Before proceeding, upon request of the Majority Floor Leader, the Presiding Officer acknowledged the presence of the students and teachers from the Center of Excellence (CENTREX) for Research and Student Leadership to witness the day's session of the 23rd Quezon City Council.

Thereafter, Councilor Medalla (Aly) moved for the approval of **PO23CC-001** and stated the merits of the ordinance, viz:

- It is a vital measure, particularly for the promotion of sustainability and circularity of textiles in the city.
- The textile industry contributes 8% to 10% of global carbon emissions and 20% of global wastewater in its production.
- Based on studies, only around 20% of textile waste is recycled. Everyone consumes textiles and wears them every day, contributing greatly to the detriment of the environment.
- Several landmark legislations for the environment have been enacted by the Quezon City Council over the years, viz: Quezon City Environment Code; Quezon City Green Public Procurement Ordinance of 2021; and Plastic Ordinance.
- It is high time for the Council to pass an ordinance that regulates textiles, their use, and disposal in the city.
- The proposed ordinance addresses several key areas: it focuses on the prevention and reduction of textile waste; emphasizes the importance of product longevity and quality over quantity; circular economy; encourages shared responsibility among stakeholders; and advocates for the creation of just or green jobs within the textile sector.
- Quezon City is set to become the first city to implement an ordinance regulating textiles, acknowledging that the proposed ordinance is new and still in its early developmental stage.
- The salient provisions of the ordinance are as follows:
 - Definition of terms for the terminologies that will be used all over the measure.
 - Textile sustainability and circularity program.

- Establishment of the Quezon City Textile Sustainability and Circularity Committee, consisting of several departments and stakeholders, concerning the regulation of textile use.
- Creation of the annual report on Quezon City Textile Sustainability and Circularity.
- Regulations on the collection, sorting, and distribution of textile waste.
- Provision for the promotion of textile repair, reuse, repurposing, and recycling initiatives in Quezon City.
- Added sustainability in the procurement of Local Government uniforms.
- Establishment of Quezon City Textile Hub. In fact, one of the hubs has already been built in the Payatas Disposal Facility.
- Provision for incentives for textile sustainability and circularity practices.
- Provision for a sunset review stating that within three (3) years after the effectivity of the ordinance or as the need arises, the ordinance shall be reviewed.
- Provision for the funding of the ordinance.
- The proposed ordinance is a product of thorough public consultations with the different stakeholders who attended the same.
- In her possession are position papers and comments from the following stakeholders: Philippine Textile and Research Institute under the Department of Science & Technology, who actively participated in the public consultation; AMH Philippines, who provided feedback on what improvements can be done in the proposed ordinance; Isla-Tek, a manufacturer and distributor of Filipino tropical yarns and fabrics; and REPAMANA, an organization that reuses or repurposes textile waste.
- The Lady Proponent further encouraged her colleagues to support the ordinance to help in the management of textile use and waste.

Councilor Delarmente expressed gratitude to the Majority Floor Leader for her inclusion as one of the principal introducers of this important measure, alongside Councilor Generoso, Chairperson of the Committee on Environment. As a steadfast advocate for environmental protection, she highlighted the significance of the measure, particularly in light of the growing problem of textile waste, which she referred to as “the new plastic.” This waste is increasingly problematic, as it occupies landfills, pollutes waterways, and contributes to carbon emissions. The Lady Speaker asserted that tackling this issue transcends mere policy; it embodies a moral obligation to protect the environment.

Moreover, the Minority Floor Leader pronounced that the ordinance provides a strong, comprehensive framework for action; hence, she conveyed her full support, especially to the following provisions:

- Establishment of Textile Circularity Centers (Section 9). These centers will make textile collection, sorting, reuse, and upcycling accessible to the communities. She is committed to helping identify barangays and local sites where these centers can be effectively implemented, especially in District 1.
- Livelihood Initiatives on Textile Repair, Reuse, and Upcycling (Section 11). This will uplift home-based tailors, women's groups, displaced workers, senior citizens, and young entrepreneurs. They are not only reducing waste but expanding economic opportunities and empowering families.
- Creation of Incentives for organizations and businesses that choose to participate in circularity efforts (Section 13). Encouraging good environmental practices, through recognition and support, will build stronger partnerships across sectors.
- Annual Reporting and Mapping of Textile Waste (Section 7). Data-driven governance will help them identify where interventions are most needed and ensure that every district, including District I, receives appropriate support.

Lastly, Councilor Delarmente asserted that this ordinance is more than a policy; it is a promise to build a cleaner, healthier, and more sustainable Quezon City; a promise to future generations that they acted when it mattered. She then hoped that this ordinance would be a testament that Quezon City does not simply react to global challenges, but rises to meet them with innovation, heart, and unity. She speaks not only with her mind, but with her conscience and hope for a greener, safer, and more sustainable city. She enjoined her colleagues to continue to lead with purpose, integrity, and compassion.

Councilor Medalla (Aly) likewise thanked Councilor Delarmente, an environmental champion, and Councilor Generoso, Chairperson of the Committee on Environment, who authored the Green Building Ordinance, another landmark legislation for the Quezon City Council.

There being no other manifestations, the discussion was terminated, and the following modifications were adopted:

- The amended version of the ordinance was already submitted to the Secretary to the Sanggunian, containing revisions on the following: Title; Whereas clauses; Declaration of Policy; Definition of Terms; widens the Scope, including A and B; Section 5 (Textile Sustainability and Circularity Program); Implementing Agencies; Creation of Textile Sustainability and Circularity Committee to include PESO, PAISD, and representatives from NGOs, CSOs with additional conditions; Functions of the QCTSCC and Secretariat; Section 10, Sorting and Distribution of the Waste; Section 11, Promotion of the textile repair, reuse, repurposing, and recycling initiatives in the city; Sections 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 19, and 20.
- To include all members of the 23rd City Council as co-introducers of the measure.

Subsequently, extending his full support for the ordinance, the Presiding Officer stated that the foregoing ordinance is very valuable, strengthens the local economy, and protects the environment for future generations.

Similarly, upon motion for its approval, Councilor Belmonte (Mikey) cited the merits of the resolution, as incorporated in the *Whereas* clauses, outlining the pertinent laws, particularly the 1987 Constitution, Local Government Code of 1991, and other local legislations, mandating the government to protect and advance the right of the people to a balanced and healthful ecology, promote a just and dynamic social order, ensure prosperity, improve quality of life of the people, and establish Comprehensive Land Use Plans (CLUPs) to guide long-term spatial development and ensure efficient land utilization. He further clarified that the proposed revised CLUP of Quezon City has been prepared in accordance with, and is guided by, the applicable guidelines, standards, and policies issued by the Department of Human Settlements and Urban Development (DHSUD). The last CLUP was updated and implemented in 2011, and the proposed revision was undertaken in recognition of substantial demographic shifts, economic restructuring, social dynamics, environmental challenges, and institutional development. This revision is deemed necessary to ensure its alignment with the city's development vision, sectoral goals, objectives, strategies, policy directions, as well as with the local executive and legislative agenda, and relevant regional, national, and global development frameworks.

As the Presiding Officer stated, meticulous planning is essential, which underscores the necessity of the Comprehensive Land Use Plan (CLUP) for the city government.

There being no other comments, on motion, duly seconded, **PR23CC-214** was **APPROVED** on its second reading, adopting the following modifications:

- The Local Health Board has approved the Quezon City SHF Guidelines through LHB Resolution No. 25, Series of 2025. These guidelines establish the framework for planning, budgeting, implementation, and monitoring related to citywide health financing.
- The proposed resolution completes the governance process by securing City Council adoption, thereby enabling all concerned departments—including QCHD, CPO, Accounting, and Budget—to officially implement fund management in accordance with UHC policies.
- By adopting the guidelines, Quezon City strengthens its transition to a fully integrated city-wide health system, promotes efficient fund pooling and strategic purchasing of health services, ensures financial sustainability for priority health programs, and provides clear accountability mechanisms aligned with COA and national UHC directives.
- The measure further enhances coordination among the LGU, DOH, MMCHD, PhilHealth, and the Department of Finance to ensure the City's readiness and compliance with UHC implementation requirements.
- The measure affirms Quezon City's commitment to operationalizing the Universal Health Care Act through transparent, unified, and accountable health financing under the Special Health Fund.

- The measure ensures that all disbursements from SHF will adhere to government budgeting, accounting, and auditing rules and remain under the oversight of the City Health Board, the governance body mandated by RA 11223.
