- The proposed ordinance aims to institutionalize participatory budgeting in the budget process of the Quezon City Government as part of its accountability measures, ensuring that Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) are part of the budgeting process.
- Quezon City has joined the Open Government Partnership (OGP) Local Program, a global initiative that aims to build partnerships between local governments and civil society organizations, promoting a more open, participatory, accountable, transparent, and responsive government.
- Accredited CSOs shall formally and publicly participate in the budget process, and they will be engaged in all phases thereof, in accordance with the Handbook on the Participation of the CSOs in the Local Budget Process and the 2023 Budget Operations Manual for Local Government Units.
- Government offices and departments shall ensure that CSOs are consulted through the conduct of budget forums before submitting their budget proposals to the City Finance Committee. Thereafter, the City Finance Committee shall endorse the proposals to the City Council for deliberation, which will be based on the recommendations jointly made by the departments and CSOs.
- The measure is a significant step toward participatory budgeting, accountability, and transparency, and expressed hope for the Council's support as a demonstration of its commitment to transparent budget processes.

The Presiding Officer indicated that the measure had been thoroughly discussed in the committees, particularly in the Committee on Laws.

- to include all Councilors present as Co-Introducers of the measure.

The Committee on Health & Sanitation recommended approval, with amendment:

The Committee on Education, Science & Technology recommended approval, with amendments/remarks:

- Section 3. Coverage. It shall now refer to all elementary and secondary schools, not only private schools;
- Section 3a. Since it is encouraging anyway;
- Section 4a. It will also reflect the same; it is for public and private schools in Quezon City;
- Section 4c. City-managed public libraries. Added their role in the implementation of the Digital Wellness Program;

- Section 5. Reflects the barangay involvement;
- Section 7. To include library staff in terms of support and engagement of programs and their role in letter “c”;

- Section 10. IRR. Indicated that it shall now be the City Health Department, Educational Affairs Unit, and other department indicated in the amended version;
- Added another Section on Monitoring and Evaluation, which would be the City Health Department in coordination with SDO and the EAU;
- to include Councilor Maria Eleanor “Doc Ellie” R. Juan, O.D., as a Main Proponent; and
- to include all Councilors present as Co-Introducers of the measure.

Councilor Medalla (Aly) moved to approve PO23CC-153.

Meanwhile, a short video clip for Toy Story V was shown, depicting the current situation of children.

After which, through a visual presentation, the Lady Proponent introduced the proposed Digital Wellness and Healthy Screen Time Ordinance of Quezon City, emphasizing its merits, objectives, significance, and key provisions, as follows:

- The World Health Organization (WHO) recommends no screen time for children under two (2) years old (except video calls) and a maximum of one (1) hour per day for those aged two (2)–five (5).
- A study by Ateneo de Manila University School of Medicine and Public Health shows that 76% of Filipino children exceed the WHO recommended screen time, averaging 8–10 hours daily.
- Countries, including Australia, France, and the United Kingdom, have begun banning social media use for children up to age 16, with other countries considering similar measures.
- The measure is not only about the screen time, but its significance to the development and health of the children. Studies show that excessive and unregulated screen time can lead to numerous effects, such as reduced physical activity, impaired problem-solving skills, reduced memory retention, over-reliance on multitasking, delayed language development, lower empathy levels, reduced attention span, increased cognitive load, and others.
- It is not an anti-technology ordinance, but pro-health, pro-family, and pro-child development; it aims for a balanced and responsible screen time.

- Declaration of Policy:
 - Encourage balanced and responsible screen use for children and adolescence
 - Support families and educators in guiding digital habits
- Digital Wellness Framework:
 - Pillar 1 - Healthy Screen Use Guidelines by Setting
 - Pillar 2 - Protection Against Harmful Digital Design
 - Pillar 3 - Capacity Building and Support Programs
 - Pillar 4 - Community and Public Space
- The measure shall be implemented in the following:
 - Public & Private Elementary and Secondary Schools
 - Daycare Centers and ECCD Facilities
 - City-Managed Learning Spaces
 - City-Supported Youth Programs
 - Homes and Barangays
- For homes and barangays, the measure is non-punitive, focusing on guidance, education, and providing support. The ordinance does not authorize the barangays or city offices to enter homes and penalize families for screen use.
- For schools and learning spaces: It aims to implement clear age-appropriate guidelines and safeguards, such as:
 - Prohibit Non-Instructional Screen Use
 - Establish Device-Free Periods
 - Adopt and Implement School Digital Wellness Policies
 - Implement Network-Level Controls
 - Engage Parents and Caregivers
 - Integrate Digital Self-Regulation
- The Healthy screen use guidelines for homes and families are:
 - Age-Appropriate Guidance
 - Key Recommendations may include: Screen-Free Family Time and Balanced Digital Device Use
- Support and Engagement Programs for Parents, Educators, and Learners:
 - Co-Development and Delivery of Parenting Seminars
 - Dissemination of Age-Appropriate Guidance and Informational Materials
 - Promotion of Consistent and Aligned Home–School Approaches to Responsible and Balanced Digital Technology Use
- For the Appropriation, the Ordinance shall be funded through existing appropriations of concerned offices, where applicable.

- It aims to create an ordinance that is practical, implementable, fair, and responsive to the needs of children, families, schools, and the communities.
- It has gone through public consultation last February 23, 2026, during the Safer Internet Forum in the MICE Center, attended by the parents, teachers, youth, barangay officials, and other stakeholders, to ensure that this policy is shaped with the people.
- It does not punish families, but supports and guides them towards a healthier learning environment.
- The Lady Councilor encourages the support of the Body for the passage of the ordinance.

Upon recognition, Councilor Belmonte (Mikey) expressed support for the measure, noting increased vision problems among young students, as revealed by the implementation of eye tests in elementary schools in Quezon City, likely linked to the pandemic time, when students were taking online classes. He added that this also resulted in rising social anxiety and depression among youth. He then commended the Majority Floor Leader for this measure.

The Lady Proponent thanked Councilor Belmonte (Mikey) for his support, acknowledged his school eye-care programs, and emphasized that excessive device use—beyond genetics—contributes to vision issues. She stressed that it is something the city government should address, as other countries begin imposing bans on this.

The Presiding Officer highlighted the importance of the measure, expecting it to have a substantial impact upon implementation. He commended Councilor Aly Medalla and suggested considering stricter policies, such as limiting social media access for individuals aged 16 and under, similar to other countries. In addition, he referenced a related proposal introduced in the Senate. His Honor acknowledged that unregulated use of devices and social media can adversely affect youth without parental oversight and expressed his strong support for the initiative. His Honor also mentioned that the Senate of the Philippines already has a measure on this matter.

Meanwhile, Vice Mayor Sotto acknowledged the presence of former Councilor Marcing Medalla.

Councilor Medalla (Aly) expressed gratitude to the Vice Mayor for the support and assured to look into the other measures mentioned by the Presiding Officer to be proposed in the Council.

There being no other manifestations, the discussion was terminated, and the following revisions were adopted:

- The title shall read as follows: “AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE QUEZON CITY DIGITAL WELLNESS AND HEALTHY SCREEN TIME FRAMEWORK FOR CHILDREN AND ADOLESCENTS IN SCHOOLS, HOMES, AND COMMUNITY SPACES AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.” (The same shall be reflected throughout the ordinance.)
- To include Councilor Juan as main introducer of the ordinance.

- This is more than a simple commendation; it is a declaration of a continued commitment to empower the youth, to invest in their potential, and to recognize their vital role in shaping society.
- By honoring SK Chairperson Magdaraog, Quezon City sent a strong message that celebrates excellence, supports youth leadership, and takes pride in every citizen who brings honor to the city on the global stage, and that recognition inspires more young people to step forward to live with integrity and to serve with purpose.
- The Presiding Officer remarked that this is another achievement for the city.
