She emphasized that a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) between the Department of Education (DepEd) and the Quezon City Government is necessary for the immediate implementation and construction of basic education facilities.

In view thereof, as moved and seconded, the rules were suspended to accommodate approval of the resolution at hand.

Whereupon, on separate motions, duly seconded, **PR23CC-382** was **APPROVED** on its second reading and **CONFIRMED**, under suspended rules, with the following manifestations and an amendment **to include all the councilors as introducers of the measure**:

- Mayor Joy Belmonte, together with the City Treasurer Edgar Villanueva, formally accepted the said award during the 38<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration of DOF-BLGF.
- For fiscal year 2024 alone, the Quezon City Government generated PhP28.8 Billion in locally sourced revenues primarily from real property taxes, business taxes, and other local taxes and non-tax revenues.
