On motion of Councilor Pumaren, duly seconded, **PO23CC-112** was **APPROVED** on its second reading, with the following manifestations from the Proponent, and the adoption of the amendments made:

- The fundamental commitment of the proposed ordinance is to prioritize the welfare and dignity of the elderly.
- The establishment of a dedicated Senior Care Home is a vital social service aimed at providing holistic, rights-based, and compassionate residential care to indigent and homeless senior citizens who lack family support or available caregivers.
- In 2016, the Quezon City Council reenacted Ordinance No. SP-2541, also known as the *Quezon City Senior Citizens Shelter Home Ordinance*, established *Bahay Aruga* as a transition house and temporary shelter for abandoned, neglected, and homeless elderly residents.
- In response to the increasing number of elderly individuals facing poverty and abuse, the City Government relocated the facility in November 2022 to a larger and more conducive site in Barangay Holy Spirit.
- The shelter served sixty-three (63) clients in 2023, sixty-nine (69) clients in 2024, seventy-one (71) clients in 2025, and currently houses seventy-two (72) residents, bringing a total of three hundred two (302) number of elderly served since 2020.
- The proposed ordinance also aims to expand the authority and activity of the facility to ensure that it can adequately address the complex needs of its residents.
- By prioritizing the dignity and welfare of senior citizens, the measure ensures that they receive comprehensive care that transcends basic shelter.
- Section 6 of the proposed ordinance outlines the essential services to be provided to residents at no cost, thereby supplementing the existing functions of the Senior Citizens Shelter Home under Ordinance No. SP-2541. The mandated services shall include the provision of basic living necessities, as well as health and medical support, such as safe, clean, and comfortable lodging; clothing and appropriate assistive devices; free nutritious and balanced daily meals with snacks, tailored to the residents' dietary needs; and regular medical check-ups to be conducted by a resident physician.

- It further mandates the provision of wellness and psychosocial services for all residents.
- It underwent review by the Office of the City Administrator, which issued its comments dated February 18, 2026, and manifested that the measure is consistent with the City’s mandate to protect and promote the welfare of senior citizens and expressed no objection to its passage.
- During the deliberations in the Committee on Laws, the Social Services Development Department (SSDD) recommended the removal of the existing two-week limit on the duration of stay of residents, as their data indicates that the majority of senior citizens under their care require assistance that extends well beyond the said initial period. The same was adopted in the amended version of the measure as reflected in Section 7.
- The Proponent emphasized that senior citizens embody the wisdom and foundation of Quezon City. Thus, it is their collective duty to ensure that they live with dignity, security, and proper care. Through the enactment of the measure, the city reaffirms that no elderly resident will be left behind as it builds to a more inclusive and compassionate city.

The Presiding Officer emphasized the necessity of the measure and sought clarification on the office responsible for overseeing the facility's implementation. The Proponent clarified that this responsibility will lie with the Social Services Development Department (SSDD), in collaboration with the Office for the Senior Citizens' Affairs (OSCA).

His Honor inquired if the establishment of a monitoring, reporting, and evaluation mechanism would be under the said offices, to which Councilor Pumaren affirmed. Additionally, the Presiding Officer asked whether the SSDD would set the criteria for the admission and discharge of residents, and the Proponent also confirmed this in the affirmative.

Amendments:

- To adopt all the amendments made during the Committee Hearings.
- To adopt the amended version of the measure.
- To include all councilors present as co-introducers of the measure.

- to amend Section 6, item 1, to include “except for large-scale bazaars such as Paskong QC which may charge a maximum of Two Hundred Fifty Pesos (Php250.00) per day”;

QC-SBCDPO shall issue and may revise, from time to time, the guidelines for the use of the logo”;
- to amend section 9, item 2, to include “with in Section 8 of this Ordinance”; and
- to include all Councilors present as Co-Introducers of the measure.

The Committee on Micro, Small and Medium Business and Entrepreneurship Development and Cooperative recommended approval, with amendment:

- to include all Councilors present as Co-Introducers of the measure.

Councilor Ferrer moved to approve PO23CC-175 on its second reading.

Moving on to the discussion, the Lady Proponent stated that:

- The ordinance seeks to foster an inclusive business environment by adopting the “3Ms” framework – Money, Market, and Mentorship, supporting community artisans and local entrepreneurs.
- Key components of the program include the organization of seasonal and specialized bazaars, the establishment of a permanent “one-stop shop” store for QC-made goods, and the development of “tourism merchandise” showcasing local craftsmanship.
- The program also offers market incubation services, entrepreneurial training in partnership with agencies like the DTI and DOST, and assistance with business registration and regulatory compliance.

The Presiding Officer emphasized the importance of the proposed "POP QC Ordinance" as a key initiative aimed at supporting small, micro, and nano entrepreneurs in the city. He posed raised questions regarding the ordinance's scope, specifically whether products should exclusively be 100% manufactured in Quezon City or if those that are designed, assembled, or significantly processed in the city would also qualify.

In response, the Lady Proponent explained that the program currently covers products made in Quezon City, with most, if not all, participants being beneficiaries of the “Pangkabuhayan QC” program or recipients of city government endorsement and assistance.

As to the inquiry of the Vice Mayor, whether the ordinance would apply to all nano, micro, and small enterprises and cooperatives, or if it would focus on certain sectors, including food, fashion, technology, and creative industries, the Proponent answered in the affirmative. At present, registrants are primarily from “Pangkabuhayan QC,” with plans to expand registration to more entrepreneurs.

QC-SBCDPO shall issue and may revise, from time to time, the guidelines for the use of the logo; Provided that any unauthorized use of the logo shall be subject to appropriate civil and/or criminal proceedings, in accordance with applicable laws, rules, and regulations.”
- To polish the wording of Section 8 to distinguish it from Section 7 on eligibility:
 - o To change the Section 8 from “QUALIFICATIONS” to “REQUIREMENTS AND PRIORITY CONSIDERATION”
 - o To add the word on item 2, “Copy of”
 - o To add the word on item 4 “Proof that”, and replace the “must be” with “are”
 - o To replace the paragraph, “Provided that QC-SBCDPO may, from time to time, require additional requirements as necessary and provided in its updated Citizens’ Charter.” Above, “Priority consideration will be given to NMSECs who have any of the following”
 - o To replace the “meet the above criteria and possess” with “have”
- In Section 9 (2), Screening, to remove the phrase “the qualification stated”
- In Section 11, replace “without warning” with “after due investigation”
- In Section 12 (1), to add the word “Serious.”
- To include all the councilors present as co-introducers of the measure.

Finally, on motion, duly seconded, **PO23CC-175** was **APPROVED** on its second reading, as amended.

On motion of Councilor Calalay, duly seconded, **PR23CC-460** was **APPROVED** on its second reading, with the following manifestations from the Proponent, and the adoption of the amendment **to include all councilors present as co-introducers of the measure:**

- The proposed resolution aims solely to preserve and pass on the culture of Quezon City. It is not only about cities, buildings, or heritage sites; rather, it is about the stories of every barangay, the traditions of every family, and the identity of every QCitizen.
- With the rapid pace of change, many cultures and traditions are gradually disappearing. When these were lost, a sense of identity was also lost. Therefore, the stories and traditions needed to be documented, the culture was preserved, and these were passed on to future generations.
- It is not only the responsibility of the government; barangays, schools, youth, and elders were their partners in the said effort. Through community-based programs and collective action, they can ensure that the culture of Quezon City will not be forgotten but will instead be further enriched.

The Presiding Officer stated that, in all honesty, he has been praying for a measure like this to be introduced. He expressed hope that, in the future, an ordinance would be enacted to truly preserve the culture, noting that each barangay and district has its own distinct characteristics and identity, particularly in a diverse city like Quezon City.

His Honor highlighted the significance of preserving all traditions, cultures, and practices as vital for the Philippines' progress toward becoming a first-world country. He praised the proponent of the measure and expressed optimism for its nationwide implementation, underscoring the necessity of recognizing the country's culture and traditions.

- to include Coun. Jose Maria “Mari” M. Rodriguez as Main Introducer.

On motion of Councilor Delarmente, duly seconded, **PR23CC-466** was **APPROVED** on its second reading, with the following manifestations from the Proponent, and the adoption of the amendments **to adopt all modifications made during committee hearings and to include all councilors present as co-introducers of the measure:**

- The proposed measure focuses on implementing community-based cultural mapping programs in Quezon City. This approach facilitates the identification and recognition of cultural assets within barangays, including artists, cultural workers, religious landmarks, traditions, festivals, and community stories. These assets serve as reflections of the identity and lived experiences of the people.
- The proposed resolution encouraged barangays to lead participatory mapping efforts with the support of city institutions. She noted that the Quezon City Tourism Department would be invited to provide technical guidance and to integrate mapping outputs into cultural and heritage initiatives.
- The Quezon City Public Library would be encouraged to help consolidate and safeguard these materials, and the Department of Education – Schools Division would be encouraged to involve schools and students in cultural mapping activities.
- The proposed measure does not impose mandates; instead, it promotes collaboration, inclusivity, and informed planning. She emphasized that the approach ensured that future cultural, educational, and tourism programs are grounded in the realities of the communities.

The Presiding Officer emphasized the significance of a measure closely aligned to their advocacy in preserving culture and traditions. He elaborated that the mapping initiative aims to pinpoint crucial areas that serve not just tourism interests but also facilitate a reconnection with the community’s roots, to which the Proponent answered in the affirmative, and added that the proposed measure encourages barangays to trace their own respective areas. She clarified that it is not only about roots or history, but also includes local artists and the various traditions present in each barangay.

His Honor mentioned that when Mayor Joy Belmonte was then Vice Mayor, Her Honor was given the task to develop QC Experience (QCX), and there was previously a part of the Quezon City Experience (QCX) Museum that highlighted the idea that each barangay had its own distinct identity. He believed that the current initiative was very similar to that concept, and he hoped that it would at least be formally included in legislation.

The Presiding Officer further stated that he highly encouraged measures like this and more similar initiatives that would preserve culture and traditions. He expressed full support for the measure.

BELMONTE TO ACCEPT AND SIGN THE DEED OF DONATION ENTERED INTO BY AND BETWEEN THE OFFICE OF THE PRESIDENT (OP), AS DONOR, AND THE QUEZON CITY GOVERNMENT, AS DONEE, FOR THE DONATION AND ACCEPTANCE OF FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE IN THE AMOUNT OF TWENTY-EIGHT MILLION FOUR HUNDRED THOUSAND PESOS (PHP28,400,000.00), REPRESENTING PHP200,000.00 PER BARANGAY, SOURCED FROM THE SOCIO-CIVIC PROJECTS FUND (SCPF), FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF EDUCATIONAL ASSISTANCE AND BARANGAY DEVELOPMENT PROPERTIES *(Introduced by Councilor JOSE MARIA “Mari” M. RODRIGUEZ)*PR23CC-809 (copy)

Subsequently, in view of the urgency of PR23CC-809, Councilor Rodriguez moved for its approval on its second reading.

Meanwhile, the Presiding Officer inquired about the existence of a Certificate of Urgency, and the Liga President assured that such a certificate would be submitted. Consequently, the rules were suspended.

Proceeding with the discussion, the Proponent elaborated that, in compliance with national government requirements, specifically from the Office of the President, the proposed resolution aims to authorize the City Mayor to accept a donation amounting to Twenty-Eight Million Four Hundred Thousand Pesos (PhP28,400,000.00). The amount will be allocated as a Presidential Support Fund, enabling each of the city’s 142 barangays to receive Two Hundred Thousand Pesos (PhP200,000.00).

As stipulated in the proposed resolution, the Presiding Officer highlighted that the donation is intended to implement educational assistance and barangay development priorities, stressed its importance, and expressed gratitude to the Office of the President. His Honor fully supported the measure, which significantly contributes to strengthening the city’s education system.

With no other manifestations, on motion, duly seconded, **PR23CC-809** was **APPROVED** on its second reading, under suspended rules, with the amendment **to include the Majority Floor Leader, Councilor Medalla (Aly), and the Minority Floor Leader, Councilor Delarmente, as co-main introducers, while all the other councilors present as co-introducers of the measure.**

Still under suspended rules, as moved and seconded, **PR23CC-809** was **CONFIRMED**.

Thereafter, the rules were restored.
