE VISAYA*)

The Committee on Laws, Rules & Internal Government; and Appropriations recommended approval, during their Joint Hearing with amendments/remarks:

- to adopt the amended version of the proposed measure to be submitted by the proponent;
- to limit the scope of the proposed ordinance, which shall only apply to entertainment and accommodation establishments such as hotels, resorts, apartelles, tourist inns, motels, pension houses, homestay operators (e.g. Airbnb), short-term rental condominiums, spa bars, karaoke establishments, massage parlors, internet cafes, and similar establishments;
- the tax incentive shall only apply to the Platinum QC Safe Seal category;
- to set a cap for the tax incentive based on the report from the City Treasurer’s Office and the Business Permits and Licensing Department; and
- to include all Councilors present as Principal Introducers of the proposed measure

The Committee on Women, Family Relations & Gender Equality recommended approval, with amendment:

- to include the names of Councilors Joseph P. Juico, Mikey F. Belmonte, Kristine Alexia Matias, RN, Charm Ferrer, CPA, MPA, JD, Albert Alvin “Chuckie” L. Antonio III and Victor “Vic” D. Bernardo, as Co-Introducers of the said measure

The Committee on Social Services recommended approval, with remarks:

- an amended version of the measure will be submitted; and
- to consider the recommendation/s from BPLD, SSDD, LEDIPO and SBCDPO

The Committees on Children’s Welfare; Trade, Commerce & Industry; and Public Order & Security recommended approval, with amendment:

- to include all Councilors present as Co-Introducers of the measure

On motion of Councilor Medalla (Aly), duly seconded, **PO23CC-033** was **APPROVED** on its second reading, with the following manifestations and amendments:

- The ordinance seeks to establish the Quezon City Safe Seal Recognition Program to promote safety and protection against exploitation, including human trafficking, in all business establishments in the city.
- In 2020, the Quezon City Anti-Trafficking in Persons Ordinance was approved. In 2023, the City Council also approved SP-3241, the Anti-OSAEC Ordinance, and the Quezon City Tourism Child Protection Policy to protect the citizens against human trafficking and online sexual abuse and exploitation.
- The Lady Proponent stated that the proposed ordinance supports these existing laws and seeks to institutionalize the Safe Seal Program. She explained that businesses can coordinate with the local government and apply for the program, and that having the Safe Seal in their establishments will reassure customers that the institution is safe.
- The pertinent provisions of the proposed ordinance include the declaration of policy, the establishment of the Safe Seal Program, the definition of terms, and the scope—covering entertainment and accommodation establishments, tourism enterprises, and other businesses with potential risks of human trafficking—as thoroughly discussed during the Committee on Laws.
- A QC Safe Seal Committee will be created; its functions will be included in Section 8, while the responsibilities of its members are outlined in the succeeding section. The said Committee will be responsible for awarding the Safe Seal.

- The Majority Floor Leader further enumerated the following Safe Seal categories and criteria:
  - The Basic Safe Seal, or standard compliance, encourages establishments to commit to being a safe space where child protection policies are applied, practice guest ID verification, and ensure compliance with the tourism protection policy. Their employees must have training on response protocols.
  - The QC Gold Safe Seal is for establishments that level up their compliance, but with additional requirements, such as inclusive hiring, conducting an annual gender inclusion audit, and advanced safety measures, including CCTVs, gender-neutral restrooms, panic buttons, and regular staff background checks.
  - The Platinum QC Safe Seal is a rigid category to attain, as establishments must have maintained their Gold Safe Seal status for three (3) consecutive years and require a transparency or compliance report.
  - There is also a BE R.I.C.H.E.R. scorecard wherein the establishments must obtain a score of at least 80%.
- They sought the opinions of the departments, such as the Local Economic Development and Investment Promotions Office (LEDIPO), on the possible incentives that may be granted to business establishments in addition to the seal, which may vary depending on whether they attained the Basic, Gold, or Platinum Safe Seal.
- During the Committee on Laws, it was noted that the initial proposal of granting 10% of the annual business taxes as an incentive was too substantial. Thus, based on the recommendation of the BPLD, the tax incentive will be 50% of the 1% discount on local business taxes. This incentive will not significantly impact the City's revenue, as it encourages business establishments to apply for the Safe Seal.
- Councilor Delarmente manifested that, as a Councilor and a mother of two (2) children, she supports the Quezon City Safe Seal Ordinance. She emphasized that every parent wishes for their children to grow up in a community where they are protected, valued, and safe. The measure strengthens the fight against exploitation, abuse, and human trafficking. It ensures that businesses operating in the city follow proper safeguards, maintain trained staff, establish clear reporting systems, and provide an environment that prioritizes the dignity and safety of every person.
- The Minority Floor Leader further noted that the Safe Seal is more than a recognition program; it represents a promise that Quezon City will not tolerate harm against children, women, and the most vulnerable. It is a commitment to building a city where families can thrive without fear. The ordinance sends a strong message that exploitation has no place in Quezon City. With this, she requested the support of the City Council, government, businesses, and communities to make Quezon City not only progressive but also a safe city for children.

- Councilor Juico expressed full support for the measure, noting that it coincides with National Children’s Month. Quezon City has been very extensive in promoting the anti-online sexual abuse and exploitation of children. He also clarified the tax incentive of 50% of 1%, which he made a sample computation, a taxpayer paying One Million Pesos (PHP1,000,000.00), the fifty percent (50%) of which is Five Hundred Thousand (PHP500,000.00), having an incentive of one percent (1%) of it, which is Five Thousand Pesos (PhP5,000.00). With that, he hopes to increase the incentive to motivate businesses beyond complying with the Safety Seal requirements. With that, he encouraged the Council members to review the numbers and assess the feasibility of enhancing the incentive.

Meanwhile, the Presiding Officer declared a one-minute recess as requested by Councilor Juico.

(While on recess, the Presiding Officer acknowledged the presence of the 27<sup>th</sup> Batch of Center for Excellence in Research and Student Leadership or CENTREX.)

When the session resumed, the period of discussion was terminated.

In the period of amendments, the following modifications were adopted:

- To change the title into “*AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE QUEZON CITY SAFE SEAL RECOGNITION PROGRAM TO PROMOTE SAFETY AND PROTECTION AGAINST EXPLOITATION, INCLUDING HUMAN TRAFFICKING IN BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENTS IN QUEZON CITY*”.
- To insert Sections 3 and 4 to reflect the *Anti-Trafficking in Persons Ordinance* and *Anti-OSAEC Ordinance*.
- In the dispositive portion, to reflect the title that “This ordinance shall be known as the Safe Seal Ordinance of Quezon City.”
- To add a *Declaration of Policy* and in Section 3, the *Establishment of the Quezon City Safe Seal Program*.
- To insert in the Definition of Terms, *forced labor, sexual exploitation, the QC Safe Seal, business establishment, tourism enterprises, Quezon City Safe Seal Committee, trafficking in persons*, and an addition of the *BE R.I.C.H.E.R.*
- To amend the Scope to accommodate the requests of the Councilors to limit it to tourism enterprises and other businesses with potential risks for human trafficking and exploitation.
- To amend the Safe Seal Committee as indicated in the amended ordinance, as well as the additional functions of the committee in Section 8.
- To amend the committee member responsibilities under Section 9.
- To amend the coordination with local bodies for safety and protection against exploitation in Section 10.

- To amend Section 11 for the QC Safe Seal Categories and Criteria, changing some criteria under the Basic Safe Seal Ordinance, the Gold Safe Seal Ordinance, and the Platinum QC Safe Seal.
- To make some amendments in the monitoring and compliance and the revocation and dissemination, as well as the IRR.
- To include Councilors Joseph Visaya, Dorothy Delarmente, and Joseph Juico as principal authors of the measure.
- To include all councilors present as introducers of the measure.
- To increase the percentage to 50% of 3% discount on all local business taxes in Section 13, Letter C, Platinum.

With that, the Presiding Officer expressed support for the measure, stating that safeguarding human dignity is a core value that Quezon City must uphold.
