I. OPENING PRAYER

Councilor Yap led the opening prayer.

II. NATIONAL ANTHEM

The Community Singing of the Philippine National Anthem.

III. COUNCILORS' CREED

The members of the City Council recited the Philippine Councilors' Creed led by Councilor Lagumbay.

IV. CALL TO ORDER

The 43rd Regular Session was called to order at 2:17 P.M. by the Presiding Officer, Vice Mayor Gian G. Sotto.

Meanwhile, **Councilor Herrera yielded the Chair to Councilor Ferrer.**

V. ROLL CALL

The Secretariat, Mr. Salting, called the roll.

There being a quorum, the Body proceeded with the calendar of business.

VI. INFORMATIONAL MATTER

1. FORWARDED MESSAGE VIA EMAIL: COPY OF A LETTER FROM MS. MA. MARGARITA MEJIA, DPA, HEAD, BUSINESS PERMITS AND LICENSING DEPARTMENT, THIS CITY, RE: SHOW CAUSE ORDER ISSUED TO BOYNITABONBON OPC/MR. WILFREDO M. AGA, JR.

REFERRED to the Committee on Markets & Slaughterhouses.

VII. PRIVILEGE HOUR

There being no council member who opted to avail of the privilege hour, on motion, duly seconded, the same was dispensed with.

VIII. QUESTION & ANSWER HOUR

Councilor Liban (Bong) manifested that during the previous session, he expressed concerns about the recent renaming of the Commonwealth Market to BOYNITABONBON Market. With that, he requested the Market Department head to discuss the matter with the owner of the Boynita Bon-Bon Market to clarify the issue. He highlighted that he is not against the renaming as long as all legal requirements are complied with.

The Speaker mentioned that as stipulate under the Local Government Code, the Sangguniang Panlalawigan, in consultation with the National Historical Institute (referred to as the Philippine Historical Commission in the Code), may change the name of places within its territorial jurisdiction: component cities, municipalities, upon the recommendation of the Sangguniang Panlalawigan, *bayan*, as the case may be, provincial roads, streets, avenues, boulevards, thoroughfares, bridges, provincial public vocational and technical schools, other post-secondary territorial schools, any other public place or building owned by the city.

As the public place likewise pertains to markets, Councilor Liban (Bong) further stated that, as provided in Article 23 of Guidelines and Limitations, no name of local government units, public places, streets, and structures with historical, cultural, or ethnic significance shall be changed unless by a unanimous vote of the Sanggunian and in consultation with the NHI.

To his knowledge, no resolution has been submitted by the Council, and no consultation with the National Historical Institute (NHI) has been undertaken by the lessor of Commonwealth Market.

He then enumerated the additional requirements for the naming as follows:

- Naming after a living person shall not be allowed.
- A name change shall be made only for a justifiable reason.
- The Office of the President, the representative of the legislative district concerned, and the Postal Service Office shall be notified of any change in the name of local government units, public places, streets, and structures.

Being a Councilor in the area where the Commonwealth Market is located, Councilor Liban (Bong) reiterated that he is not against the said renaming, provided that all legal requirements are strictly complied with.

Meanwhile, Acting Presiding Officer Councilor Ferrer called for a one-minute recess. Upon resumption, the Majority Floor Leader noted the manifestation of Councilor Liban (Bong).

Thereafter, as moved by the Majority Floor Leader, the Question & Answer Hour was terminated.

The Committee on Education, Science and Technology recommended approval.

After moving for its approval, Councilor Medalla (Aly) presented and explained the proposed ordinance, highlighting its merits, objectives, significance, and key provisions, supported by a visual presentation.

- The ordinance seeks to establish the “Safe School Zone Ordinance of Quezon City.”
- Quezon City records the highest number of road crash incidents in Metro Manila in 2024, with more than 35,000 incidents in the city out of 88,000.
- Children are highly vulnerable road users, and daily exposure to heavy traffic on their way to and from school increases their risk of accidents and injuries.
- Through the proposed ordinance, it is hereby declared the policy of the city to prioritize the safety, welfare, and protection of its youth.

- The ordinance provides for the Establishment of School Zones (Sec. 4), viz:
 - o All public and private elementary and secondary schools in Quezon City.
 - o School Zone: clearly defined boundaries of at least one hundred (100) meters from all entry and exit points of the school premises.
 - o The City will map school zones with the schools through the City Planning and Development Department.

- For School Zone Audits (Section 4), the following will be included:
 - o Mandatory Road Safety Audit
 - o Training and Accreditation of Assessors
 - o Implementation of Findings
 - o Monitoring and Evaluation

- The city government, through the Transport & Traffic Management Department (TTMD), will conduct the road safety audits.

- Traffic Regulations in School Zones (Section 6):
 - o Speed Limit Enforcement for school hours
 - o No Loading and Unloading in Prohibited Zones
 - o One-Way Traffic Flow (where applicable)
 - o Strict Parking Regulations
 - o Use of Hazard Lights
 - o Anti-Obstruction
 - o Designated Drop-off and Pick-up Points
 - o Priority to Pedestrians

- Safety Measures (Section 7):
 - o Installation of Traffic-Calming Devices and Infrastructure
 - o Emergency Preparedness
 - o Adequate Lighting and Surveillance
 - o Pedestrian Lanes and Signages
 - o Crossing Guards and Traffic Aides

- The TTMD shall serve as the lead agency responsible for the implementation of this Ordinance (Section 8).

- Other enforcement agencies (Section 9):
 - o City Planning and Development Department (CPDD)– for road safety audit;
 - o Department of Public Order & Safety (DPOS) – for obstruction;
 - o Barangay and Community Relations Department (BCRD) - coordination with the barangays.

- Inter-agency coordination (Section 10) with the Schools Division Office, Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH), Quezon City Police Department (QCPD), and Metropolitan Manila Development Authority (MMDA) is also encouraged.

- For Enforcement and Force Multipliers (Section 11), operations will be carried out during school arrival, midday shift dismissal, and end of class hours.

 - o Complaint and Reporting Mechanism
 - o School Zone Registry and Coordination
 - o Public Information Campaign
- Collaboration with stakeholders - Elementary Learner Government, Secondary Learner Government (Section 12), and Parent and Teachers' Association (Section 13).
- Appropriations (Section 14) and Penalties (Section 15) for violations, such as First Offense, Second Offense, and Third and Subsequent Offenses, are also provided in this Ordinance.
- A comprehensive public consultation was held for this purpose, with participation from public and private schools, barangays, PTAs, students, DPOS, TTMD, and other sectors.
- It is envisioned to establish a safe school zone equipped with adequate signage and traffic enforcers to ensure students can safely cross and move about.
- The ordinance was developed with support from the schools, TTMD, and a consulting law firm.

 - Letter **c**, to insert the “Training of Enforcers.”
 - Letter **d**, to insert the “Issuance of Traffic Violation Receipts (TVRs) and Ordinance Violation Receipts (OVRs).”
 - Letter **e**, “The TTMD shall adopt the use of CCTV and similar technologies for enforcement.”
 - Letter **f**, to insert “SDO-QC.”
 - Letter **g**, to insert “The TTMD, as lead agency, shall submit an annual report of the resolution of Citizens Complaints to the City Council.”
- **SECTION 12** shall be the “**COLLABORATION WITH SUPREME ELEMENTARY LEARNER GOVERNMENT (SELG) AND SUPREME SECONDARY LEARNER GOVERNMENT (SSLG)**.”

On motion of Councilor Generoso, duly seconded, **PR23CC-393** was **APPROVED** on its second reading, with the following manifestations from the Proponent, and the adoption of the amendments made:

- The proposed measure seeks to formally rename the Payatas Controlled Disposal Facility to Quezon City Closed Disposal Site to accurately reflect the facility’s status pursuant to the closure, rehabilitation, and post-closure care requirements under Republic Act No. 9003, otherwise known as the Ecological Solid Waste Management Act of 2000.
- Pursuant to DENR Administrative Order No. 2001-34 (Implementing Rules and Regulations) and DENR Administrative Order No. 2006-09, which outline closure and rehabilitation guidelines, the facility in question had already stopped functioning as a disposal site by the time Mayor Joy Belmonte took office. Following this, significant rehabilitation efforts were initiated, resulting in the facility being transformed into a multi-use public amenity.
- The site now features a bike park, dog park, and recreational green spaces within the Textile Circularity Hub, contributing to community wellness and promoting sustainable development through climate-responsive land use.
- Retaining the name *Controlled Disposal Facility* no longer accurately represents the site’s present condition, function, or intended future use. Thus, renaming it as *Quezon City Closed Disposal Site* ensures proper public representation, aligns with national environmental policy, and supports the City's local land use and sustainable development initiative.

Amendments:

- To convert the proposed measure from a resolution into an ordinance, as reflected in the amended version submitted to the Office of the Secretary of the Sanggunian.
- To incorporate the amendments made during the committee hearing, particularly the revision of the title from “*Quezon City Closed Disposal Facility*” to “*Quezon City Closed Disposal Site.*”
- To include all councilors present as co-introducers of the measure.

PR23CC-428 – A RESOLUTION ENCOURAGING ALL BARANGAYS IN QUEZON CITY TO ACTIVELY SUPPORT, PROMOTE, AND COORDINATE WITH THE QUEZON CITY VETERINARY DEPARTMENT IN THE IMPLEMENTATION OF ITS SPAY AND NEUTER (KAPON) PROGRAMS (*Introduced by Councilor DOROTHY A. DELARMENTE, M.D.*)

On motion of Councilor Delarmente, duly seconded, **PR23CC-428** was **APPROVED** on its second reading, with the following manifestations from the Lady Proponent, and amendments **to adopt all modifications made during committee hearings and to include all councilors present as co-introducers of the measure:**

- The proposed measure aimed to encourage all barangays in Quezon City to actively support and promote the spay and neuter (kapon) program of the Quezon City Veterinary Department. Previously, stray animals had commonly been seen roaming the streets freely, unattended, unvaccinated, and often neglected.
- While progress had been made over the years, the problem persisted in many communities. At the same time, even among households with pets, the same issue of uncontrolled breeding had continued, leading to unwanted litters and eventually increasing the number of stray animals. The situation had been similar to what had been experienced before with anti-rabies vaccination efforts.
- There had been a time when many pet owners had been hesitant to have their animals vaccinated. They had not been well informed, and some had even feared that it might be dangerous for their pets. However, through consistent information campaigns, education, and community engagement, anti-rabies vaccination has become widely accepted and has been recognized as essential for public health.
- At that time, the situation had been similar to spaying and neutering. Many pet owners were still hesitant, thinking it might be dangerous, unnecessary, or that something might happen to their pets. However, in reality, spaying and neutering have been safe, beneficial, and necessary—not only to control the animal population but also to protect the health of pets and the safety of communities.
- The proposed resolution aimed to strengthen collaboration between the city government and all barangays to promote responsible pet ownership and to actively promote spaying and neutering programs.

PR23CC-432 – A RESOLUTION ENCOURAGING THE IMPLEMENTATION AND STRENGTHENING OF MENTAL HEALTH AND WELL-BEING PROGRAMS FOR FEMALE YOUTH IN QUEZON CITY, IN LINE WITH THE OBSERVANCE OF NATIONAL WOMEN’S MONTH (*Introduced by Councilors JHON ANGELLI “Sami” C. NERI, DOROTHY A. DELARMENTE, M.D., AIKO MELENDEZ and CANDY A. MEDINA*)

- The amended version is attached on pages 189 to 190 of the order of business.

The Committees on Laws, Rules & Internal Government; Health & Sanitation; and Women, Family Relations & Gender Equality recommended approval, with amendments/remarks:

- to remove and/or delete the phrase “in line with the observance of National Women’s Month” in the title and dispositive portion;

On motion of Councilor Neri, duly seconded, **PR23CC-432** was **APPROVED** on its second reading, with the following manifestations from the Proponent, and **the adoption of the amendments made in the committee hearings:**

- The proposed resolution had simply sought to emphasize the importance of supporting the mental, emotional, and physical well-being of female youth, particularly during adolescence. Said stage of life had been critical, as many young women had faced mental health challenges, body image concerns, academic and social pressures, and physical health issues that, if left unaddressed, could affect their long-term development and self-worth.
- It encourages city departments, barangays, schools, and youth organizations to work together to provide accessible mental health support, wellness education, and safe spaces for adolescent girls. Investing in the health and well-being of young women would strengthen the foundation of empowered women and responsible leaders of the future.

PR23CC-433 – A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING AND ENCOURAGING OF WOMEN’S MENTAL HEALTH AND LIFE-CYCLE CARE PROGRAMS IN QUEZON CITY (*Introduced by Councilors DOROTHY A. DELARMENTE, M.D., AIKO S. MELENDEZ and CANDY A. MEDINA*)

The Committees on Laws, Rules & Internal Government; Health & Sanitation; and Women, Family Relations & Gender Equality recommended approval, with amendment:

- to include all Councilors present as Co-Introducers of the measure

On motion of Councilor Delarmente, duly seconded, **PR23CC-433** was **APPROVED** on its second reading, with the following manifestations from the Lady Proponent, and **the adoption of the amendments made in the committee hearings, and the inclusion of all councilors present as co-introducers:**

- The proposed resolution affirms that women’s mental health is not a side issue; it is a public health concern.
- When women are mentally and emotionally supported, families become stronger, children are better nurtured, and communities grow more resilient.
- Through the Women Month initiatives and all the other initiatives year-round, Quezon City has shown that programs on mental health, self-care and life cycle awareness work.
- The proposed measure seeks to encourage the continuation and integration of said efforts into regular city and barangay health services, ensuring that support for women continues when the month of March is over.

The Committees on Laws, Rules & Internal Government; and Cultural Communities & Religious Affairs recommended approval, with amendment:

- to include all Councilors present as Co-Introducers of the measure

Likewise, on motion of Councilor Delarmente, duly seconded, **PR23CC-465** was **APPROVED** on its second reading, with the following manifestations from the Proponent and amendments to **adopt the amendments in the committee hearings and to include all councilors present as co-introducers:**

- Quezon City is blessed with religious diversity, which, when nurtured with understanding and respect, serves as a source of strength rather than division.
- Interfaith dialogue allows communities to learn from one another, build trust, and work together for the common good.
- The proposed resolution encourages barangays, schools, and city institutions to provide spaces that facilitate dialogue and cooperation among various faith communities. It acknowledges the significant contribution of religious organizations in promoting peace, social services, and community development.
- It does not interfere with religious beliefs or practices; rather, it affirms freedom of religion while promoting respect, harmony, and collaboration - values that strengthen the communities and the city as a whole.

- One of the City’s Fourteen-Point Agenda is to build a liveable, green and sustainable city. In line with this, Quezon City aims to be a leading city in climate action by enhancing resilience, promoting sustainable economic growth, and ensuring a vibrant and liveable environment for every QCitizen.
- The proposed measure seeks to adopt the Quezon City Air Quality Management Plan as a guiding framework for the City’s policies, programs, and initiatives aimed at improving and sustaining ambient air quality. The adoption of the said plan reinforces the commitment of the city government to protect public health, safeguard the environment and ensure a balance and healthy ecology for its residents.
- The Quezon City Air Quality Management Plan was developed through a multi-sectoral and science-based approach to address air pollution challenges in the city.
