- Following the incidents on July 19 and November 10, 2025, along Katipunan Avenue, a public consultation was conducted to address the circumstances and the contributing factors related to these events, focusing on the proposed *Quezon City Billboard Weather Safety Ordinance*.
- During the said consultation, gaps in the current billboard regulations were identified. It was recommended that the Technical Working Group formulate amendments to the existing billboard ordinance to address these gaps.
- Given the increasing impacts of climate change and the urgency of addressing public safety concerns, the *Quezon City Billboard Weather Safety Ordinance* is designed as a preventive measure to protect lives, prevent injuries, and minimize property damage caused by unsecured billboards and signage during severe weather events, as Quezon City frequently experiences typhoons, strong winds, and heavy rainfall.

- The existing regulations do not explicitly require the securing or removal of these materials during adverse weather conditions, resulting in recurring safety hazards. Thus, the proposed ordinance seeks to address this gap by mandating immediate safety actions based on official advisories issued by PAGASA and the City Government.
- The measure establishes a structured framework for preparedness and response, empowers the Quezon City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (QCDRRMC) and concerned departments to enforce safety measures, and imposes penalties to ensure compliance.
- The proposed ordinance demonstrates the City Government’s commitment to disaster risk reduction and public safety by emphasizing proactive measures to safeguard lives and property.

Meanwhile, the Majority Floor Leader noted that during the hearing of the Committee on Laws, several suggestions were raised regarding the ordinance, and the changes would be incorporated later during the period of amendments.

- **Amendments:**

- To remove the first WHEREAS clause reading, *Whereas, Ordinance No. SP-2109, S-2011 regulates the construction, display, and maintenance of billboards, signage, and related structures within Quezon City to ensure safety, aesthetics, and compliance with city standards.*
- To add another WHEREAS clause, *“Whereas, to ensure the proper regulations of billboard and signage within Quezon City, Ordinance No. SP-3044, S-2021, provides procedures for the installation, operation, and oversight of such structures on government property.”*
- To add another section, short title, *“This ordinance shall be known as the Quezon City Billboards Weather Safety Ordinance.”*
- To insert the phrase, *“Section 2, Coverage. This ordinance shall apply to all billboard and signage owners, operators, lessors, lessees, advertisers, and any other persons or entities responsible for billboards and signage located within Quezon City, including those situated on government-owned properties covered under Ordinance No. SP-3044 S-2021, that are designed, constructed, or otherwise equipped to allow for the immediate lowering, rolling, removal, or securing of display materials and structural components in response to weather disturbance or other public safety hazards.”*
- Section 3. Upon the issuance of PAGASA or the Quezon City Governemnt of any public advisory pertaining to tropical depression, tropical storms, severe tropical storms, and meteorological condition, all billboards and signage possessing roll-up, roll-down, removable, or dismantlable components shall be immediately secured, which includes what is not limited to rolling down, removing, dismantling, or otherwise rendering said component safe against displacement, detachment, or collapse.

Billboard owners and operators are hereby expressly notified and reminded that the Quezon City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (QCDRRMO) regularly issues official public advisories—including and not limited to WIND ADVISORIES—signifying the presence of wind conditions that create a substantial risk of structural failure or collapse of billboards and signage materials.

Upon issuance of such advisories, all covered billboard owners and operators are under a mandatory and immediate obligation to undertake the requisite safety measures to secure their structures.

Non-compliance, delay, neglect, or refusal to act upon said advisories shall constitute a violation of this ordinance and shall subject the responsible owner-operator to the penalties provided therein.

- To add another section—*Weather Preparedness Response*, notwithstanding, the foregoing in cases of heavy rainfall, isolated rain shower, other calamities or hazardous weather condition not accompanied by the issuance of tropical cyclone wind signal and Quezon City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council composed of the following: 1. Office of the City Mayor as the Chairperson, Office of the City Administrator and the Department of Public Order and Safety as co-vice persons. The Quezon City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Officer as the Action Officer with member offices of Committee on Disaster Risk Reduction, Task Force Dangling Wires, Task Force Streetlighting, City Budget Department, City Accounting Department, Quezon City Department of Engineering, City Health Department, City Planning and Development Office, Department of the Interior and Local Government, Quezon City Field Office, District Action Offices, Barangay Community Relations Department, City Tourism Department, Climate Change and Environmental Sustainability Department, Department of Sanitation and Clean Up Works Quezon City, Gender Development Office, Housing, Community and Resettlement Department, Office of the Senior Citizens Affairs, Parks Development Administration Department, Persons with Disability Affairs Office, Small Business and Cooperative Development and Promotion Office, Social Services and Development Department, Traffic and Transport Management Department, City Treasurer's Office, Philippine Red Cross-Quezon City Chapter, Liga ng mga Barangay, Public Affairs and Information Service Department, Public Employment Service Office, Quezon City Fire District, Quezon City General Hospital, Rosario Maclang Bautista General Hospital, Novaliches District Hospital, Quezon City Police District, Armed Forces of the Philippines, National Capital Region Command, Quezon City Citizens Service Department, Schools Division Superintendent—is hereby authorized to issue directive requiring the immediate pulling up and rolling down, removal, dismantling, or otherwise the securing of billboard and signage, whenever such action is necessary to protect life, property, and public safety. Such directive shall be immediately enforceable upon insurance.

All billboard owners are hereby mandated, on their own initiative or upon the recommendation of the Quezon City Disaster Reduction Management Council, to comply with a phased implementation framework. Said framework shall include definitive timelines and areas hereby adopted to ensure timely, uniform, and enforceable compliance with this ordinance.

- To add another Section, *Information Public Advisories and Dissemination*. The Public Affairs and Information Services Department, or PAISD, in coordination with the DBO, the Quezon City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office, and other concerned offices, shall be responsible for timely, accurate, and wide dissemination of the public advisories, announcements, and information relative to this ordinance.

The dissemination of the information by PAISD shall not excuse noncompliance with this ordinance, as covered entities are expected to independently monitor official advisories issued by the PAGASA and the Quezon City Government.

- To change the amount of the penalty clause and to add the word “*Per Day*” until compliance.
- To add the phrase in Section 5—*By PAGASA or Quezon City Government, and upon the posting of clearance by the Quezon City Disaster Risk Reduction Management Council. Such posting of clearance shall serve as official authorization for installation or reactivation. Any reinstallation or reactivation conducted without such clearance shall be considered a violation of this ordinance and shall be subject to penalties as provided herein.*
- To include all councilors present as co-introducers of the ordinance.

Councilor Medalla (Aly) manifested her understanding that there was also a suggestion **to include a section on the creation of the Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR)**, which she noted had not yet been mentioned.

Meanwhile, a one-minute recess was declared as requested by Councilor Ferrer.

When the session resumed, the Lady Proponent manifested **the inclusion of an IRR before No. 10**.

Councilor De Leon inquired whether the amendments included that the Department of the Building Official (DBO) would be the lead department, as agreed upon during the Committee on Laws hearing, to which the Lady Proponent responded that it is already written in the original ordinance that it would be led by the DBO.

Thereafter, the Majority Floor Leader noted that Councilor Ferrer has already introduced the proposed amendments to the penalty clause to ensure conformity with the Local Government Code. Further suggested, if possible, the inclusion of a section on the Definition of Terms, particularly defining signage and billboard, their specifications, but its adoption remains at the discretion of the Lady Proponent.
