For the discussion, the Proponent read the *Whereas* clauses of the resolution, emphasizing the need to amend Ordinance No. SP-2007, S-2010, regulating the traffic flow in Barangay White Plains. He also highlighted the sections pertinent to the definitions of terms, illegal parking, double parking, one-side parking, one-way streets, etc. He added that the Traffic and Transport Management Department (TTMD) issued a letter of no objection to the proposed amendment of the traffic scheme of Barangay White Plains, and the said barangay also enacted a Barangay Resolution seeking the City Council's assistance to amend the previous ordinance. Also, he stressed that the resolution was thoroughly discussed in the hearing of the Committees on Transportation and Laws.

There being no other discussants, on motion, duly seconded, **PO23CC-103** was **APPROVED** on its second reading, **adopting all the amendments made during the committee meetings and including all the District III councilors (to be placed after the name of Councilor Lagumbay), as well as all the other councilors present, as co-introducers of the measure.**

Having moved for its approval, Councilor Juico expressed that the foregoing ordinance seeks to implement one-side parking zones, one-way traffic flow, and strictly no parking areas on designated streets in Barangay Paraiso, as prescribed under the Quezon City Ordinance No. SP-2785, S-2018, as amended by Ordinance No. SP-3172, S-2023, or the Quezon City Traffic Code.

For the amendments, the following revisions were adopted:

- The title shall read as follows: “AN ORDINANCE INSTITUTIONALIZING A TRAFFIC AND PARKING REGULATION SCHEME IN BARANGAY PARAISO, DISTRICT 1, QUEZON CITY, PROVIDING FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF ONE-SIDE PARKING ZONES, ONE -WAY TRAFFIC FLOW, AND STRICTLY NO PARKING AREAS ON DESIGNATED STREETS, AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF.”

- The 2nd *Whereas* clause shall read as follows: “WHEREAS, Section 5 (e) and (f) of Republic Act No. 7924 creating the Metro Manila Development Authority (MMDA), vest upon the MMDA the authority to formulate, coordinate, and regulate metro-wide traffic management policies and programs within Metro Manila; and pursuant to prevailing jurisprudence, such authority has primacy over the traffic regulation powers granted to cities under Section 458(a)(5)(v-vi) of Republic Act. No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, insofar as local traffic ordinances must not conflict with valid MMDA’s regulations and metro-wide traffic policies.”
- To move the last *Whereas* clause of the original ordinance as the 3rd *Whereas* and insert this provision: “(vi) Regulate traffic on all streets and bridges; prohibit encroachments or obstacles thereon, and when necessary in the interest of public welfare, authorize the removal of encroachments and illegal constructions in public places.”
- To amend the 7th *Whereas* clause of the original version and read as follows: “WHEREAS, the Sangguniang Barangay of Barangay Paraiso, District 1, Quezon City, coordinated with the Quezon City Traffic and Transportation Management Department (TTMD), which expressed no objection to the institutionalization of the Barangay Paraiso Traffic and Parking Regulation Scheme, including the implementation of one-side parking zones, one-way traffic flow, strict no-parking areas, and the imposition of clamping, towing, and other penalties for illegal parking, in accordance with Quezon City Ordinance No. SP-3172, S-2023, an ordinance revising Ordinance No. SP-2785, S-2018, otherwise known as the Revised Traffic Management Code of Quezon City, pursuant to Metro Manila Development Authority Resolution No. 2023-02.”
- To insert a new Section 5, to read as follows:

“SECTION 5. IMPLEMENTATION. The Barangay Paraiso Council, in coordination with the Traffic and Transport Management Department of this City, the Metro Manila Development Authority, and the Barangay Public Safety Officers (BPSO) shall:

 - Install appropriate traffic signs and signals;
 - Conduct an information campaign; and
 - Assign traffic enforcers in affected areas during implementation.”
- To insert a new Section 6, viz: “SECTION 6. EXEMPTIONS. - The Emergency services, such as ambulances, fire trucks, and police vehicles responding to emergencies, are exempted from this ordinance.
- Section 6 of the original version shall become Section 7 and be amended as follows:

DEPUTIZATION. - The Sangguniang Barangay of Paraiso shall endorse its personnel, including, but not limited to, the Barangay Public Safety Officers (BPSO), for training and deputization by the appropriate authority, including the Metro Manila Development Authority and/or the Quezon City Transport and Traffic Management Department, subject to existing laws, rules, regulations, and deputization protocols.

Upon completion of the following training and formal deputization, such personnel shall be authorized to enforce the provisions of this Ordinance and applicable Quezon City traffic ordinance within the territorial jurisdiction of Barangay Paraiso.”

“SECTION 8. ENFORCEMENT. - The Traffic and Transport Management Department of this city, the Philippine National Police Quezon City Station, and the Barangay Deputized Traffic Enforcers, as duly deputized, are hereby authorized and empowered to administer and implement all the rules and regulations in the Barangay Paraiso Traffic and Parking Regulation Scheme Ordinance.

All existing Quezon City ordinance related to traffic management is hereby adopted. The TTMD of Quezon City, as duly deputized, shall formulate and issue the necessary rules and regulations for the effective implementation of this Ordinance.

- Section 8 of the original version shall become Section 9 and be amended as follows: “SECTION 9. PENALTIES. - Any person found violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be issued a Unified Ordinance Violation Receipt (UOVR) and shall pay the corresponding fines, and/or be subject to vehicle clamping and/or towing, pursuant to Quezon City Ordinance No. SP-2785, S-2018 (Revised Traffic Management Code of Quezon City), as amended, including Ordinance No. SP-3052, S-2021, and Ordinance No. SP-3172, S-2023, and other applicable traffic regulations.”
- Section 9 of the original version shall become Section 10 (REPEALING CLAUSE).
- Section 10 of the original version shall become Section 11 and read as: “SECTION 11. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. - If any reason or reasons, any part or provision of the Ordinance shall be held unconstitutional or invalid, or other parts or provisions hereof which are not affected thereby shall continue to be in force and in effect.”
- To include all the councilors present as co-introducers of the measure.

Finally, on motion, duly seconded, **PO23CC-132** was **APPROVED** on its second reading, as amended.

PO23CC-136 – AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE GRANT OF HONORARIA TO MEMBERS OF THE QUEZON CITY DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL (CDC) (*Introduced by Councilors ALY MEDALLA, ALBERT ALVIN “Chuckie” L. ANTONIO III, ATTY. VOLTAIRE GODOFREDO “Bong” LIBAN III and CHARM FERRER, CPA, MPA, JD*)

The Committees on Laws, Rules & Internal Government and Appropriations recommended approval, with amendment:

- to include all Councilors present as Co-Introducers of the measure.

The Majority Floor Leader moved for the approval of PO23CC-136 on its second reading.

Moving on to the discussion, Councilor Medalla (Aly) elaborated that:

- The City Development Council (CDC) has a very important role in the city as it is responsible for formulating the city's socio-economic development plans and public investment programs for coordinating development efforts across all barangays.
- The CDC is composed of the City Mayor as Chairperson, all Punong Barangays, the Chairperson of the Committee on Appropriations of the Sangguniang Panlungsod (Councilor Shay Liban), the Congressional District Representatives or their authorized representatives, and representatives of accredited NGOs and POs constituting not less than one-fourth of its membership.
- The measure authorizes the grant of honoraria to the CDC members to modestly defray transportation and incidental expenses and to recognize the time and effort contributed by the members in the fulfillment of their mandated functions.
- The ordinance provides for the grant, rationale, and rates of the honoraria, viz: PhP3,000.00 for the Chairperson and PhP2,000.00 for each member of the Council, with a total amount of PhP806,000.00 for the year.
- All honoraria granted to the CDC members through executive orders or directives issued by the Mayor are hereby validated and ratified.

Upon recognition, Councilor Liban (Bong) expressed his no objection to the measure as it is just right to defray the expenses of the CDC members. However, he pointed out that Article IX B, Section 8 of the Philippine Constitution provides that no elective or appointed public officer or employee shall receive additional, double, or indirect compensation unless specifically authorized by law. To his knowledge, a law authorizing or granting additional compensation should be made by Congress. For this reason, he suggested clearing the matter as it will run in direct contravention of the Constitution.

The Majority Floor Leader shared her experience on the Local School Board, granting honoraria to teachers on top of their salary. She stressed that the law allows honoraria not exceeding the percentage specified by the Local Government Code, and the proposed measure falls under that. She further remarked that the city government also provides honoraria to all special bodies, just like the Quezon City Board of Regents, and teachers from public schools receive allowances from the local government; and these are usually done through an ordinance passed by the City Council.

On the other hand, Councilor Liban (Bong) recalled that they did not receive any emoluments when he was a member of the Quezon City Polytechnic University. He clarified that he does not want to harm anyone. However, he pointed out that if they violate this provision, they could be subjected to administrative, civil, and criminal cases. Hence, they need to clear this matter.

Meanwhile, a recess was declared.

There being no other clarifications, on motion, duly seconded, **PO23CC-136** was **APPROVED** on its second reading, with an amendment to **include all the councilors present as introducers of the measure.**

The Committee on Laws, Rules & Internal Government recommended approval, with amendments/remarks:

- to adopt suggested amendments to include provisions on deputization, enforcement, and penalties;
- to submit an amended version of the measure; and
- to include all Councilors present as Co-Introducers of the measure.

The Committees on Public Order & Security and Transportation recommended approval, with amendment:

- to include all Councilors present as Co-Introducers of the measure.

On motion of Councilor Calalay, duly seconded, **PO23CC-144** was **APPROVED** on its second reading, with the following manifestations from the Proponent, and the adoption of the amendments made:

- The Frisco area is a primary source of traffic congestion, particularly when there is heavy traffic from Manila going to Del Monte, as well as from West Avenue or the Quezon City Circle passing through Frisco en route to Manila.
- Traffic in Frisco, particularly in Barangay Damayan, has worsened due to the ongoing construction of the Congressman Rey Calalay Public Market.
- The barangay officials, led by the Punong Barangay, had passed a resolution proposing the implementation of a one-way traffic scheme in the area.
- The Applicant has complied with all the necessary requirements and has undergone the required public consultation.

- The proposed ordinance seeks to amend an existing measure granting general authority to Mayor Ma. Josefina G. Belmonte to sign all Memoranda of Agreement (MOA), Memoranda of Understanding (MOU), and other similar agreements that do not involve any sale, purchase, or disposal of government properties.
- Under the amended version, there was an additional clause on the grant of general authority – authorizing the City Mayor, or her duly authorized representative, to sign all Memoranda of Agreement or Understanding and other similar agreements or instruments, provided that they do not involve the sale, purchase, or disposal of government properties; do not involve the disbursement of public funds; and do not bind the Quezon City Government to any monetary obligations.
- The proposed measure also incorporates a sunset provision, wherein the ordinance shall take effect in accordance with the provisions of the next succeeding section and shall remain effective only for as long as the incumbent Mayor, Honorable Ma. Josefina Belmonte, remains in office. It shall be automatically revoked upon any change in leadership in the Office of the City Mayor.
