I. OPENING PRAYER

Councilor Neri led the opening prayer.

II. NATIONAL ANTHEM

The Community Singing of the Philippine National Anthem.

III. COUNCILORS' CREED

IV. CALL TO ORDER

The 39th Regular Session was called to order at 2:34 P.M. by the Presiding Officer, Vice Mayor Gian G. Sotto.

Before proceeding, the Presiding Officer acknowledged the presence of former Councilor Eufemio "Pinggoy" Lagumbay.

V. ROLL CALL

Meanwhile, as moved by Councilor Wenceron Lagumbay, a recess was declared for the presentation of plaques of recognition, particularly honoring his father, Honorable Eufemio C. Lagumbay, who was acknowledged for his service as one of the National Chairpersons of the Philippine Councilors League (PCL) from 1999 to 2001.

Then, a photo op ensued.

Similarly, the same plaque of recognition was awarded to the late former Councilor Victor V. Ferrer, Jr. for serving as the National President (2008 to 2010) of the PCL, which was received by his daughter, Councilor Charm Ferrer.

When the session resumed, on motion, duly seconded, the rules were suspended to accommodate a short speech from former Councilor Pinggoy Lagumbay.

Foremost, former Councilor Pinggoy Lagumbay extended his greetings to Vice Mayor Gian Sotto, officers, and members of the City Council, headed by Councilor Aly Medalla, former colleagues, and sons and daughters of his former colleagues. He did not expect that this award from the Philippine Councilors League during its 35th Anniversary would be handed to him by the Quezon City Council in the day’s session. He then expressed his gratitude to the PCL, composed of 18,000 councilors nationwide, for this recognition. He also conveyed his gratitude to the late Councilors Guillermo “Willy” C. Altuna, founder and first National Chairperson of the PCL, and Jun Ferrer, his batchmate, who also served as National President of this huge and vital League. Also, he thanked God for the opportunity to serve the approximately 18,000 councilors they have represented during that time.

Giving a brief background, Councilor Pinggoy Lagumbay narrated that the late Councilor Guillermo Altuna (fondly called Manong Willy) assisted in crafting the Local Government Code of the Philippines (RA 7160), which provides recognition to the different leagues, one of which is the PCL, headed by him (Manong Willy) and late Councilor Ponce Subido of Manila. Through Manong Willy’s leadership, the PCL was recognized by the national government for the first time. The PCL is rooted in the Metro Manila Councilors League. During that time, many criticized its formulation, but now, the said league is already celebrating its 35th Anniversary. He said that the promise of “Manong Willy” that all presidents of this League will sit as an Ex-Officio member of their Sangguniang Panlalawigan also comes in reality, through the Local Government Code. He further claimed that his representation and the late Councilor Jun Ferrer are products of the teachings and guidance of “Manong Willy,” assisting the PCL in its birth pains. He again expressed his thanks to “Manong Willy” for his guidance, especially when he was elected the National Secretary and eventually the National President from 1998 to 2001. He stressed that it is a big honor since Quezon City was again elected after “Manong Willy’s” presidency.

To conclude, former Councilor Pinggoy Lagumbay reiterated his gratitude to the Lord, to “Manong Willy”, to Quezon City, and the City Council. He offered this honor to all who trusted them during their incumbency as councilors of the city, and because of that, they were also trusted by their colleagues in the PCL.

The Presiding Officer thanked former Councilor Pinggoy Lagumbay, whom they are very proud of, for his message of appreciation.

Upon recognition, Councilor Wencerom Lagumbay thanked the Presiding Officer and his colleagues for allowing his father to speak on behalf of his colleagues who are now in God's presence. He proudly claimed that Quezon City is truly a city that is always first, since PCL started in the city. He added that for the first time in history, the Quezon City Council got the Hall of Fame award. “*Mabuhay ang Philippine Councilors League, Mabuhay po ang Lungsod Quezon,*” he uttered.

Thereafter, the rules were restored.

After which, the Presiding Officer again declared a recess to acknowledge some guests in the gallery.

While on recess, multiple plaques/scrolls of recognition were also awarded to the following, followed by a photo op with the recipients:

On motion of Councilor Herrera, duly seconded, **PO23CC-108** was **APPROVED** on its second reading, with the following manifestations from the Proponent, and the adoption of the amendment made, **including the authors of the previous ordinances, Councilors Aly Medalla and Joseph Juico as principal authors of the measure:**

- The proposed measure seeks to institutionalize the National Feeding Program in Quezon City pursuant to Republic Act No. 11037 to strengthen the local implementation of the national mandate to address child hunger and undernutrition by consolidating the existing related programs currently implemented by the Social Services Development Department (SSDD) and the Quezon City Health Department (QCHD) under the Quezon City Comprehensive Child Care Package, which covers supplemental feeding for children aged three (3) to five (5) years old, school-based feeding for kindergarten up to Grade Six (6), micronutrient supplementation, health services, such as *Gulayan sa Paaralan*, Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (WASH) standards, and integrated nutrition education.
- During the hearing of the Committee on Laws, the City Council proposed an amendment compiling previously enacted related ordinances with recommendations, to include a new *Whereas Clause* recognizing Ordinance No. SP-3242, S-2023, otherwise known as the Barangay Comprehensive Nutritional Program Ordinance, to ensure alignment with existing barangay-level nutrition mandates.
- Section 4 of the measure was also amended to clarify funding responsibilities, affirm the City's allocation from its Special Education Fund (SEF), and other appropriations. The amendment likewise ensures that barangays and their respective Sangguniang Kabataan incorporate supportive nutrition programs into their Barangay Nutrition Action Plans, Annual Investment Plans, and Annual Budgets, consistent with existing laws.
- The Body also adopted the policy recommendations of Assistant City Administrator Rene Grapilon, specifically strengthening the standards and clarifying implementation and funding provisions to ensure that the ordinance remains legally sound, operationally clear, and aligned with existing government frameworks.
- The Quezon City Health Department (QCHD) formally requested the approval of the proposed measure as part of the City's deliverables to sustain and strengthen the *Green Banner Seal of Compliance*. It was noted that Quezon City received the Green Banner Award for Nutrition in 2025 and is aiming to secure the same award in 2026.

Meanwhile, a recess was called by **the Acting Presiding Officer, Councilor Ferrer, to yield the Chair to the Majority Floor Leader, Councilor Aly Medalla.**

“The implementation of this ordinance shall be funded through the annual appropriations of the Quezon City Government, subject to the existing budgeting, accounting, and auditing laws, rules, and regulations. The amount necessary for its effective implementation shall be included in the Annual Investment Plan and the annual budget of the City thereafter such sums as may be necessary for the continuous implementation of this ordinance shall be appropriated annually. In the absence of a specific appropriation, the implementation shall be subject to the availability of funds and may be sourced from existing appropriations of concerned offices and departments included but not limited to the Quezon City Health Department and other implementing agencies, consistent with the applicable laws and regulations”;
- to cite previously enacted Ordinances related to this measure;
- to include the Principal Authors of previous Ordinances as Co-Authors of the measure; and
- to include all Councilors present as Co-Introducers of the measure.

The Committees on Health and Sanitation recommended approval, with amendment:

- to include all Councilors present as Co-Introducers of the measure.

On motion of Councilor Herrera, duly seconded, **PO23CC-109** was **APPROVED** on its second reading, with the following manifestations from the Proponent, and the adoption of the amendment made, **including the authors of the previous ordinances, Councilors Vic Bernardo, Joseph Juico, and Aly Medalla, as principal authors of the measure:**

- The proposed ordinance aims to strengthen the integrated strategy for maternal, neonatal, and child health and nutrition during the first one thousand (1,000) days of life.
- The measure localizes the provisions of Republic Act No. 11148 and consolidates Quezon City’s existing maternal and child health initiatives into a unified and institutionalized framework.

- The Proponent cited previously enacted related city ordinances, namely: Ordinance No. SP-2703, S-2019, otherwise known as the *First 1,000 Days Early Childhood Development (ECD) Package*; Ordinance No. SP-3146, S-2022, providing free postnatal supplements; and Ordinance No. SP-3192, S-2023, providing free maternity and child kits to ensure policy harmonization and program convergence.
- Several recommendations were raised during the deliberations of the Committee on Laws, such as including a clear funding provision and citing the previously enacted related ordinances in 2018, 2022, and 2023; and to include its authors, Councilors Aly Medalla, Joseph Juico, and Vic Bernardo, as principal authors of the proposed measure.
- The observations of Assistant City Administrator Rene Grapilon were adopted and incorporated into the measure through the insertion of a new *Section 12, Funding*. The provision mandates the inclusion of the program in the City's Annual Investment Program and Annual Budget, ensuring its annual appropriations and allowing utilization of existing funds when necessary, and directs barangays and their respective Sangguniang Kabataan to utilize the mandatory one percent (1%) nutrition allocation under Ordinance No. SP-3242, S-2023 in support of the first one thousand (1,000) days strategy.
- With the amendments, the measure is now fiscally operational, legally harmonized with the existing city policies, and fully aligned with the national law.
- Through the proposed measure, the Quezon City government further strengthens its commitment to protect mothers and children during the most critical window of human development. Thus, respectfully sought the support of the Honorable Body for its approval.

The Acting Presiding Officer, Councilor Medalla (Aly), clarified whether the appropriations provisions apply to the current year or the next year. The Proponent replied that the provisions are intended for the next year. Likewise, the Acting Presiding Officer expressed her gratitude to the Proponent for adopting the amendments as proposed during the Committee on Laws.

- It seeks to formally institutionalize a program that honors and supports senior citizens by providing them with a birthday package, in the form of grocery bags, during their birth month.
- It is anchored on Section 16 of Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, which empowers local government units to promote the general welfare of their constituents. It is likewise consistent with Republic Act No. 9994, or the Expanded Senior Citizens Act of 2010, which upholds the rights and welfare of senior citizens and mandates support for their well-being.
- All registered senior citizens of Quezon City, as validated by the Office for the Senior Citizens’ Affairs (OSCA), shall be entitled to receive a birthday package during their birth month, regardless of their economic status, to ensure fairness, inclusivity, and uniform implementation across all barangays.

- During the committee deliberations, Ms. Ma. Lorelei Salvador, Officer-in-Charge of the Social Services Development Department, expressed support for the objectives of the measure and recognized that the program provides practical assistance to senior citizens and serves as a gesture of appreciation from the Quezon City Government for their invaluable contributions to the community.
